REWARD.

1. The person or persons giving information leading to the apprehension and conviction of a person or persons guilty of the above-mentioned offence will receive such amount or amounts not exceeding in the aggregate £5,000 as shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

2. The person or persons entitled to any reward and the amount or amounts payable to such person or persons shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

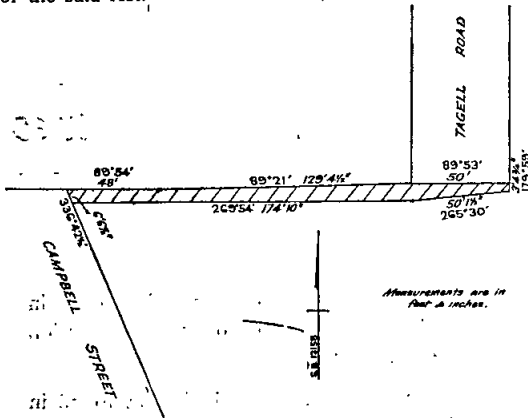
**PROCLAMATION**

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the City of Ringwood has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land shown hatched on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

**PROCLAMATION**

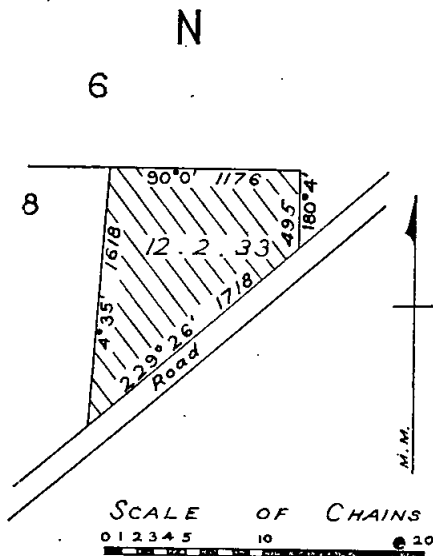

(b) In the case of any other dog a fee of 7s. 6d. or (where the registration is made after the First day of October in any Year) a fee of 4s.

(3) Any person desirous of applying for the benefit of this By-law shall deliver to the Council an application in writing signed by him in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

(4) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

- for making the crossing of any street or road less dangerous to any such persons.

(3) No person shall cut maim injure mutilate or destroy any tree shrub or plant planted or any tree guard statue monument fountain or seat erected in or upon any street or road.

(4) No person shall drive or ride any vehicle or animal or permit any hoofed animal of which he is the owner or in charge to be on or upon any garden garden plot lawn or ornamental plantation in or upon any street or road.

(5) No person shall throw stones or other missiles in any garden garden plot lawn or ornamental plantation in or upon any street or road or place or leave therein any refuse or rubbish whatsoever save in a receptacle placed therein by the Council for the purpose.

(6) No person shall cut maim injure deface disfigure or destroy any traffic control structure or bus shelter or write paint print stencil place or affix any letter figure device poster sign or advertisement upon any traffic control structure or any statue monument fountain or seat in or upon any street or road.

(7) This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

## CITY OF ST. KILDA.

BY-LAW No. 183.

A By-law of the City of St. Kilda made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* and the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*, and numbered 183 for prescribing areas in which off-street accommodation for stationary vehicles shall be provided.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*, (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations") and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of St. Kilda, order as follows:—

1. (a) The whole of the municipal district of the City of St. Kilda is hereby prescribed as an area in which off-street accommodation for stationary vehicles shall be provided in relation to buildings of class II and III Occupancy (as classified in the Regulations).

(b) Any person who, after the date upon which this By-law comes into operation, constructs a building of class II or III Occupancy shall provide in relation to such building off-street accommodation for stationary vehicles in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule hereto.

## SCHEDULE.

*Off-street Parking Provisions.*

1. One garage or vehicle space for the accommodation of stationary vehicles shall be provided for every flat, apartment or unit designed for separate occupation.

2. Accommodation to be provided as aforesaid shall be provided in every building or within the distance between the same and the boundaries of the site appertaining

thereto but at a distance of not less than 10 feet from the alignment of any street abutting such site and not so as to be closer to the frontage of such site than the alignment of the front of the building thereon.

3. Save where access to a car space is obtained directly from a street or road an access lane or lanes of not less than 12 feet in width shall be provided.

4. Every vehicle space provided for the accommodation of stationary vehicles shall be of a minimum area of 140 square feet.

5. Where access to a vehicle space is obtained from a side boundary of the site appertaining thereto the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) The combined width of the vehicle space and the street from which access thereto is obtained shall not be less than 15 feet.

(b) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the street from which access thereto is obtained is not more than 16 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 24 feet.

(c) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the street from which access thereto is obtained is more than 16 feet but not more than 17 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 22 feet.

(d) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the street from which access thereto is obtained is more than 17 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 20 feet.

6. Access may be provided from the frontage or the rear of the site to a vehicle space at right angles to the street from which access is obtained provided that the width of such street is not less than 20 feet and the length of the vehicle space is not less than 16 feet 6 inches.

7. Access may be provided from the frontage or the rear of the site to a vehicle space at an angle of 45 degrees to the street from which access is obtained provided that the width of such street is not less than 12 feet and the length of the vehicle space is not less than 16 feet 6 inches.

8. Every plan lodged with the Surveyor to accompany an application for a permit to construct a building in relation to which off-street accommodation for stationary vehicles is required shall clearly delineate all vehicle spaces constituting such accommodation and every street from which access to such vehicle spaces is to be obtained.

9. The boundaries of all vehicle spaces and streets from which access thereto is obtained shall be clearly indicated on the ground and shall conform with the plan lodged with the surveyor in accordance with paragraph 8 hereof.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Schedule, land upon which provision under or pursuant to this By-law is made for the accommodation of stationary vehicles shall not without the consent of the Council be used in any manner so as to reduce such accommodation.

- (a) Fixing fees payable to the Council under Part XV. of the Health Act 1958, for the examination and branding of carcasses of animals slaughtered for sale within the Bulla Meat Area.
- (b) For fixing the hours of slaughtering in private abattoirs or slaughteryards within the Bulla Meat Area.
- (c) Prohibiting the removal of carcasses, or meat, unless branded as required by Regulations or rendered unfit for human consumption in the prescribed manner.
- (d) Prohibiting any diseased animal being brought onto the premises without the permission of the Meat Inspector.
- (e) Prevention of cruelty to animals.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Bulla, in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law:—

"the Council" means the Council of the Shire of Bulla.

"The Meat Inspector" means the Meat Inspector appointed by the Council pursuant to Part XV. of the Health Act 1958.

"The Meat Area" means the whole of the Municipal district of the Shire of Bulla, being the area proclaimed as a meat area in the Victorian Government Gazette No. 90 of the 11th November, 1964.

"bobby calf" means a calf not more than six weeks old.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation after its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately from the date of its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The Council may charge and collect the following fees, for its own use, in respect to matters listed hereunder:—

- (c) for any certificate issued by the Meat Inspector . . . . . 5. 0.

The said fees shall be paid by the proprietor, of any abattoir, or slaughteryard, carried on within the meat area, to the Council at its office in Sunbury, once at least in every month and the amount of each payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher prepared by the Meat Inspector.

4. The times of slaughtering animals in the Meat Area shall be between the hours of 7.30 o'clock a.m., and 4.0 o'clock p.m., on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

No animal shall be slaughtered in the Meat Area on Saturday, Sunday or a gazetted holiday unless with the consent in writing of the Shire Secretary, to whom at least 24 hours notice, of intention to slaughter on that day, must be given.

5. No person shall remove, or permit to be removed, from any abattoir or slaughteryard within the Meat Area, any carcass or part of the carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the Meat Inspector and passed by him as fit for human consumption and branded with the regulation brand; or rendered unfit for human consumption and disposed of in the manner prescribed in the Meat Supervision Regulations.

6. No animal visibly affected, or known to be affected, by any contagious or infectious disease shall be brought into any abattoir or slaughteryard; or into any yard or pen thereat; in the Meat Area without the express permission of the Meat Inspector.

7. No animal shall be slaughtered in the Meat Area before it has been examined by the Meat Inspector.

8. No person shall ill-treat or unnecessarily frighten or irritate any animal or resort to unnecessary cruelty in slaughtering any animal.

9. All animals held in yards or pens in any abattoir or slaughteryard within the Meat Area shall be provided with good and sufficient food and water at least once in every 24 hours, and the owner shall provide that all milch animals shall be duly milked.

10. No animal shall be allowed to remain in the holding pens at any abattoir or slaughteryard within the Meat Area for a longer period than 48 hours.

11. The Meat Inspector may refuse to allow any person, not wearing clean overalls and head covering to handle any carcass or meat.

12. Any person who shall by any act or default contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty Pounds (£20).

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the Shire of Buln Buln described in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

All those pieces of land situated in the Town of Drouin, Parish of Drouin West being—

- (a) Section 18;  
(b) Part of the Railway Station Reserve bounded by Princes Highway, Hope Street, the railway line, and a production of the eastern building line of Bank Place to the railway line;  
(c) Section 10, but to the depth of 66 feet only at right angles from the building lines of Hope Street, Young Street, Sinclair Street and Princes Highway respectively;

#### SHIRE OF KNOX.

##### By-LAW No. 4.

A By-law of the Shire of Knox made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 4 for—

- (a) Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases, and
- (b) Prohibiting or regulating the leaving standing of caravans on streets or roads and the placing of caravans on private property.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Knox order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Knox.  
“Private Property” includes vacant land and a private street.

2. No person shall leave standing or permit or suffer to be left standing any caravan on any street or road for a longer period than one hour after being requested by an authorized officer of the Council or a member of the Police Force to remove such caravan.

3. (1) No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed more than one caravan on any private property without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

(2) No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed any caravan on any private property for a period exceeding fourteen days (other than for the purpose of storing or parking such caravan) without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

4. (1) No person shall occupy any caravan placed on private property for a period exceeding fourteen days without the consent, in writing, of the Council.

(2) Every person applying for such consent shall make application, in writing, to the Council and supply such information as the Council may reasonably require.

(3) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to the application as it sees fit.

(4) If the Council gives its consent, then the permit to be issued as a result shall be—

- (a) for a period not exceeding six months;
- (b) absolutely conditional upon proper sanitation facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector to the Council being at all times available for the use of the occupant or occupants.

(5) In event of such sanitation facilities ceasing to be so available, then any permit granted under sub-clause (4) hereof shall be immediately cancelled on service on the holder of such permit of a notice under the signature of the Health Inspector that such facilities have ceased to be available.

5. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Five pounds or more than Twenty

pounds, and to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order is made by any court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Knox, except such areas as are registered with the Council as camping areas under the provisions of section 221 of the *Health Act 1958*.

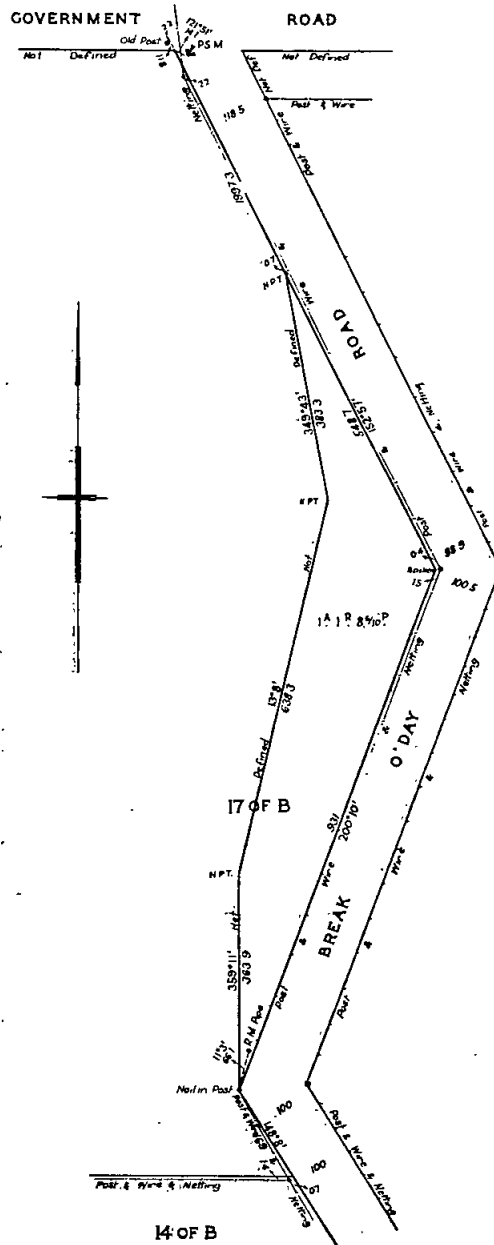
