WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 10 of the *Grain Elevators Act 1958*, it is amongst other things enacted that when an elevator is constructed operated maintained or controlled by the Grain Elevators Board in any place the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* define an area as the area with respect to which the elevator has been constructed to provide facilities for handling wheat or barley or wheat and barley grown or being therein: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth by this Order hereby define each of the respective areas set forth in the sub-joined Schedule as the area with respect to which the elevator specified in respect of such area has been constructed to provide facilities for handling wheat grown or being in such area and doth hereby specify the twenty-second day of March, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six as the date from and after which any person who without the consent of the Grain Elevators Board, delivers for transport or for storage within any area so defined any wheat grown in Victoria except through the agency of the Grain Elevators Board shall (unless exempted by the By-laws made under the said Act or otherwise by the said sub-section) be guilty of an offence.

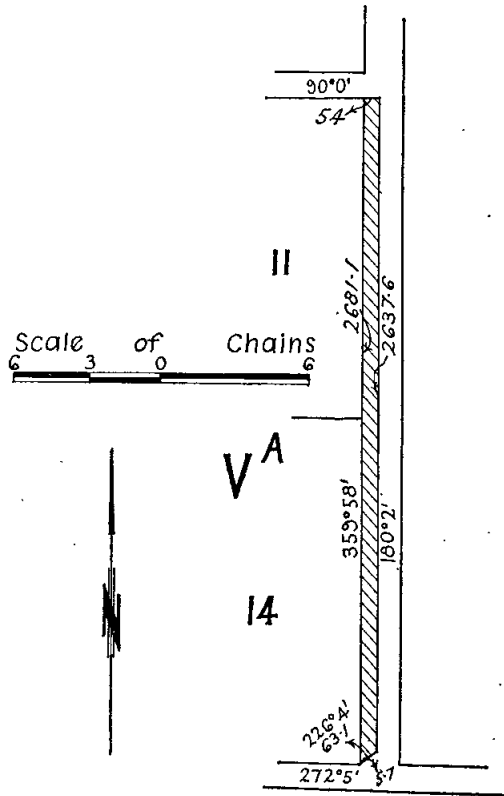

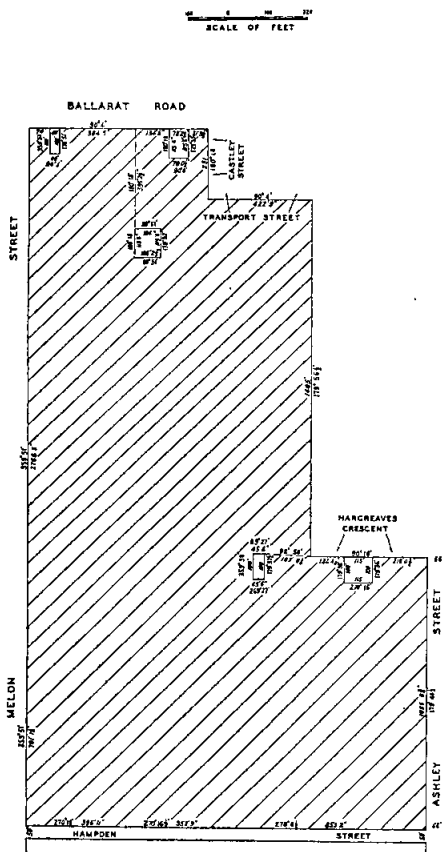

**SECTION 1.**

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity supplied to him they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For electricity supplied for lighting purposes—  
10c per unit.

For electricity supplied for purposes other than lighting—

5c per unit.

**SECTION 2.**

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by the electrical quantity contained in the supply given to him, they shall be entitled to charge him according to the rates set forth in section 1 of this Schedule, the amount of electricity supplied to him being taken to be the product of such electrical quantity and the declared pressure at the consumer's terminals; that is to say, such a constant pressure at those terminals as may be declared by the undertakers under any Regulations made under the Act.

**SECTION 3.**

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the undertakers may charge any consumer a minimum charge of \$1.00 per quarter for single phase supply, or \$1.50 per quarter for three phase supply whether the supply is used for lighting or other purposes.

**SECTION 4.**

Where the undertakers charge any consumer by a fixed periodical or service charge and a further charge according to the amount of energy supplied they shall be entitled to charge him at the following rates:—

For energy supplied for normal residential use for lighting, cooking, heating or power—

A service charge of 54c per quarter for every assessable\* room which does not exceed 350 square feet in floor area, plus 54c per quarter for every 350 square feet of floor area or odd fraction thereof of every assessable room in such premises where such floor area exceeds 350 square feet (but the service charge in respect of any one room shall not exceed \$1.62 per quarter) and, in addition, for any amount of energy supplied, 2.6c per unit; but (subject to the minimum quarterly charge provided for in section 3 of this Schedule) the amount chargeable to any consumer under this method shall not be higher than a sum calculated at the rate of 6c per unit used in any quarter.

\*Assessable Room.—An assessable room is any room (whether lighted by electricity or not and other than those exempted below) used or erected for use as a dining-room,

kitchen, bedroom, dressing-room, sun-room, ballroom, lounge, servery, library, billiard-room, sleep-out, laboratory, dispensary, gymnasium, or the like, or any enclosed verandah or vestibule used for such purpose. The following are normally exempt in assessing service charges:—

Passages, pantries, lobbies, bathrooms, lavatories, cellars, entrance halls, porches, garages, private workshops, sculleries, and washhouses where not combined with kitchens, verandahs and vestibules, unless such verandahs when enclosed are used for the purposes stated above.

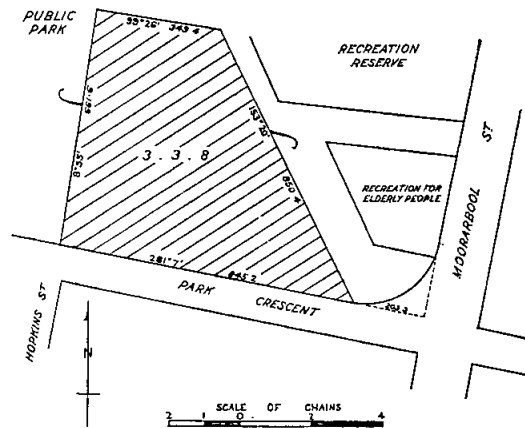

No person in an uncleanly condition shall use the swimming pool nor whilst suffering from any skin infectious or contagious disease and any such person shall leave the swimming pool upon being requested so to do by the person in charge or his or her assistants.

No person shall use soap or any form of detergent in any part of the swimming pool other than in the cleansing showers provided for that purpose.

No person shall at any time whilst in the swimming pool use any substance or preparation whereby the water may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of bathers.

No person shall take into the swimming pool kickboards manufactured of a material likely to cause a blockage of the filters.

No person shall take into the swimming pool goggles, snorkels, aqualungs or similar contraptions.

No person shall run whilst in the swimming pool area or duck or push another person.

No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person, or under his or her control, to enter or remain in the swimming pool.

No person shall at any time whilst in the swimming pool use any indecent or improper language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

No person shall wilfully or improperly commit any nuisance or foul or pollute the water in the swimming pool, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any buildings, furniture, fittings or other articles therein.

No person shall enter or remain in the swimming pool whilst in a state of intoxication.

No person using the swimming pool, nor any servant or other person employed thereat shall at any time introduce into the swimming pool any spirituous or or intoxicating liquor.

Any person finding anything which may have been left in any dressing room or in any part of the swimming pool shall, immediately, after finding such article, deliver the same to the person in charge of the swimming pool or other person acting on his or her behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of the same and all particulars relating thereto in a book kept for that purpose and any person losing such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the person in charge (or other person authorized to receive such article) upon entering his signature and address in the book referred to.

The days and hours of opening of the swimming pool and the charges for admission thereto shall be those as may be fixed by the Council from time to time.

3. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
