Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304). DECLARING THAT CHICORY SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by proclamation—

(a) Provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and

(b) make such further provision as will enable the

(b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the

same;

AND WHEREAS by a proclamation made on the 24th day of December 1935, under the provisions of Section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared chicory to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS by an Order made on the 8th April 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to chicory and assigned to such board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board": NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation hereby PROVIDE AND DECLARE that on and from the ninth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, all chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act

1958 be divested from the producers of chicory and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from the ninth day of April One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof AND to enable The Chicory Marketing Board as owner of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I DO FURTHER PROVIDE that all such chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Chicory Marketing Board by public notice or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.







REFUSAL OF REQUEST FOR SEVERANCE OF PART OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE BOROUGH OF WONTHAGGI (CAPE PATERSON AREA) AND ANNEXATION THEREOF TO THE SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ELMORE RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And WHEREAS certain Crown lands in the Township of Elmore were reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And WHEREAS such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; and WHEREAS

it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore, I James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for horse racing, football or cricket matches, sports or other amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One dollar 50 cents may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve and except—
 - (α) in regard to any Caravan and Camping Park set aside for that purpose by the Committee and for which a fee or fees may be charged;
 - (b) the Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purposes of a Caravan and Camping Park;
 - (c) persons occupying any portion or portions of any Caravan and Camping Park in the Reserve shall pay to the Committee such fee or fees as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 2. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, on such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the grounds so set apart.
- 3. Persons renting or hiring any portion of the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever and who make any charge to the public for admission shall pay to the Committee such a fee as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 4. No person shall enter, be, or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no person shall commit any nuisance therein or in any building thereon.
- 5. For the purpose of maintaining good order any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.
- 6. No persons, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
- 7. No club, association, society, or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained.
- 8. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose, and any person using any such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by the Committee, not exceeding Twenty cents in respect of any such motor car or cycle for the use of any parking area on such days only as a charge for admission is being made as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.
- 9. No person, club, or any other body using the Reserve shall damage any building therein or the furniture or fittings of such buildings, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club or other body shall be responsible for such damage and shall pay the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.
- 10. No person shall engage in training or in cricket, croquet, football, bowls, tennis or any other game in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, unless such person is at the time playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time; provided, however, that such permission shall not be arbitrarily denied.
- 11. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs or pluck any flowers or walk on any beds or borders or climb, jump, get upon, or over any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures or roll or throw stones or other missiles or leave any bottles, broken glass, papers, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein or post bills, or advertisements on any of the trees, buildings, fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

- 12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
- 13. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the Committee, sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any articles of food or drink or any other commodity.
- 14. No person shall erect in the Reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. Children under the age of ten years not being under the control of some competent person may be removed from the Reserve.
- 16. No person shall solicit or gather money in the Reserve nor hawk or sell any article or animal nor distribute any bills therein without the permission of the Committee first obtained.
- $17.\ N_{\rm O}$ person shall dig or remove any sand, soil, or other material from the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall camp in the Reserve or in any of the buildings therein.
- 19. No person shall take any dog on any part of the Reserve when a race meeting or any other sports meeting is being held thereon, and no person shall at any time take or keep any dog on any part of the Reserve, unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord or other similar means.
- 20. No person shall drive, ride, or propel any motor car or other vehicle on or through the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- 21. No person shall permit or suffer any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animals belonging to him or under his control or care to be at large in the Reserve, or to graze or wander over or upon the same without permission in writing, and the payment of such fees as may be fixed by the said Committee.
- 22. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind, or ride any bicycle, motor cycle or horse within the Reserve in any parking area or along any road thereon recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, including the nature, condition and use of the road or parking area of the Reserve, and to the amount of traffic which actually is at the time or which might reasonably be expected to be on such road or parking area, in the Reserve.
- 23. The Committee shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any appliance or property of such Committee nor from any cause whatsoever arising within the Reserve or Caravan Park.
- 24. No person shall drive any vehicle or animal in the Reserve at a speed in excess of 5 miles per hour.

These regulations are made in lieu of all previous regulations in respect of the said reserve which are hereby revoked. (Rs.922).

(SWIMMING POOL) RESERVE, SUNBURY.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Sunbury and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the fifteenth day of December, 1965, were reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Swimming Pool): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and

management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

- 1. No person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
 - (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
 - (d) offer any articles for sale or bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without, in either case, the consent of the Committee;
 - (e) enter the Reserve whilst suffering from any
- infectious or contagious disease;

 (f) obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed in the Reserve;
 - (g) enter the pool without first using the showers provided.
- 2. For the purpose of maintaining good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.
- 3. No person shall use any part of the Reserve for the purpose of bathing except upon payment of the fees that may from time to time be fixed by the Committee.
- 4. No person shall enter or use any bathing-box, dressing-shed, or other dressing-places authorized by the Committee under any Regulation until and unless the above-mentioned fee has been paid by him or her.
- 5. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the Reserve and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 6. The Committee shall have power to let the Reserve to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports subject to payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as provided hereinbefore in these Regulations.
- 7. No club, association, or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first being obtained.
- 8. No persons, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fees chargeable for admission.
- 9. No person shall damage any building in the Reserve or the furniture or fittings thereof.
- 10. No person shall in the Reserve, interfere with, or break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb, jump, get upon or over any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, nor roll or throw stones or other missiles. or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, or banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.
- 11. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such place or places as is or are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
- 12. No person shall, without the permission of the Committee first being obtained, sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any articles of food or drink, or any other commodity or operate any money-making concern.
- 13. Children under the age of seven years not being under the control of some competent person may be removed from the Reserve.
- 14. No person shall carry or use firearms in the Reserve. - 15. No person shall permit, allow, or suffer any horse, cow, goat, or other animal to wander or to be put or placed in the Reserve without the authority of the Committee first being obtained, and no person shall bathe any horse, or cause, suffer, or permit any dog or other animal to swim or enter the water in the Reserve.
- 16. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee to leave the same.

- 17. Any person found in a state of intoxication or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing any act of indecency in the Reserve, or refusing to obey those authorized by the Committee, or by the club, association, or persons renting or having been granted the use of the Reserve for the time being, to keep order shall be liable to be removed therefrom notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.
- these Regulations.

 18. Persons hiring or renting any stand, building erection or enclosure on the occasions of any sports, swimming or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding Forty Dollars, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.
- 19. No person shall use soap or any other preparation or cause the water within the pool to be polluted in any wav.
- 20. The Committee shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person or persons whilst within the boundaries of the Reserve.
- 21. The Committee shall have power from time to time, by resolution to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper care and management of the Reserve consistent with these Regulations.—(Rs. 8294.)

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Public Service Act 1958, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations of the Public Service (Public Service Board) tions as follows:-

PART V.--ALLOWANCES.

DIVISION IV.—OTHER ALLOWANCES.

The words "Public Works Department" in the heading to Regulation 119 are deleted.

After Regulation 118 the following heading and Regulation are inserted—

"Public Works Department

118A. A Plumber, Leading Hand or Plumber who is authorized by the Permanent Head to act on his plumber's licence by signing notices and assuming responsibility to relevant authorities shall be paid an allowance of 15c. an hour while so authorized.
