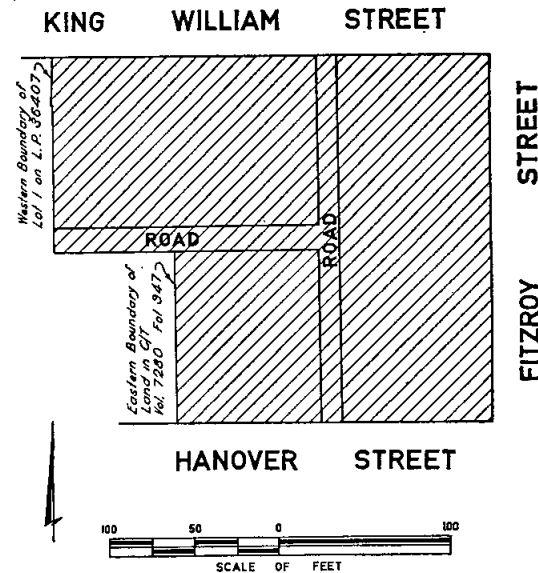

POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION NO. 124 OF THE POLICE SERVICE BOARD.

THE Police Service Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958*, hereby makes the following Determination (that is to say):—

1. The Determination No. 107 of the Police Service Board of the 15th November, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th February, 1964, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—

2. Paragraph 39 of Determination No. 107, as amended, is hereby repealed.

3. Paragraphs 40 and 41 of Determination No. 107, as amended, are hereby re-numbered 39 and 40 respectively.

4. Sub-Division IX. of Division III. of Determination No. 107, as amended, is hereby repealed, and the following Sub-Division is inserted in lieu thereof:—

“ SUB-DIVISION IX.

Time-Off, Rates of Pay and Allowances for Overtime Duty and Duty Performed on a Rest Day.

41. This Sub-Division shall not apply to—

- (a) a member above the rank of Station Officer, or except for paragraph 43, to a Detective;
- (b) recall from recreational leave to which the provisions of paragraph 40 apply; or
- (c) interruption to a meal break to which the provisions of paragraph 88 apply.

42. (1) For the purposes of this Sub-Division “overtime duty” means and includes—

- (a) any duty performed in excess of eight hours on any day, other than a rest day;
- (b) any duty performed on a rest day;

but in either case does not include any duty performed unless it was for a continuous period of not less than one half-hour.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision in this Determination, if a member performs duty which requires attendance at a Court and if—

- (a) any part of such duty is performed within eight hours of ceasing night duty, or on a rest day, such member shall be deemed to have performed a minimum of four hours overtime duty;
- (b) any part of such duty is performed not less than two hours before commencing day duty, such member shall be deemed to have performed a minimum of two hours overtime duty.

For the purposes of this sub-paragraph “night duty” means a period of rostered duty of not less than five hours performed between 9 p.m. of one day and 7 a.m. of the following day.

43. A Detective not above the rank of Sergeant shall be paid an overtime allowance at the following rate:—

	Annual Allowance.

Sub-Officers	286
First Constables and Constables	228

Such allowance shall be for duty he may perform in excess of eight hours on any day or in excess of eighty hours in any working fortnight (as the case may be) or on a rest day. It shall be cumulative upon any allowances to which he is entitled under the provisions of this Determination.

44. (1) A member appointed to a one-man Station, during the time he is acting in such appointment, shall be paid an overtime allowance at the annual rate of \$200. Such allowance shall be paid for any duty he may perform in excess of eight hours on any day or on a rest day. It shall be cumulative upon any other allowances to which he is entitled under the provisions of this Determination. The following paragraphs of this Sub-Division shall not apply to a member during the time he is in receipt of this annual allowance.

(2) (a) A member who relieves the member appointed to a one-man Station during any period of the latter member's recreational leave, or sick leave or long service leave shall for each of such periods be paid, *pro rata*, the annual allowance referred to in sub-paragraph (1) appropriate to the length of each period of such relieving duty. During any period in respect of which a relieving member receives such *pro rata* allowance the following paragraphs of this Sub-Division shall not apply to him.

(b) The provisions of part (a) of this sub-paragraph shall not apply to any period of relieving duty of less than fourteen days continuous duration.

45. The provisions of the following paragraphs of this Sub-Division shall apply only to overtime duty which either—

(a) is expressly authorized or directed by an Officer (other than a Station Officer) before it is performed; or

(b) when by reason of the exigencies of the service the prior approval of such an Officer could not be obtained, such overtime duty is approved of as soon as practicable after it was performed by such an Officer or by the Sub-Officer in charge of the Station or Branch to which the member performing the overtime duty is attached, and the approval of such Sub-Officer is confirmed by such an Officer.

46. (1) A member who performs overtime duty shall, if the exigencies of the service permit, be given time off in lieu thereof as provided in paragraph 47 hereof.

(2) If a member is not given time off in lieu of all or any of the overtime duty he has performed, as provided in paragraph 47 hereof, he shall be paid an allowance for such overtime duty in respect of which time off has not been so given calculated as hereinafter provided, at the appropriate hourly rate set out hereunder:—

(a) Such member who performs duty in excess of eight hours other than between midnight on Friday and midnight on Sunday or on any day other than a day mentioned in sub-paragraph (b) and (c) hereof, shall be paid an allowance for such duty at a rate per hour determined in accordance with the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Fortnightly Salary}}{80} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$$

(b) Such member who performs duty in excess of eight hours between midnight on Friday and midnight on Saturday, or on Easter Monday, Anzac Day or the Holidays observed in accordance with the provisions of section 67 of the *Public Service Act 1958*, so far as they relate to Australia Day, Labour Day, Queen's Birthday, Boxing Day, New Year holidays, and any holiday proclaimed by the Governor in Council as a Public Holiday for the whole of Victoria and published in the *Government Gazette*—at a rate per hour determined in accordance with the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Fortnightly Salary}}{80} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$$

(c) Such member who performs in excess of eight hours between midnight on Saturday and midnight on Sunday and on Good Friday and Christmas Day (when such does not occur on a Sunday)—at a rate per hour determined in accordance with the following formula:—

$$\frac{\text{Fortnightly Salary}}{80} \times 2$$

(3) For the purposes of this paragraph "Fortnightly salary" shall exclude all allowances, including any allowance payable under paragraph 34 hereof.

47. (1) (a) Subject to the exigencies of the service, a member shall be given an equivalent amount of time off in lieu of any overtime duty he has performed as soon as practicable after the overtime duty has been performed.

(b) A member may be given the time off due to him in one or more periods and from time to time.

(2) If at the end of any calendar month a member has not been given time off in lieu of all or any of the overtime duty performed by him during that month, subject to the exigencies of the service he shall be given that time off to which he is still entitled within the three calendar months then next ensuing.

(3) If at the end of that period of three calendar months a member has not been given all the time off in lieu of overtime duty to which he was entitled at the beginning of that period, he shall be entitled to be paid at the appropriate rate specified in sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 46 for the overtime duty he had performed during that month referred to in sub-paragraph (2) hereof and for which he has not then been given time off.

48. (1) A member who claims to be entitled to payment for overtime duty shall within fourteen days of being entitled to payment forward a claim for payment through the appropriate channels.

(2) Such claim shall be made in the form prescribed by the Chief Commissioner and shall contain the information therein required. It shall be signed by the member making the claim and by the Officer or Officers who authorized or approved of the performance of the overtime duty for which payment is claimed and by the Sub-Officer who approved of the performance of the overtime duty (as the case may be).

(3) In any case in which it is not practicable to obtain the required signature of any Officer or Sub-Officer to a claim, the Chief Commissioner may authorize payment of the claim if he is satisfied that the overtime duty was properly and necessarily performed and was directed or authorized or approved of in accordance with the requirements of this Sub-Division.

(4) In any case in which the Chief Commissioner is satisfied that it was not practicable for a member to submit his claim within the time specified in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph, the Chief Commissioner shall authorize payment of the claim if it is submitted by that member as soon as it is practicable for him to do so.

49. Notwithstanding anything in the provisions of this Sub-Division a member, not above the rank of Station Officer, who is required to perform the duties of an Officer (other than a Station Officer) and in doing so has qualified to receive higher duty pay in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 34 hereof, shall not be paid any allowance under the provisions of this Sub-Division for any duty performed during the period for which he receives the salary of the higher rank.

50. For the purposes of this Sub-Division "duty" shall include travelling from and returning to a member's Station in connexion with some specific duty, but shall not include—

- (a) Meal breaks, except as provided in paragraph 87 hereof, and any period of time off during the performance of duty;
- (b) That part of any period spent away from the member's Station during which no specific duty is performed;
- (c) Any time spent in travelling from the member's home or place of residence to the Station to which he is attached for duty or in returning therefrom to his home or place of residence;
- (d) Any time spent in travelling to another State or Territory of the Commonwealth to take up interchange duty or travelling overseas on special duty, or duty performed overseas, or in another State or in any such Territory.

51. The Chief Commissioner may require a member to keep such records, and may require such returns to be furnished, as the Chief Commissioner thinks fit for the purpose of giving effect to this Sub-Division."

5. Paragraph 90 of Determination No. 107, as amended is repealed and the following paragraphs are inserted in its stead:—

"90. (1) When a member, other than a member referred to in sub-paragraph (2) hereof, is so required to perform his duties for any period in excess of eighty hours in any working fortnight, or when the Chief Commissioner is satisfied that circumstances required such a member to perform actual duties for any period in excess of eighty hours in any working fortnight, such member shall be allowed time off in lieu thereof as soon thereafter as is practicable.

(2) Sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph shall not apply to a member to whom any of the provisions of Sub-Division IX. of Division III. apply.

90A. For the purpose of this Division "working fortnight" means a fortnight in respect of which the members salaries are paid."

THE Tallangatta Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of 4½ cents in the dollar of the net annual value of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Tallangatta Urban District.

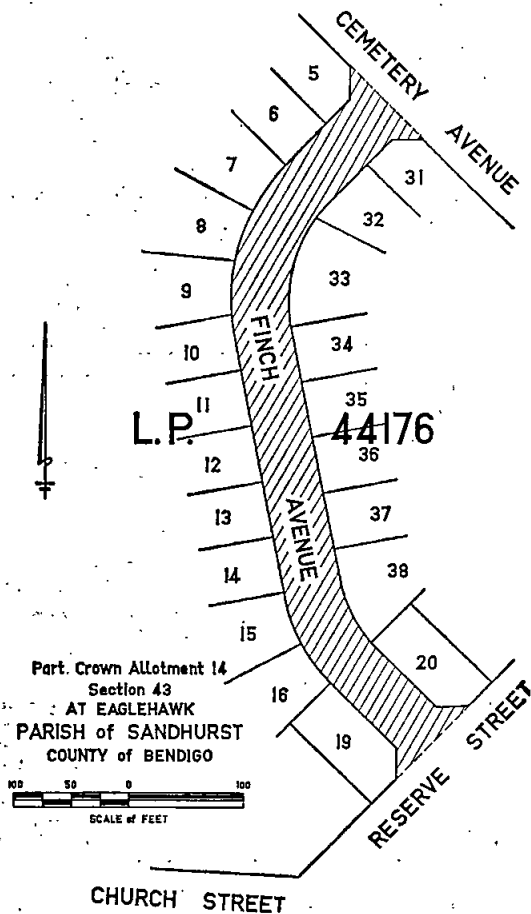

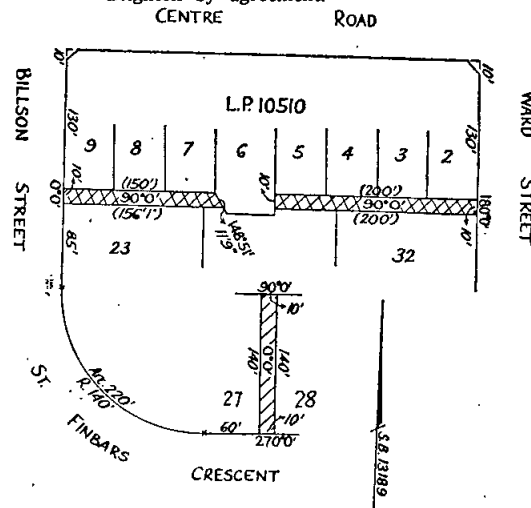

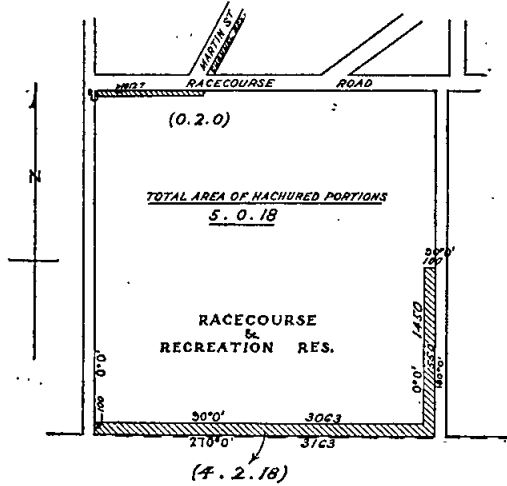

Provided, however, that the Council may, if it considers it expedient so to do permit such other persons, on application by them in writing, to borrow books from the library in cases where such other persons—

- (a) own property in the municipality of Hawthorn and do not reside in the municipality;
- (b) work in the municipality;
- (c) attend schools in the municipality;
- (d) are nominees of corporations for enrolment on the municipal rolls of the municipality.

All such other persons permitted to borrow books from the library under this clause shall furnish the Librarian with the prescribed form of guarantee signed by two ratepayers.

5. All books borrowed are to be returned within fourteen days, and all magazines borrowed are to be returned within fourteen days and in case of loss or damage the borrower or his guarantor or guarantors shall replace the book or pay to the Council the value of the book, set, or series lost or damaged within one week of the date on which the loss or damage is notified to him. The Council shall be the sole judge of the value of any book, set, or series lost or of any damage done.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clause, any borrower who does not return any book or magazine within the time specified in such clause 5 shall pay a fine of five cents per week or any portion of a week in respect of each book or magazine retained in excess of the said period.

7. No borrower shall lend any book taken from the library or exchange any book with another borrower.

8. Any borrower ceasing to use the library shall return his membership card to the Librarian and borrowers and their guarantors shall remain responsible for any book taken out in their names until the membership card shall have been cancelled.

9. Any borrower changing his residence shall forthwith notify the Librarian of such change.

10. No person shall write in or upon or mark or fold down any leaf of any book or document or deface, mutilate, or in any manner injure the same.

11. Any borrower finding any book written on or mutilated shall report the fact to the Librarian.

12. The loan of any book shall not be renewed if such book be required by another borrower.

13. The Librarian is hereby empowered to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Library, or who is not entitled for any other reason to be entrusted with books.

14. Any person taking into the library, books, magazines, and/or papers not belonging to the library, and/or any parcel or bag, must leave same at the attendant's desk until leaving the library.

15. Any person removing a book or books from the shelves for perusal shall leave such book or books on the library table for replacement in the shelves by the library attendants.

16. No person shall use any ink within the library, except by express permission of the Librarian.

17. No male person shall wear his hat within the library, except by express permission of the Librarian.

18. No person shall shift any article of furniture or any map, chart, or drawing placed in or hung upon the walls of the library or its precincts.

19. No dogs shall be taken into the library or its precincts, or any approach thereto.

20. No person shall take into the library building any bicycle or scooter or similar contrivance.

21. No person shall stand or place his feet upon any chair or table in the library.

22. No person shall smoke any tobacco or other substance or shall ignite any match or other article or thing within the library or its precincts, or any approach thereto.

23. No persons shall spit upon the floor or walls of the library, or upon any of the property of the Council therein.

24. No person shall remain or attempt to remain within the library after the appointed time for closing it.

25. No person shall enter or remain in the library who is not decently attired and cleanly in person in the opinion or judgement of the Librarian or the person for the time being in charge of the library.

26. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this Regulation may be forthwith removed from the library by the Librarian or the person for the time being in charge of the library or any officer of the Council, and such removal shall not prejudice or affect any proceedings against such person for so offending.
