MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961, SECTION 2 (1).

PROCLAMATION

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304).
DECLARING THAT TOBACCO LEAF SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE TOBACCO LEAF MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

(a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation, be divested from

the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and

(b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner, and to deal with the same:

AND WHEREAS by a proclamation made on the 20th day of December 1963 under the provisions of Section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared tobacco leaf to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS by an Order made on the 22nd April, 1964 the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to tobacco leaf and assigned to such board the name of "The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board":

NOW, THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation hereby PROVIDE AND DECLARE that on and from the thirteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, all tobacco leaf shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 be divested from the producers of tobacco leaf and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any tobacco leaf coming into existence within two (2) years from the thirteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board as the owner thereof: AND to enable The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board as owner of the above-mentioned commodity effectively, to obtain possession thereof, and to deal with the same I DO FURTHER PROVIDE that all such tobacco leaf shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

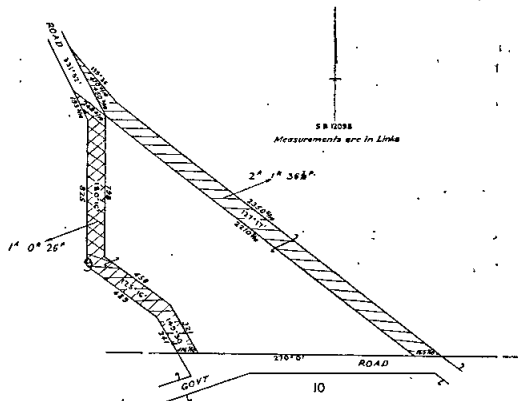

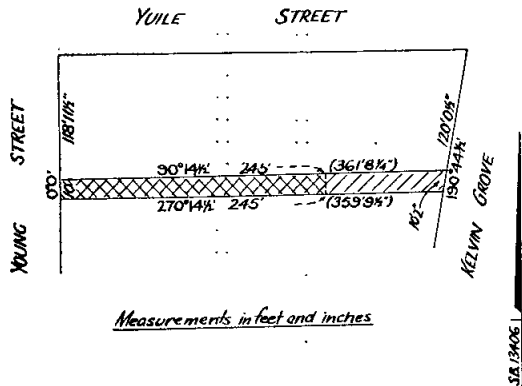
ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

WHEREAS it is provided in section 528 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, that where a road (whether or not a public highway but not being a road set out on land of the Crown) or any part thereof is not required for public use the Governor in Council on the request of the Council of the municipality in which such road is situated made not less than one month after publishing in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posting to the registered proprietor (if any) of the land and any person known to have an interest in the land notice of intention to make such request may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* direct that such road or part shall be discontinued and thereupon such road or part shall be discontinued accordingly.

And whereas the Council of the City of Camberwell has requested that a right-of-way, between Young-street and Kelvin-grove, be discontinued and not less than one month previously has published in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posted to the registered proprietor of the land in the road and to all persons known to have an interest in the said road notice of intention to make such request.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby directs:—

- (a) that the said road which is shown by hachure and cross-hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be discontinued;

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Ringwood orders as follows—

(1) This By-law shall be known as the Nuisances (suppression of noises) By-law.

(2) In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—“Instrument” means any instrument device or thing whatsoever capable of making or being used for making sound or noise and without affecting the generality of the foregoing includes any loudspeaker amplifier broadcasting set wireless receiving set television set gramophone piano guitar or other musical instrument or device whatsoever.

(3) No procession of persons or of vehicles, shall except for military or funeral purposes, parade or pass through any street without the prior consent in writing of the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk.

(4) No person shall without the prior consent in writing of the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk, in any public place cause or permit or suffer to be caused any noise:—

- (a) by shouting calling out haranguing or singing or
- (b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any instrument.

(5) No person shall in or upon any land house building or place make or cause or permit or suffer to be made or caused such a volume or amount of sound or noise as to be an annoyance or nuisance to any person being in or upon any other land house building or place or in or upon any public highway:—

- (a) by shouting calling out haranguing or singing, or
- (b) by using operating controlling sounding or playing any instrument.

(6) No person shall use any land or building or place for the operating or playing of any instrument in such a manner as to cause any objectionable noise at any unreasonable time.

(7) No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

(8) No person shall throw, place or leave upon any public highway any orange peel, banana peel, or other vegetable matter.

(9) No person shall cause permit or suffer to be emitted from any land of which he is the owner or occupier any smoke dust grit ashes or particles of solid matter the product of the combustion of any material in such quantities as to be an annoyance or nuisance to any other person in or upon any other land or any public highway.

(10) Save as is herein otherwise provided this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
