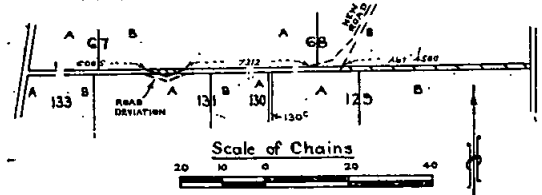
And whereas the Rural Finance and Settlement Commission, after consultation with the council of the municipality concerned, has so certified:

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of section 40 of the *Soldier Settlement Act 1958* (No. 6373), do by this my Proclamation direct that the roads, as described hereunder, be closed, that is to say:—

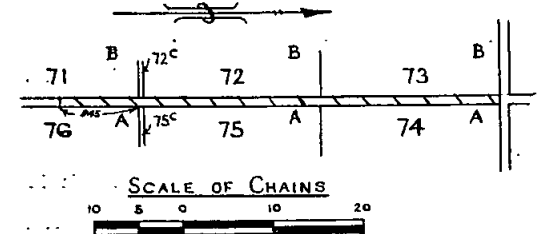

Parish of Turkeeth, County of Grenville, being the road between Allotment 133A and Allotment 134A.—(T.118 (2) (D.35806).

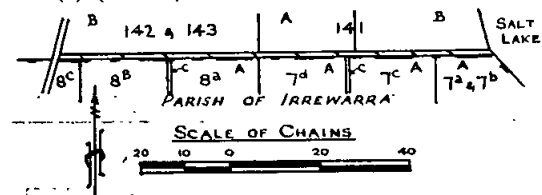
Parish of Turkeeth, County of Grenville, being the sections of road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(T.118 (2) (D.35806).

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.  
MORNINGTON PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT—PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DISTRICT".

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do hereby proclaim that as on and from the first day of July, 1966 that portion of the Mornington Peninsula Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purpose of the said Act and shall be known as Somers-Flinders Urban District.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Somers-Flinders Urban District.

1. Commencing at the south-eastern angle of the Coolorr Pre-emptive Right, parish of Bittern, county of Mornington; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said pre-emptive right to a point in line with the northern boundary of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 12225; thence generally easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of the lands on that plan of subdivision to the south-western angle of lot 75 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 56726; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundary of said lot 75 and a line in continuation thereof to the north-eastern boundary of Victoria Avenue; thence south-easterly by that avenue boundary and generally north-easterly by the western and northern boundaries of Stanmore Avenue to the north-western boundary of Alexandra Avenue; thence north-easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of lot 138 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 11951; thence south-easterly by a line and the north-eastern boundaries of the lands in lodged plan of subdivision No. 11951 and by a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary across Camp Hill Road to the western boundary of lot 2 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 63293; thence south-westerly and south-easterly by the north-western and south-western boundaries of said lot 2 and south-westerly and south-easterly by the north-western and south-western boundaries of lot 3 to the most southern angle of that lot; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundaries of said lot 3 and lot 4 to a point in line with the northern boundary of Wills Road; thence generally easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of that road and a line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of South Beach road; thence southerly by the last-mentioned road boundary to the north-western angle of lot 2 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 45190; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundary of that lot and generally southerly by the eastern boundaries of said lot 2 and lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 45190 and of lots 14, 15 and 16 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51741 to the most eastern angle of said lot 16; thence south-easterly by the north-eastern boundaries of lots 17 to 23 inclusive on lodged plan of subdivision No. 56001, of lot 1 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 62523 and a line connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence generally southerly by the eastern boundaries of said lot 1 and lot 2 and a line in continuation of the last-mentioned boundary to the shore of Western Port Bay; thence generally westerly by that shore and the left bank of Merricks Creek to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 111B2, parish of Bittern, county of Mornington; thence northerly by the western boundaries of that allotment and allotment 111B1 to a point in line with the northern boundary of Clarke Street; thence easterly by that street boundary to a point in line with the eastern boundary of lot 30 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 8846; thence southerly by a line, the eastern boundaries of said lot 30, lots 29, 28, 27, 26, 25, 24 and 23 on that plan of subdivision and a line to the most northern angle of lot 5 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 58480; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundaries of said lot 5, lots 4, 3, 2 and 1 to the most western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly by the northern boundary of a Government road to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Balnarring Beach Road; thence south-westerly by a line and generally southerly by the eastern

boundaries of Balnarring Beach Road and a line in continuation thereof to the right bank of Merricks Creek; thence generally easterly by that creek bank to a point in line with the eastern boundary of lot 3 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 28170; thence southerly by a line, the eastern boundaries of said lot 3 and lot 7 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 28171 and a line in continuation thereof to the shore of Western Port Bay; thence generally south-westerly by that shore to a point in line with the western boundary of Merricks Beach Road (Manly Beach Road); thence northerly by a line and that road boundary to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of lot 106 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 54792; thence south-easterly by a line, the northern boundaries of said lot 106, lots 104, 103, 102, 101, 100, 99, 98, 97, 96, 94, 93, 91, 90, 89, 88, 87, 86, 85, 84 and 83 and a line connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of said lot 83 to the north-eastern boundary of Palmers Hill Road; thence generally south-easterly by the north-eastern boundaries of that road to the northern boundary of Bay View Road; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of that road, of lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 51477 and a line connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of said lot 7; thence generally north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of lots 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 on said lodged plan of subdivision No. 51477 and of lots 34 and 35 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 70556 to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said lot 35, north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of lots 36 and 229 and a line connecting those boundaries, and north-westerly by the south-western boundary of lot 230 to the most western angle of that lot; thence generally northerly by the western boundaries of said lot 230, lots 231, 249 to 265 inclusive, lots 275 and 276 and lines connecting those boundaries to the south-western angle of lot 277; thence generally westerly by the southern boundaries of lots 279 to 286 inclusive to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundary of said lot 286 and a line in continuation thereof to the northern boundary of Junction Road; thence generally easterly by that road boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the western boundary of lot 64 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 11196; thence northerly by the western boundaries of said lot 64 and lot 65 and generally north-westerly by the south-western boundaries of said lot 65 and lots 66 to 72 inclusive to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned lot; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said lot 72 to the south-western boundary of Campbell Crescent; thence north-westerly, north-easterly, south-easterly, north-easterly and northerly by the south-western, north-western, north-eastern, north-western and western boundaries of that crescent to the northern boundary of High View Road; thence easterly by that road boundary to the western boundary of Balnarring Beach Road; thence northerly by the last-mentioned road boundary to the south-eastern angle of lot 241 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 12392; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of said lot 241 and lots 242 to 250 inclusive and northerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned lot to the north-western angle thereof; thence westerly by the southern boundary of Renown Road and generally north-easterly by the western boundaries of Albert Crescent and Bruce Street and the northern boundary of Strathmore Street to the south-western angle of lot 3 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 12391; thence northerly by the western boundary of said lot 3 and a line in continuation thereof to the southern boundary of lot 17 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 50715; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of said lot 17, lots 18 to 22 inclusive and a line in continuation thereof to the north-western boundary of the Red Hill to Balnarring Railway Reserve; thence north-easterly by that railway reserve boundary to the south-western boundary of Railway Road; thence north-westerly and northerly by the south-western and western boundaries of Railway Road to the southern boundary of a Government road forming the northern boundary of allotment 29, parish of Balnarring; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that road to a point in line with the western boundary of Westport Street; thence northerly by a line and that street boundary and easterly by the northern boundaries of Azure Avenue and a line connecting those boundaries to the north-western boundary of Hurley Street; thence generally north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of that street and a line in continuation of that street across Mornington Road to the south-western boundary of aforesaid allotment 111E2 parish of Bittern; thence south-easterly and easterly by the south-western and southern boundaries of that allotment to the point of commencement.

3. Commencing at the most eastern angle of lot 78 on lodged plan of subdivision No. 13907, parish of Balnarring, county of Mornington; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundary of Murray Drive and a line in continuation thereof to the north-western boundary of Griffiths Street; thence north-easterly by that street boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the north-eastern boundary of Point Leo Road; thence generally south-easterly by the north-eastern boundaries of that road, and an extension of it and a line in continuation thereof to the shore of Western Port Bay; thence generally south-westerly by that shore to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Seal Street; thence north-westerly by a line and that street boundary to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Lesley Avenue; thence generally north-easterly by a line and the north-western boundaries of that avenue to the point of commencement.

4. Commencing at the most eastern angle of allotment 62, parish of Balnarring, county of Mornington; thence north-westerly by the south-western boundary of Hastings-Flinders Road to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 101A; thence generally north-easterly by a line and the south-eastern boundaries of allotment 101A and 100 to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Nelson Street; thence south-easterly by a line, the last-mentioned street boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the shore of Western Port Bay; thence generally south-westerly by that shore to a point in line with the south-western boundary of allotment 1, section 1, township of Balnarring "Shoreham"; thence north-westerly by a line and the south-western boundaries of said allotment 1 and allotments 2 to 8 inclusive to the most western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of Flinders Road to a point due east of the intersection of the north-western boundary of that road and the western boundary of Orama Road; thence west by a line to the said intersection of those road boundaries; thence generally north-easterly by the western boundaries of Orama Road and by the western and north-western boundaries of Flinders Road to the point of commencement.

5. Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 58, section B, parish of Flinders, county of Mornington; thence northerly by the western boundary of a Government road to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 60, section B; thence easterly by a line, the last-mentioned allotment boundary, and a line in continuation thereof to the shore of Western Port Bay; thence generally southerly and generally westerly by that shore to the left bank of the Double Creek adjoining the south-western boundary of allotment 42; thence generally northerly by that creek bank to the south-western angle of allotment 54, section B; thence easterly by the southern boundaries of allotments 54 and 55, aforesaid allotment 58, and a line connecting those boundaries to the point of commencement.

The lands set out and described in the foregoing Schedule are shown on a set of 6 plans approved by the Governor in Council and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, Melbourne.—(Corr. No. 66/1137.)

#### PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

##### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street

road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Mansfield has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, used for streets, be so declared to be public highways:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Laxton Street coloured brown on Plan of Subdivision No. 40410 lodged in the Office of Titles, Goughs Crescent coloured brown on Plans of Subdivision Nos. 42416 and 43520 lodged as aforesaid and Catherine Street coloured brown on Plans of Subdivision Nos. 42416 and 55228 lodged as aforesaid shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1966.

## POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

## DETERMINATION No. 125 OF THE POLICE SERVICE BOARD.

THE Police Service Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Police Regulation Act 1958*, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

1. The Determination No. 107 of the Police Service Board of the 15th November, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th February, 1964, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—

By deleting sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 57 and substituting therefor the following sub-paragraph:—

“(3) The preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to Police Cadets. If a Police Cadet is required to live away from home and to pay a weekly amount for board and lodging in excess of one-third of his weekly salary rate, computed by reference to his annual salary, the Chief Commissioner may authorize payment of an allowance equal to one-half of the excess.

If laundry services, lunch, or tea are not provided by the proprietor of the establishment at which the Cadet boards the following charges may be added to the cost of board and lodging:—

- (a) Laundry charges not to exceed a maximum of \$1.00 per week; and
- (b) Cost of meals not to exceed a maximum of forty cents for lunch and eighty cents for tea or one dollar twenty cents for both meals on a seven day week basis.

No allowance shall be payable if the amount so determined is less than fifty cents.

The cost of board and lodging, including the items specified above, in excess of fourteen dollars per week, shall be disregarded when calculating this allowance.”

2. This Determination shall come into operation on the third day of July, 1966.

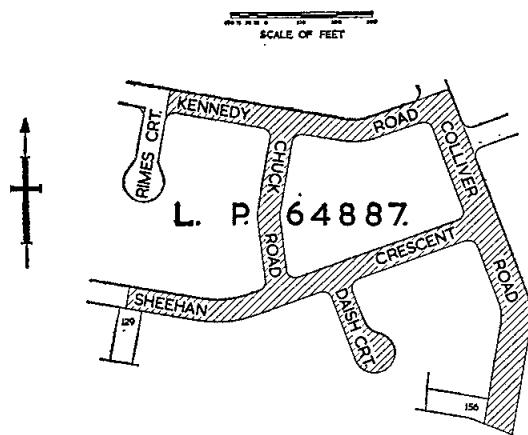

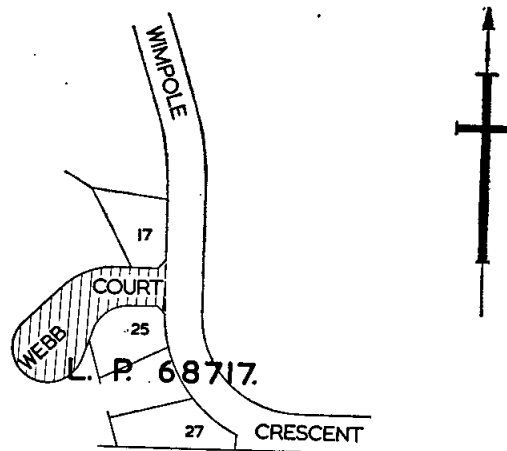

I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act 1958* (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—

- (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division fourteen of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of by-pass roads and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications extend and apply accordingly; and
- (b) sub-section (2) thereof that no by-pass road shall be widened or opened up pursuant to the said section unless the Governor in Council has by Order published in the *Government Gazette* approved such widening or opening up.

II. Section 101 of the Act provides (*inter alia*) that for the purposes of Part VII. of the Act sections nineteen to twenty-one of the Act shall so far as applicable and with such adaptations as are necessary extend and apply with respect to by-pass roads.

## III. The Board has—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of opening up a by-pass road in the Shire of Flinders under the name "Mormington Peninsula By-pass Road" by Resolution dated the sixteenth day of May, 1966, fixed an alignment for each side of the said road;
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing—
- (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said road is proposed to be made; and
- (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

IV. The Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the said land.
