MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961 SECTION 4 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, may from time to time appoint an Authority in control over any Victorian waters:

And whereas by section 4 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:


And whereas the Council of the Shire of Stawell has been proclaimed the Authority over the waters of Lake Lonsdale:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Stawell has recommended the prohibition of the use of certain specified parts of the waters of Lake Lonsdale for all classes of boating:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Boating Act 1961 do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of those parts of the waters of Lake Lonsdale specified hereunder for all classes of boating:—

- (a) All that water within five chains of the Main Bank on the west side of the Lake including the concrete retaining wall.
- (b) All that water marked by buoys within a radius of ten chains from a point on the northern shoreline due South (magnetic bearing) of the Dressing Shed at the "Sand-bar".

The areas specified in this Proclamation are those delineated on drawing No. L.L.A.1 in the Schedule hereunder.

On such lands and tenements a rate of 20 cents in the dollar on the amounts of annual municipal valuations not exceeding Fifty dollars, and five cents in the dollar on the amount of municipal valuations exceeding Fifty dollars but not exceeding one hundred and Fifty dollars and two point five cents (2.5 cents) in the dollar exceeding one Hundred and fifty dollars.

Provided that in no case shall the amount payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Ten dollars or more than Forty dollars, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than one dollar.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1966, and shall be payable on the 31st day of August, 1966, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at the charge of 20 cents per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water to be supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Ten cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the said Trust.

- 2. The Officer in charge shall exercise general supervision and control over the Cemetery and be responsible to the Trustees for its administration.

Part II.-Memorial Work.

- 3. A person desiring to carry out memorial work shall apply, in writing, to the Trustees for their permission to carry out the work enclosing with his application a plan of the proposed work (clearly showing any inscriptions).
- 4. No memorial work shall be carried out without the permission of the Trustees.
- 5. When the Trustees give a person permission to carry out memorial work, the work may be carried out only according to the plans enclosed with the application for permission.
- 6. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be
- 7. No trees or plants shall be planted in the cemetery unless their planting is approved by the Trustees and the trees and plants are planted in accordance with the terms of the approval.
- 8. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after the execution of any memorial work shall be removed immediately by the person who carried out the work and he shall repair and make good all damage caused by him to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge.

Part III.—Interments.

- 9. An application for a permit to bury a corpse shall be made at least 24 hours before the time appointed for burial and shall be made in the form contained in Schedule A to these Regulations.
- 10. No private grave shall be reopened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person holding the certificate of right of burial or his/her representatives.
- 11. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open from 7 a.m.
- 12. No person shall within the Cemetery allow any vehicle (other than a hearse) to pass along a road, a path or part of a road or path in the Cemetery.
- 13. No photographs shall be taken in the Cemetery without the written authority of the Trustees being first obtained.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE SEAL ROCKS STATE FAUNAL RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Phillip Island and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the tenth day of March, 1882, were reserved as a site for Recreation and Amusement of the People: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.
- 2. Without the consent in writing of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers, no person shall-
 - (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into, out of, or within the Reserve nor remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
 - (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
 - (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
 - (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird, other animal, or nest, or take away any skin, egg, feathers, or nests or part thereof, in or from the Reserve.
 - (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage, or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
 - (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fire-place which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber or standing tree, and with the surrounds cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet in any direction. Further no person shall leave such fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
 - (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (h) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
 - (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve. Any dog shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
 - (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird, or other wildlife.
 - (h) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed structure or equipment. Any fence, shed structure, or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parishes of Newmerella, Tildesley East, Tildesley West and Waygara and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the 11th day of September, 1963, were reserved as a site for Wildlife Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

- 2. Without the consent in writing of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers, no person shall-
 - (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into, out of, or within the Reserve or remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
 - (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthern banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
 - (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
 - (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958 the holders of current Game Licences may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.
 - (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage, or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the
 - (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fire-place which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber and with the surrounding ground cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet. Further no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
 - (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
 - (h) Deposit any rubbish, debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
 - (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting

- ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current Game Licence. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird, or other wildlife; provided that, subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958, the holder of a current Game Licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season for such ducks may use a shotgun as defined under the Game Act 1958.
- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed horse-power greater than three horse-power.
- (1) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed structure or equipment. Any fence, shed structure, or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the

Tree and Fence Height By-law.

- A By-law of the City of Nunawading made under Section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 57
 - (a) Prohibiting or regulating the use of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees shrubs or hedges within certain limits.
 - (b) Requiring the removal or lopping of such trees shrubs or hedges.
 - (c) Requiring the reduction in height of any portion of a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.
 - (d) Authorizing the Council at the expense of the owner to remove or lop certain trees shrubs or hedges and to reduce in height certain trees.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Nunawading orders as follows:—
- (1) This By-law shall be known as the Tree and Fence Height By-law.
- (2) No person shall use any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of any tree shrub or hedge abutting on any such street or road or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads if such tree shrub or hedge exceeds a height of 3 ft. 6 in. above the level of the portion of the street or road nearest to such tree shrub or hedge.

- (4) The Council may at any time by notice in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk require (within a time specified in such notice) the owner of any land to reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence upon such land and within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.
- (5) Any owner upon whom any notice under clause 3 or clause 4 hereof is served, shall comply with the require-ments of such notice within the time therein limited.
- (6) The Council may at the expense of the owner:
 - (a) Lop any tree shrub or hedge growing or being on private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads which is not lopped as required by any such notice as aforesaid.
 - (b) Reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by any such notice as aforesaid;

and the amount of any such expense as aforesaid may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
