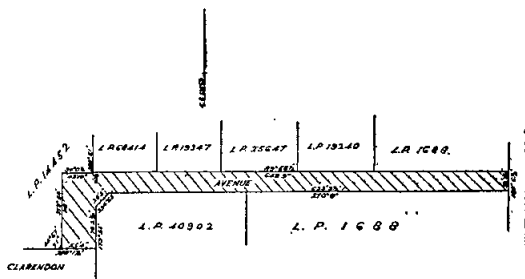

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Clarendon Avenue, Oakleigh, shown by hachure on the attached plan shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 916A of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX. of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th September, 1946, the operation of the said Part was extended to part of the municipal district of the Shire of McIvor:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of McIvor defined hereunder:

Commencing at the south-western corner of allotment 31A¹, Parish of Spring Plains; thence proceeding easterly along the southern boundary of the above allotment and its projection to the south-western corner of allotment 34, Parish of Spring Plains; thence northerly and easterly along the western and northern boundaries of the said allotment and by the projection of the latter to the south-western corner of allotment 38A²; thence northerly to the north-western corner of allotment 38A²; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments 38A², 38B, Parish of Spring Plains, and G, 1A of G; and G, Township of Mia Mia, and the projection of the latter to the south-eastern boundary of the Heathcote-Redesdale road at the most westerly angle of allotment 66, Parish of Spring Plains; thence generally north-easterly by the south-eastern boundary of the said road to a point being the most northerly angle of allotment B11J, Parish of Heathcote; thence northerly across the said road to the most southerly angle of allotment B29B, Parish of Heathcote; thence north-westerly to the most westerly angle of the said allotment B29B; thence north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of allotments B29B and B29 to the western corner of allotment B10; thence north-westerly to the most westerly angle of allotment B36B; thence generally north-easterly by the north-western boundaries of allotments B36B and B36A to the northern corner of allotment B36A; thence south-easterly and north-easterly by the boundary of the State Forest to its junction with the southern boundary of allotment 48, Parish of Heathcote; thence westerly to the most western angle of the said allotment 48; thence north-easterly by a line across the McIvor Highway to the most western angle of allotment 44, Parish of Heathcote; thence easterly by a line across the Northern Highway to the north-western angle of allotment 44A, Parish of Heathcote; thence generally northerly by the eastern boundary of the Northern Highway to the north-western angle of allotment 7 of A, Parish of Knowsley East; thence north-westerly

across the Northern Highway and generally westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 30, 5b, 60 20g and 20b, to the south-western angle of allotment 20b, Parish of Knowsley East; thence northerly to the south-western angle of allotment 21a, Parish of Knowsley East; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 21, 22, 9a, 30 and 10a, Parish of Knowsley East, and allotment 7a, Parish of Knowsley, to the eastern boundary of the McIvor Highway; thence generally north-westerly by the said boundary in a straight line across the McIvor Highway to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment 11, Parish of Knowsley; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 11 and 11a to the south-eastern corner of allotment 11a; thence westerly along the northern boundary of the Knowsley-Eppalock road to the most south-westerly angle of allotment 12a, Parish of Knowsley; thence generally south-westerly and northerly by the boundary of the State Forest to a point east of and the projection of, the northern boundary of allotment 31 and 32c, Parish of Knowsley; thence westerly by the said northern boundary to the Campaspe River; thence generally southerly along the eastern bank of the Campaspe River to the point of commencement.

And order that the said Regulation shall come into operation in the above described part of the municipal district of the Shire of McIvor on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* provided that parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 20th October, 1966, except in so far as may be necessary to enable Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 20th October, 1966.

Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1958 (No. 6317).

DECLARING THE TOWNSHIP OF BIRCHIP TO BE A MILK AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 65 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1958* it is provided that on the recommendation of the Minister, any portion of Victoria may be proclaimed a Milk Area by the Governor in Council: And whereas by paragraph (b) of section 55 of the said Act it is provided that Part II. of the said Act shall have effect as regards any Milk Area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the Milk Areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine and Port Fairy, on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture, do by this my Proclamation declare that the Township of Birchip together with the whole of the premises of each and every dairy farm or dairy outside such Township, wherever situated, from which milk is sold within such Township shall constitute a Milk Area to be called the Birchip Milk Area: And I do further declare that the 1st day of August, 1966, shall be the day on which Part II. of the said Act and Regulations and Orders made thereunder shall come into operation and be of full force and effect in such Milk Area.

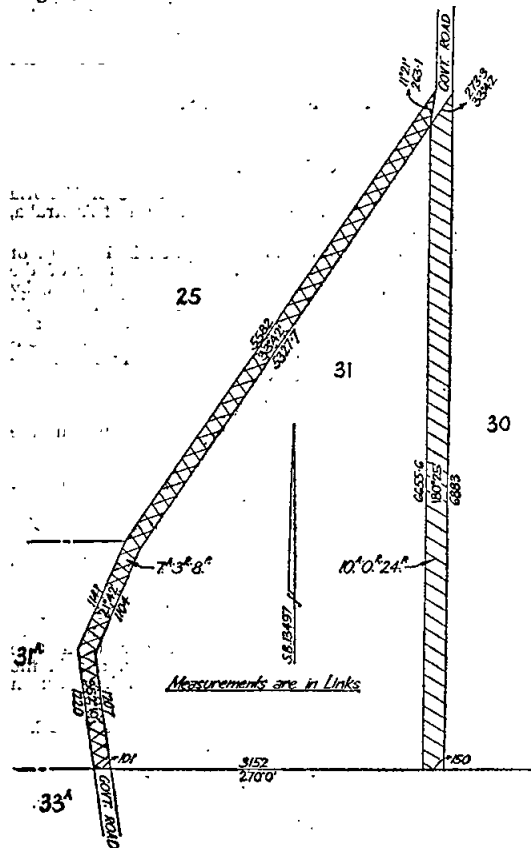

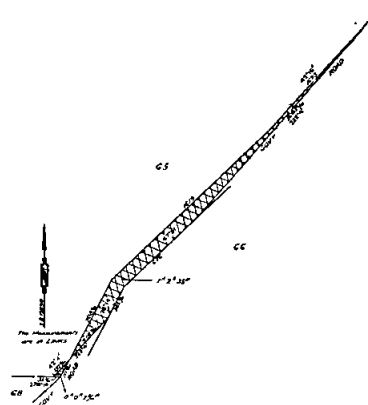

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

Shire of Altona Planning Scheme.

Altona Shopping Area.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961* and of every power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Altona, (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme on the 12th day of December, 1957, in accordance with the *Town and Country Planning Acts* then in force, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any building or works on any land within the area described in the Schedule.

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use, subdivide or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any building or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

2. Every application for a permit under the provisions of this Order shall be made on the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the Responsible Authority at Altona.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent (a) the continuance of the use of any land or of any existing buildings or works for the purposes for which such land or buildings or works were being lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order. (b) any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in a subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of Altona and lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to section 569 of the Local Government Act 1958, before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. Schedule—those portions of the Municipal District of the Shire of Altona (a) within the area bounded by Railway-street south, Bent-street, The Esplanade, Pier-street, Queen-street and Sargood-street and (b) the land facing Pier-street between Railway-street north and Civic-parade described, as lots 64 and 63 of LP 7931, and lots 238 to 245 inclusive, lots 152 and 153, and lots 226 to 235 inclusive of LP 2102.

MURRAYVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1966.

THE Murrayville Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Seventeen Cents in the dollar on the annual Municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Murrayville Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Thirteen Dollars and Fifty Cents and in respect of land on which there is no building be less than Four Dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st. day of December, 1966, and shall be payable on the 31st. day of July, 1966, at the Office of the said Trust at the Shire Hall, Ouyen.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Twenty Cents per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Twenty Cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust and where no agreement exists, is hereby fixed at Twenty Cents per 1,000 gallons and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is supplied is hereby fixed at 67,500 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust, Ouyen.

COWANGIE WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

RATING BY-LAW.

THE Council of the Shire of Walpeup, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act; doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of TWENTY FIVE CENTS in the DOLLAR on the annual Municipal value of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Cowangie Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect to any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than SIXTEEN DOLLARS, and in respect of land on which there is no building be less than FOUR DOLLARS.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st. day of October, 1965, and ending on the 30th. day of September, 1966, and shall be payable on the 21st. July, 1966, at the office of the said Council at the Shire Offices, Ouyen.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year, without further charge to any property rated by the Council, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of TWENTY FIVE CENTS per thousand gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at TWENTY FIVE CENTS per thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council and where no agreement exists is hereby fixed at TWENTY FIVE CENTS per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 30,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

(6) A fee of 2s. 6d. or 25 cents is hereby prescribed for the transfer of any registration of premises or food vending machines.

(7) This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
