PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Bank Holidays Act 1958* Thursday, the twenty-ninth day of September, 1966, shall be observed as a bank holiday throughout the municipalities mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act:

AND WHEREAS it is made to appear to the Governor in Council expedient that the said day should not be a bank holiday throughout the said municipalities:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 7 of the *Bank Holidays Act 1958*, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a bank holiday throughout the said municipalities and appoint—

THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1966, to be a bank holiday throughout the municipalities mentioned in the Second Schedule to the *Bank Holidays Act 1958*.

Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts.

SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 14 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958*, No. 6409, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specify a day being a day not less than thirty days after the publication of such proclamation from and after which any noxious weed specified in such proclamation shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in Victoria or in any part of Victoria described in the proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby specify the third day of October, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six as the day from and after which the noxious weed, *Senecio jacobaea* L.—Ragwort—shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in those parts of Victoria described in the Schedule hereunder.

SUBMISSIONS TO ENQUIRY.

1. To assess the needs of Victorian hospitals for nurses—at present and in the immediate future.
2. To relate these needs to the numbers at present available, or likely to become available in the immediate future, considering the growth of secondary education, the entrance qualifications required for training, and the other demands for the services of those in the relevant age groups.
3. To advise on the effects on metropolitan and country hospitals of the curriculum proposed by the Victorian Nursing Council, including financial implications.
4. To recommend ways in which the training needs of nurses and the service needs of hospitals may be reconciled with the least detriment to either.

("Nurses" in this context includes the various categories of trained nurses engaged in administration nursing and teaching, student nurses, nursing aides and student nursing aides, as well as any other categories that may be envisaged;
"hospitals" in the context includes public hospitals, institutions and organizations, and private hospitals.)

As an early step in undertaking its task, the Committee invites any who wish to state their views to the Committee on any of the above matters to first forward a written outline and summary of the case they wish to present to the undersigned, care of Department of Health, 295 Queen-street, Melbourne.

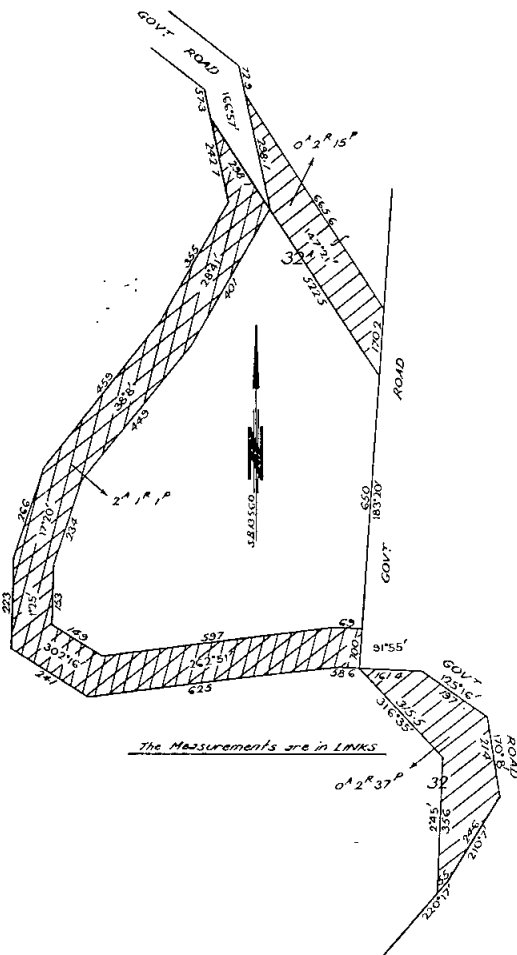

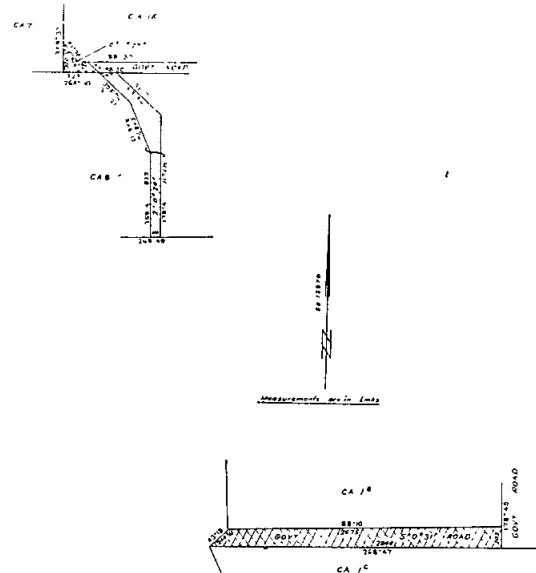

TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1966.

5. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust will be fixed by special agreement with the Trust provided that in no case shall the amount payable be less than ten dollars (\$10).

6. The charge for water supplied by measure and by special agreement shall be payable on demand at the Office of the said Trust.

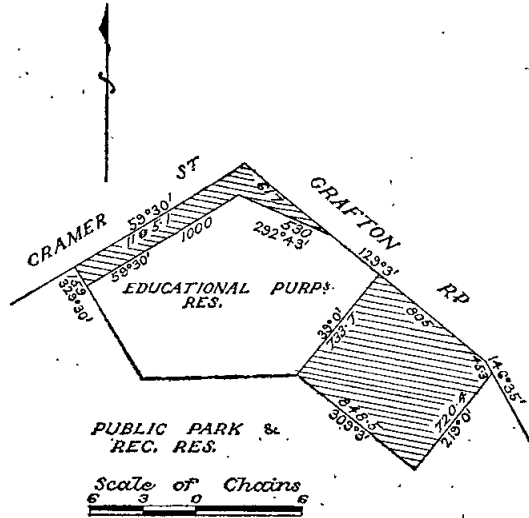
