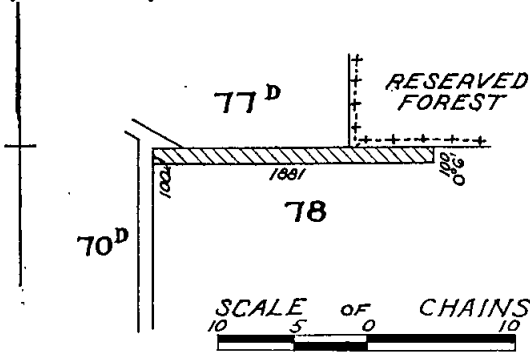

LYSERGIC ACID DIETHYLAMIDE

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

By-LAW No. 104.

Water Supply.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust pursuant to the powers conferred upon it by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958*, the *Water Act 1958* and every other power enabling it in that behalf order as follows—

PART I.

INTERPRETATION AND REPEAL.

Definitions.

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- "The Act" means the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act or any other Acts incorporated therewith.
- "Fittings" includes all appliances and things whatsoever, other than pipes, used in connection with the conveying storing or regulation of the flow of water in or derived from a main pipe or service pipe.
- "Main Pipe" means any pipe belonging to or under the control of the Trust and used for the conveying or supplying of water.
- "Person" includes a corporation or company.
- "Private Service" means and includes all pipes and fittings used in connection with the supply of water from a main pipe to a tenement and/or in connection with the use or consumption of such water in or on such tenement.
- "Proper Officer" means any employee of the Trust authorised to execute any function on behalf of the Trust.
- "Service Pipe" means any pipe (not being a main pipe) used for the conveying or supplying of water derived from a main pipe.
- "Trust" means the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust.
- "Works" means the works of or in connexion with the laying, constructing, altering, disconnecting, removing, repairing, renewing or maintaining of a private service or any part thereof.

All words used in this By-law which are also used in the Act shall have the meanings assigned to them by the Act.

Uniform Building Regulations.

2. All matters affecting the water supply to any building shall conform to the requirements of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and to this By-law, provided that any provision in this By-law shall, so far as it is or shall become invalid by reason of any provision of the Uniform Building Regulations be of no force or effect.

Repeal of By-laws.

3. By-laws Nos. 36, 65 and 84 relating to Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby revoked as from the date of coming into operation of this By-law, but nothing herein contained shall relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the said By-laws; nor abrogate or alter the power of the Trust to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; nor withdraw any permission given, nor cancel any licence granted or order made, nor invalidate any act or thing done, nor annul or stay any proceedings taken, prosecution commenced, or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-laws prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation; but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion, and all offences against any provision of the said By-laws committed before the date of this By-law coming into operation, may be prosecuted for and punished as if this By-law had not been made and passed.

PART II.

CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLY SERVICE.

Supply by Measure.

General charges.

4. Where pursuant to any Act having application to the Trust or any By-law of the Trust now or hereafter made thereunder the Trust is empowered to charge for water by measure, the amounts to be so charged for the supply of water by measure shall be as follow—

- (a) To the Geelong Harbor Trust for use in shipping other than that owned by the said Trust at the rate of fifty cents per 1,000 gallons.
- (b) For parks (but excluding areas used as football or cricket ovals or sports grounds) gardens and rockeries under municipal control at the rate of ten cents per 1,000 gallons.
- (c) For sports grounds, football and cricket ovals to which no charge for admission is made at the rate of 15 cents per 1,000 gallons provided that the minimum charge in any one year shall in no case be less than ten dollars.
- (d) For swimming pools under municipal or public control at the rate of 15 cents per 1,000 gallons for the first 500,000 gallons consumed, 5 cents per 1,000 gallons for the next 1,500,000 gallons consumed and 15 cents per 1,000 gallons for all consumption above two million gallons in any one year.
- (e) To public benevolent institutions not conducted for private profit but maintained for the charitable care of diseased, aged, infirm, incurable or delinquent persons at the rate of 15 cents per 1,000 gallons for such quantity of water consumed in any one year as shall exceed an agreed allowance free of charge.
- (f) For churches at the rate of 15 cents per 1,000 gallons provided that the minimum charge in any one year shall in no case be less than 10 dollars.
- (g) For the Victorian Railways Commissioners or the Geelong Harbor Trust Commissioners for the use of such Commissioners at the rate of 5 cents per 1,000 gallons as prescribed under Section 52 of the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act Number 6263.
- (h) In all cases other than the foregoing and those dealt with in Clause 9 herein at the rate of 20 cents per 1,000 gallons.

5. In charging the owner or occupier of any lands and tenements for water by measurement supplied thereto such owner or occupier shall be first credited as having paid an amount equal to the amount of water rate charged in respect of such lands and tenements. Allowance for Rated Premises.

6. For the purpose of calculating the amount payable for water supplied by measure a deduction of 7,000 gallons in respect of each water closet installed shall in all cases be made from the annual consumption measured; provided however that the total deduction allowed shall not in any case exceed 21,000 gallons. Allowance for Sanitary Flushing.

7. If any meter stops registering or registers incorrectly the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until it is repaired and refixed as follows— Estimation of charges.

(a) By taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month, 3 months or year or during the corresponding period of the previous year or

(b) On the basis of subsequent consumption after repair.

8. In the event of a consumer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter he may by notice in writing require the Trust to cause such meter to be removed and tested and together with such notice shall forward a sum of one dollar which if the meter be found to register correctly within a margin of 5 per centum shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing and replacing such meter and the balance if any shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register or be found to register incorrectly after allowing such margin as aforesaid such meter shall be repaired or replaced or another meter shall be placed instead of it at the cost of the Trust and the amount deposited by the consumer shall be returned to him. Testing Meters.

9. (a) *Water Supplies for Rural Purposes.*—The Trust may grant supplies of water for rural purposes to properties for which the following minimum annual charges shall be payable. Special Rates and charges.

(i) For properties exceeding 1 acre and less than 30 acres—16 dollars.

(ii) For properties exceeding 30 acres and less than 60 acres—32 dollars.

(iii) For properties exceeding 60 acres—48 dollars.

(b) *Standpipes.*—The Trust may grant supplies of water for standpipes to municipalities within its water supply area for which a charge of 20 cents per 1,000 gallons with a minimum annual charge of 10 dollars shall be payable.

(c) The Trust may grant supplies of water for road consolidation purposes for which a charge of 25 cents for each one hundred square yards of road consolidated shall be payable.

(d) The Trust may allow seals on hydrants to be removed in respect of which a charge for replacement of 3 dollars shall be payable.

(e) *Tappings.*—The following charges shall be payable in respect of tappings of the Trust's mains.

(i) Cast Iron mains of all sizes under pressure—4 dollars.

Cast Iron mains not under pressure—

3"—5 dollars 50 cents

4"—5 dollars 50 cents

6"—7 dollars

9"—9 dollars

12"—10 dollars.

(ii) Asbestos Cement mains under pressure—

4"—8 dollars

6"—8 dollars

9"—10 dollars

12"—10 dollars

Asbestos Cement mains not under pressure—

3"—5 dollars 50 cents

4"—5 dollars 50 cents

6"—7 dollars

9"—9 dollars

12"—10 dollars.

(iii) Steel mains under pressure—

6" with tapping saddle—8 dollars

9" with tapping saddle—8 dollars

6" steel plate welded—10 dollars

9" steel plate welded—10 dollars.

(iv) 1½" and 2" Galvanised mains—4 dollars.

PART III.

REGULATING LICENCES CONSTRUCTION MAINTENANCE AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO WATER SUPPLY GENERALLY.

Licences.

10. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service pipe, cock or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust unless— Unlicensed persons not to interfere with pipes or services.

(a) he is the holder of a "Working Plumber's Licence" under Trust By-law No. 97, or any other By-law, which may now or hereafter be in force within the Drainage Area relating to Sewerage, or

(b) he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred dollars (\$100).

Licences to Plumbers
expiration of.

11. Every such Licence shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year, and may be renewed, but shall be subject to review from time to time, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being adjudged by the Trust to be incompetent, or by himself or his employees committing any breach of the Water Acts or of this By-law, or being guilty of any conduct which the Trust may regard as improper. Application for a renewal of every such licence must be lodged on or before 30th November every year, along with evidence that the applicant has renewed his registration with the Plumbers and Gasfitters Board of Victoria. A minimum charge of One dollar (\$1) will be made on all applications for renewals received after 30th November each year.

12. Before any such licence shall be granted or renewed by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the By-laws of the Trust relating to Water Supply, and with the Sections of the Water Acts applicable to the Trust; but the Trust may, for any reason it so sees fit, refuse to grant or renew such licence, and shall not be bound to give any reason for such refusal.

Carrying Out of Works.

Notice before
Starting.

13. No person shall carry out any works as herein defined except urgent repairs, without giving the Trust at least two (2) days notice of his intention to do so. Notices shall be in writing and shall specify the work proposed to be done and the time when it is to be carried out. In the event of urgent repairs being required to stop waste or escape of water, notice must be sent to the Trust concurrently with, or immediately after the execution of such urgent repairs.

14. In the case of every private service containing any service pipe of one (1) inch and upwards in diameter, the notice must be accompanied by a properly dimensioned plan of the premises at which the work is to be done showing the location of all buildings and the arrangement of all pipes and fittings proposed to be laid.

Notices to be signed
by Licensed Plumber.

15. Every notice, specification and plan shall be signed by the licensed plumber actually engaged to carry out the works referred to in the notice, or by a licensed plumber employing another licensed plumber to carry out the work under his supervision.

Completion to be
reported.

16. Each licensed plumber shall report to the proper officer of the Trust the completion of any new work, extensions or repairs in connection with any service within twenty-four (24) hours of effecting same.

Carrying out of
plumbing work.

17. Every licensed plumber shall in carrying out any work of water supply—

- (a) execute the work in accordance with the provisions of the Act and any special directions or orders given or issued by the proper officer of the Trust;
- (b) execute the work in a thorough and expeditious manner to the satisfaction of the proper officer;
- (c) use materials of the description, quality, kind and standard prescribed by this By-law;
- (d) employ only competent operatives and assistants;
- (e) obtain permission, where necessary, for the execution of the work on, over or through any private property, or any street, road, park, reserve or other public place or property;
- (f) pay all fees payable to the council of a municipality for the opening of any public road or street or otherwise in connection with the works;
- (g) restore upon completion of the work any part of any public road or street to the satisfaction of the municipal council or other authority having control thereof;
- (h) except where authorised, in writing, by the owner or his agent to omit restoration, restore any other property interfered with by the work to the satisfaction of the proper officer;
- (i) take all proper and necessary precautions so that no accident, damage or unnecessary inconvenience may be directly or indirectly occasioned by the execution of the work and
- (j) exercise at all times immediate supervision over the work.

Service Pipes.

Size of Service Pipe.

18. No service pipe (other than those installed for fire-service purposes and sealed in accordance with the provisions of clause 41 of this By-law) which supplies water otherwise than by measure to any tenement shall have a bore exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ inch. No person shall connect or affix to the Trust's mains any service pipe (other than those installed for fire service purposes and sealed in accordance with the provisions of clause 41 of this By-law) which has a diameter exceeding the appropriate diameter listed in the Schedule hereunder written corresponding either to the net annual valuation of the property to be served or to the anticipated annual consumption of water at the said property as demonstrated to the satisfaction of the proper officer of the Trust and certified to under his hand, whichever is the larger—

Net Annual Valuation of Property.	Annual Consumption of Water.	Maximum Diameter of Service Pipe Allowed Inches.
Not over \$600	Not over 200,000 gallons	$\frac{3}{4}$
Over \$600 but not over \$1,200	Over 200,000 gallons but not over 500,000 gallons	1
Over \$1,200 but not over \$1,800	Over 500,000 gallons but not over 800,000 gallons	$1\frac{1}{4}$
Over \$1,800 but not over \$3,000	Over 800,000 gallons but not over 1,500,000 gallons	$1\frac{1}{2}$
Over \$3,000 but not over \$5,000	Over 1,500,000 gallons but not over 3,000,000 gallons	2

Provided however, that where the supply of water is in the opinion of the Trust insufficient to meet the normal demands of the properties in the vicinity the sizes of service pipes to be laid to connect such properties to a main pipe will be determined by the Trust irrespective of the valuations or area of such properties.

19. No person shall lay, construct, repair or alter any private service unless every service pipe forming part thereof for such portion of its length as lies in or on private property is securely clipped to a structure or is laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than twelve (12) inches below the surface of the ground. Every such service pipe for such portion of its length as lies in or on any road, street, lane or right-of-way or where it may be exposed to vehicular traffic shall be laid and constructed in such manner that the same is at all points at a depth of not less than eighteen (18) inches below the surface of the ground or at such greater depth as the Council of the Municipality having control of the said road, street, lane or right-of-way may require.

Depth of Service Pipes.

20. No person shall—

- (a) lay, construct, or alter any private service or any part thereof :
- (b) erect or construct any building, erection or structure—

Access to service pipes.

in such place, position or manner that any part of such private service is not easily accessible for the purposes of inspection, repair and renewal unless such part is comprised of copper piping and copper fittings.

21. Any person using any private service shall at all times keep same in proper repair.

Repair of Service pipes.

22. If any person refuses, neglects or delays to have any private service or any part thereof used by him properly repaired after having been required in writing, by the proper officer of the Trust so to do the Trust by its proper officers, servants or agents may enter into or upon any premises supplied by such private service or any part thereof and may where necessary repair or renew such private service or any part thereof so as to prevent the waste of water and may charge such person with the cost and expense of such repair or renewal and such cost and expense shall be a debt due by such person to the Trust.

Trust can repair Service pipe in certain circumstances.

23. Repair of existing service pipes not laid in accordance with the provision of this section will not be permitted should the repair involve the replacement of more than one pipe length of the service, and all such services must be renewed strictly in accordance with these provisions.

Renewal of Service Pipes.

24. One service pipe only shall be used for domestic supply to each tenement. No extension of private services will be permitted, and not more than one tenement shall be supplied from a single service pipe, except with the approval of the Trust.

One Service Pipe per tenement.

25. A combined or trunk service for the supply of more than one tenement may be allowed, with approval in writing from the Trust, provided it be so arranged that the supply to each tenement shall be independent of the supply to the remaining tenements and that each branch service shall be controlled by a stop cock fixed in a public thoroughfare or right-of-way. The maximum number of branch services of any of the diameters given in the table below that will be allowed from the trunk shall be as follows—

Trunk Services.

Diameter of Trunk Service Inches.	No. of 1 inch Branches only.	No. of ½ inch Branches only.	No. of ¼ inch Branches only.

1	..	2	or 5

Connections.

26. No person shall affix or connect or cause to be affixed or connected any service pipe to any main pipe without having first paid to the Trust a tapping fee as from time to time determined to cover the expense of such tapping including the stop cock and ferrule. Should a bossed thimble tapping be required or should repair, removal or replacement of the tapping subsequently become necessary, such work will be carried out by the Trust at cost to the consumer.

Tapping Fee.

27. The maximum diameter of tapping that may be taken shall be ¾ inch provided that permission for a larger tapping may be granted after application, in writing has been made to the Trust.

Size of Tappings.

28. A branch must be inserted in mains of 6" diameter and over for connections of 3" diameter and over and in mains of less than 6" diameter for connections of 2" diameter and over.

Tapping Branches.

29. The service pipe shall be connected to the main pipe with a proper stop cock ferrule which shall be opposite the tenement supplied and in one line at right angles to the main pipe to which such stop cock ferrule is fixed, unless such an arrangement is impracticable.

Connexion to Main.

30. Each water service shall be provided with two (2) high pressure screw down stop cocks, suitably protected and covered with approved cast iron boxes, where ordered. One stop cock shall be fixed to the stop cock ferrule at the main and fitted with a right angle band of copper alloy or brass. The other stop cock shall be located as follows—

Location of Stop Cocks.

- (a) Where the service pipe is in one line at right angles to the main, above ground not more than three (3) feet inside the building line in an accessible position adjacent to the meter site.
- (b) Where the service pipe is not in one line at right angles to the main, underground outside the building line in a position to be fixed by the Proper Officer.

Insulating
Couplings.

31. If required by the Trust a service must be provided with insulating couplings approved by the Trust—one of such couplings must be fixed at the stop cock ferrule on the main, and the other must be fixed at the service crossing the building line, but where a meter is fixed the coupling shall be fixed at the outlet end of the meter connections instead of at the building line.

Cross Connexions.

32. No person shall permit or suffer any fluid, solid or gas, which in the opinion of the Proper Officer of the Trust is capable of polluting water supplied by the Trust, to have means of access to any pipe in communication directly or indirectly with any main pipe of the Trust.

Where any service pipe is connected to any cistern, tank or receptacle used for the storage of water or fluid, there shall be an effective air gap at the outlet of such service pipe and the said outlet shall be not less than one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) inch above the highest possible water level in the said cistern, tank or receptacle.

*Supply of Water for Particular Purposes.*Connexions to
Steam Boilers.

33. Water supply connections to steam boilers shall be made as follows—

- (a) By direct connection from a service pipe, in which case a screw-down, high pressure stop tap with its spindle vertically upwards shall be fixed on the piping supplying water to a boiler; a vertically acting reflux valve shall be fixed between the stop-tap and the boiler and a half inch ($\frac{1}{2}$) testing ferrule or bit-tap shall be fixed between the reflux valve and the stop-tap; or
- (b) By direct connection from a service pipe together with an injected supply from a storage tank or condensate sump, in which case, in addition to the provisions of paragraph (a) hereof, the injected water to a boiler shall be taken through a separate opening in the wall of the boiler. In no circumstances shall a connection be permitted between any service pipe and the piping from a storage tank or condensate sump.

Water connections may be made through the tops or sides of steam boilers.

Pump Connexions.

34. Pumps for the purpose of increasing pressure in private services shall not be connected without approval in writing from the Trust and then only to cisterns having an effective air gap at the outlet of the service pipe from the main. No person shall fit such a pump to any service pipe communicating directly or indirectly with any main pipe of the Trust unless with the written approval of the Trust where the pump is connected to a service used solely for fire service.

Cooling Water.

35. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service or any part thereof for the supply of water for cooling purposes unless in accordance with the following requirements—

- (a) any apparatus in which water is used for cooling purposes shall be deemed to be an apparatus within the meaning of this By-law;
- (b) the use of water as aforesaid for any such apparatus shall be subject to the conditions as set out in this By-law;
- (c) No such apparatus shall be installed or used in on or in connection with any property land or tenement unless the Trust shall have first consented thereto in writing;
- (d) Applications for consent to install or use such apparatus shall state the make and type, the minimum and maximum water requirements, and any other information the Trust may require;
- (e) If water used for or in the operation of the said apparatus under full output exceeds one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) gallon per minute it shall not be run to waste unless consent in writing shall have first been obtained from the Trust;
- (f) The quantity of water run to waste shall be limited to the quantity specified in the Trust's consent. Should water in excess of the quantity so specified in the Trust's consent be run to waste the owner or occupier of the property land or tenement or other persons supplied with or using the water so supplied by the Trust who shall permit or allow such excess water to be run to waste shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law;
- (g) The water run to waste shall be recorded by a meter.

Baths.

36. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private services for the purpose of supplying water to any bath capable of containing more than one hundred (100) gallons of water, unless with the approval of the Trust.

Swimming Pools.

37. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service or any part thereof, for the supply of water to any swimming pool, unless in accordance with the following requirements—

- (a) The supply to the property shall be metered.
- (b) The use of water for any such swimming pool shall be subject to the conditions as set out in this By-law;
- (c) No swimming pool shall be installed or used on any property unless the Trust shall have first consented thereto in writing.
- (d) Application for supply of water to a swimming pool shall state the location and capacity of the pool and give details of any proposed water treatment;
- (e) The pool shall not be emptied into street channels or storm water drains unless consent of the local municipal council has first been obtained and the necessary permission in writing from the municipal council must accompany the application for supply of water.
- (f) The pool shall not be emptied into the Trust's sewer without written approval from the Trust for which a separate application must accompany the application for supply of water.
- (g) The supply to the pool shall be shut off during emptying and the time and rate of supply shall be at the discretion of the Trust;
- (h) An air disconnection to the approval of the Proper Officer shall be provided between the water supply pipe or hose filling the pool and the highest water level of the pool.
- (i) The discharge from the pool may be used for garden watering provided such watering is not carried out during any period that water restrictions are in force.
- (j) Applications shall be made for any alterations or additions to the pool.

38. (a) No person shall fix a storage tank to a service pipe unless in accordance with the following requirements—

- (i) The storage tank shall be provided with a ball tap, overflow pipe and cover.
 - (ii) The storage tank shall be fitted with a stop cock in an accessible position near ground level.
 - (iii) The supply of water to the ball tap shall be controlled by a stop tap connected to the ball-valve by a flexible copper pipe.
 - (iv) The cold water feed into a storage tank shall be at least $\frac{1}{2}$ inch above the top of the overflow from the tank.
 - (v) The overflow pipe shall be of galvanised sheet iron with soldered joints and shall be at least $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter and all other parts of such tank shall be made of approved materials.
 - (vi) The storage tank and the connections thereto shall be situate in an accessible position.
- (b) Where a storage tank is installed between the roof and the ceiling of any building there shall be fixed beneath such tank a tray constructed of approved material and with an overflow pipe of at least 2 inches in diameter constructed of galvanised sheet iron with soldered joints.

(c) An overflow pipe whether from a storage tank or from a tray or from a storage tank and a tray shall be so constructed as to discharge outside the building in which the storage tank is situate in such a manner that the discharge, if any, therefrom may be readily discernable.

39. No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private service or any part thereof for the supply of water to any automatic flushing cisterns unless in accordance with the following requirements—

- (a) A meter shall be fixed solely to record the water used by the cistern;
- (b) The automatic cistern shall be kept under inspection and maintained in proper working order at all times;
- (c) The supply to the automatic cistern shall be shut off at all times when the urinals or other fittings supplied are not made available for use;
- (d) In the event of the Trust at any time ordering the removal of the automatic cistern and its replacement by a hand operated appliance, such order shall be carried out forthwith;
- (e) An agreement in writing containing the said conditions (a) (b) (c) and (d) and such further or other conditions as may be deemed necessary in the circumstances by the Trust shall first be executed by the owner of the premises.

40. No person shall construct, lay or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with or supplies water to any urinal or water closet or any part thereof save through a cistern or tank so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously and that not more than 3 gallons can escape at one static flush.

41. (a) Private fire services comprising pipes and fittings not exceeding six (6) inches in diameter and without meters may be permitted at the expense of the owner of the premises. Every such fire service shall be sealed. Except in case of fire no person shall, without the authority of the Trust, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service and in the event of any such seal having been broken accidentally or otherwise the occupier of the tenement shall within twenty-four (24) hours thereafter give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the Trust, and shall be liable to pay for all water estimated by the Trust to have been used as a result of the seals having been broken. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of a private service except for extinguishing fires.

(b) Except as expressly provided in sub-clause (a) of this clause all portions of private services installed for fire service purposes shall comply with all provisions of this By-law.

(c) Every private fire service pipe shall be laid and fixed in a conspicuous position and shall be painted with a distinguishing coating of bright red paint which shall be maintained at all times.

(d) Any application for a fire service shall be made by the owner of the premises and, in writing, to the Trust.

(e) In the event of the owner or occupier committing any offence under the Act or any breach of this By-law or permitting or suffering any such breach or offence to be committed the Trust may by notice, in writing, to the owner withdraw permission for the private fire service and such service shall thereupon be disconnected.

Materials.

42. No person shall use any pipe or fittings in or in connection with a private service unless the same shall comply in all respects with the following specifications—

- (a) The whole of the pipes and fittings shall be of the best quality galvanised wrought-iron, copper, brass, cast iron, welded mild steel or asbestos cement, shall be sound and free from all defects and shall comply with the relevant specifications of the Standards Association of Australia where such specifications have been issued.
- (b) All pipes and pieces shall be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, clear in bore and (in case of wrought-iron piping) properly galvanised throughout and shall be of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (c) Only pipe and fittings which have been tested in accordance with the requirements of the specifications of the Standards Association of Australia will be permitted to be used for services whether inside or outside the tenement.
- (d) All ends of galvanised wrought-iron and brass pipes bends and fittings shall be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees and fittings.
- (e) All stop taps and bib-taps shall be screw-down, high pressure taps made of hard brass or gun metal.

(f) Copper piping shall comply with AS B158-1961 for copper tubes and any amendments thereto, and shall be of the following diameters and dimensions—

(h) Except with the consent of the Trust all new services of 2 inches internal diameter or under must be of brass, copper, or other materials approved by the Trust.

Meters.

Meters Supplied and Maintained by the Trust.

43. (a) Except as permitted in clause 41 of this By-law no person shall use any private service save for the supply of water solely for domestic purposes exclusive of the watering of any garden or filling of any swimming pool unless the whole of the water supplied to such private service passes through a meter.

(b) Such meters will be provided and maintained by the Trust and every person before installing a private service shall ascertain from the Trust the size of meter to be installed and shall make provision in the arrangement and construction of the private service for connection of such meter in accordance with the following requirements—

- (i) The meter shall be located within the property and not more than three (3) feet from the building line.
- (ii) The meter shall be in an easily accessible position protected from accidental damage.
- (iii) The meter shall be properly and securely affixed to such private service or service pipe by means of connections or quarter bends of brass, copper or copper alloy.
- (iv) The meter shall be fixed truly level on a solid foundation of brick, stone or concrete the top of which foundation is level with or above the surface of the ground.
- (v) All washers used for the connection couplings for meters shall be made of leather.

(c) Pending connection of the said meter the person authorised to install the service pipe shall connect a distance piece in the service pipe in place of the meter.

44. No person shall without the written consent of the Trust construct, place, stack or store or permit or suffer to be constructed, placed, stacked or stored any building, erection or thing over or upon any meter or distance piece in place of any meter connected or affixed to any private service or shall do or permit or suffer to be done any act, matter or thing whereby inspection of such meter or distance piece shall be prevented, obstructed or in any way rendered difficult or interfered with. Restriction of Access to Meter.
45. (a) The Trust may at any time replace or remove for testing any meter attached to any private service. Replacement and Testing of meter.
- (b) Any consumer may at any time request the Trust, in writing, to test any meter attached to his private service and through which water supplied to him passes and shall at the time of the delivery of such request deposit with the Trust a sum of money as from time to time determined by the Trust. The Trust shall thereupon remove and test the meter or cause the same to be tested in such manner as it thinks fit. Fees returned in certain circumstances.
- If such meter is found to be registering correctly the Trust may retain the deposit money in satisfaction of the fee for testing meter hereinbefore prescribed but if such meter is found to be registering incorrectly the deposit shall be returned to such consumer.
46. Every person ceasing to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed shall give to the Trust, in writing, at least six (6) days' notice of his intention to do so. Consumer Leaving Premises to Notify Trust.
- Misuse and Waste.*
47. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall waste the same or permit or suffer the same to run to waste. Wasting of Water.
48. No person shall take or carry away or permit or suffer any other person to take or carry away any such water from any premises supplied with water by the Trust and no person shall sell any water supplied by the Trust. Sale of Water.
49. No person other than a servant or agent of the Country Fire Authority in the execution of his duty as such servant or agent shall without written permission of the Trust open, close or otherwise interfere with any hydrant attached to any main pipe. Fire Hydrants.
50. No person other than a servant or agent of the Municipality corporation or body having the care and management of a public park, public garden or reserve for public purposes shall without the previous consent of the Trust open, close or otherwise interfere with any tap, valve or other like regulator (except a drinking fountain or other tap provided for public use) in, on or connected with any service pipe used for the supply of water to such park, garden or reserve. Taps in Parks and Reserves.
51. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, use fire plugs or hydrants attached to the Trust's mains for the purpose of watering streets or thoroughfares or for road construction purposes. Water for Road Construction Purposes and Street Watering.
- General.*
52. Any person authorised by the Trust in that behalf either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case may at all reasonable times— Inspections.
- (a) enter into or upon any premises for the purposes of inspecting and may inspect any private service or any part thereof or any works in course of execution therein or thereon; and/or
- (b) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of superintending the execution of any works in course of execution therein or thereon and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises or any person engaged in executing such works any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connection with the execution of such works;
- (c) for any such purpose as aforesaid may dig or excavate in or upon any such premises.
53. No person shall obstruct, hinder, impede, resist, oppose or refuse admission to any premises by the Proper Officer or any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Trust, or shall fail or neglect to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given by him.
54. Where the sanction, permission, authority, consent, approval, satisfaction, order, direction, opinion, indication, or notice of or from the Trust is necessary, whether special, in writing, or otherwise, with regard to any act, matter or thing mentioned in this By-law, the same may be given by and under the hand of the Secretary, or of the Engineer-in-Chief, personally, or through an inspecting officer appointed under and responsible to him, and authorised on behalf of the Trust, to prescribe any conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only the same shall be deemed to have been given. Consent etc. of Trust—how same may be given.
55. No variation from the Regulations contained in this By-law will be allowed except by the special written approval of the Trust obtained previously to the proposed variation being carried out. Variations without prior special permit.
56. Any person who commits any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars (\$100). Penalties.

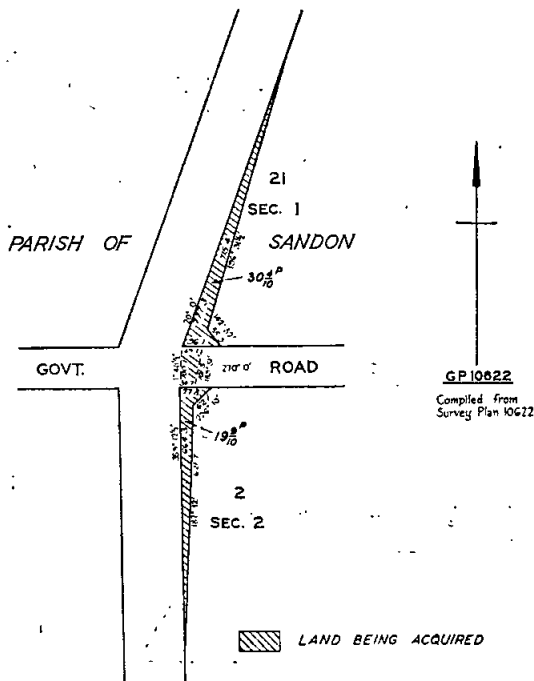

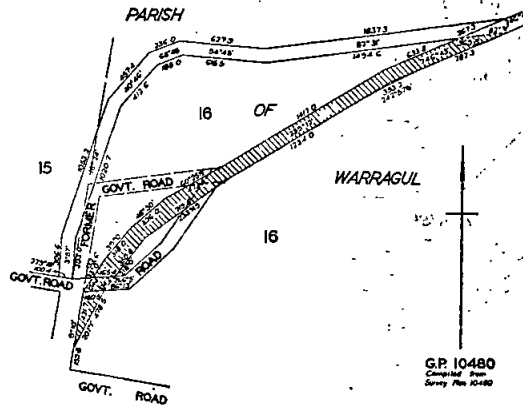

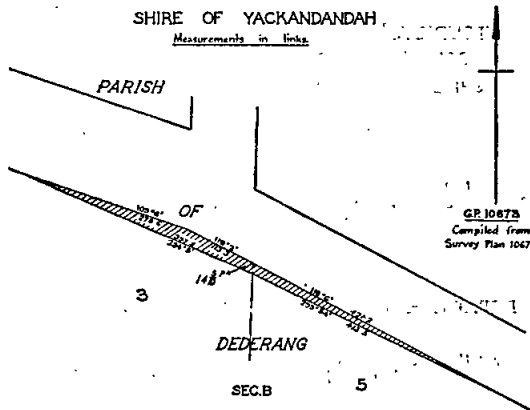
