PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mansfield has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, being streets roads lanes or passages made or laid out or pro-

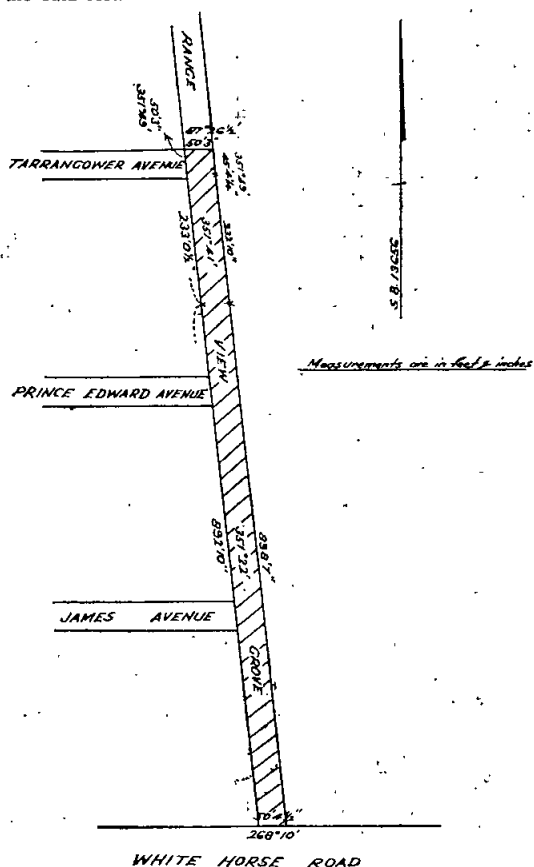

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the powers conferred by section 116HA of the Racing Act 1958 of Victoria and section 20 of the Betting (Off-course Totalizator Agency) Ordinance 1964 of the Australian Capital Territory an Agreement was made on the fifteenth day of October, 1964, between the Totalizator Agency Board of Victoria (hereinafter called the Board) and the Australian Capital Territory Totalizator Agency Board of Canberra (hereinafter called "A.C.T.A.B."):

And whereas the purport of such Agreement was contained in an Order in Council dated the twentieth day of October, 1964, published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-first day of October, 1964:

And whereas it is provided in sub-section (3) of section 116HA of the Racing Act 1958 that the provisions of the said Act relating to the application of commissions deducted by the clubs or the Board shall operate and have effect in relation to commissions attributable to any bets made through or with the Board under or pursuant to such Agreement subject to such alterations and modifications as the Governor in Council by Order published in the *Government Gazette* determines are necessary or expedient to give effect to any such Agreement:

And whereas it is expedient to further alter and modify the application of commission deducted pursuant to the provisions of the Racing Act 1958 for the purposes of such Agreement:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 116HA of the said Racing Act 1958 and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth by this Order determine that further alterations and modifications to the provisions of the said Act relating to the application of commissions deducted by the said clubs or the Board in relation to commissions attributable to any bets made through or with the Board under or pursuant to the said Agreement, which alterations and modifications are expedient to give effect to the said Agreement, shall be as follows:—

(1) For sub-sections (2) and (3) of section 116O there shall be substituted the following provision:—

"The part of the commission deducted pursuant to sub-section (1) of section 102 of this Act which the club using the totalizator is informed by the Board is derived from bets made through the Board under or pursuant to the said Agreement shall be paid by the said club to the Board within the period of fourteen days after the holding of the race-meeting and the commission so received, to the extent that it was in fact derived from bets made through the Board under, or pursuant to the said Agreement, shall be dealt with by the Board in manner following—

(a) as to two-thirteenths the Board shall pay it to the Treasurer of Victoria to be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Revenue; and

(b) as to the balance the Board shall pay it to A.C.T.A.B.

If any part of the commission so paid by the club to the Board was not in fact derived from bets made through the Board under or pursuant to the said Agreement such part shall be repaid by the Board to the said club and shall be dealt with by the said club in accordance with the provisions of sub-sections (2) and (3) of the said section 116O of the said Act."

(2) For sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 116AN there shall be substituted the following provision:—

"Such part of the commission deducted pursuant to section 116AJ of this Act as is derived from bets made through the Board under or pursuant to the said Agreement shall be dealt with by the Board within the period of fourteen days after the holding of the race-meeting at which the races selected as a daily double were run or the last of the races selected as a feature double was run (as the case may be) in the manner following—

(a) as to two-thirteenths the Board shall pay it to the Treasurer of Victoria to be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Revenue; and

(b) as to the balance the Board shall pay it to "A.C.T.A.B."

(3) For sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 116BM there shall be substituted the following provision:—

"Such part of the commission deducted pursuant to section 116AJ of this Act as is derived from bets made through the Board under or pursuant to the said Agreement shall be dealt with by the Board within the period of fourteen days from the date of the race-meeting on which the off-course totalizator was conducted under this Division in the manner following—

(a) as to two-thirteenths the Board shall pay it to the Treasurer of Victoria to be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Revenue; and

(b) as to the balance the Board shall pay it to A.C.T.A.B."

AMENDMENT TO THE REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE QUEENS PARK PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE, HEALESVILLE.

WHEREAS in pursuance of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* as then enacted the Board of Land and Works on the 1st day of July, 1964, made Regulations for the care, protection and management of certain Crown land in the Township of Healesville and described in a notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th day of July, 1964, which reserved the said land as a site for Public Recreation: And whereas the said Board was dissolved by the *Public Lands and Works Act 1964*, which provided *inter alia* that all Regulations made by the Board shall remain in force subject to the *Land Act 1958*: And whereas the Minister of Lands is now empowered to make Regulations for or with respect to the said land (hereinafter called "the Reserve") in pursuance of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*: And whereas it is expedient

that the Regulations made by the Board as aforesaid should be amended: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria do hereby rescind Regulation 10 and substitute under the same number the following Regulation.

REGULATION.

10. Persons driving motor vehicles within the Reserve shall at all times give way to pedestrians therein and shall proceed at a speed not dangerous to pedestrians or other persons using the Reserve and shall obey such speed limit signs as may be erected by the Committee from time to time.

No person shall park any motor cycle, motor car, motor bus, or other vehicle within the Reserve except at such place or places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee and any person using any such place for parking any motor cycle, motor car, motor bus, or other vehicle, shall on demand by any officer authorized by the Committee pay such parking fees as are fixed by the Committee from time to time.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE JONES BAY STATE GAME RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Broadlands and described in notices published in the *Gazettes* of the 7th day of April, 1961, 24th October, 1962 and, 10th November, 1965, were reserved as a site for Public Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

2. Without the consent, in writing, of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers, no person shall—

- (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into, out of, or within the Reserve nor remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
- (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
- (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
- (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958 the holders of current Game Licences may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.
- (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
- (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fireplace which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber and with the surrounding ground cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet. Further no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
- (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (h) Deposit any rubbish debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
- (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current Game Licence. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958 found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird, or other wildlife; provided that, subject to the provisions of the Game Act 1958, the holder of a current Game licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season for such ducks may use a shotgun as defined under the Game Act 1958.
- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed horse-power greater than three horse-power.
- (l) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed structure or equipment. Any fence, shed structure, or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.

These Regulations are made in lieu of all previous Regulations in respect of the said Reserve which are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PURPOSE (PLAYGROUND) AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE KANGAROO FLAT.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Kangaroo Flat and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the ninth day of March, 1966, were reserved as a site for Public purpose (playground) and Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following regulations.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates in or around the Reserve, nor post bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, erections, gates, fences, seats or trees, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put or bring into the reserve any dog, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
6. No person shall camp in the Reserve.
7. No person shall erect any structure therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without permission, in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or tablet or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any Regulation or notice and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.
10. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill placard, notice, works, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Committee of Management.
11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.
12. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use the playground or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or others in charge of children shall be at liberty to enter the Reserve to watch over children who are in their charge.
13. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Reserve, except for the purposes for which they are respectively provided.
14. All papers, fruit peel, and other litter shall be placed in the receptacles provided by the Committee of Management for that purpose.
15. Every person in the Reserve shall obey the lawful directions of any officer of the Committee of Management in respect of his or her conduct therein.
16. The Committee of Management shall not be liable for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Reserve.
17. Any bailiff of the Crown lands, member of the Police Force, or duly appointed officer or servant of the Committee of Management shall have the right (in addition

to any other penalty provided under these Regulations) to remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Reserve.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Sherwood as shown hachured on plan marked S/14.12.1965 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.8332 were reserved as a site for Public Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

Ramps, Tracks, Cliffs.

1. No person shall enter or leave the Reserves except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb on, or in any way damage the cliffs in the Reserves.

Dress, Conduct.

2. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserves whose dress, language or conduct is such as in the opinion of the Committee or its authorized officer, to offend against decency.

Bathing.

3. No person shall bathe from the Reserves unless wearing a bathing costume which, in the opinion of the Committee or its authorized officer, does not offend against decency.

Vehicles.

4. No person shall drive, push, pull or place on the Reserves or park or leave thereon any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, horse-drawn vehicle, water craft, trailer or other vehicle except in such places as are set aside for such purposes by the Committee, unless such person first obtains the permission, in writing, of the Committee, and no vehicle shall remain stationary within 25 yards of a children's playground.

Boats.

5. (a) No person shall launch from or bring on to the Reserves any motor boat, rowing boat, yacht or other water craft except by such means and at such places as may be specified by the Committee.

(b) Water craft left, wrecked or marooned on the foreshore, may be removed by the Committee, and the cost of such removal shall be borne by the owner.

Camping and Parking Fees.

6. The Committee may set aside portions of the Reserves as and for the purpose of camping or parking, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and using any such area.

Camping.

7. No person shall camp or park any caravan or vehicle or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserves except on such portion or portions thereof as may be specially set apart for such purpose by the Committee, and then only with the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained and on payment of such fees and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.

Persons Responsible.

8. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to use a site in a camping area shall be deemed to be the person who erected on such site any structure, tent, or shelter thereon or who parked a caravan on such site, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in such camping area in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and before vacating such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose all refuse, litter or garbage from the site.

Production of Permit.

9. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or the properly appointed servant of such Committee or any member of the Police Force, or any bailiff of Crown lands, produce such receipt or permission in writing.

Cancellation of Site.

10. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to a person to use a camping area may be cancelled or withdrawn by the Committee or its authorized officer, and subsequent to such cancellation or withdrawal a proportionate refund of any fees or charges paid in advance may be refunded and the Committee or its authorized officer, at its or his discretion, may deduct and retain from any such proportionate refund such sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clean up and put in order the site in relation to which the permission has been so cancelled or withdrawn.

Removal.

11. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove forthwith any tent, camping structure or vehicle erected or installed on any portion of the Reserves when directed to do so by the Committee or a properly appointed servant of the Committee.

Bathing Box, Boatshed, Buildings.

12. (a) No person shall erect any bathing box, shed, boat-house, or any other building, structure or erection or booth on any site on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations.

Use of Bathing Box, &c.

(b) No person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure or erection or booth for residential purposes.

Transfer or Hire.

13. The Committee may, subject to the payment of a fee prescribed by it, allow the transfer of any permit, but no person shall sublet or hire any site or structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Withdrawal of Permit.

14. The granting, withdrawal, renewal or allowance of the transfer of any permit or the subletting of any site or structure shall at all times be at the absolute discretion of the Committee.

Removal for Non-Maintenance of Structure.

15. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserves of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or booth which has been placed, erected or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

Removal for Non-Compliance with Conditions.

16. If the owner of any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or any other building, structure, or booth erected on any site on the Reserves neglects to pay to the Committee the fee payable in respect thereof, or fails to comply with conditions specified by the Committee in relation to upkeep and maintenance of such bathing-box, boathouse, building structure, or booth, then and in any such case it shall be lawful

for the Committee in such manner as it thinks fit to remove and/or dispose of such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other buildings, structure, or booth, and to recover from the proceeds of such disposal the arrears of rent and the costs and expenses of such removal or disposal.

Notice to Remove.

17. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other buildings, structure or booth erected or placed by him on any site in or on the Reserves within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last-known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the Chairman or Secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

Disposal of.

18. In the event of any such neglect or refusal as mentioned in Regulation 17 hereof continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may pull down and/or remove and/or dispose of such bathing-box, boathouse, shed or other building, structure, or booth and recover the costs and expenses of such pulling down, removal or disposal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

Deposit.

19. Any person or persons renting or hiring any stand, building, enclosure or any portion of the Reserves on the occasion of any fete, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may from time to time determine not exceeding 100 dollars by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, or enclosure or portion of the Reserves and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, enclosure or portion of the Reserves or any thing contained therein or thereon during such occupancy or hiring and may deduct the cost of making good any loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee without prejudice to any damage in excess of 100 dollars. And each and every person or persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

Missiles.

20. No person shall carry any firearms or airguns in the Reserves, and no person shall throw, fire, shoot, aim or discharge any firearms, airguns, spearguns, or other explosive substance in the Reserves without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Fauna.

21. No person shall shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any birds or native game in the Reserves.

Flora, Grass, Trees and Fixtures.

22. No person shall injure, damage or alter in any way whatsoever any trees, shrubs, grass, flora, living or dead timber, or wood or any building, fence, table, seat, post, tap, sign, light or any other structure or thing whatsoever within the Reserves without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

Signs.

23. No person shall erect or display any signs, advertising material or notices within the Reserves without the permission of the Committee, in writing.

Removal from Reserve.

24. No person shall remove from the Reserves any wood, debris, or bottles without the permission of the Committee first obtained, in writing; provided that nothing in this Regulation shall affect any right which any person would otherwise have to deal with or alter any such property the subject of private ownership.

Soil.

25. No person shall dig or remove from or take on to the Reserves any gravel, stone, shell grit, sand, loam, soil or any part or parts of the land or sea-bed within the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Plantations.

26. No persons except employees of the Committee and authorized officers of the Committee shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees shrubs or other flora.

Fires.

27. (1) No person shall, in the Reserves—

- (a) light or use fires except in fire-places provided by the Committee, or except by permission or direction of the Committee;
- (b) break glass of any kind; or
- (c) deposit or leave any bottle, glass, tin can, fruit peel, waste paper, fish, fish offal, garbage, obstacles or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.

(2) No person shall bring on to the Reserves any waste, fish offal, garbage, obstacles or litter of any kind.

Nuisance.

28. No person shall commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public in the Reserves, whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in a public or private building, tent, or other structure, or in any enclosed space in the Reserves.

Noise.

29. No person shall on any portion of the Reserves cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from any amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

Public Address.

30. No person shall take part in any public entertainment, public address or public meeting of any sort in the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Sport.

31. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserves unless by consent of the Committee.

Conveniences.

32. All persons using any conveniences provided on the Reserves by the Committee shall, on demand, pay to such Committee such fee as shall from time to time be indicated.

Use of Facilities.

33. No person shall use any electric installation or the water closets, urinals or taps in the Reserves or any portion of such water closets, urinals, or taps for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed.

34. No person other than those duly authorized to camp on the Reserves shall use any of the laundry facilities provided thereon, and no person other than a person authorized to camp or who is picnicking on or using the Reserves for swimming purposes shall use the shower facilities thereon.

Playgrounds.

35. No person above the age of fourteen years shall use or play with any of the swings, fixtures or other equipment erected or provided in any children's playground.

Sale or Hire.

36. No person shall offer for sale or for hire or distribute by way of gift any article or vehicle within the Reserves or within any structure thereon without the permission of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

Cattle.

37. No person shall bring into the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

Dogs.

38. (1) No person shall, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge—

- (a) to enter or remain in the Reserves unless such dog be and continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and unless such dog be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the Committee; or
- (b) to be brought into the Reserves for training or exercising for coursing or for any other purposes of sport.

(2) Any dog found in the Reserves otherwise than in accordance with Sub-Regulation (1) of this Regulation may be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the

owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be liable to pay compensation to the said Committee for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

39. Every person who shall fail to comply with, or commit any breach of these Regulations or any conditions determined by the Committee may be removed from the Reserves or from any place therein or directed forthwith to leave the Reserves or the said place by any member of the Committee or any properly appointed servant of the Committee or any member of the Police Force or any bailiff of Crown lands, and every person who shall fail to comply forthwith with any such directions shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

40. Every person found drunk in the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

41. No person shall—

- (i) throw or project or cause to be thrown or projected any stone or other hard substance or object in, along, across, or over any portion of the Reserve,
- (ii) play any game or take part in any activity in or on any portion of the reserve to the danger, inconvenience, or annoyance of the public or any member of the public.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LAKE CONEWARRE STATE GAME RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown Lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parishes of Conewarre and Moolap and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 28th day of February, 1962, were reserved as a site for Wildlife Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

2. Without the consent, in writing, of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers no person shall—

- (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into, out of, or within the Reserve or remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
- (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
- (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
- (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provisions of the

Game Act 1958 the holders of current Game Licences may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.

- (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
- (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fireplace which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber and with the surrounding ground cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet. Further no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
- (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (h) Deposit any rubbish debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
- (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current Game Licence. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958* found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird, or other wildlife; provided that, subject to the provisions of the *Game Act 1958*, the holder of a current Game Licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season for such ducks may use a shotgun as defined under the *Game Act 1958*.
- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed horse-power greater than three horse-power, excepting that boats with a greater horse-power may use such areas within the boundaries which are defined for such purposes:
- (l) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed structure or equipment. Any fence, shed structure, or other equipment located within the reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.

These regulations are made in lieu of all previous regulations in respect of the said reserve which are hereby revoked.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown Lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Dunkeld and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 27th day of October, 1954, were reserved as a site for Tourist Camping Purposes, together with the abutting reserved frontage to the Wannon River: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of

the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language or conduct shall remain in the Reserve.

2. No person shall climb or jump over any fence or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, seats or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure or destroy the said fences, seats or other improvements, or remove any soil therefrom.

3. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited wastepaper, bottles or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall erect any structure on the Reserve other than a tent or booth, and then only as hereinafter provided.

5. No person shall camp, or erect any tent, in or upon the Reserve, except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only by obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions, and the payment of such fees, as the Committee of Management shall determine by resolution.

6. No person shall erect a booth in the Reserve for the purpose of offering for sale any articles, nor shall any person offer for sale in the Reserve any articles without the permission, in writing, and subject to such conditions and payment of such fees fixed by the Committee of Management.

7. All persons using the conveniences provided by the Committee of Management on the Reserve shall pay such charges (if any) for the use of same as shall from time to time be fixed by the Committee of Management.

8. No person shall light fires, except in places set apart for that purpose by the Committee of Management and no refuse material shall be burned in the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee of Management, and then only in places set apart for the purpose.

9. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve, or leave thereon anything which shall or may injure any person.

10. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun or any firearm or other offensive weapon in or upon the Reserve.

11. No person shall in or upon the Reserve, kill, wound, trap or snare or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare, any bird, or native game.

12. No person shall put in or on the Reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals, or any vehicles, without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. Permission of the Committee of Management must be obtained beforehand for the holding of all organized sports, picnics, or functions of any kind in the Reserve.—(Rs.7171.)
