REWARD

NOTICE is hereby given that a reward or rewards will be paid by the Government of Victoria in accordance with the conditions set out hereunder for information leading to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons guilty of the offences of burglary with violence, rape and indecent assault on a man, his wife and daughter at Brighton on the 11th August, 1966.

The co-operation of the general public is sought with a view to establishing the identity of the person or persons responsible for these crimes.

Information may be communicated at any time of the day or night to the Officer in Charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Russell-street, Melbourne (Telephone 34-999), or to the local Officer in Charge of Police. All information will be treated as strictly confidential.

CONDITIONS.

1. The person or persons giving information leading to the apprehension and conviction of a person or persons guilty of the above-mentioned offences will receive such amount or amounts not exceeding in the aggregate \$5,000 as shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.
2. The person or persons entitled to any reward and the amount or amounts payable to such person or persons shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.
