*Land Act 1958.*

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

## POISONS ACT 1962 (No. 6889).

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Poisons Act 1962* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to such Act by adding to any such Schedules or removing therefrom any item:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, by virtue of the provisions of the said section and all other enabling powers, do by this Proclamation—

1. Amend Schedule Two to the said Act by adding thereto the following item:—

COLCHICINE in substances containing 0.5 per centum or less of Colchicine.

2. Amend Schedule Four to the said Act by removing therefrom the following item:—

MEFANAMIC ACID

and by adding thereto the following items:—

MEFENAMIC ACID

NALADIXIC ACID

3. Amend Schedule Five to the said Act by removing therefrom the following item:—

COPPER SALTS AND COMPOUNDS (both organic and inorganic) and substances containing 1 per centum or more of the equivalent of such salts and compounds, except copper carbonate, copper oxychloride, copper sulphate, cuprous oxide and substances containing copper carbonate, copper oxychloride, copper sulphate and cuprous oxide

and by adding thereto the following items:—

CHLOROPROPYLATE

COPPER SALTS AND COMPOUNDS (both organic and inorganic) and substances containing 1 per centum or more of the equivalent of such salts and compounds except the following:—copper carbonate, copper naphthenate, copper oxychloride, copper sulphate and cuprous oxide.

4. Amend Schedule Six to the said Act by removing therefrom the following items:—

ARSENICAL PREPARATIONS specifically prepared, packed and labelled for use as sheep dips or cattle dips.

PHOSPHATES, Organic; Organic Fluorophosphates; Organic Pyrophosphates; Organic Thiophosphates, except for therapeutic use,

and by adding thereto the following items:—

ARSENIC, the following:—

(a) Preparations containing 0.5 per centum or less of Arsenic.

(b) Preparations containing more than 0.5 per centum of Arsenic when specifically prepared, packed and labelled for use as sheep or cattle dips or as sheep or cattle drenches or as solutions for the treatment of foot rot.

DIMETHYL SULPHATE and preparations containing Dimethyl Sulphate except when conspicuously labelled with the words—"Warning. Highly corrosive. Avoid contact with the skin and avoid breathing the vapour."

ORGANO-PHOSPHOROUS COMPOUNDS, except for therapeutic use.

PROMETRYNE.

5. Amend Schedule Seven to the said Act by removing therefrom the following item:—

ARSENIC and substances containing more than 0.5 per centum of arsenic except arsenate of lead and except arsenical preparations specifically prepared, packed and labelled for use as sheep dips or cattle dips,

and by adding thereto the following item:—

ARSENIC and substances containing more than 0.5 per centum of Arsenic except when included in Schedule Six.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407).

DECLARING PROCLAIMED AREAS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 25 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958* (No. 6407), it is provided that where the Governor in Council is of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the planting on any land in the proclaimed area of any tree, plant or vegetable specified, and prohibit the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or from any place in the proclaimed area to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species which in his opinion may provide a host for fruit flies or any package which has or is reasonably suspected of having contained such fruit or vegetables and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly as is specified in the Proclamation: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetidae* (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare those portions of Victoria described in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be proclaimed areas.

2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the proclaimed areas to any place outside those areas or to any other place in those areas of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation or any package which has contained or is reasonably suspected of having contained such fruit or vegetables unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector or with his written permission, provided that fruit or vegetables passing through the proclaimed areas may leave the proclaimed areas without such instruction if such fruit or vegetables are completely enclosed within a fly-proof cover and the vehicle carrying such fruit or vegetables does not come to a halt within the proclaimed areas except as required by traffic regulations.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land, not being a commercial orchard, in the proclaimed areas to—

(a) Apply to all trees and plants of the kinds and species named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation one of the following treatments:—

(i) Thoroughly spray with an efficient garden spray pump the whole of the foliage with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) at intervals of not more than twenty-one (21) days commencing at the time fruit on such trees and plants has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested, or

(ii) Apply by spraying or by splashing the required quantity of solution on the foliage of trees and plants by any suitable method such as with a large paint brush dipped in an open container or from a bottle with a perforated stopper at intervals not longer than seven (7) days commencing at the time the fruit has set and continuing until one (1) month after it has been harvested to the foliage on at least three (3) different parts of each tree and to the foliage of all plants a solution consisting of two (2) ounces of tartar emetic and two and one-half (2½) pounds of white sugar in four (4) gallons of water, or a solution consisting of two (2) pounds of a 25 per cent. dispersible powder preparation of malathion and two (2) pints of protein hydrolysate

in four (4) gallons of water at the rate of six (6) fluid ounces per tree and six (6) fluid ounces per four hundred (400) square feet of planted area of such plants.

(b) Pick up from the said land before noon each day all fallen fruits of the kinds and species specified in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation, and dispose of all such fruits as prescribed in paragraph 4 (c) below.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed areas to take action as and when directed by a notice served on such occupier or owner by an Inspector and within the time specified in such notice—

(a) To remove and destroy all plants of—

Tomato (*Lycopersicum* sp.),  
Pepper (*Capsicum* sp.),  
Egg Plant (*Solanum melongena*),  
Ornamental Solanum (*Solanum* sp.),  
Rock Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Sweet Melon (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Cucumber (*Cucumis* sp.),  
Cape Gooseberry (*Physalis edulis*),  
Brambles (except cultivated varieties),  
Box thorn (*Lycium* sp.), provided that where box thorn is grown as a hedge along a boundary or dividing fence the occupier or owner may continue to so grow it on the following conditions:—

(i) that the hedge is cut back forthwith and periodically as necessary to retain it within a height not exceeding six (6) feet from the ground level and a width not exceeding two (2) feet, and

(ii) that when such a hedge has been cut back to within the foregoing dimensions, he shall thoroughly spray it forthwith to cover all parts of the plants forming the hedge with a solution containing two thousand (2,000) parts of two-four Dichloro-phenoxy-acetic acid (2-4D), or one of its derivatives to one million (1,000,000) parts of water (0.2 per cent.) and he shall spray it thereafter as often as is necessary to prevent the plants from forming fruit,

and refrain from planting such plants while this Proclamation remains in force.

(b) To remove from all trees and plants growing upon the said land and to pick up from the said land all fruits and vegetables of the kinds and species named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation, including all such fruits and vegetables which shall form on such trees and plants after the service of the said notice during such time as this Proclamation remains in force.

(c) To dispose of all such fruits and/or vegetables by boiling for fifteen (15) minutes, or burning them so as to destroy all eggs and larvae of the fruit fly or burying them under a depth of soil at least three (3) feet after having applied to the upper layer of such buried fruit or vegetables D.D.T. at the rate of not less than one-half ounce per square yard in the form of a spray containing not less than 0.2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or in the form of a dust containing not less than 2 per cent. of the pure para para isomer of D.D.T. or by otherwise treating them as an inspector may direct, in such a manner as to kill all eggs, larvae and pupae of fruit flies.

(d) To spray all trees and plants growing on the said land not being a commercial orchard with a solution containing Two thousand (2,000) parts of Dichloro-diphenyl-trichloroethane (D.D.T.) to one million parts of water (0.2 per cent.) or in the case of a commercial orchard equipped with a power spraying plant approved by an inspector, with a solution containing one thousand (1,000) parts of D.D.T. to one million parts of water (0.1 per cent.), at intervals not exceeding twenty-one (21) days during the period specified in such notice, and/or with such other solution as is specified in the said notice and at times specified therein.

- (e) To treat the soil beneath and around trees and plants known or suspected by an inspector to be infested or to have been infested with fruit fly by applying uniformly to the surface of an area or areas marked by an Inspector a dust containing 1 per cent. of the pure gamma isomer of Benzene hexachloride at the rate of not less than two (2) ounces per square yard, and/or by giving such other treatment as is specified in the said notice.
- (f) To reduce the size and height of trees and plants (except for fruit trees growing in a commercial orchard) to a size and height which will in the opinion of an inspector enable effective spraying, stripping and other treatment of such trees and plants to be carried out.

5. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed areas to give access to such land at all times to an Inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an Inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

PORTIONS OF VICTORIA DECLARED BY THIS PROCLAMATION TO BE PROCLAIMED AREAS.

A. Within the City of Shepparton in the County of Moira, commencing at the intersection of St. George's-road and Wilmot-road; thence westerly along Wilmot-road and Longstaff-street to the end of Longstaff-street; thence north-westerly along a line from the end of Longstaff-street to the Goulburn River; thence generally northerly along the Goulburn River to a point due west of Balaclava-road; thence easterly in a straight line to Balaclava-road and along Balaclava-road to Dunkirk-avenue; thence southerly along Dunkirk-avenue to Rea-street; thence easterly along Rea-street to Anzac-street; thence southerly along Anzac-street to Sutherland-avenue; thence easterly along Sutherland-avenue to Barker-avenue; thence southerly along Barker-avenue to Knight-street; thence easterly along Knight-street to Skene-street; thence southerly along Skene-street to Railway-parade; thence south-westerly along Railway-parade to High-street; thence easterly along High-street to St. George's-road; thence southerly along St. George's-road to the point of commencement.

B. In the Parish of Shepparton in the County of Moira, commencing at the intersection of Swainston-road and Central-avenue; thence southerly along Central-avenue to the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission irrigation channel known as 1/10; thence generally easterly along that channel to Connor-road; thence northerly along Connor-road to the Midland Highway and across that Highway to the south-western angle of allotment 93, section D; thence northerly along the western boundary of that allotment to Hosie-road; thence north-easterly across Hosie-road to the State Rivers and Water Supply drain known as No. 3; thence northerly and westerly along that drain to a point in allotment 49A, Parish of Shepparton, due west of Swainston-road; thence westerly to and along Swainston-road to the point of commencement.

## BY-LAW No. 61.

*Swimming Pools.*

A By-law of the Shire of Swan Hill made under the provisions of sections 197 and 756 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 61 for regulating the management and use of the municipal swimming pools at Robinvale and Manangatang and for fixing the

amounts to be charged for persons using or entering the said Pools and for providing penalties for breaches of this By-law.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts the President, Councillors and Rate-payers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—

#### DEFINITIONS.

1. Throughout this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter—

"Attendant" means the manager, lessee or person authorised in writing by Council from time to time to be in charge of the Pool.

"Council Officer" means the Shire Secretary, Shire Engineer, Shire Health Inspector and their respective deputies.

"Learners' Pool" at Robinvale means the pool of dimensions 42 feet by 30 feet.

"Main Pool" at Robinvale means the pool of dimensions 110 feet by 42 feet and at Manangatang the pool of dimensions 82 feet 6 inches by 36 feet.

"Pool" means and includes any Pool erected or provided by the Council within the premises for the purpose of providing a place for bathers to swim, wade or dive.

"Premises" means and includes the whole of the area fenced and used for the purposes of and incidental to the Pools erected thereon at Manangatang and Robinvale.

"Wading Pool" at Robinvale means the 42 feet diameter semi-circular pool and at Manangatang the 36 feet diameter semi-circular pool.

#### ADMISSION.

2. The Pool shall be open to the public during such periods and such hours as the Council shall from time to time by resolution fix.

3. Admission to the premises shall be obtained by purchasing a season ticket or paying the appropriate charge which the Council by special order from time to time shall fix.

4. No season ticket shall be transferable and any holder of such ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and all the rights and privileges given by such ticket.

5. No person shall enter the premises unless the attendant is present.

6. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter the premises unless in the opinion of the attendant such child is in the care of a responsible person.

#### CONDUCT.

7. Every person using the premises shall be properly attired in a bathing costume so as to preserve public decency and the decision of a Council Officer or the Attendant shall be final in this regard.

8. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume in any part of the premises open to public view.

9. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the Pool, on any lawns, in the dressing rooms, in entrances, on walls or any sealed surface within the premises.

10. No person shall spit, spout water or blow his or her nose in any Swimming Pool.

11. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to remain in the premises.

12. No person shall within the premises mis-conduct himself or herself, commit a nuisance, bring rubbish, filth or other offensive matter or deposit any rubbish therein nor leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes or litter except in receptacles provided for such purpose.

13. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the premises or roll or throw stones into the Pool.

14. No person not authorised by the attendant shall climb or attempt to climb over onto or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fence, roof, building or other structure within the premises.

15. No person other than a person authorised in writing by the Council shall hawk, sell or offer for sale in the baths any goods or articles.

16. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the premises.

17. No person using the premises shall at any time bring or introduce into the premises or any part thereof, spiritous or other intoxicating liquors.

18. No person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

19. No person shall use the Pool whilst in an uncleanly condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and any such person shall retire from the Pool upon being requested so to do by the attendant.

20. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the Pool or the shower baths or wilfully or improperly soil or defile the toilet facilities, dressing rooms or any part of the premises or any furniture or article thereon.

21. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting in connection with the Pool nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture, fitting or other article supplied for use in the Pool or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other parts of the premises.

22. No person shall at any time while being in or upon the premises use indecent or offensive language nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

23. No person shall occupy the shower baths for an unreasonable time.

24. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the premises by any other person and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths when required to do so by the attendant.

25. For the purpose of maintaining good order the attendant may refuse admission to any person.

26. No person shall use or interfere with any life-saving appliance in the premises unless legitimately for the purpose of rendering assistance to another person.

27. No person shall use any soap or other substance or preparation in any place or manner in the premises whereby any water in the Pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for use of bathers.

28. No person shall introduce into the main pool or learners' pool, beach balls, tennis balls, motor tubes, inflated rubber, plastic articles or any other similar articles but toddlers may be permitted at the discretion of the attendant to introduce toys into the wading pool. This shall not preclude the introduction into the Pool with the consent of the attendant of any article being legitimately used by any person for the purpose of assistance in learning to swim.

29. No person shall be in possession of any bottle or glass within ten feet of the pool.

30. No person shall bring any bicycle into the premises.

31. No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play within the premises.

32. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the attendant or Council officer in the performance of his or her duty thereat.

33. No boy or girl under the age of ten years who is unable to swim shall use the main pool without the permission of the attendant unless accompanied by an adult.

34. No man or boy shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

35. No woman or girl shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.

36. No person over the age of six years shall use the wading pool.

37. Running jumps and running dives from the side of the pool into the pool are prohibited. Jumping from diving boards is also prohibited.

38. No person shall, for fee or reward, instruct or coach any person in the pool unless authorised in writing as a professional coach by the Council.

39. No person shall remain in any part of the pool or premises when in the opinion of the attendant such presence hinders the effective management of the pool or premises and when requested so to do by the attendant such person shall forthwith vacate such part of the pool or premises.

## CARNIVALS.

40. The Council reserves the right to permit any person or persons or organization to use the premises or any part thereof for carnivals, gala, entertainment or other purposes for such time and upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit and on such occasions—

- (a) The charges fixed by the Council for admission to the premises shall be suspended.
- (b) Season tickets issued by the Council shall not be used or availed of for attendance or entrance to the premises.
- (c) Entire responsibility for the conduct of such carnival, gala, entertainment or other purposes as aforesaid shall be assumed by the persons or organization permitted to use the premises.
- (d) Neither the Council nor its officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for any article deposited with any person in charge of or in any way connected with any such carnival, gala, entertainment or other purpose.
- (e) Neither the Council nor any of its officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for any injury to or any loss or damage sustained by any person during the time of any such carnival, gala, entertainment or other purpose.

## PROPERTY.

41. Neither the Council nor any officer, employee or agent of the Council shall be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person admitted to the premises.

42. Any person finding any article in or on the premises, shall immediately thereafter deliver the same to the attendant who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in a book to be kept for that purpose and upon any person claiming such article, giving satisfactory proof of loss, the attendant shall deliver the same to such last-mentioned person after entering the name and address of that person in the same book and obtaining his or her signature therefor.

43. Any person may deposit with the attendant any articles for safe keeping and the attendant receiving the article shall thereupon give to the person so depositing the article a ticket or token as a receipt therefor. On presentation of such ticket or token the attendant may deliver the article to the person presenting the same notwithstanding that such person may not be the person who deposited the article; provided however that the Council or any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any article deposited as aforesaid and not claimed within three calendar months from the date of such depositing without being liable in any way to the owner or depositor of such article by reason of such sale or disposition.

44. Any attendant receiving any article deposited as aforesaid shall take reasonable steps to ensure the safe keeping of such article but neither the Council nor any attendant exercising such reasonable care shall be answerable to any person for the loss, theft or destruction of or any damage to any article deposited as aforesaid.

## OFFENCES.

45. The attendant may require any person offending against any part of this By-law (but without prejudice to the imposition of any penalty in respect of such offence) to leave the premises and may cause such person to be ejected therefrom if he fails to leave forthwith.

46. The attendant may temporarily suspend admittance and/or clear the premises or any part thereof of any person or persons who fail to comply with any provisions of this By-law.

47. Any person wilfully offending against any provision of this By-law shall for every such offence upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 (\$40).

## OPERATION.

48. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
