





If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.























REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "DEVIL'S KITCHEN" RECREATION RESERVE, CLARKESDALE.

WHEREAS by Section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And WHEREAS certain Crown lands in the Parish of Clarkesdale and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 27th day of September, 1966 were reserved as a site for Public Recreation: And WHEREAS such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And WHEREAS it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person in the Reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency or offence against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
2. No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
3. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun or any firearm, or any shanghai, catapult or other offensive weapon in or upon the Reserve.
4. No person shall in or upon the Reserve, kill, wound, trap or snare, or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare, any bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or have any dead bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or the skin or pelt thereof, in his possession.
5. No person shall in or upon the Reserve cut down, ringbark, destroy or damage any tree or plant growing thereon.
6. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no person shall leave any fire which has been lighted by him until the same shall have been thoroughly extinguished. No refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee, and then only in a place set apart for that purpose.
7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
8. No person shall erect any tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee or its representative, and any such tent, booth, stand, buildings, or other structure may be erected only on the site allotted by the Committee or its representative.
9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
10. The Committee shall have power, from time to time, by Resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for the use of the Reserve.
11. A charge fixed by the Committee, may be made for the admission of any car or vehicle to the Reserve.
12. The Committee shall have power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.
13. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.—(Rs.8623.)

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Yea, Parish of Yea and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the tenth day of August, 1966, were reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Swimming Pool): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) with power and authority to enforce the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Every person within the Reserve shall wear suitable bathing costume and no person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume, in any part of the Reserve open to public view.
2. No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to enter or to remain within the Reserve.
3. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance in the Reserve.
4. No person shall bring any rubbish or offensive matter into the Reserve, and no person shall deposit any rubbish therein unless it is deposited in a receptacle provided for the purpose.
5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the reserve, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve.
6. No person shall without the permission in writing of the Committee, hawk, sell or offer for sale, in the Reserve, any goods or articles.
7. No person shall damage or remove any placard or noticeboard within the Reserve.
8. No person shall bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve, and no person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in the state of intoxication.
9. No person shall enter the Reserve whilst in an unclean condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease, and any such person shall retire from the Reserve immediately upon being requested to do so by any attendant on duty in the Reserve.
10. No person shall enter the Swimming Pool within the Reserve until he or she has first used the showers provided.
11. No person shall expectorate within the Reserve or improperly foul or pollute the water in the baths, or shower-baths, or wilfully or improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume, or any bathroom, dressing room closet, box or compartment or any part of the baths, within the Reserve.
12. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting within the Reserve, nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture or fitting, towel or other article supplied for use in the baths, or write upon, or deface, the walls, or partitions or any part of the baths, within the Reserve.
13. No person shall at any time within the Reserve use indecent or offensive language nor behave in an indecent manner nor offensive manner.
14. Any person finding any article in the Reserve, shall immediately thereafter deliver same to one of the attendants in charge, who shall thereupon register a description of same, and all particulars relating thereto, in the book kept for the purpose and any owner losing such article shall upon, giving satisfactory proof thereof, receive such article from the attendant in charge upon entering his or her signature and address, and signing a receipt for the article in such book referred to.
15. The Committee shall not be responsible for any article lost or stolen from any person whilst in the Reserve.
16. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the Reserve by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behave in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the reserve when required to do so by any attendant in charge of the Reserve.
17. No man or boy above the age of six years shall either use any dressing-rooms, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.
18. No woman or girl shall enter or use any dressing-room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy, or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.
19. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the attendant or person in charge of the Reserve may refuse admission to any person.
20. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the attendant, or any person employed within the Reserve or any officer of the Committee in the performance of his or her duty.
21. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any ball or substance of any kind within the Reserve.
22. No person shall run or take part in any game or activity to the danger, inconvenience or annoyance of any other person.
23. No person shall bring into the reserve any diving stand apparatus, spear fishing gun, boat, tin, drum or structure without the consent of the Committee.
24. No person shall light any fire or burn any material or discharge any firearm, airgun, explosive cracker or fireworks in the reserve.
25. The Committee shall have the power from time to time to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for admission to the Reserve, and the times which the Reserve shall be open to the public.
26. No club, association or person shall, without written authority of the Committee hold any entertainment, performance, sports or ceremony in any part of the Reserve.
27. The Committee shall have the power to let the reserve to any club, association or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances or sports subject to the payment of such fees, and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and to authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for the admission thereto.
28. The Committee shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person whilst within the Reserve.

THE Public Service of Papua and New Guinea is seeking a wide range of professional officers to help in the development of the Territory's primary industries.

Entomologists.

Class I.—\$3,975—\$5,373 per annum.  
Class II.—\$5,581—\$6,221 per annum.  
Class III.—\$6,431—\$7,051 per annum.

Qualifications.—Degree in Science or Agricultural Science with a major in Entomology. Classification will depend on relevant post-graduate research or experience.

Duties.—Carry out field and bionomic studies of economic insects, and experiment with chemical and biological control. Opportunity to collect, catalogue and carry out taxonomic studies with specified insect groups and to make field surveys of distribution.

Parasitologists.

Qualifications.—Degree in Science or Agricultural Science with a major in Parasitology. Class II applicants must have at least five years' post-graduate field experience. The position is in the Veterinary Research Section of the Division of Animal Industry.

The Parasitologist is responsible for providing a parasitological diagnostic service for the pastoral industry in the Territory, and for carrying out research. Problems of particular importance to the Territory are the cattle tick (*Boophilus microplus*) the screw-worm fly (*Chrysomya bezzians*) and the various helminth parasites of domestic animals. In the third group one of the main investigations is into the distribution of the liver fluke (*Fasciola hepatica*) and its control and/or ultimate eradication. Investigations into the screw-worm fly problem are of great importance to the Territory, also to Australia for this parasite does not occur here. A full knowledge of the bionomics of the fly is necessary both for its control in the Territory and for the forming of possible eradication methods, should it gain entry to Australia. As far as the cattle tick is concerned, it would seem that Papua and New Guinea has been the only truly tropical country that has had any success in attempts at eradication. The extension of this eradication programme to all the Territory is the ultimate aim. The Parasitologist will play an important part in this tick eradication programme through his research into the parasite at the Central Veterinary Laboratory at Kila Kila, 3 miles from Port Moresby.

Agronomists.

Class I.—\$3,975—\$5,373 per annum.  
Class II.—\$5,581—\$6,221 per annum.

Qualifications.—Degree in Agricultural Science, preferably with major in agronomy. For Class II, experience in crop breeding and selection necessary.

Duties.—

Class I.—Crop improvement by introduction, selection and controlled hybridization plus agronomic trials, including fertilizer, cultural and management trials often in co-operation with the specialist sections such as Plant Pathology, Entomology, and Agricultural Chemistry. Most Territory crops are perennials, but annual crops such as rice and peanuts are also under investigation. There is also a developing programme of pasture research.

Class II.—Agronomic investigations in a specific field of agronomy in a particular geographic or environmental region. Control and implement breeding and selection programmes with particular crops or pastures. Investigate agronomic techniques with specific crops or cropping systems. Carry out plant nutrition studies. Plant Pathologist.

The Class I. Officer is required to carry out service and research work on *Rhizobium* in the laboratory and the field. The higher positions will require more specialising in a particular field. Officers will be required to train and supervise indigenous technical staff. Generally, officers will have their headquarters at Port Moresby or at the Keravat Experimental Station in New Britain but may be required to work in the field anywhere in the Territory.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where definite quantities are specified, the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule; but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule, the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated, in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The contractor must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purpose of this contract, the Melbourne District, will include a radius of 12 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway stations as required.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.
