By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c. WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—



#### Cemeteries Act 1958. WANGARATTA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

#### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Cemeteries Act 1958, the Trustees of the Wangaratta Public Cemetery do hereby revoke all previous Regulations and scale of fees and make the following Regulations and scale of fees, which shall come into operation upon publication in the Government Gazette:—

#### Part One-General.

- 1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—
  - "Cemetery" means the Wangaratta Public Cemetery. "Memorial work" means manual work (including the writing of inscriptions) in connexion with any building, tomb, vault, tombstone, kerbing or other structure erected or placed on or in any place of
  - " Trustees " ustees" means the Trustees of the Wangaratta Public Cemetery.
- 2. The Officer in Charge shall exercise general supervision and control over the Cemetery and be responsible to the Trustees for its administration. He shall be present at the Cemetery between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive (Public Holidays excepted) to carry out such work and to receive orders on behalf of the Trustees.
- 3. A person who carries out work within the Cemetery, whether or not he is carrying out the work for the Trustees, shall carry out the work in as short a time as is possible and shall obey directions given to him by the Officer in Charge or other authorized employee relating to the carrying out of the work or to any other matter arising out of the carrying out of the work.
- 4. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 5. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in the Cemetery unless the planting is approved by the Trustees and the trees and shrubs are planted in accordance with the terms of the approval.
- 6. No person shall cause or allow any animal or vehicle (other than a hearse or authorized vehicle) to pass along a road, path or part of a road or path in the Cemetery.
  - 7. No person shall within the Cemetery-
    - (a) Put any animal or animals for the purpose of grazing except with the consent, in writing of the Trustees.
  - (b) Wilfully damage or destroy any flowers or other tokens placed upon any graves.
- 8. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7.00 a.m. to Sunset daily throughout the

### Part Two-Memorial Work

- 9. A person desiring to carry out memorial work shall apply in writing to the Trustees, for their permission to carry out the work enclosing with his application a plan of the proposed work (clearly showing any inscriptions).
- 10. No memorial work shall be carried out without the permission of the Trustees
- 11. When the Trustees give a person permission to carry out memorial work, the work may be carried out only according to the plans enclosed with the application for permission.
- 12. The name of the monumental mason shall be restricted to a plaque not more than 3 inches long by 2 inches wide and any other writing whatsoever, except the approved inscription, shall not be allowed to be upon the monument or any part thereof.
- 13. A person who has carried out any memorial work otherwise than in accordance with the plan enclosed with his application for the permission of the Trustees to his carrying out of the work, shall if required to do so by the Trustees, have the structures altered so as to accord with the plan. with the plan.
- 14. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after the execution of any memorial work shall be removed immediately by the person who carried out the work and he shall repair and make good, all damage caused by him to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge.
- 15. When a person proposes digging or making a grave or vault or carrying out memorial work in a Cemetery, he shall produce the document evidencing the permission of the Trustees for his digging or making that grave or vault or carrying out that work to the Officer in Charge before beginning the work or delivering the materials or equipment within the Cemetery (as the case may be).

- 16. The only type of memorial permitted on a grave in the Lawn Section shall be of marble, granite or other material approved by the Trust with maximum height 2 ft. 8 in. above the ground level with base measuring not more than 2 ft. 6 in. long by 15 in. wide by 8 in. high.
- 17. The only type of memorial permitted on a child's grave in the Lawn Section shall be of marble, granite or other material approved by the Trust with maximum height of 30 inches being not more than 15 inches wide and not more than 4 inches thick.
- 18. The Trustees will provide at no cost to the person making application for burial, flower containers for use in the Lawn Section. No person is permitted to use a container other than that provided.
- 19. All flowers, wreaths, &c., remaining on any grave in the Lawn Section seven days after the date of burial shall be removed by the Officer in Charge with the exception of those placed in containers provided by the
- 20. The Trustees may order the removal or alteration of any monument, tomb, tablet, gravestone, vault, railing or other erection, or the erasure of any inscription, which has been erected or placed in the burial ground in contravention of the foregoing Regulations.

#### Part Three-Interments.

- 21. An application for a permit to bury a corpse shall be made at least eight working hours before the time appointed for burial and shall be made in the form contained in Schedule B to these Regulations.
- 22. The Trustees shall divide the burial ground into 22. The Trustees snall divide the burial ground into sections, and shall allot graves within the sections and shall cause a plan to be made showing the sections and graves of the burial ground and shall sign and certify the plan when made. The plan or a copy thereof shall be kept for reference in the Office of the Officer in Charge.
- 23. The Trustees shall cause a Register to be kept, in 23. The Trustees shall cause a Register to be kept, in which shall be entered the name and former address of every person whose body is interred in the burial ground and the section and number of the grave in which the interment has been made, and the date of the interment. The entry shall be made as soon as possible after each interment.
- 24. Two persons only shall be interred in any one grave ccept where under special circumstances the permission of the Trustees has been obtained.
  - 25. The grave allotments shall be as follows:-
    - (i) General Cemetery: 8 feet long and 4 feet wide.
    - (ii) Lawn Section: 10 feet long and 4 feet wide.
  - (iii) Children's Lawn Section-

    - 6 feet long by 4 feet wide (8-12 years),

- 26. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug.

28. Plots of ground in the Lawn Section shall be allotted in rotation and be restricted to two plots per application and provided that one is needed for immediate use for burial, the other may be reserved but at the same time as the former

# Police Regulation Act 1958. POLICE FORCE OF VICTORIA.

DETERMINATION No. 136 of the Police Service Board.

THE Police Service Board, in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Police Regulation Act 1958, hereby makes the following Determination, that is to say:—

- 1. The Determination No. 107 of the Police Service Board of the 15th November, 1963, and published in the Government Gazette of the 4th February, 1964, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—
  - (a) In paragraph 23-

By adding to paragraph 23 (b) the following paragraph:—
"Where a member is called upon during this period to commence National Service Training for a continuous period of not less than twelve months, the purchase of this uniform may be deferred until he resumes Police duty. A member shall not be entitled to reimbursement under this paragraph after a period of six months from the date of his resumption or if he claims reimbursement under paragraph 24 (b)."

(b) In paragraph 24-

By renumbering the existing paragraph as sub-paragraph 24 (a) and inserting thereafter the following sub-paragraph:—

"(b) Where a member resumes duty after having served for not less than twelve months as a National Service Trainee, he shall be entitled, within six months from the date of so resuming to reimbursement of the cost of purchasing items of uniform clothing not exceeding \$20 and reimbursement of the cost of altering not more than two uniforms upon the Sub-Officer under whom he is serving certifying the account and that the alterations were necessary."

(c) In paragraph 52—

In sub-paragraph (2) (f), by deleting the amount "29c" and substituting therefor the amount "32c".

2. This Determination shall come into operation on the  $10 \mathrm{th}$  day of July, 1967.




MAIN . ROAD CALROSSIE-WONWRON ROAD SHIRE OF ALBERTON





- 2. (a) The whole of the municipal district of the City of Hawthorn is hereby prescribed as an area in which off street parking for stationary vehicles shall be provided in relation to buildings of Class II and Class III Occupancy as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.
- (b) Any person who, after the date upon which this By-law comes into operation, constructs a building of Class II or Class III Occupancy, as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, shall provide in relation to such building off street parking for stationary vehicles in accordance with the provisions of the schedule hereto.
- (c) Every plan lodged with the Surveyor to accompany an application for a permit to construct a building in relation to which off street parking for stationary vehicles is required shall clearly delineate all vehicle spaces and every access lane to such vehicle spaces.
- (d) The boundaries of all vehicle spaces and access lanes thereto shall at all times be clearly indicated on the ground and shall conform with the plan lodged with the surveyor in accordance with Clause 2c hereof.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Schedule hereto, land upon which provision under or pursuant to this By-law is made for the parking of stationary vehicles shall not without the consent of the Council be used in any manner so as to reduce such provision for parking of stationary vehicles.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### OFF STREET PARKING PROVISIONS.

- 1. In relation to buildings of Class II Occupancy as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, off street parking for stationary vehicles shall be provided on the basis of at least one vehicle space for each portion of a building used or intended adapted or designed for use as a dwelling.
- 2. In relation to buildings of Class III Occupancy as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations off street parking for stationary vehicles shall be provided on the basis of at least one vehicle space for each two habitable rooms in an apartment house and on the basis of at least one vehicle space for each four lodging rooms in other residential buildings.
- Every vehicle space provided for the parking of stationary vehicles shall be not less than 140 square feet in area.
- 4. Every vehicle space shall be provided either in the said buildings or within the distance between the same and the boundaries of the site appertaining thereto, provided that in no case shall any part of any vehicle space be situated nearer than 30 feet from any frontage of the site upon which the said buildings are constructed and provided further that all such vehicle space shall be within the curtilage of the site.
- 5. Save where access to a vehicle space is obtained directly from a street or road, an access lane or lanes of sufficient dimensions shall be provided.
- 6. Where access to a vehicle space is obtained from a street or road the following provisions shall apply.(a) The combined width of the vehicle space and the
  - street or road shall be not less than 15 feet.
    - (b) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the street or road is not more than 16 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 24 feet.
    - (c) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the street or road is more than 16 feet but less than 17 feet, the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 22 feet.
  - (d) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the street or road is more than 17 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 20 feet.
- 7. Where access to a vehicle space is obtained from the side, the following provisions shall apply:—
  - (a) The combined width of the vehicle space and the access lane shall be not less than 15 feet.
  - (b) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the access lane is not more than 16 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than
  - (c) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the access lane is more than 16 feet but less than 17 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 22 feet.
  - (d) If the combined width of the vehicle space and the access lane is more than 17 feet the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 20 feet.
- 8. Where access to a vehicle space is from an end and such vehicle space is at right angles to the access lane the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 16 feet 6 inches and the width of the access lane shall be not less than 20 feet.
- 9. Where access to the vehicle space is from an end and such vehicle space is at an angle of 45 degrees to the access lane the length of the vehicle space shall be not less than 16 feet 6 inches and the width of the access lane shall be not less than 12 feet.

Subject as is hereinafter provided no person shall without the prior consent, in writing, of the Council, place any caravan on any private property which is not a camping area in respect of which a current permit issued by the Council under the Camping Regulation 1965 or any amendment or alteration thereof is in existence provided always that nothing in this clause shall prevent—

(a) The placing by the owner of any land of not more than one caravan belonging to him on such land where such caravan is not without the prior consent, in writing, of the council used by any person for the purpose of sleeping or living therein.
(b) The placing of caravans for sale or hire on any land the use of which for the purposes of the business of selling, or hiring caravans is not prohibited by any Planning Scheme made under the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 or any Statutory Amendment, modification, or reenactment thereof, By-law or Regulations or in respect of which a permit for such use has been granted under any Interim Development Order made under the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 or any statutory amendment, modification or re-enactment thereof.
No person shall, without the prior consent, in writing,

5. No person shall, without the prior consent, in writing of the Council erect or construct on any land any tent or similar structure.

6. This. By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Township of Charlton.

7. Any person guilty of a continuing offence contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten dollars for each day on which an offence against this By-law shall be continued after a conviction or order by any court.

Refuse.—Collection, Removal and Disposal.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1958 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Deakin in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-Law (that is to say):—

- 1. This By-Law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor-in-Council and immediately after its publication in the Government
- 2. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation in the residential, industrial and commercial zones and reserves for public purposes as contained within the township of Girgarre, and unless exempted by Council shall apply to every house, building and premises therein.
- apply to every house, building and premises therein.

  3. In this By-Law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, occupier or any person having the management or control thereof. "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises. "Approved receptacle" means a suitable holder approved and supplied by the Council, at the Proprietor's expense, to which is securely attached a container approved and supplied by the Council and erected in such a manner that there is a clearance of at least 42 inches from ground level to the bottom of the ring of the holder. ring of the holder.
- 4. The Proprietor of every house, building or premises shall keep and maintain at all times upon his premises, a properly erected approved receptacle in which he shall from time to time, cause to be deposited refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.
- 5. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle.
- 6. The Proprietor shall cause the approved receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and good condition.
- 7. The Proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse the container to be detached from the holder and adequately closed and be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building or premises from the street, lane or right of way on which such house, building or premises abut, in order that the container may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorised or employed in that behalf by the Council.
- 8. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such container in or upon any street, lane or right of way, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right of way or land on which such container could be placed for collection and emptying.
- 9. The contractor or person authorised or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the placing (without spilling any of the contents) of such container or containers directly into a suitable vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days, not being less than once a week, as may be appointed by the Council, and for the removal of such refuse in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for closing the gate or gates of the premises from which such container is taken.

10. If any refuse is authorised to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, quarry, hole or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and the contractor or the person or persons authorised and employed by the Council shall comply with any directions of the Council regarding the proper and adequate disposal of such refuse. and adequate disposal of such refuse.

11. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane or passage.

12. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land, other than in a tip established by the Council.

13. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-Law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Forty Dollars and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Ten Dollars.



#### (CORRUGATED, CYLINDRICAL.)

#### SPECIFICATION.

Tanks to be made of 24-gauge galvanized corrugated "Orb" brand iron for side, with bottom of 22-gauge galvanized "Queen's Head" flat iron (or other approved brand) to be lapped not less than 3 inches at all vertical joints and one (1) corrugation for all horizontal joints and bottoms properly seam-jointed and well soldered.

All vertical joints to be riveted as shown in appended sketch with galvanized iron rivets and joints soldered on external face of tank only.

All horizontal joints to be riveted with galvanized iron rivets at 9-in. pitch round circumference of tank and joints soldered on external face of tank only.

The whole of the rivets and soldering to be well sweated in.

The junction of side and bottom to be well paned on and thoroughly soldered.

Cover to be 26-gauge galvanized flat iron, conical shaped 9-in. pitch with all joints properly seamed and soldered and paned on to a 3-in. 24-gauge galvanized iron rim and well soldered, the bottom edge of rim to be wired.


Cut a circular hole in cover for and provide and set therein an 18-in. diameter 24-gauge galvanized iron strainer. Strainer to have \(\frac{1}{2}\)-in. adameter holes, cut in sides only in sets of three vertically \(\frac{1}{2}\)-in. apart at 4-in. centres round strainer, lowest hole kept \(\frac{1}{2}\)-in. above bottom of strainer, top edge of strainer flanged and wired and to be movable.

Provide and securely fix a galvanized wrought iron socket properly bossed and soldered to receive tap. With each tank an approved  $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. brass low-pressure tap, lock-up type.

All tanks to be thoroughly watertight.

The whole of the walls and bottoms internally to be twice coated with "Biturine" or other approved bituminous paint.

Provide with external overflow of 2-in. diameter 24-gauge pop-bossed and soldered on near top and provide with tank 1/6 ft. length of 2-in. 24-gauge overflow pipe with elbow to connect to pop and 1/3 ft. length with shoe to discharge into drain. Provide overflow with galvanized clip to secure to stand.

## Conditions of Contract for General Stores, 1967-69, &c.

Published in the Victoria Government Gazette, No. 28, dated 22nd March, 1967, pages 942 to 943.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates. The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedule the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.
- 2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any Department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.
- 3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.
- 4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The contractor must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.
- 5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Departments requiring the goods, which shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach it to his claim for payment.
- 6. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of this contract, the Melbourne District will include a radius of 12 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Rallway Stations as required.
- Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the supply.
- 8. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.
- 9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In the event of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as provided in clause 8.
- 10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after the delivery of the goods, the account to be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form

- for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The rates and the quantities quoted in the orders cannot be increased.
- 11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedule. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.
- 12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as provided in clause 8.
- 13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the the terms of clauses 15 and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as provided in clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay to terminate the contract forthwith and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.
- 14. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, where railway facilities are available, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.
- a legibly-written business label.

  15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rall for any Department excepting Departments of the Commonwealth, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignee in accordance with clause 16, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only, which accompanies the order, must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note must not be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as is provided in clause 13.
- 16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified, by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred thereby will be deducted as provided in clause 8.

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners, under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing on the consignment note, an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount thereof to be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

18. The contractor is not at liberty to transfer his contract under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. Should it be found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract and forfeit the security money.

19. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works, or by the State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or the Country Roads Board, or for the Railways Department, or for supplies for Technical, High, or Higher Elementary Schools, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries, or by any

article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 152 of the *Customs Act* 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice, in writing, from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

The foregoing provision shall not apply where the contract is for definite quantities of imported goods to be delivered at stated times, as stipulated in the schedule, and any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer rate of exchange affecting the goods included in such contract shall be to the accounts of the Government; adjustments to be based on the F.O.B. and C.I.F. prices of the goods, respectively, and the Telegraphic Transfer rate ruling at the time of delivery of the goods.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in clause 20, will the contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

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
