### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

## CITY OF CAULFIELD.

## BY-LAW No. 146.

A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under the provisions of the Health Acts, and numbered 146 for the purpose of prescribing the fees to be charged for the registration of certain premises requiring registration and of food vending machines and for the renewal or transfer of registration thereof, pursuant to such Acts.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Caulfield ORDER as follows:—

1. By-law No. 141 of the City of Caulfield is hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not prejudice or affect any right accrued or liability incurred prior to the commencement of this By-law.

2. The fees to be charged, received and taken by the Council of the City of Caulfield for the registration and renewal and transfer of registration of any premises and of every food vending machine required to be registered by or under the Health Act 1958 (as amended) shall be the respective fees specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. The fees specified shall be paid to the Town Clerk of the City of Caulfield by any person making application for such registration or renewal or transfer.

4. This By-law shall come into operation on its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, and shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Caulfield.

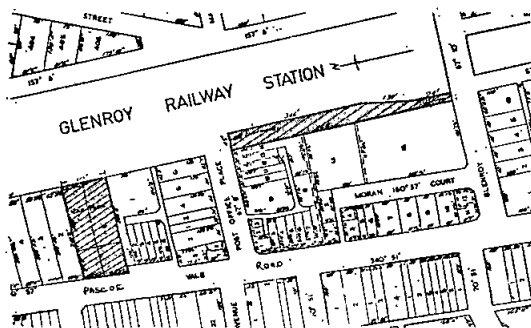

**EXTENSION OF THE POWERS OF THE HOSPITAL MEDICAL ANCILLARY SERVICES BOARD AND ADJUSTMENT OF THE POWERS OF SUCH BOARD AND OF THE HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT HOMES BOARD.**

  - (c) a clear notification that the eggs are presented pursuant to the said section 41c and not pursuant to section 21 of the *Marketing and Primary Products Act 1958*—

and all such egg cases shall be fitted with a steel label holder adapted to hold a grading label 5½ inches in height and 4 inches in width,

7. (a) The fee chargeable to persons submitting eggs for grading under section 41c of the Act will be 3.30 cents per dozen or at such other rate as fixed by the Board from time to time in accordance with the Act.

THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD.

BY Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 61, dated 9th August, 1967, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria, provided and declared on 1st August, 1967, that all eggs (with certain exceptions) coming into existence within a period of two years from 16th August, 1967, shall become vested in and be delivered by producers to the Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board or its Authorized Agents.

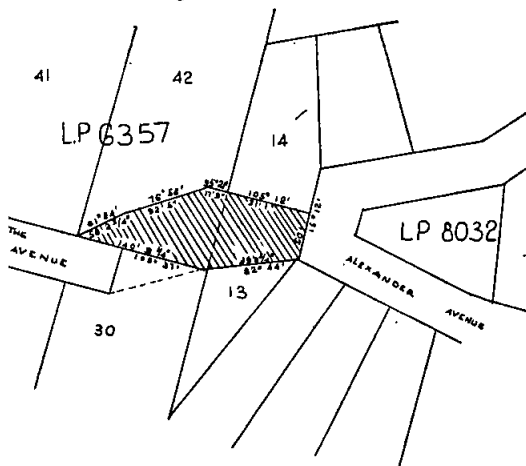
