PROCLAMATION


By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Mildura AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shife of Milduta has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, being streets roads lanes or passages made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating those streets roads lanes or passages has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part

XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be public highways:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Hassell and Elms Streets, Irymple, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act:

Marine Act 1958.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 79 of the Marine Act 1958, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

That on and after the 1st day of January, 1968:-

The Pilotage Rate for ships from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, shall be \$0.0265 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of Four hundred and thirty dollars (\$430) and a minimum charge of Fifty dollars (\$50).

The Pilotage Rate for ships from without Westernport Bay to an anchorage or the Refinery Pier within Westernport Bay, or vice versa, shall be \$0.0265 per ton, calculated on the ship's gross tonnage, subject in any case to a maximum charge of Four hundred and thirty dollars (\$430) and a minimum charge of Fifty dollars (\$50).

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held on the 24th day of November, 1967.

LEXTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1967-1968.

THE Lexton Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Seventeen and one half cents in the dollar of the Net Annual Value of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Lexton Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Seventeen dollars, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five dollars. less than Five dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of October, 1967, and shall be due and payable on the 8th day of January, 1968, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at a quantity which, at a charge of Thirty four cents per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such properties for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Thirty four cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the Office of the Trust.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Lexton Waterworks Trust on the 13th day of December, 1967, and the seal of the Trust affixed hereto, in the presence of—

THORNTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1968.

THE Thornton Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water of six cents in the dollar, on the annual municipal valuation of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Thornton Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than fifteen dollars, and in respect of land on which there is no building be less than four dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1968, and shall be due and payable on the 5th day of January, 1968, at the office of the said Trust, and if unpaid by the 5th day of May, 1968, shall bear interest at 6% per annum from the day on which they became payable.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which at a charge of eighteen cents per 1,000 gallons would produce the amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at eighteen cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by Trust is hereby fixed at nineteen cents per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in any case where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 30,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.



Such application shall be signed by the applicant and by at least five ratepayers of the Shire of Healesville. Healesville.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 4 hereof the 3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 4 hereof the Council may in its discretion grant or refuse to grant the said application and any grant of a permit may be made for such period and subject to such terms and conditions as the Council may cause to be endorsed on the permit. Any such permit shall be substantially in the form in the Second Schedule hereto together with such additions or alterations as the Council may require and shall be given under the hand of the Shire Secretary.
- 4. No permit shall be issued pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this by law for the sale of goods from any stall within the areas set forth in the first part of the Third Schedule hereto unless the following conditions (in addition to any conditions imposed by the said Council) are complied with:—
 - (i) sales of goods from the stall are made only on behalf of a church or on behalf of a youth organisation festival or charity registered by the Council as a church organisation festival or charity for the purposes of this bylaw;
 - (ii) the whole of the proceeds of the sale of those goods (save only for so much of the proceeds as is necessary to meet the cost of those goods) must be paid to the church the youth organisation festival or the charity concerned; and (iii) the stall must be so located as not to create any undue congestion either for vehicles or for pedestrians.
- 5. Any person selling goods from a stall that is permitted by Clause 4 must ensure that no box cardboard carton crate glass package paper plastic straw tin or vegetable matter is deposited on any part of any street road or public place by any person selling goods from the stall.
- 6. When a stall is removed any person who was selling any goods from that stall must ensure that no box cardboard crate glass package paper plastic straw tin or vegetable matter is left on any part of any street road or public place within 10' of where the stall stood.
- 7. Any person who is the holder of a current permit hereunder when engaged in the business of selling goods within the Shire of Healesville shall carry the said permit and produce the same on demand to any authorized officer
- 8. If at any time in the opinion of the Council the holder of any permit issued hereunder shall fail to comply with all the terms and conditions thereof or if at any time in the opinion of the Council any obstruction shall be caused or traffic shall be interfered with by the exercise of any rights granted by such permit or any assemblage of persons caused thereby the Council may revoke or vary such permit and the same shall thereupon become void and of no effect or varied accordingly.

9. 


