DECLARING THAT CHICORY SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CHICORY MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same:

AND WHEREAS by a proclamation made on the twenty-fourth day of December 1935, under the provisions of section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared chicory to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS by an Order made on the eighth April 1936, the Governor in Council appointed

a marketing board in relation to chicory and assigned to such board the name of "The Chicory Marketing Board": NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation hereby PROVIDE AND DECLARE that on, from and after the ninth day of April, 1968, all chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958* be divested from the producers of chicory and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any chicory coming into existence within two (2) years from the ninth day of April, 1968, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Chicory Marketing Board as the owner thereof: AND to enable The Chicory Marketing Board as owner of the abovementioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I DO FURTHER PROVIDE that all such chicory shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Chicory Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Chicory Marketing Board by public notice or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same:

AND WHEREAS by a proclamation made on the ninth day of December 1935 under the provisions of section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared onions to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS by an Order made on the twenty-sixth day of March 1936 the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to onions and assigned to such board the name of "The Onion Marketing Board": NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation hereby PROVIDE AND DECLARE that on, from and after the fifth day of April, 1968, all onions shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958* be divested from the producers of onions and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any onions coming into-existence within two (2) years from the fifth day of April, 1968, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof: AND to enable The Onion Marketing Board as owner of the abovementioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I DO FURTHER PROVIDE that all such onions shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Onion Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Onion Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN BOATS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF PART II. OF THE "MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961".

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intitled the *Motor Boating Act 1961* (No. 6832), it is amongst other things enacted that Part II of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* (No. 6832) shall not apply to any class or type of boat specified in any Proclamation made by the Governor in Council and published in the *Government Gazette* as exempted for the time being from compliance with the provisions of that part which Proclamation the Governor in Council may at any time in the like manner revoke, amend or vary:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation exempt from registration as provided by the said Part II of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*—

All rubber dinghies being the property of the Victorian Air Rescue Service used for and in connection with search and rescue operations.

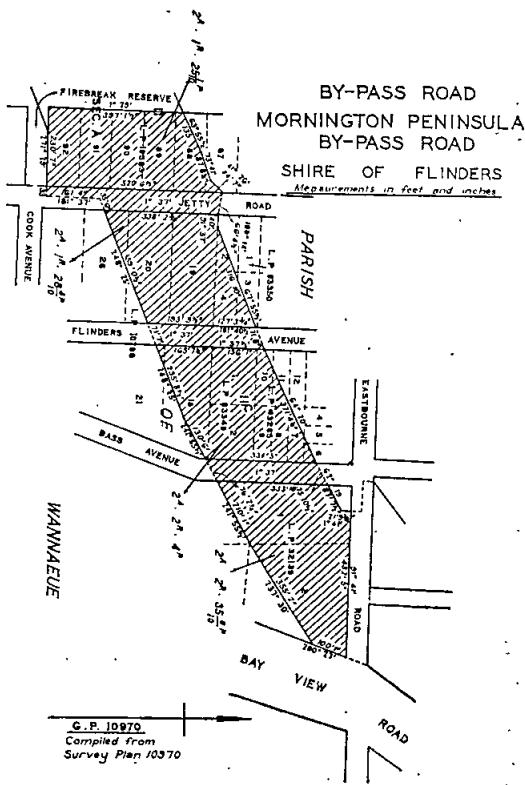

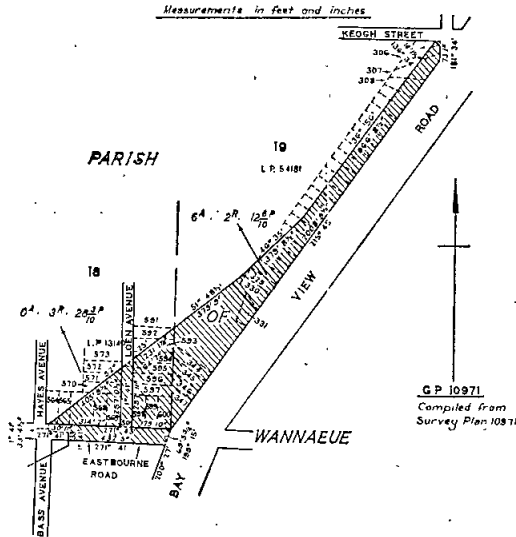

- (g) Regulating the transportation or removal by road of wooden buildings or structural parts thereof including provision for the giving of reasonable security for due compliance with the By-Law, the route to be followed and any deviation thereof as determined by the Council or its engineers and the supervision of the work of transportation and removal and payment for reasonable charges for such supervision.
- (h) Prohibiting on and from the date hereinafter specified the erection or placing against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway in any street or part thereof hereinafter specified of any verandah over or across such footway unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers brackets or projecting supports and not otherwise.
- (i) Requiring the pulling down and removal before the date hereinafter specified (not being less than ten years after the coming into operation of this By-Law) of all verandahs before the date so specified erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any such public footway which verandahs are upon over or across such footway and are supported otherwise than by cantilevers brackets or projecting supports.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the above mentioned parts of the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and of any every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Healesville orders as follows:—

1. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Healesville.

2. This By-Law shall come into operation on the publication thereof or of notice of the making thereof in the *Victorian Government Gazette*.

The Council may sue for and recover from the owner of the premises the costs of such pulling down demolition and removal unrecouped by sale of materials in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

7. No person shall exhibit any advertisement in such place or in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.

8. No person shall transport or remove by road any wooden building or part thereof except under conditions laid down in a permit in writing first had and obtained from the Council and designed to secure the safety of road users, the avoidance of traffic congestion, the protection of road surfaces, drains, pipes and boundaries and the property of public utilities.

9. On or after the date of commencement of this By-Law no person shall erect or place against or in front of any building abutting upon any public footway in any street or part thereof any verandah over or across such footway unless such verandah is supported by cantilevers brackets or projecting supports of a type and specifications approved by the Council by written permit and not otherwise.

10. The owners of any premises having a verandah erected or placed against or in front of any house or building abutting upon any public footway which verandah is upon or over or across such footway and is supported otherwise than by cantilevers brackets or projecting supports approved by the Council by written permit shall pull down and remove such verandah before the 31st day of December, 1978, and if any owner shall fail to comply with this By-Law the Council may remove such verandah and sell or dispose of materials so obtained and apply any proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such verandah.

11. Any person may lodge with the Shire Secretary of the said Shire an application signed by the applicant substantially in the appropriate form set out in the First Schedule hereto for any permit or approval required by this By-Law.

12. The Council may in its discretion grant or refuse the said application and any grant of a permit or approval may be made for such period and subject to such terms and conditions as the Council may require to be endorsed on the permit or approval. Any such permit or approval shall be substantially in the appropriate form in the Second Schedule hereto together with such additions or alterations as the Council may require and shall be given under the hand of the Shire Secretary or Shire Engineer.

13. No permit or approval shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of this By-Law until a permit or approval fee shall first be paid to the Council of the said Shire being the following:

For erection of a hoarding . . . . .	2 dollars
For transportation or removal of wooden buildings . . . . .	1 dollar per 100 square feet with a maximum of 10 dollars.

Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than forty dollars and any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten dollars for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect thereof.

## CITY OF SPRINGVALE.

## By-LAW No. 175

A by-law of the City of Springvale made under the provisions of Sections 197 and 198 of the Local Government Act 1958 and the Uniform Building Regulations (Victoria) for:—

- (a) regulating restricting restraining or prohibiting the erection construction use occupation conversion and alteration of and any addition to buildings or erections and regulating restraining or prohibiting the erection and construction of hoardings or of fences abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road;
- (b) authorising the Council to pull down demolish and remove buildings erections or hoardings or fences or any part thereof erected constructed converted altered or added to contrary to this by-law or not pulled down demolished or removed as required by or under this by-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down demolishing and removing such buildings erections hoardings or fences or such part thereof and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;
- (c) regulating restricting or preventing the exhibition of advertisements in such places and in such manner or by such means as to affect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape;
- (d) regulating and controlling all advertisements attached or fixed to or painted on any hoardings or on any building or on any fence rock cliffs or tree and regulating and controlling the erection or use of coloured lights and signs in the vicinity of traffic lights or signs or of street intersections;
- (e) regulating or prohibiting the writing painting printing stencilling placing or fixing of any letter figure device poster sign or advertisement upon any footpath street or road or upon any building fence or other property vested in the municipality or under the control or management of the Council thereof;
- (f) prescribing determining applying adopting and dispensing with or regulating such matters as are left to be prescribed determined applied adopted dispensed with or regulated by the Council under the Uniform Building Regulations.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by sections 197 and 198 of the Local Government Act 1958 and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and every other power thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Springvale order as follows:—

1. (1) In this by-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Area" applied to a building means that superficial area of a horizontal section thereof made at a point of greatest surface inclusive of the external walls and of such portions of any party wall as belong to the buildings.

"Consent of the Council" means the consent of the Council by a proper resolution duly passed at a properly constituted meeting.

"Dwelling" has the same meaning as "dwelling house" in Section 198(6) of the Local Government Act 1958 but does not include a building of Class III Occupancy or portion of such building.

"Flat" means a portion of a building used or intended adapted or designed for use as a dwelling but does not include a building of Class IV Occupancy.

"Frontage" means the boundary line between a site and the street upon which such site abuts and where the site abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between the site and the street to which any building that may be erected fronts.

"Ground Storey" means that storey closest to ground level in which the height of the ceiling above the level of the adjoining ground is greater than the distance from such level to the floor measured at the centre frontage.

"Height" as applied to hoardings means the distance from the natural surface of the ground to the top of the hoarding.

"Hoarding" has the same meaning as in Section 198(1)(c) of the *Local Government Act 1958* and includes placard, sign board, poster, sign or similar structure used for display or advertising purposes.

"Major Traffic Control Item" has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Regulations 1962*.

"Minor Traffic Control Item" has the same meaning as in the *Road Traffic Regulations 1962*.

"Municipal District" means the municipal district of the City of Springvale.

"Masonry" means stone brick terracotta block solid or hollow concrete block or other similar building unit or a combination of same laid up unit by unit and set in mortar.

"Occupancy" means the purpose for which a building is used or intended to be used.

"Proper Officer" means any officer of the Council authorised by the Council to carry out the provisions of this by-law.

"Regulations" means the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*.

"Surveyor" means the building surveyor or any competent person appointed by the Council to carry out the duties of the building surveyor.

(2) The classification of buildings by occupancy set out in Clauses 601 and 602 of the Regulations shall apply "mutatis mutandis" for the purpose of this by-law wherever a building is referred to in this by-law as being of a specified class.

2. By-laws numbered 103, 112 and 118 of the City of Springvale (and where applicable formerly the Shire of Dandenong) are hereby repealed.

#### FEEs AND DEPOSITS.

3. (1) The fees specified in Chapter 4 of the Regulations are hereby appointed as the fees to be charged and received by the Council for any permit granted under the Regulations by it or for any inspection made or other service provided under the Regulations by an officer of the Council.

(2) The Council hereby determines that the following fees shall be payable to the Council for permits and services issued and provided by the Council for such matters as are left to be determined by the Council under the Regulations—

- (a) Openings in unmade streets and footpaths and in made streets where use of conduits is involved and where blowing is used—two dollars.
- (b) Openings not exceeding five feet in length in bitumen constructed streets—three dollars. Each additional five feet or part thereof—one dollar.
- (c) Openings in a constructed footpath where such footpath does not exceed five feet in width—four dollars.
- (d) Openings in a constructed footpath for each additional five feet or part thereof—one dollar.
- (e) Any other opening in roads, footpaths or channels not specified—three dollars for each five feet in length or part thereof.
- (f) Use of footpath or roadway during building operations—two dollars.
- (g) Inspection of temporary crossing—fifty cents.
- (h) Inspection of drains across pathway—one dollar.
- (i) Inspection of permanent crossing over footpath—two dollars.

(3) The Council hereby determines that the following deposits be lodged with it under the Regulations—

- (a) Construction of permanent crossing over footpath—deposit twenty dollars.
- (b) Construction of drains across pathway—deposit five dollars.
- (c) Construction of temporary crossing during building operations—
  - (i) buildings of Class I Occupancy—deposit fifty dollars.
  - (ii) buildings of Class II to IX Occupancy—deposit fifty dollars.

#### ASSISTANCE TO OFFICERS.

4. (1) Every person carrying on works for the erection, construction, conversion, alteration or addition to any building or other erection on any land or premises and the owner or occupier of any such land or premises shall give assistance to the Surveyor or any other officer of the Council in the carrying out of his duties under the Regulations and this by-law and shall allow him the use of any plant or scaffolding on or about any such land or premises or any works being carried out thereon to enable him to make any inspection he deems necessary.

(2) Any person who obstructs, impedes or in any other way hinders the Surveyor or any other officer of the Council from entering on any such land or premises or inspecting any works being carried out thereon shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

5. (1) Every person carrying out works for the erection, construction, conversion, alteration or the addition to any building or other erection shall give written notice to the Council of the completion of such works within seven days after the date of completion.

(2) Every person carrying out the work of constructing a crossing over a footpath shall notify the Council in writing of the date of completion of the work within seven days after the date of completion.

#### REQUIREMENTS FOR BUILDINGS.

6. The whole of the municipal district is hereby prescribed as an area in which buildings of Class II Occupancy shall contain not more than four flats per site.

7. The whole of the municipal district is hereby prescribed as an area within which no building of Class II Occupancy containing more than two storeys including the ground storey shall be constructed.

#### SITE REQUIREMENTS.

8. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in Column 3 of Table 804 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I or II Occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

9. (1) The minimum distance of the outer wall of any building of Class I or II Occupancy from the frontage of any land is hereby specified as twenty feet.

(2) No person shall erect or construct any building of Class I or II Occupancy or erect or construct any additions to any such building closer to the frontage of any land than twenty feet.

10. In the case of a building proposed to be constructed on land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of the first coming into operation of the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria*, the Council may dispense with the requirements of Clause 813 of the Regulations.

11. (1) The areas described in the 1st Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas—

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

- Balmoral Avenue, Springvale, both sides from Buckingham Avenue to St. Johns Avenue.
- Buckley Street, Noble Park, both sides from Douglas Street to Noble Street.
- Douglas Street, Noble Park, both sides from Heatherton Road to Stuart Street.
- Douglas Street, Noble Park, south side, being Lots 35 and 36 on Lodged Plan 6156.
- Forster Street, Springvale, north side from Lawn Road to Somers Street.
- Heatherton Road, Springvale, north side from Springvale Road, easterly 198 feet.
- Heatherton Road, Noble Park, both sides from Railway Line to Mile Creek.
- Heatherton Road, Noble Park, south side from Chandler Road, westerly 198 feet.
- Heatherton Road, Noble Park, north side north-west corner with Kelvinside Road and being Lot 3 on lodged Plan 18903.
- Lawn Road, Springvale, east side from Lightwood Road to Forster Street.
- Lawn Road, Springvale, west side, being Lot 51 on Lodged Plan 4817.
- Leonard Avenue, Noble Park, both sides from Douglas Street to Noble Road.
- Leonard Avenue, Noble Park, west side, being Lot 32 on Lodged Plan 6156.

Lightwood Road, Springvale, southern side from Lawn Road to Somers Street.

Princes Highway East, both sides within the whole municipal district of the City of Springvale for a depth of 150 feet north and south of the respective side lines.

Sandown Road, Springvale, on the northern side from Springvale Road to Merton Street.

Somers Street, Springvale, west side Lightwood Road to Forster Street.

Springvale Road, Springvale, east side from Princes Highway East southerly 198 feet.

Springvale Road, Springvale, east side from Lucian Street to Mary Street.

Springvale Road, Springvale, both sides from Windsor Avenue to Mary Street.

Springvale Road, Springvale, east side from Ash Grove to State School.

Springvale Road, Springvale, west side from Windsor Avenue to 150 feet south of St. James Avenue.

Springvale Road, Springvale, east side from Ash Grove to Grace Park Avenue.

Stuart Street, Noble Park, west side from Douglas Street southerly 528 feet.

(2) No person shall in any of such areas construct, erect or cause to be constructed or erected any building or any addition or extension to any existing building the external walls of which are of material other than masonry or concrete with the exception that in cases of existing buildings of Class I Occupancy no addition to or any extension to such buildings shall be required to be constructed or erected in masonry or concrete materials.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clause (2) hereof the Council may permit the construction of a building or any additions or extension to any existing building the external walls of which are of material consisting of a composite of masonry, concrete, glass or aluminium.

#### ACCOMMODATION FOR VEHICLES LOADING AND UNLOADING VEHICLES.

12. The whole of the municipal district is hereby prescribed as an area within which off-street accommodation for stationary vehicles shall be provided for a building of Class II Occupancy within the boundaries of the site on which such building is erected but, except with the permission of the Council, no closer to the frontage than such building in accordance with the following prescribed schedule—

One garage or car-port for each flat contained in such building.

#### REMOVAL AND RE-ERECTION OF WOODEN BUILDINGS.

13. (1) Where any person is desirous of moving an existing brick-veneer building or erecting and re-erecting the same within the municipality such person shall give notice in writing to the Council of such intention to do so at least seven days before the date of intended removal.

(2) With such notice of intention, every such person shall supply the following information—

- (a) the present situation of such building or erection;
- (b) the situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect the same;
- (c) the external dimensions and height of such building or erection;
- (d) plans and specifications of the proposed re-erected building;
- (e) the purpose for which the same is to be used when re-erected;
- (f) if the re-erected building or erection is intended to be used as a dwelling the number and sizes of the rooms contained therein; and
- (g) the purpose for which such building or erection was last used prior to the notice.

(3) The Surveyor shall cause every such building or erection to be inspected before removal and to ascertain whether same when re-erected or re-constructed will comply with the requirements of the Regulations.

(4) If in the Surveyor's opinion any such building or erection when re-erected will not comply with the Regulations or this by-law then he shall advise the applicant in writing accordingly and report his findings to the Council.

(5) No permit to re-erect any such building or erection will be issued by the Council unless all the provisions of the Regulations and of the *Health Act 1958* are complied with.

#### HOARDINGS AND ILLUMINATED SIGNS.

14. No person shall erect, alter, or add to any hoarding except in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Council.

15. No person shall erect any hoarding (other than an illuminated or sky sign) within a distance from the boundary line of any street or road equal to the height of such hoarding or with the lowest part of any such hoarding other than the main supports thereof less than three feet from the level of the land.

16. (1) Every hoarding (other than a sky sign) shall be constructed of material and to a design approved by the Council.

(2) No person shall erect any hoarding (other than an illuminated sign)—

- (a) covering any window or architectural projection of any building;
- (b) over or in front of any dwelling house;
- (c) so that any part of the same is less than 9 feet over the level of any footpath over which it may be re-erected; or
- (d) (except with the approval of the Council) exceeding 5 feet in height or having a face area exceeding 30 square feet.

17. (1) No illuminated sign shall be erected, attached to the wall of any building unless—

- (a) it is so attached as not to cover any portion of any window or architectural projection in such wall;
- (b) it does not overhang or extend over any footpath at a lesser height than twelve feet unless it is also attached to a verandah;
- (c) it is attached to a metal frame or box secured firmly to such wall;
- (d) it or any part thereof does not project over any footpath if the face area exceeds ten square feet;
- (e) it is terminated at least 2 feet 6 inches from the edge of any kerb line in front of such building.

(2) No illuminated sign shall be attached to any verandah without the approval of the Council and unless—

- (a) any part of the same is not less than 9 feet above the level of any footpath over which it may be erected;
- (b) it has a face depth not exceeding 14 inches and a face length not exceeding 96 inches;
- (c) it is rigidly supported from the frame work of any such verandah by steel supports; and
- (d) it is terminated at least 2 feet 6 inches from the edge of the kerb line in front of the building to which such verandah is attached.

18. No person shall erect any illuminated sign erected on or supported by a pole, steel tower, or similar structure unless its location is approved by the Council.

19. No persons shall erect any sky sign unless its location, design and construction are approved by the Council and unless—

- (a) the maximum dimensions of any such sign does not exceed 30 feet;
- (b) the maximum area of any such sign does not exceed 200 square feet;
- (c) if attached to a building is erected not less than 6 feet from the frontage of the land on which the building is erected;
- (d) if erected on land or premises situated at an intersection of two streets and if illuminated it does not contain in such illumination the colours of red, green or amber if of a flashing or moving type or the colours of green or amber if a fixed type.

20. No person shall erect, establish, place, maintain or display on any public highway or in view of any person on any public highway any matter or thing which purports to be or is an imitation of or is similar to any major or minor traffic control item or interferes with the effectiveness of or prevents any person from clearly distinguishing any major or minor traffic control item.

21. (1) Every permit to erect a hoarding issued by or under the authority of the Council shall be issued on the express condition that any such hoarding shall be maintained at all times in good order and condition.

(2) If the Council is of the opinion that any hoarding erected pursuant to such a permit is in a ruinous dilapidated or dangerous condition it shall cause the proper officer to serve a notice in writing on the owner or occupier of the premises on which the hoarding is erected

requiring such owner or occupier to bring the same into conformity with the requirements of this by-law or demolish the same.

(3) Any persons failing to comply with the requirements of any such notice within the time specified therein shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

#### ROAD OPENING.

22. (1) No person shall carry out any work necessitating the disturbing of the surface of any road, street or lane without first obtaining the written permission of the Council.

(2) Every permit issued by the Council to excavate in any road, street or lane shall be issued on the following express conditions—

- (a) all water gas service pipes laid in any such excavation must be at least 1 foot 6 inches below the surface and must not be laid longitudinally without the written permission of the Council;
- (b) all refilling or any such excavation in any road pavement must be done with fine crushed rock or other approved crushed material thoroughly rammed with a heavy rammer every six inches.

#### TEMPORARY CROSSINGS.

23. (1) Where any channel or footpath in or on any street or road has been constructed or paved any person intending to carry out works for the erection, construction, conversion or alterations to buildings or erections on any premises fronting or abutting on any such street or road shall cause a proper temporary crossing to be constructed over such channel or footpath to give access to such premises before commencing such works.

(2) Every person who carries on any such works on any such premises and fails to so provide a proper temporary crossing shall be liable for the cost of repairing any damage caused to any such channel or footpath and in the event of the Council repairing the same shall be liable to reimburse the Council the cost thereof.

(3) Every person obtaining a permit to carry on any such works on any such premises shall lodge with the Council as security for the cost of repairing any channel or footpath damaged as a result of his building operations the following amounts—

- (a) in the case of a building of Class I Occupancy the sum of fifty dollars; and
- (b) in the case of a building of Class II to IX Occupancy the sum of fifty dollars.

#### FENCES.

24. (1) No person shall erect or construct or cause to be erected or constructed any fence abutting on or within ten feet of any street or road except in accordance with specifications approved by the Surveyor and subject to the following conditions—

- (a) *Timber*—All timber used in posts and struts shall be redgum.
- (b) *Gate and Corner Posts*—Gate posts and corner posts shall be not less than 5 inches x 5 inches in sectional area, plated and strutted on all four sides unless otherwise allowed by the Surveyor.
- (c) *Intermediate Posts*—Intermediate posts shall not be less than 5 inches x 3 inches in sectional area spaced not more than nine feet apart and every post shall be plated and strutted on two sides.
- (d) *Sole Plates and Struts*—Sole plates shall be not less than 3 inches x 2 inches housed one half an inch into post, and not less than three feet in length. Struts shall be not less than three inches x two inches and not less than two feet in length, cut to correct levels and securely nailed to posts and plates.
- (e) *Depth and Ground*—Posts shall be fixed vertically, and shall be sunk below the surface of the ground not less than two feet in the case of fences up to 5 feet 6 inches in height and 2 feet 6 inches in the case of fences over 5 feet 6 inches in height.
- (f) *Rails*—Rails for paling or similar fences shall be not less than 3 inches x 2 inches, spaced more than 2 feet 6 inches apart centre to centre, except in the case of fences 5 feet 6 inches or under in height, where the centre rail may be 3 inches x 1½ inches. Rails shall be in lengths sufficient to span two panels and shall break joints on alternate posts.
- (g) *Plinths*—Where a plinth is used at the bottom of a fence it shall be not less than 6 inches x 1 inch full and shall be in lengths to span two panels.

(h) *Palings*—Palings shall be hard wood, redgum or jarrah, not less than one half inch in thickness, and shall be fixed vertically. The tops of all paling or similar fences shall be cut off to a regular line.

(i) *Corrugated Iron*—Where corrugated iron is used as a covering it shall be fixed with corrugations vertically. It shall be new iron of not less than twenty-six gauge and finished to a regular line along the top.

(j) *Special Fences*—The method of construction or ornamental wire fences, picket fences, brick fences, concrete fences and other fences of special design must be approved by the Surveyor before being erected.

(k) *Short lengths*—The use of short lengths of timber in posts, rails, pickets and palings is not permitted.

(l) *Heights*—No fence or any addition thereto shall exceed seven feet in height.

(m) *Gates*—Every gate must be properly framed, braced, and constructed and hung on suitable hinges opening into the premises only.

(2) No person shall dig, break or remove or damage any paved or constructed footway for the purpose of erecting any strutted fence without first obtaining a permit under Clause 27 hereof.

#### ADVERTISEMENTS.

25. (1) No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisements upon any footpath, street or roadway or upon any building, fence or other property vested in the Council or under the management and control of the Council except with the written permission of the Council.

(2) Council may remove or obliterate or delete any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisement written, painted, printed, stenciled, placed or affixed contrary to this clause and recover from the person responsible therefor the cost of so doing as a civil debt recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

26. No hoarding or sign for advertising purposes shall be exhibited in such places or in such manner or by such means as to effect injuriously the amenities of a public park or pleasure promenade or to disfigure the natural beauty of a landscape.

#### ENFORCEMENT OF BY-LAW.

27. (1) Where any building, erection, hoarding or fence is erected, constructed, converted, altered or added to contrary to Clause 9, 10, 17, 23 and 28 (all inclusive) of this by-law and the owner fails to comply with any written notice to make any such building, erection, hoarding or fence comply with the relevant provisions hereof then the Council is hereby authorised to—

- (a) enter upon the subject land or premises and pull down, demolish, and remove any such building, erection, hoarding or fence; and
- (b) sell the materials therefrom and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down, demolishing and removing; and
- (c) pay into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of any such building, erection, hoarding or fence.

(2) If the proceeds of any such sale are insufficient to meet the costs of the Council of such pulling down and removal then the amount of such costs still outstanding may be recovered by the Council from the owner as a civil debt recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

28. (1) In the event of any owner of premises being prevented by the occupier of such premises from complying with any notice served by him under the provisions of this by-law he shall notify the Proper Officer accordingly.

(2) The Proper Officer shall then serve a notice on the occupier of such premises requiring him to allow the owner to comply with the provisions of such notice within a time specified in such notice.

(3) If the occupier continues to prevent or obstruct the owner from complying with the requirements of the notice served on the owner after service of the notice referred to in sub-clause 2 hereof then he shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

29. (1) If at any time during the erection, construction, conversion, alteration of or addition to any building, erection, hoarding, or fence the Surveyor find on inspection that any defective or unsound material is being used in any such erection, construction, alteration or addition he shall immediately serve notice on the owner or the person

responsible for the use of such defective or unsound material to discontinue the use of the same and to remove it from the site.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with any such notice shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

30. Every person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$40.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

31. This by-law (except Clauses 8, and 11 to 13 (inclusive) hereof which shall apply to and have operation throughout those parts of the municipal district to which each respective clause relates) shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

4. The fee for any transfer of registration shall be One dollar or 50% of the registration fee (whichever is the lesser amount).

5. (a) Where application for the renewal of registration is not lodged with the Council until after the last day fixed for the lodging thereof, an additional fee equal to one-half of the relevant prescribed fee shall be paid.

(b) The last day for lodging applications for renewal of registration shall be the 1st day of November in the year preceding the year for which such registration is requested.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Stawell.
