Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958.

DECLARING THAT TOBACCO LEAF SHALL BECOME
THE PROPERTY OF THE TOBACCO LEAF MARKET-
ING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2)
YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the
Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, it is enacted
that where a product has been declared a commodity and
a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the
Governor in Council may by proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall
forthwith upon the date of publication of the
proclamation or on, from and after a later date
specified in the proclamation, be divested from
the producers of the commodity and become
vested in and be the absolute property of the
board as the owner thereof, and that upon any
of the commodity coming into existence within
a time specified in the same or a subsequent
proclamation it shall by virtue of the said Act
become vested in and be the absolute property
of the board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the
board effectively to obtain possession of the
commodity as such owner, and to deal with
the same:

AND WHEREAS by a proclamation made on the
twentieth day of December, 1963 under the provisions of
section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared
tobacco leaf to be a commodity under and for the purposes
of the said Act: AND WHEREAS by an Order made on
the twenty-second day of April, 1964 the Governor in
Council appointed a marketing board in relation to tobacco

leaf and assigned to such board the name of "The Tobacco
Leaf Marketing Board": NOW THEREFORE, I, the
Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth
of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive
Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation
hereby PROVIDE AND DECLARE that on, from and after
the thirteenth day of May, 1968, all tobacco leaf shall
subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of
Primary Products Act 1958* be divested from the producers
of tobacco leaf and become vested in and be the absolute
property of The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board as the
owner thereof and that upon any tobacco leaf coming into
existence within two (2) years from the thirteenth day
of May, 1968, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in
accordance with the said Act become vested in and be
the absolute property of the Tobacco Leaf Marketing
Board as the owner thereof: AND to enable The Tobacco
Leaf Marketing Board as owner of the above-mentioned
commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to
deal with the same I DO FURTHER PROVIDE that all
such tobacco leaf shall subject to and in accordance with
the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers
thereof to The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board or its
authorized agent within such times at such places and
in such manner as The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board by
public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or
as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

Water Restrictions—Winchelsea Urban Waterworks Trust District.

THE Winchelsea Waterworks Trust (hereinafter referred to as "the Trust") in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* doth hereby make the By-Law following, restricting the use for other than domestic purposes of water supplied by the said Trust within the Winchelsea Urban Waterworks Trust District.

1. This By-Law shall come into operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the District and cease to have operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by notice so published.

2. The use of water supplied by the Trust shall be restricted or prohibited in the manner or for the purpose set out below:—

- (a) For the watering of any private garden (but not including nature strips the watering of which by hose is not permitted) during the 24 hours of each day unless carried out by means of a watering can or any other similar container except that between the hours of 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. each day watering may be carried out by means of a hose held in the hand.

- (b) For the watering of:—

- (i) any garden lawn or vegetation
(a) under the control of a Government Instrumentality or Municipal Council,
(b) in or about a public building,
(c) in or about property occupied by a commercial or industrial undertaking where no person is in residence at the property;
or
(ii) any ground used or adapted for use in connection with any sport game or other form of recreation;

during the 24 hours of each day unless carried out by means of a watering can or other similar container except that between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. each day watering may be carried out by means of a hose held in the hand.

- (c) For the watering of market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. each day unless carried out by means of a watering can or similar container. Watering of market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms by means of fixed sprinklers or fixed hoses or hoses held in the hand may be carried out (on a permit obtained from the Trust) at other hours of the 24 hours of each day.

- (d) For the washing of any vehicle, including cars, trailers, caravans, boats, etc., by means of a hose or other attachment connected to the Trust's water supply system unless

- (i) the washing of a vehicle such as a garbage truck, mechanical street sweeper, etc., cannot be carried out satisfactorily in an alternative manner;
(ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for recirculating of the cleaning water;

and provided that in respect of (i) and (ii) above the approval in writing of an officer authorised by the Trust in that behalf shall have been first obtained;

- (e) For the filling, adding to or cleansing of any swimming pool (not being a swimming pool to which members of the public are admitted) the depth of which exceeds one foot unless the approval in writing of an officer authorised by the Trust in that behalf shall have been obtained.

- (f) For the washing of paths, walks or buildings by means of a hose except where necessary, for public health or construction purposes.
(g) For the filling of tankers or the cleaning or flushing of streets, gutters or drains by means of a hose, except for construction purposes or for cleaning necessary for public health.
(h) For the operation of all public and private fountains whether recirculated or not.
(i) Other than in the approved times for use of hoses as set out above hoses must be disconnected from taps, stopcocks, etc. controlling supplies from the Trust's mains.

during the 24 hours of each day unless carried out by means of a watering can or other similar container except that between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. each day watering may be carried out by means of a hose held in the hand.

- (c) For the watering of market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. each day unless carried out by means of a watering can or similar container. Watering of market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry

farms by means of fixed sprinklers or fixed hoses or hoses held in the hand may be carried out (on a permit obtained from the Trust) at other hours of the 24 hours of each day.

- (d) For the washing of any vehicle, including cars, trailers, caravans, boats, etc., by means of a hose or other attachment connected to the Trust's water supply system unless

(i) the washing of a vehicle such as a garbage truck, mechanical street sweeper, etc., cannot be carried out satisfactorily in an alternative manner;

(ii) the washing of vehicles is carried out for fee or reward by a vehicle cleaning establishment which has made provision for recirculation of the cleaning water;

FIFTEEN MILE CREEK IMPROVEMENT TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Fifteen Mile Creek Improvement Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *River Improvement Act 1958*, doth hereby make the By-Law following:—

4. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of January, 1968, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1968, and shall be payable on the 10th May, 1968, at the office of the Fifteen Mile Creek Improvement Trust at Wangaratta.

5. Such person or persons as the Fifteen Mile Creek Improvement Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate.

2. Subject to the provisions of Clauses 3 and 4 of this By-law no person shall, with water supplied by the Trust—

(a) Water any garden, lawn or other land (other than commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms) within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand, between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. on each day.

(b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

3. No person shall, with water supplied by the Trust, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 8 p.m. of each day.

4. No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, racecourses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 8 p.m. and 10 p.m. of each day, or as otherwise agreed by the Trust.

5. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the *Water Act 1958*.

BY-LAW No. 5579.

Water Restrictions—Urban and Waterworks Districts.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission") in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 doth hereby make the By-law following, restricting the use for other than domestic purposes of water supplied by the said Commission within the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula and Otway Waterworks Districts and the Corop, Dingee, Gunbower, Leitchville, Lockington, Macorna, Mitiamo, Murrabit, Pyramid Hill, Stanhope, Tallygaroopna, Carwarp, Lake Boga, Koondrook, Merbein, Meringur, Nyah, Nyah West, Piangil, Red Cliffs, Robinvale, Werrimull, Eildon, Heyfield, Wonthaggi, Antwerp, Berriwilllock, Beulah, Birchip, Brim, Chillingollah, Chinkapook, Culgoa, Dimboola, Doon, Hopetoun, Jeparit, Jung Jung, Lalbert, Lascelles, Manangatang, Marnoo, Minyip, Nandaly, Natimuk, Nullawil, Ouyen, Patchewollock, Pimpino, Quambatook, Rainbow, Rupanyup, Sea Lake, Speed, Tempy, Ultima, Waitchie, Walpeup, Watchem, Woomelang, Woorinen, Wycheproof, Yaapect and Newstead Urban Districts.

1. This By-law shall come into operation at such time and in such Districts or parts of Districts (hereinafter referred to as "the specified area") as the Commission from time to time directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within the Districts and cease to have operation at such time as the Commission from time to time directs by a notice so published.

2. Subject to the provisions of Clauses 3 and 4 of this By-law no person shall, with water supplied by the Commission:—

(a) Water any garden, lawn or other land (other than commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms) within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand between the hours of 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. each day.

(b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

3. No person shall with water supplied by the Commission, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10 a.m. of each day or by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.

4. No person shall with water supplied by the Commission, water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, racecourses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand, and then only for a maximum period of 14 hours a week at times and under conditions to be determined by the Commission's District Engineer.

5. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act 1958.

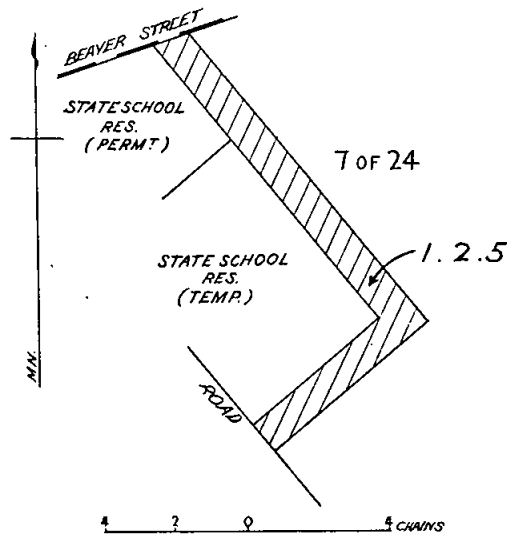

BY-LAW NO. 34.

A By-law of the City of Benalla made under the powers conferred by the Health Acts for the purpose of fixing fees for the registration and renewal and transfer of registration of premises throughout the City of Benalla.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution, the Council of the City of Benalla in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors and Ratepayers thereof, hereby orders and enacts that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation:—

1. The following fees shall be payable to the Council of the City of Benalla by any person making application for the granting, annual renewal of registration, or transfer of registration of the following premises respectively, and for the late payment of such registration.

Provided that in respect of any registration granted after 31st day of March in any year the fee shall be calculated at the rate of one-quarter of the fee prescribed by these regulations for each full three months or part thereof between the date of such registration and the 31st day of December following.

2. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the City of Benalla and shall come into operation immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. By-law No. 11 is hereby repealed.

The Resolution for passing this By-law No. 34 was agreed to by the Council on the 13th day of November, 1967, and confirmed at a meeting of the Council held on the 22nd day of January, 1968.

SHIRE OF HEYTESBURY.

BY-LAW No. 49.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1958*, and of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Council of the Shire of Heytesbury, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heytesbury, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Heytesbury.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Garbage" is the animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of foods.

"Premises" includes land upon which no house or building is erected if the same is occupied and/or used for any purpose in respect of which refuse is produced or accumulated.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any house, building or premises, and includes the owner, occupier, and/or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" subject as hereinafter appears, means any solid waste and includes garbage, combustible and non-combustible rubbish and ashes.

4. The proprietor of every house, building or premises abutting on any street or part of a street, along which the Council undertakes or contracts for the removal of refuse or rubbish shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises or land upon which such house, building or premises is erected a properly constructed rat-proof and fly-proof receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

5. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle and with a proper handle or other lifting devices, and such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered with such lid (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom) and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such receptacle and lid and refuse in an inoffensive condition.

6. Such receptacle and lid shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other material approved by the Council, in such manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle or lid of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than 1½ cubic-feet nor more than 3 cubic-feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man, and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached sidelifting handles.

8. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle or place or cause or permit to be deposited any moist refuse in such receptacle, unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper to the extent that such moist refuse shall remain confined in such wrapping whilst in such receptacle and shall not become loose or spread therein.

9. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed in such receptacle any ashes or dust from fires or vacuum cleaners, unless—

(a) Such ashes or dust has been effectually wrapped in paper to the extent that such ashes or dust shall remain confined in such wrapping whilst in such receptacle and shall not become loose or spread therein.

(b) such ashes are cold and combustion has completely ceased therein.

10. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle and lid to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle and lid with tar or other suitable substance if required to do so by the Council.

11. The proprietor (at, such hours and at such times as may be appointed by the Council) shall cause such receptacle, or such receptacles, to be deposited conveniently close to the kerb of the street or roadway abutting on the land upon which such house, building or premises is erected in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

12. No person shall remove from such receptacle any rag, cloth or similar substance except for the disposal of the whole contents of such receptacle in a manner and at a place approved by the Council.

13. Any person who commits a breach of the By-law shall be liable for every such breach to a penalty of not more than Forty Dollars, and in the case of such continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Ten Dollars.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 7 and 3 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Supreme Court Act 1958.

SUPREME COURT (SERVICE AND EXECUTION OF PROCESS) RULES 1968.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Supreme Court Act 1958* the *Service and Execution of Process Act 1901-1963* and all other powers hereunto enabling the Judges of the Supreme Court of Victoria hereby make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Supreme Court (Service and Execution of Process) Rules 1968*.

2. The Rules made under the *Service and Execution of Process Act 1901-1912* by Order dated the 20th day of August, 1914, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2nd day of September, 1914, shall be repealed.

3. The fees to be paid in connexion with the service of the process of the courts of Victoria under the *Service and Execution of Process Act 1901-1963* and the execution and enforcement by those courts of the process and

judgments of the courts of other States and parts of the Commonwealth shall be those set forth in the Schedule hereto.

4. Where proceedings are taken to enforce any judgment a certificate of which has been registered under the said Act in any court of Victoria, the same costs shall be allowed as upon similar proceedings to enforce a like judgment of such court.

SCHEDULE.

A. Fees to be paid in connexion with the service of process of the courts of Victoria.

For service of any process issued out of the courts of Victoria and served in any of the other States the following fees shall be allowed:—

- (a) If served by a person who is an officer of any court, the same amount as would be paid in accordance with the scale of fees in force for the time being in the court whereof such person is an officer for the service of process issued out of such court;

- (b) If there is no such scale of fees or if the process is served by any other person, the amount actually paid to that person in respect of—

- (i) the fee paid for swearing the affidavit of service;
- (ii) reasonable and necessary expenses of travelling and sustenance; and
- (iii) a fee of \$4, with an additional \$4 for each day necessarily occupied after the first day.

Where more than one attendance is necessary but can be made on the same day, no additional allowance is to be made. Where it is necessary to employ a solicitor to effect service, in addition to the above allowances a sum of \$10.

B. Fees to be paid in connexion with the execution and enforcement by courts of Victoria of the process and judgments of the courts of other States and parts of the Commonwealth.

The same fees of court shall be charged in connexion with the execution and enforcement of such process and judgments as are charged for the like or analogous proceedings to execute and enforce the process and judgments of courts of Victoria; and in addition thereto the following fees:—

If registered in any other court	\$1.00
For every notification to a court of another State—	
if sent from the Supreme Court50

No fee shall, however, be charged for entering satisfaction of any judgment entered in pursuance of a notification received from the court of another State.

1. The Determination No. 107 of the Police Service Board of the 15th November, 1963, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th February, 1964, as amended, is hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) In paragraph 7, by inserting after sub-paragraph (c), the following sub-paragraph:—

“(d) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (c) of this paragraph a person who has been reappointed to the Force in the rank of constable after having ceased to be a member of the Force for a period of not more than five years shall be credited with the years of his previous service, up to a maximum of seven years, for purposes of his salary as a constable, but for no other purpose under this Determination”.

(b) In paragraph 52—

“(ii) In all places other than capital cities, in respect of each visit, for each day, but not more than three weeks, \$9.00 per day, and thereafter, three quarters of the daily rate.”

“(e) After the first night and up to three weeks inclusive, he shall be paid for each full day—\$9.00; for part of a day—38 cents per hour.

(f) After three weeks in one place he shall be paid for each full day three-quarters of the daily rate prescribed in clause (e) hereof; for part of a day—38 cents per hour.”

2. This Determination shall come into operation on the 12th day of May, 1968, in relation to paragraph 1 (b), and on the 19th day of May, 1968, in relation to paragraph 1 (a).

6. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the *Water Act 1958*.

- (b) Water any garden, lawn, plantation, orchard, uncovered place, tree, plant, or vegetation without the permission of the Council in writing except between the hours of 30 minutes past 4 o'clock and 30 minutes past 5 o'clock in the afternoon other than by means of a garden hose of not more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter which during use shall be continuously held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand; or
- (c) Wash any vehicle of any description by means of a hose or other mechanical contrivance.

4. Any person who shall use or permit or suffer any water supplied by the Council to be used or allow such water to run in a contravention of the provisions of this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in the case of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding \$10 for every day after notice of the offence from Council.

5. If any person supplied with water by the Council wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-Law the Council may (without prejudice to any remedy thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes through which water is supplied by the Council to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water, as provided by the Water Acts.

- (b) Fill, add to or cleanse any private swimming pool within the specified area.

No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any commercial market gardens, commercial nurseries or land used for the growing of green feed for commercial poultry farms within the specified area by means of fixed sprinklers except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10 a.m. of each day or by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.

4. No person shall with water supplied by the Trust, water any land comprising sports grounds, golf courses, racecourses, public and club bowling and croquet greens and public and club tennis courts within the specified area except by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand, and then only for a maximum period of 14 hours a week at times and under conditions to be determined by the Trust's Engineer.

5. No person shall wash a car within the specified area by means of a hose held in the hand.

6. Every person who uses or permits or suffers water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One Hundred Dollars.

7. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this by-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the *Water Act 1958*.

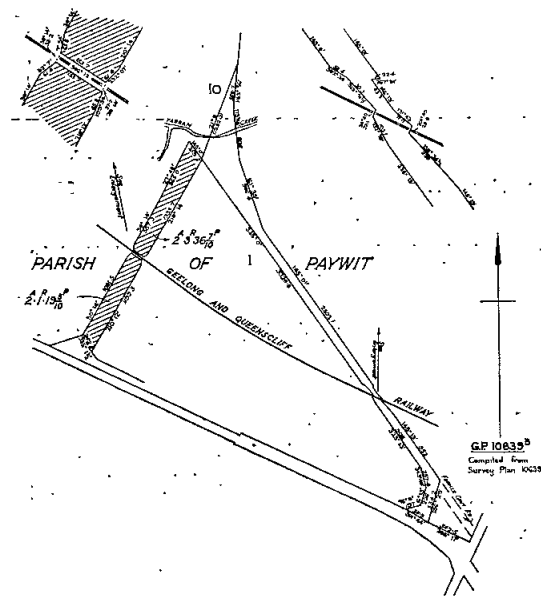

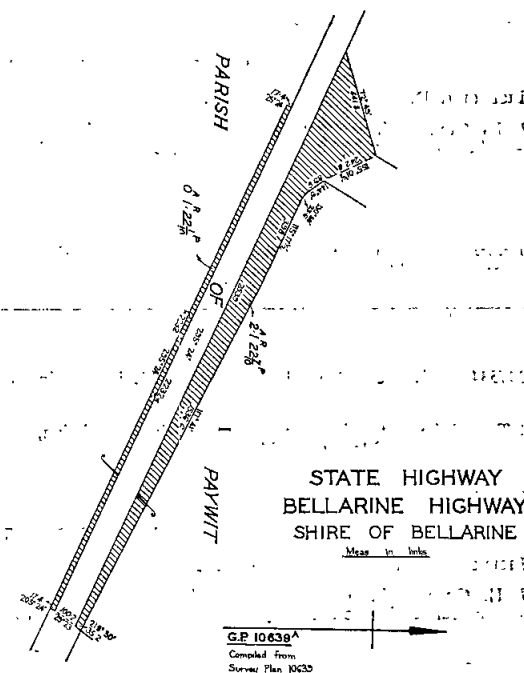

ON THE APPLICATION of (hereinafter referred to as the 'Applicant') and upon payment of the sum of _____ having been made, the TRUSTEES OF THE CHELTENHAM GENERAL CEMETERY have agreed to grant and do hereby grant to the said Applicant permission to dig or make a grave on the piece of ground 8 feet long by 4 feet broad lying within the portion of the said Cemetery appropriated for NON-DENOMINATIONAL burials and marked Section No. _____ on the map or plan of the said Cemetery, kept by the Trustees; and it is hereby declared that the said Applicant shall be entitled to have the grave maintained by the Trust according to the terms of this permission, for the sole and separate use of the said Applicant or her/his (or their) representatives forever, provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz.:—

FIRSTLY, that the piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said Applicant or her/his (or their) representatives solely as a burial place and no other use shall be made thereof.

FOURTHLY, notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Trustees shall be entitled at the request of the person holding the exclusive right of burial at any time before interment in the grave specified to cancel this Certificate and either refund to the Applicant the fee paid in respect thereof, or issue a similar certificate for a different grave.

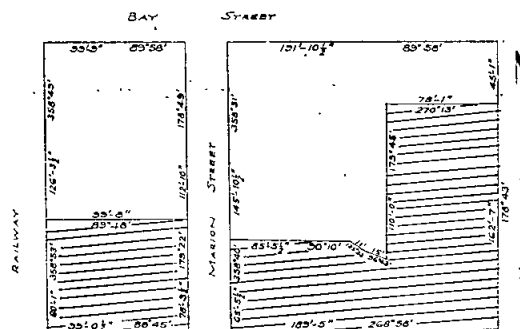

MOTOR CAR TRIALS OF SPEED AT SIMPSON'S LANE,
WARRNAMBOOL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (2) of Section 83 of the Motor Car Act 1958, that, if a motor car is used on a highway for purposes of racing or of trial of speed the driver or the person in charge thereof shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that the said sub-section (2) shall not apply to a motor car used as aforesaid on any highway or portion thereof specified by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette and on such days and during such hours as are specified in the Order:

Buckley-street, from Douglas-street to Noble-street.

Leonard-avenue, from Douglas-street to Noble-street—between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and twelve o'clock noon and between one o'clock and five o'clock in the afternoon of any day.

5. (1) No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, box, basket, crate, bag or other vehicle or receptacle standing or placed on any street, road, or public place within the municipal district of the City of Springvale on any day without the written permission of the Council.

(2) Any person applying for such consent shall—

(a) make application in writing to the Council;

(b) with his written application supply the following information—

(i) full name and address;

(ii) the name of any charitable organization interested in the application or on whose behalf it is made;

(iii) date and place of proposed sale; and

(iv) any other information required by the Council.

(3) The Council may either grant or refuse to grant the application as it sees fit.

6. Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$40 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which such an offence is continued after conviction or order by any Court.

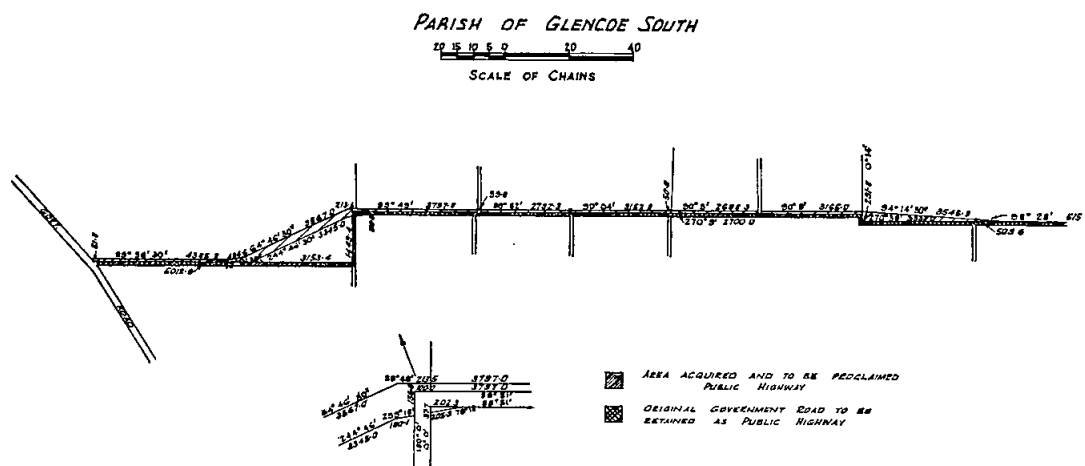

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria,
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II intituled the *Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Act 1967* (which Act is amended by the *Teaching Service (Amendment) Act 1968*), it is amongst other things enacted that the provisions of the *Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Act 1967* other than section 8 of the said Act shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my proclamation fix Wednesday the fifteenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight as the date upon which the provisions of *Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Act 1967*, other than section 8 of the said Act, shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
