*Motor Boating Act 1961.*

EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN BOATS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF PART II OF THE MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intituled the *Motor Boating Act 1961* (No. 6832), it is amongst other things enacted that Part II of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* (No. 6832) shall not apply to any class or type of boat specified in any Proclamation made by the Governor in Council and published in the *Government Gazette* as exempted for the time being from compliance with the provisions of that part which Proclamation the Governor in Council may at any time in the like manner revoke, amend or vary:

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation exempt from registration as provided by the said Part II of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*—

"All motor boats operated by Units of the Australian Sea Cadets Corps."

### PROCLAMATION

## PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF CROYDON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Croydon has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, used for streets be so declared to be public highways.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the State, do by this Proclamation declare that Gracedale Avenue coloured brown on Plans of Subdivision Nos. 28047, 34239 and 42263 and the un-named road coloured brown abutting the western boundaries of Lots 2 to 7 (both inclusive) on Plan of Subdivision No. 7088 lodged in the Office of Titles, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.





#### ROSEDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### BY-LAW No. 20.

THE Rosedale Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year, the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 22 cents per thousand gallons for any meter year, would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause, the charge is hereby fixed at 30 cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 22 cents per thousand gallons.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at \$10.00.

5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of Clauses 3, 4 and 5 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

## CITY OF DONCASTER AND TEMPLESTOWE.

## By-Law No. 49.

A By-Law of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe made under the *Health Act 1958* and the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 49 for the purpose of—

- Repealing By-Law No. 41 of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe.
- Regulating the keeping of any animals and the regulating and prohibiting of the keeping of any place or the storage of any things which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive to health or dangerous.
- Fixing subject to Part IV of the *Health Act 1958* the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal or store any such thing.
- Suppressing nuisances.
- Regulating the keeping of animals and birds and limiting the number of any such animals and birds kept on any property, and
- Generally for the good rule and government of the Municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and the *Local Government Act 1958* The Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe order as follows—

1. By-Law No. 41 of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe is hereby repealed.

2. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Dwelling” means and includes any building or structure used by people for the purpose of living therein.

“Area of property” means—

(a) In the case of a flat unit the total area of the property on which such flat unit is built divided by the number of flat units built thereon.

(b) In any other case the superficial horizontal area of such property.

“Dog” means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of three months.

“Cat” means and includes a cat of either sex over the age of three months.

"Horse" means and includes any mare, stallion, gelding, foal, pony, ass, mule, donkey or any other animal of the equidae family.

"Approved Material" means and includes masonry concrete reinforced concrete iron or any other hard and incombustible material approved by the Council.

"Battery cage" means a wire or metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

"Poultry House" means any building structure or enclosure where poultry is kept but does not include a battery cage nor any run attached to or connected with a poultry house.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe.

"Poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.

"Fowl" means a fowl six months or more old.

"Domestic Animal" means any goat, sheep, horse, dog or cat.

3. No person shall keep or permit or cause to be kept on any property situate within an area prescribed or zoned under any Town Planning Scheme or Interim Development Order of the Council or of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works as a residential zone more than two horses other than horses used for the drawing of vehicles or implements for trade purposes without a written permit issued by the Council.

4. No person shall keep more than 2 dogs or 2 cats on any property without a written permit issued by the Council.

5. No person shall keep any dog or dogs, cat or cats on any property in such a manner as to be offensive injurious to health or dangerous or so as to create a nuisance.

6. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property more than 12 birds or 12 fowls without a written permit issued by the Council.

7. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any horse used for trade purposes on any property having an area of less than three-quarters of an acre without a written permit issued by the Council.

8. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any animal other than a domestic animal on any property without a written permit issued by the Council.

9. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any domestic animal other than a dog or cat on any property having an area of less than three-quarters of an acre without a written permit issued by the Council.

10. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept more than one domestic animal other than a dog or cat for each three-quarters of an acre on any property of less than five acres but more than three-quarters of an acre without a written permit issued by the Council.

11. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any animal, other than a cat or dog on any property within a distance of 40' from the nearest point of any dwelling whether erected on that or any adjoining property.

12. No person shall keep or permit to be kept in any poultry house a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry house by four.

13. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any poultry on any property other than in a poultry house or battery cage which is—

(a) At least 75' distant from the boundary of the street or road to which the property has a frontage.

(b) At least 10' distant from any other street or road of a greater width than 25'.

(c) At least 6' distant from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25' or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land; and

(d) At least 30' distant from any dwelling whether erected on the same or any adjoining property.

14. No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any poultry house or battery cage or use any poultry house or battery cage unless—

(a) It is roofed with an approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to proper storm water drains adequate to take off the discharge of water to a proper lawful point of discharge;

(b) The grounds surrounding it are adequately and properly drained;

(c) The floor beneath it is built up so that the surface level shall be at least one inch above the surrounding ground level;

(d) The floor of it is paved with an impervious material;

(e) It is constructed of approved material.

15. Every poultry house or battery cage shall be rendered rat proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations of the structure to a depth of at least 18" below the ground level or to bedrock and all sides shall be constructed of rat proof material.

16. No person shall erect or cause to be erected or allow to remain erected or use any poultry house or battery cage exceeding 8' in height and having a total superficial horizontal area of more than 100 square feet and in the case where there is more than one poultry house or battery cage or both on any property the aggregate superficial horizontal area of such poultry houses or battery cages shall not exceed 100 square feet without a written permit issued by the Council.

17. The owner or occupier of any property on which poultry is kept shall—

(a) Keep the area of land within 10' of any poultry run, poultry house or battery cage free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin;

(b) Cause every poultry run, poultry house or battery cage to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as may be necessary;

(c) Keep every poultry run, poultry house or battery cage erected thereon in a clean, wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

18. No person shall burn any feathers, carcass or part of any poultry in such manner as to cause a nuisance or to be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

19. No person shall keep or store permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept in rat proof receptacles or rat proof buildings.

20. The owner or occupier of any property on which any dog is kept shall cause the place where such dog is kept to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

21. Any person applying for a permit under this By-Law shall—

(a) Lodge with the Council—

(i) An application in writing in the form of the First Schedule hereto;

(ii) A block plan of the property referred to in such application showing delineated thereon the portion of the said property on which it is intended to keep the dogs, animals or poultry;

(b) At least fourteen days before such application is lodged publish his intention to apply for such permit in a newspaper circulating within the Municipality of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe in the form of the Second Schedule hereto.

(c) Lodge a copy of such publication with the Council at the time that he makes the application aforesaid.

22. Any person interested in or affected by such application may object to the Council stating the grounds of his objection.

23. The Council shall before granting any such application consider all objections made thereto as aforesaid.

24. The Council may grant or refuse to grant such application and if the Council grants the application it shall issue a permit in the form of the Third Schedule hereto.

25. Any permit may be revoked or cancelled by the Council at any time if in its opinion the property by reason of the keeping of the number of dogs or animals/birds or poultry becomes offensive, injurious to health or dangerous or if by reason of any alteration to the property the Council is of the opinion that the permit should be revoked or if in its opinion there has been any breaches of this By-Law.

26. Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$40.00 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction by a Court.

27. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe.

#### SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

##### BY-LAW NO. 22.

##### *For Regulating the Keeping of Animals and Birds.*

A By-law of the Shire of Tullaroop made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and sections 92 and 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and numbered 22, for regulating the keeping of animals and birds.

##### PART 1.

##### *Introduction.*

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1958* the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Tullaroop in the name of the President Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district provided however that the owner or occupier of premises registered with the Council as poultry killing premises, poultry sale-yards, horse sale-yards, racecourses, trotting tracks, premises conducted by a veterinary surgeon and any other premises may apply in writing to the Council for exemption from the provisions of this By-law or any part thereof, which exemption the Council may grant subject to such terms and conditions as it from time to time imposes and which exemption may be withdrawn at any time by the Council giving one month's notice in writing to the applicant or his legal personal representative.

3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Animals" shall mean horses, cattle and dogs.

"Approved" means approved by the Council.

"Battery Cage" means a cage of metallic, plastic or other approved material divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

"Commercial Poultry Farm" shall mean any poultry farm situated within the area described in the Schedule hereto and application for registration of such premises as a "Commercial Poultry Farm" shall be lodged at the Tullaroop Shire Office not later than December 31st, 1967, if it is desired that the exemptions applicable to "Commercial Poultry Farms" in Part 2, Paragraphs 1 and 3 of this By-law are to apply to such premises.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Tullaroop.

"Dwelling" shall include a living room, sleep-out, caravan, tent and all rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.

"Litter" includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw, dry grass clippings, sawdust or other similar suitable clean material.

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Council and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Mature" when applied to poultry shall mean over twelve weeks of age.

"Person" shall include the owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises.

"Poultry" means fowls, turkeys, ducks, geese, pigeons and doves.

"Poultry Farm" means any premises on which there is kept at any time more than twenty-five head of mature poultry.

"Poultry House" means any structure in which poultry are housed or enclosed.

"Poultry Keeper" means any person who keeps more than twenty-five head of mature poultry.

"Registered Stable" shall mean any stable situated within the area described in the Schedule hereto and application for registration of such premises as a "Registered Stable" shall be lodged at the Tullaroop Shire Office not later than December 31st, 1967, if it is desired that the exemptions applicable to "Registered Stables" in Part 5, Paragraph 1 of this By-law are to apply to such premises.

"Stable" shall mean any premises or enclosure in which there is kept at any time more than one horse.

##### PART 2.

*This Part shall Apply to the Area described in the Schedule hereto.*

1. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any of the areas described in the Schedule hereto more than twenty-five head of mature poultry with the exception of the person on whose premises the business of a Commercial Poultry Farm was conducted before the coming into operation of this By-law, but such Commercial Poultry Keeper shall not be permitted to extend the area of his poultry farm nor erect any buildings or make any alterations or additions to any buildings already erected unless he first submits to the Council a plan of such erection alteration or addition and such erection alteration or addition is approved by the Council and is in accordance with the Council's Building Regulations.

2. Unless the mature poultry are confined in battery cages, the maximum number of mature poultry which shall be kept in any poultry house shall be such that the floor space for each mature head of poultry shall be at least four square feet.

3. No person other than the owner of any premises on which the business of a Commercial Poultry Keeper was carried on before the coming into operation of this By-law shall add to or extend any poultry house existing at the date of the operation of this By-law which would cause the poultry house to exceed one hundred square feet or conflict with the Council's Building Regulations.

4. Except on a "Commercial Poultry Farm", no person shall keep more than twelve mature turkeys, ducks or geese.

5. No person shall keep any poultry on any premises within the area described in the schedule hereto otherwise than in a poultry house or battery cages:—

(a) Distant at least seventy-five feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage.

(b) Distant at least ten feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five feet.

(c) Distant at least five feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five feet or from the boundary of any other adjoining allotment.

(d) Distant at least forty feet from any dwelling whether on the same or an adjoining allotment.

6. Every poultry house except a pigeon loft, dove cote or battery cage shall be roofed with approved materials and paved with approved impervious material and the surface material of the floor shall be at least three inches above the level of the ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six inches of litter.

7. Every poultry house except a pigeon loft, dove cote and battery cage shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brickwork, cement sheet or concrete around the foundation of the poultry house to a depth of at least eighteen inches below the level of the ground and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

8. Every pigeon loft, dove cote and battery cage—within any of the areas described in the schedule hereto—shall have a permanent roof and any walls shall be constructed of approved materials and have a floor raised at least three inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

9. Any person who owns or occupies more than one allotment within the area described in the schedule hereto shall be entitled to keep on each such allotment the number of mature birds provided for in paragraph 1 of this

part of this By-law unless such allotments adjoin each other in which case such allotments shall be considered as one.

### PART 3.

#### Provisions relating to Poultry Farms.

1. No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry house or battery cage.

2. When the number of mature birds is at any time greater than twenty-five every poultry house or battery cage shall be:—

- (a) Distant at least seventy-five feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage.
- (b) Distant at least ten feet from any other street.
- (c) Distant at least ten feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
- (d) Distant at least one hundred feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment of land excepting only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder houses not less than forty feet from his own dwelling.

3. Every poultry house or battery cage shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate storm water drains.

4. The ground surrounding every poultry house or battery cage shall be well drained.

5. The floor beneath any battery cage and the floor of any poultry house shall be such that the surface shall be at least three inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

### PART 4.

#### General Provisions relating to Poultry.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry is kept except those exempted by Part 1, paragraph 3 of this By-law.

1. The person responsible for the observance of this By-law shall keep the area of land within five feet of any poultry house or battery cage free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other material capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.

2. Such person shall cause the poultry house or battery cage to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean, wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

3. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

4. Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be removed from the premises from time to time as the Council or its Inspector directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.

### PART 5.

#### Stables.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which a stable is built except those exempted by Part 1, paragraph 2 of this By-law.

1. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises within any of the area defined in the schedule hereto more than one horse except in the case of premises on which a Registered Stable was established before the coming into operation of this By-law but such person shall not be permitted to extend the area of the Registered Stable or make any alterations or additions to any stable already erected unless he first submits to the Council a plan of such alteration or addition and such alteration or addition is approved by the Council and is in accordance with the Council's Building Regulations.

2. The owner or occupier of more than one allotment within the area described in the schedule hereto shall be entitled to keep on each allotment one horse unless such allotments adjoin in which case such allotments shall be treated as one allotment.

3. The owner or occupier of any land in the municipal district of the Shire of Tullaroop on which is erected any stable shall:—

- (a) Cause all manure, refuse and rubbish produced or accumulated thereon to be placed in a properly constructed receptacle of brickwork with walls 9 inches in thickness lined throughout internally with cement rendering compound

2½ parts of sand to 1 part of cement. Providing however that the Council may subject to any terms or conditions approve in writing—

- (i) any receptacle which was in use before the coming into operation of this By-law, or
- (ii) may approve a variation of the aforesaid specifications on the written application of the owner or occupier.
- (b) Maintain such receptacle in a good state of repair and prevent the escape or leakage of the contents thereof.
- (c) Keep such receptacle covered constantly and from time to time deodorize the receptacle and the contents thereof.
- (d) Cause the contents of such receptacle to be removed and satisfactorily disposed of at least once in every week.
- (e) Cause the floor of such stable to be properly drained and paved or flagged with brick, stone, concrete or other impervious material.
- (f) Keep such stable in a good state of repair and in a clean, wholesome and sanitary state and condition in the opinion of the Inspector.
- (g) Such stable shall be:—
  - (i) Distant at least seventy-five feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage.
  - (ii) Distant at least ten feet from any other street.
  - (iii) Distant at least ten feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land.
  - (iv) Distant at least forty feet from any dwelling whether on the same or an adjoining allotment.

### PART 6.

#### Miscellaneous.

1. No person shall allow, cause, permit or suffer any poultry to wander either at large or under control on any street vacant land or water course within any part of the area described in the Schedule hereto.

2. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept more than two dogs older than six months in the yard of or attached to any dwelling situated within any part of the area described in the Schedule hereto without the permission of the Council in writing.

3. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any swine in the yard of or attached to any dwelling situated within any part of the area described in the Schedule hereto without the permission of the Council in writing.

4. No poultry house or stable shall be placed in the yard of or attached to any dwelling unless a plan and description of such poultry house or stable is first submitted to and approved by the Council or any duly authorized officer thereof and the plan complies with the Council's Building Regulations.

5. Any poultry house or stable erected on or placed in the yard of or attached to any dwelling contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall be removed by the owner or occupier of such yard or dwelling within seven days after being required to do so by notice in writing given by the Shire Secretary or other duly authorized officer of the Council.

6. No occupier of any yard in which has been erected or placed any poultry house or stable or in which any animals or poultry are kept or housed shall leave or suffer to remain therein for a longer period than is absolutely necessary any waste food or other matter likely to become offensive or injurious to health or attract or harbour rodents or vermin.

7. Any animals or poultry which develop any infectious or contagious disease injurious to the health of mankind shall be forthwith destroyed or caused to be destroyed by the person keeping the same.

8. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any poultry or animals in any dwelling or in the yard of or attached to any dwelling in such manner as in the opinion of the Council or Inspector is offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

9. The owner or occupier of the yard of or attached to any dwelling in which any animals or poultry are kept or housed shall cause the place wherein such animals or poultry are kept to be maintained in a good state of repair and thoroughly cleansed and effectively deodorized from

time to time as may, in the opinion of the Inspector, be necessary for the purpose of keeping such place in a clean, wholesome and sanitary state and condition.

10. Any contravention of the foregoing sections by any act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

11. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding forty dollars and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than ten dollars but the total of such penalties shall not exceed two hundred dollars.

#### THE SCHEDULE HEREINBEFORE REFERRED TO.

The area in Carisbrook with the boundary commencing at the north end of Church-street; thence by lines leading respectively north-easterly along the Maryborough—Castlemaine Railway to Cameron-street, south-easterly along Cameron-street to Deep Creek, westerly and southerly along the Deep and McCallum Creeks to Camp-street, westerly along Camp-street to Talbot-Eddington main road, southerly along Talbot-Eddington road for a distance of ten chains, westerly along a line parallel to and ten chains south of Victoria-street to a point in line with Church-street and along Church-street, to the point of commencement.

##### BY-LAW NO. 23.

##### *Proceedings of Council By-law.*

A By-law of the Shire of Tullaroop, made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and Numbered 23 for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of meetings of the Council and meetings of Committees of the Council of the Shire of Tullaroop.

**IN** pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Tullaroop order as follows:—

(1) This By-law shall be known as the *Proceedings of Council By-law*.

(2) By-law Number 1 and that part of By-law Number 19 adopting Part XI of the 15th Schedule are hereby repealed.

(3) Such of the clauses of part XI of the 15th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* entitled "Regulation of Proceedings of Council, Officers, etc." as are set out hereunder are hereby adopted, namely:

Clause 1,  
Clauses 4–5 both inclusive,  
Clauses 8–30 both inclusive,  
Clauses 32–34 both inclusive,  
Clauses 36–39 both inclusive,  
Clauses 41–44 both inclusive,  
Clauses 46–51 both inclusive.

(4) (a) The Council may confirm the minutes of the proceedings of an ordinary or special meeting at that meeting.

(b) Unless the minutes of the proceedings of any meeting are confirmed at the meeting to which those minutes relate the same shall be confirmed at the next meeting of Council.

(5) At every meeting of the Council when the minutes of the proceedings of the preceding meeting have not been confirmed under the last preceding clause the first business thereof shall be:

(a) If a copy of the said minutes of the preceding meeting shall have been delivered to each Councillor at least forty-eight hours before such meeting, the putting of a question for the confirmation of such minutes.

(b) If a copy of the said minutes of such preceding meeting have not been so delivered the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation of such minutes.

No discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings and the said minutes shall then be signed as by law required.

(6) (a) After the confirmation of the minutes and the signing thereof as provided for in Clause 5 hereof, the business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that affect:—

(i) Resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meeting.

(ii) Reading the summary of correspondence referred to in Clause 7 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.

(iii) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

(iv) Presentation of reports and authorising of payments.

(v) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

(vi) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.

(vii) Notices of Motion.

(viii) Extraordinary business not elsewhere included.

(ix) Ordinary business not elsewhere included.

(b) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

(7) The Municipal Clerk shall prepare and place before each meeting of Council a summary of correspondence received since the last preceding meeting of Council.

(8) All notices of motion (where notice of motion is required by law to be given) shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the Municipal Clerk at the close of the meeting of Council, or at such time before the next meeting of the Council as will permit the Municipal Clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for special meetings, and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they are received.

(9) (a) A motion moved at a meeting of the Council need not be reduced to writing by the mover unless the Chairman of the meeting so directs.

(b) The Municipal Clerk shall cause to be recorded in the rough minutes all motions moved and seconded at a meeting of the Council.

(10) (a) It shall not be necessary to keep minutes of the proceedings of any committee.

(b) All reports of Committees shall contain a recommendation to the Council on the matters considered.

(11) The mover of every original proposition but not of any amendment shall (if he has not spoken on any amendment proposed to such original proposition) have a right of reply to be exercised at the conclusion of the debate (including debate on any such amendment) but save as aforesaid no Councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission is given to explain or unless for the purpose of calling the attention of the chair to a point of order. For the purposes of this clause a proposition shall be deemed to be an original proposition even though any amendment thereto has been carried.

(12) Every petition presented to the Council shall be in writing (Other than in pencil) typing or printing and shall contain the prayer of the Petitioners at the end thereof and shall be signed by at least one Petitioner on every sheet on which it is written.

(13) The common seal of the Council shall be kept by the Municipal Clerk in a safe place and shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of the Council and in the presence of the President and one other Councillor and the Municipal Clerk or in the presence of two Councillors and the Municipal Clerk.

(14) It shall be lawful for the Municipal Clerk to disburse such moneys as have been appropriated by the Council for the purposes of this clause, and as are required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the Council the sum of Fifty dollars.

(15) Any one or more of the rules or regulations in Clauses 4 to 13 both inclusive of this By-law or in those provisions of Part XI of the said 15th Schedule hereby adopted may be suspended for a particular purpose on notice of motion duly given or (without notice of motion) by a unanimous vote of the whole of the Councillors present at the meeting.

- (16) Every person found guilty of—  
 (a) Any wilful act of omission or commission of negligence or

(b) Any offence  
 contrary to any provisions contained in this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty dollars.





## VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION OF THE FLAT GLASS TRADES AS APPRENTICESHIP TRADES

## PROCLAMATION

- (j) Glass Embossing and Glass Sand-Blasting
- (k) Glass Bending:

AND WHEREAS the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria has recommended to the Minister that the said proclamation be varied in the manner following:

AND WHEREAS the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

NOW THEREFORE I, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation vary the aforesaid proclamation by substituting for the apprenticeship trades proclaimed thereby the trade of Flat Glass Working, in so far as it is carried on in the supply, servicing and/or fitting of flat glass and in the manufacture and repair of furniture, in the Metropolitan District.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 65 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1958* it is provided that on the recommendation of the Minister any portion of Victoria may be proclaimed a milk area by the Governor in Council: AND WHEREAS by paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of section 65 of the said Act it is provided that the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister may revoke, amend or vary any such proclamation: AND WHEREAS by paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 55 of the said Act it is provided that Part II of the said Act shall have effect as regards any milk area other than the Metropolitan Milk Area and the milk areas of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Castlemaine and Port Fairy on such day after the constitution thereof as is fixed by the Governor in Council: AND WHEREAS divers milk areas that from time to time have been so proclaimed have subsequently undergone alteration in status, in name or in boundaries in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1958*: AND WHEREAS it is desirable that it should be made patently clear as to which portions of Victoria are milk areas for the purposes of the said Act: NOW, THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Honorable the Minister of Agriculture of the said State do by this my proclamation—

I. REVOKE on and after the seventh day of August One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight the proclamations made heretofore in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 65 of the said Act or any corresponding section of any corresponding previous enactment;

II. DECLARE the portions of Victoria set out in the Schedule hereto to be milk areas as specified; and

III. I DO FURTHER DECLARE that the seventh day of August One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight shall be the day on which Part II of the said Act shall have effect in such milk areas and all Regulations and Orders made thereunder now in operation shall be of full force and effect in such milk areas.

## SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 14 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958*, No. 6409, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation specify a day being a day not less than thirty days after the publication of such proclamation from and after which any noxious weed specified in such proclamation shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in Victoria or in any part of Victoria described in the proclamation:







- (a) No tree shall be removed or soil disturbed in any way without the specific approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.
- (b) The crossing of streams and water courses within this category is permitted only by means of properly constructed crossings specifically approved for the particular site by the Soil Conservation Authority.

This category covers areas within a 10-chain radius of the offtake weir and within 1 chain, or such greater distance as the Authority may require, from the banks of specified streams, springs or watercourses.

## Category No. 2.

Land which shall be used for permanent forest where forestry operations shall be carried out only in accordance with management conditions made or approved by the Soil Conservation Authority. The construction of roads, dams or earthworks of any description are subject to the approval of the Authority.

## Category No. 3.


Land which may be developed for grazing or agricultural purposes, subject to Soil Conservation Authority approval and conditions for the particular circumstances, such conditions to include:—

- (a) the specification of areas which may be cleared and those which shall remain under forest;
- (b) the specification of areas where cropping may be practised and areas where grazing only may be practised;
- (c) the application of management and conservation practices where necessary.

4A. Land used or reserved for roads on which any changes in land-use shall be made only after consultation with the Soil Conservation Authority.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND  
MANAGEMENT OF THE YARRAYNE PUBLIC  
PURPOSES (CAMPING AND TOURIST PURPOSES)  
RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Yarrayne and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the sixth day of February, 1968, were reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Camping and Tourist purposes) together with the adjacent frontage to the Loddon River, as shown coloured green on plan Y/18.12.67 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.8930: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person in the Reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency or offence against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
2. No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
3. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun or any firearm, or other offensive weapon in or upon the Reserve.
4. No person shall in or upon the Reserve, kill wound, trap or snare or attempt to kill wound, trap or snare, any bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or have any dead bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or the skin or pelt thereof, in his possession.
5. No person shall—
  - (a) cut down, ringbark, destroy or damage any tree or plant growing on the Reserve;
  - (b) dig, cut, or remove any turf, sod, loam, sand or gravel or other substance in or on the Reserve.
6. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no person shall leave any fire which has been lighted by him until the same shall have been thoroughly extinguished.
- No refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve except by a representative of the Committee.
7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
8. No person shall erect any tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee or its representative, and any such tent, booth, stand, building, or other structure may be erected only on the site allotted by the Committee or its representative.
9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
10. The Committee shall have power, from time to time, by Resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for the use of the Reserve.
11. A charge fixed by the Committee may be made for the admission of any car or vehicle to the Reserve.
12. The Committee shall have power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle!

13. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work and duty.—(Rs.8930.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he, has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Nunawading and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 22nd day of November, 1967, were reserved as a site for Public Park: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

1. No person in the Reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency as regards dress, language or conduct.
2. No person shall, except in an area set apart for the purpose, play any game in which a hard ball is used or engage in any game or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance or danger to other persons using the Reserve.
3. (a) No person, except with a permit issued by the Committee, shall in the Reserve remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interfere with any rock, timber, tree, shrub, plant, wild flower or other vegetation or any sign, notice board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building, structure or any other thing of the like nature to any of the foregoing.
- (b) No person shall without a permit from the Committee, in writing, dig or remove from or take into the Reserve any gravel, stone, sand, soil or loam.
4. No person shall roll or throw any stone or other substance or missile within the Reserve.
5. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building, tent or booth without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
6. No person shall within the Reserve deposit or cause to be deposited (except in a receptacle provided for the purpose) any bottle, glass object, vessel or other container, broken glass, tins, waste paper, foodstuff, vegetable matter, offal or other refuse or litter.
7. No person shall intentionally break any glass, bottle or other container within the Reserve and in the event of breaking any glass, bottle or other container shall immediately gather the pieces up and place them in the receptacles provided.
8. No person shall offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale in the Reserve nor bring any intoxicating liquor thereon without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
9. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart for that purpose by the Committee.
10. No person shall place any bill or advertisement on any trees, buildings, seats or other equipment within the Reserve.

11. No person shall obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his work or duty.

12. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

13. No person shall bet publicly in the Reserve and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

14. No person shall in the Reserve, except in accordance with a written permit—

(a) Shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any bird or animal;

(b) have in his possession, carry or use any firearm, poison, trap or snare.

15. No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or any other animal without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless under effective control, without authority.

17. No person shall bring into the Reserve any motor car, motor cycle or any other vehicle without authority of the Committee.

18. (a) The Committee may, by clear notices or signs established in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserve or any part thereof.

(b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign, except with the authority of the Committee.

(c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.—(Rs.1564.)

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE KYABRAM RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Kyabram East and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 13th day of December, 1967, were reserved as a site for Racecourse and Recreation Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the Committee) with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the Public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, or other amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding \$1.50 may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any Club or association of Clubs on such terms and conditions as the Committee may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the ground so set apart.

3. Persons renting or hiring any portion of the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever and who make any charge to the Public for admission shall pay to the Committee such a fee as the Committee shall consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

4. No person shall enter, be, or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, and no person shall commit any nuisance therein or in any building thereon.

5. For the purpose of maintaining good order any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserve.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee chargeable for such admission.

7. No Club, association, society or person shall hold any entertainment, performance, or ceremony on any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall park a motor car or motor cycle or vehicle within the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose, and any person using such place for parking a motor car or motor cycle shall, on demand by an authorized officer of the Committee, pay such fee as is from time to time determined by the Committee, not exceeding 20c in respect of any such motor car or cycle for the use of any parking area on such days only as a charge for admission is being made as provided in clause 1 of these Regulations.

9. No person shall engage in training or in any game or sport in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any Club which is duly authorized to play in the Reserve at such time; provided, however, that such permission shall not be arbitrarily denied.

10. No person, club, or any other body using the Reserve shall damage any building therein or the furniture or fittings of such building, and in the event of such damage occurring during their occupancy thereof such person, club, or other body shall be responsible for such damage and shall pay to the Committee the cost of making good and repairing such building or fittings.

11. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break, or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs or pluck any flowers or walk on any beds or borders or climb, jump, get upon, or over any of the fences or gates or cut or in any way damage any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures or roll or throw stones or other missiles or leave any bottles, broken glass, papers, or any refuse or rubbish or car bodies or things whatever therein or post bills or advertisements on any of the trees, buildings, fences, gates, seats or other structures therein unless authorized by the Committee of Management.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

13. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the Committee, sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any articles of food or drink or any other commodity.

14. No person shall erect in the Reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

15. Children under the age of ten years not being under the control of some competent person may be removed from the Reserve.

16. No person shall solicit or gather money in the Reserve nor hawk or sell any articles or animal nor distribute any bills therein without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

17. No person shall dig or remove any sand, soil or other material from the Reserve.

18. No person shall camp in the Reserve or in any of the buildings therein authorized by the Committee of Management.

19. No person shall take any dog on any part of the Reserve when a race meeting or any other sports meeting is being held thereon, and no person shall at any time take or keep any dog on any part of the Reserve, unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord or other similar means.

20. No person shall drive, ride, or propel any motor car or other vehicle on or through the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.—(Rs.1446.)

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act 1958*, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as shown below:—

**PART V.—ALLOWANCES.****DIVISION II.—OVERTIME AND STAND-BY ALLOWANCES.**

Regulation 128 is revoked and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

"128. (1) Subject to these Regulations payment for overtime work shall be made for all time worked in excess of the ordinary hours of duty. Any question as to the ordinary hours of duty of any officer shall be determined by the Board.

(2) Officers working overtime must record, in the usual manner, the time of ceasing duty. A record must also be kept by the officer in charge showing—

- (a) the date on which the overtime was worked,
- (b) the name of the officer,
- (c) the nature of the work,

- (d) the time taken for tea,
- (e) the time of departure, and
- (f) the authority for working the overtime.

(3) An officer in receipt of a standard salary in excess of that prescribed for the top subdivision of Class "B1", Administrative Division, shall not be eligible to receive payment for overtime worked.

(4) In computing overtime each day's work shall stand alone: Provided that any continuous period of overtime that extends after midnight shall be considered as having been performed on the day the overtime commenced.

(5) The following overtime rates shall be paid for work performed outside the ordinary hours of duty:—

*Monday to Saturday inclusive.*

Officers whose ordinary weekly hours of duty are 38 hours—at the rate of time and a half of the ordinary rate.

Officers whose ordinary weekly hours of duty are in excess of 38 hours—at the rate of time and a half of the ordinary rate for the first 3 hours and double time thereafter.

*Sunday.*

In all cases—at the rate of double time.

*Public Holidays.*

Where the time worked does not exceed the ordinary daily hours of duty—at the rate of ordinary time additional.

Where the time worked is in excess of the ordinary daily hours of duty—at the rate of double time.

(6) Unless otherwise determined by the Board, officers whose ordinary hours of duty are less than 38 hours a week shall be entitled to payment of overtime rates only for the time worked in excess of daily hours deriving from a 38-hour week.

(7) Overtime payments for work performed additional to the hours of a rostered shift of ordinary duty shall be as prescribed in sub-regulation (4) of Regulation 136.

(8) The hourly rates of payment for overtime shall be determined in accordance with the following formulae, but in no case shall the hourly rate exceed that calculated on an annual actual salary appropriate to the standard salary prescribed for the top subdivision of Class "C2", Administrative Division:—

(a) Time and a half rate—

$$\frac{\text{Actual fortnightly salary}}{\text{Fortnightly ordinary hours of duty}} \times \frac{3}{2}$$

(b) Double time rate—

$$\frac{\text{Actual fortnightly salary}}{\text{Fortnightly ordinary hours of duty}} \times \frac{2}{1}$$

(9) "Standard salary" means salary excluding any additional amount payable under the provisions of Regulation 87.

(10) Actual fortnightly salary shall be determined as follows:—

$$\frac{\text{Annual salary (including any additional amount payable under the provisions of Regulation 87)}}{365\frac{1}{2}} \times \frac{14}{1}$$

(11) The provisions of this Regulation other than sub-regulation (3) shall not apply in such special cases as may be approved by the Board.

(12) Unless otherwise directed by the Board, the Permanent Head shall forward to the Board a quarterly return showing overtime worked in each branch or section during the preceding quarter, the reasons for requiring the overtime to be worked and the amounts of allowances paid.

(13) The Permanent Head may, on the application of an officer, grant such officer time-off in respect of overtime work performed by him. No time-off shall be granted in respect of any overtime for which payment is made."

**DIVISION IV.—OTHER ALLOWANCES.****ROSTERED TIME OF ORDINARY DUTY PERFORMED BY OFFICERS DURING WEEK-ENDS OR ON PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.***Regulation 136.*

(i) his full name and address;

(ii) the date and times between which he proposes to use such wireless set amplifying equipment gramophone piano, piano-player or any other instrument or contrivance;

(iii) the purpose for which he desires to use such electrical wireless set amplifying equipment gramophone piano piano-player or any other instrument or contrivance;

(iv) the name of the public highway involved; and

(c) supply any other information the Council of the City of Moe may desire.

4. The Council of the City of Moe may grant the application either subject to conditions or not or refuse the same as it sees fit.

5. distance from boundaries other than frontage specified in Column 3 of said Table 804 is hereby adopted as the minimum distance from boundaries other than frontage from which a building of Class I or Class II shall be constructed in those portions of the Municipal District coloured green on the Area Map."

For sub-clause (3) of Clause 6 the following is substituted—

"(3) The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in Column 2 of said Table 804 are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I or II Occupancy shall be constructed in those portions of the Municipal District coloured pink on the Area Map."

The minimum distance from frontage and distance from boundaries other than frontage specified in Column 2 of said Table 804 are hereby adopted as the minimum distance from frontage and distance from boundaries other than frontage from which a building of Class I or Class II shall be constructed in those portions of the municipal District coloured pink on the Area Map PROVIDED THAT in the case of any land having a frontage to any of the following streets, namely Alexandra Avenue, Toorak Road, Malvern Road, High Street, Dandenong Road, Williams Road, Wattletree Road, Orrong Road, Kooyong Road, within those portions of the Municipal District coloured pink on the Area Map the minimum distance from frontage is hereby specified as 25 feet."
