MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.—SECTION 4 (1)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Gordon has been appointed the Authority in respect of Little Lake Boort:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Gordon has recommended that the use of certain parts of the waters of Little Lake Boort be set aside and/or prohibited for certain classes of boating or similar activity:

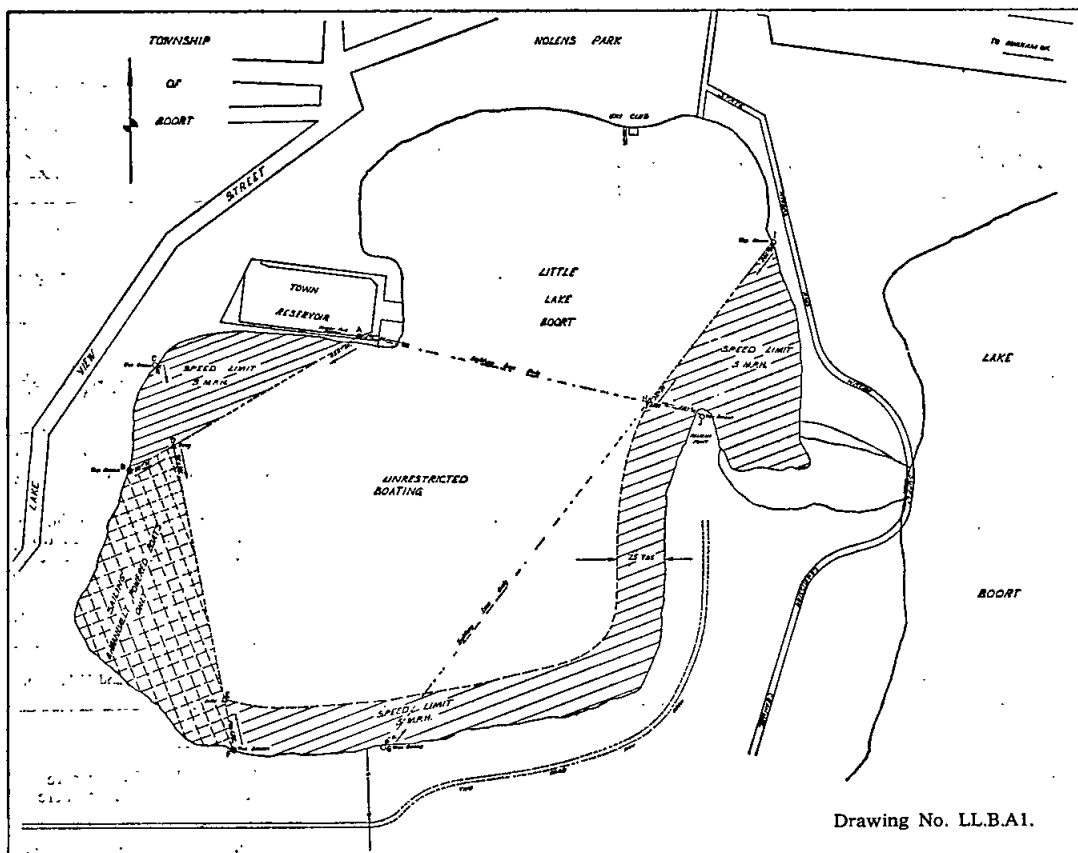
NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, do by this my Proclamation—

1. Set aside the use of those parts of the waters of Little Lake Boort south and west of the line defined in the Schedule hereto for sailing boats or manually powered boats and prohibit the use of the said waters for motor boats.
2. Set aside the use of those parts of the waters of Little Lake Boort not specified in paragraph 1 of this Proclamation for all classes of boating.
3. The boundaries of all waters specified herein shall be marked on the shore by beacons and on the water by buoys.

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at Beacon 'B' on the western shoreline; thence 75 yards on a bearing of 58° magnetic to Buoy 'D'; thence on a bearing of 177° magnetic to Beacon 'F' on the south-western shoreline.

The Reference Datum for positions referred to in this Proclamation shall be the post marked Beacon 'A' on Drawing No. LL.B.A1 hereunder, being the southern post of the splay on the fenceline on the south-eastern corner of the Town Reservoir.

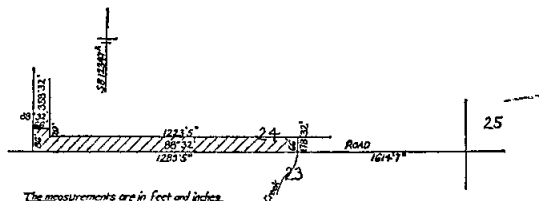
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, reserved for a street be so declared to be a public highway.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the State, do by this Proclamation declare that portion of Main Street, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway.

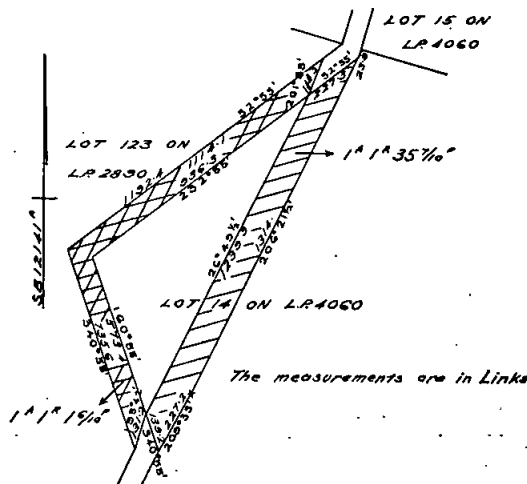

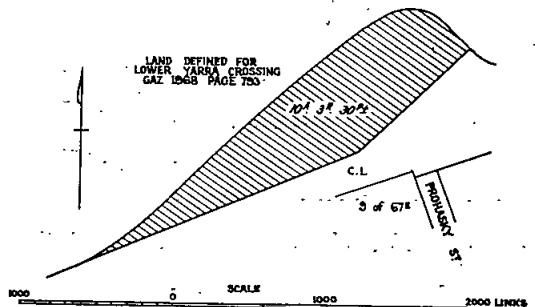

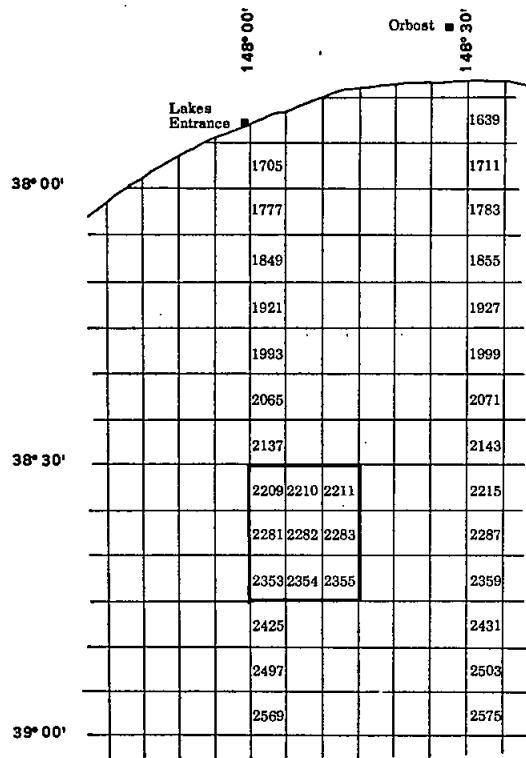

BY-LAW No. 6.

THE Gembrook-Cockatoo-Emerald Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust:—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed at a quantity which if charged at FORTY CENTS per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at FORTY CENTS per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at FORTY CENTS per thousand gallons.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed as follows:—

In no case shall the minimum annual charge be less than an amount equal to the district rate in the \$1 on the value of the house and surrounding one acre of land.

5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

6. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this By-law shall not apply to any land or tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1968.

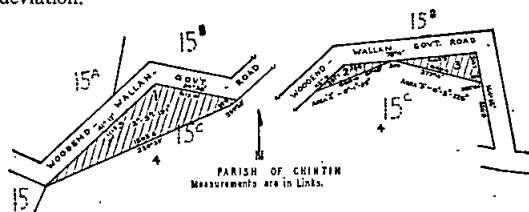

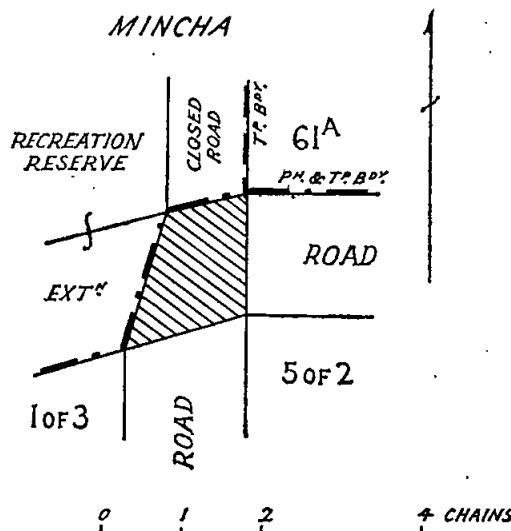

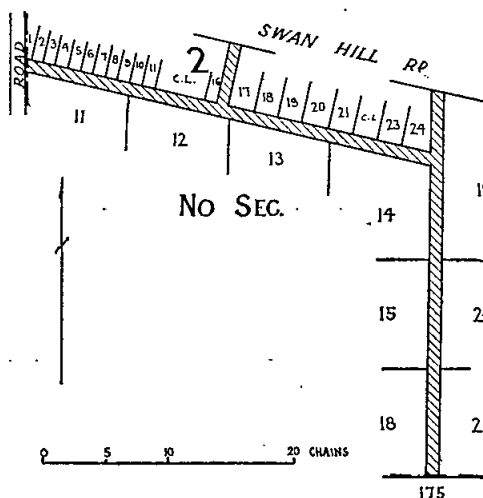

CLASSES OF PIPELINES EXCLUDED FROM THE
PROVISIONS OF THE PIPELINES ACT 1967.

WHEREAS in paragraph (d) of the interpretation of "Pipeline" in section 3 of the Pipelines Act 1967 it is stated that a pipeline or part thereof or a pipeline of a class of pipelines excluded from the provisions of the said Act by Order of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette shall not be a pipeline within the meaning of the said Act:

Now therefore in pursuance of the said power of exclusion conferred by the Pipelines Act 1967 His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order exclude the following classes of pipelines from the provisions of the Pipelines Act 1967:—

CLASSES OF PIPELINES EXCLUDED FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE PIPELINES ACT 1967.

WHEREAS in paragraph (d) of the interpretation of "Pipeline" in Section 3 of the *Pipelines Act 1967* it is stated that a pipeline or part thereof or a pipeline of a class of pipelines excluded from the provisions of the said Act by Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* shall not be a pipeline within the meaning of the said Act:

AND WHEREAS an Order was made on 5th March, 1968, excluding certain classes of pipelines:

AND WHEREAS it has become necessary to amend such Order:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, revoke the Order made on 5th March, 1968, and do by this Order exclude the following classes of pipelines from the provisions of the *Pipelines Act 1967*—

1. Pipelines situated partly within the properties mentioned in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (c) of the said interpretation of "Pipelines" in section 3 of the *Pipelines Act 1967*, where—

- (a) the length of the pipelines situated outside the relevant property is not greater than 100 feet;
- (b) the diameter of the pipeline is not in any place greater than four inches;
- (c) the operating pressure in respect of the pipeline is not greater than 50 pounds per square inch gauge; and
- (d) the thing conveyed through the pipeline is a hydrocarbon in liquid state with a vapour pressure at operating temperature not greater than 15 pounds per square inch.

2. Pipelines used for the delivery of petroleum products from railway tankers to storage tanks, where—

- (a) the length of the pipeline outside the property of the Victorian Railways Commissioners or of the storage premises is not greater than 250 feet in any one place;
- (b) the diameter of the pipeline at any place outside the property of the Victorian Railways Commissioners or the storage premises is not greater than four inches;
- (c) the operating pressure of the pipeline is not greater than 50 pounds per square inch gauge; and
- (d) the thing conveyed through the pipeline is a hydrocarbon in liquid state with a vapour pressure at operating temperature not greater than 15 pounds per square inch.

3. Pipelines conveying hydrocarbons to or from any port or an installation in any port to a bulk storage where—

- (a) the pipeline is not greater than five miles in total length and is—
 - (i) wholly within an area under the control of a Harbour Trust or a Port Officer and subject to the control of that Trust or that Port Officer.
 - (ii) partly within an area under the control of a Harbour Trust or a Port Officer and subject to the control of that Trust or that Port Officer.
 - (iii) partly within an area under the control of a Harbour Trust or a Port Officer and subject to the control of that Trust or that Port Officer, partly on property of the Victorian Railways Commissioners and subject to the control of the said Commissioners and partly within premises used as a bulk storage.
- (b) the length of the pipelines lying outside the areas described in paragraph (a) and not otherwise subject to regulation by the Authorities described in paragraph (a), is not greater than 250 feet in any one place; and

- (c) the thing conveyed through the pipeline is a hydrocarbon in liquid state with a vapour pressure at operating temperature not greater than 15 pounds per square inch.

4. Pipelines connecting bulk storages where the length of the pipeline outside any storage premises is not greater than 250 feet in any one place.

5. Pipelines connecting bulk storages and factories where the length outside the limits of the premises of such bulk storages and factories is not greater than 250 feet in any one place.

For the purposes of this Order—

"Bulk storage" means bulk storage within the meaning of the *Inflammable Liquids Act 1966*.

"Factory" means factory within the meaning of the *Labour and Industry Act 1958*.

"Port Officer" means a port officer appointed within the meaning of the *Marine Act 1958*.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LEITCHVILLE RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Gunbower West and described in the Government Gazettes of the 6th July, 1938, and the 3rd November, 1943, were reserved as sites for Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twenty in any one year) as the Reserve or any part thereof may be set apart for horse racing, cricket, or football matches, fêtes, sports, or other amusements, on any of which occasions the fees set out hereunder may be charged and taken for the admission of each adult to the Reserve:—

(a) On such days as the Reserve or any part thereof may be set apart for horse racing, a sum not exceeding \$5.00.

(b) On such days as the Reserve or any part thereof may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or other amusements, a sum not exceeding \$2.00.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein, without the permission of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind.

5. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, amusements or sports and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

6. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve or any portion thereof for any purpose whatsoever and who make any charge to the public for admission to the Reserve shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the said Committee, but shall not exceed the sum of \$21.00 per day.

7. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Minister of Lands.

8. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. And for the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958.

9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

11. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained at least seven days prior to such entertainment or event.

12. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, nor in or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

13. No person shall carry on the trade, business or calling of a bookmaker, except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

14. No person shall play, practice or engage in any sport or game on Sunday, before 1 p.m., if that game or sport be organized for profit to any individual, body or institution.

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Twenty dollars (\$20.00), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by such Committee.

16. Persons obtaining from the Committee of Management the key to any gate, door, stand, building or enclosure to, in or upon the Reserve on any occasion whatsoever may be required to deposit with such Committee the sum of Two dollars for each key so obtained. Such deposit will be refunded on the return of the key, undamaged, to the said Committee.

17. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

18. No persons or person shall park a motor car or motor cycle within the Reserve, except at such parking areas as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and every person using such parking area shall, on demand, pay a fee not exceeding Twenty cents per motor car or motor cycle per day for entrance to and use thereof on such days as a charge is being made for admission as provided in clause 1.

19. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall ride or drive any horse or vehicle of any kind in or through the Reserve, except as herein provided, without the permission of the Committee of Management, and no person shall ride any bicycle or motor bicycle therein, except on the tracks set apart for the purpose.

20. No person shall behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency in the Reserve or the buildings therein, and any person found in a state of intoxication or otherwise offending against this Regulation shall be liable to be forthwith removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding that such person shall have purchased a ticket for admission thereto, and shall also be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

21. No male person other than a boy under the age of seven years shall enter or use any playground, oval, place, room, or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any playground, place, room or building set apart for the use of males.

22. No person other than the players and officials connected with any game (football, cricket, tennis, golf, bowls or hockey), and other than any competitor at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such games and sport.

23. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or tablet, or any support, fastening, or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any regulation or notice and fixed or set up by the Committee of Management on the Reserve.

24. No person shall affix, print, post, paint or cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.

25. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any sport, including tennis, football, golf, cricket, hockey or any other game or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose and then only subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine.—(Rs.3361.)

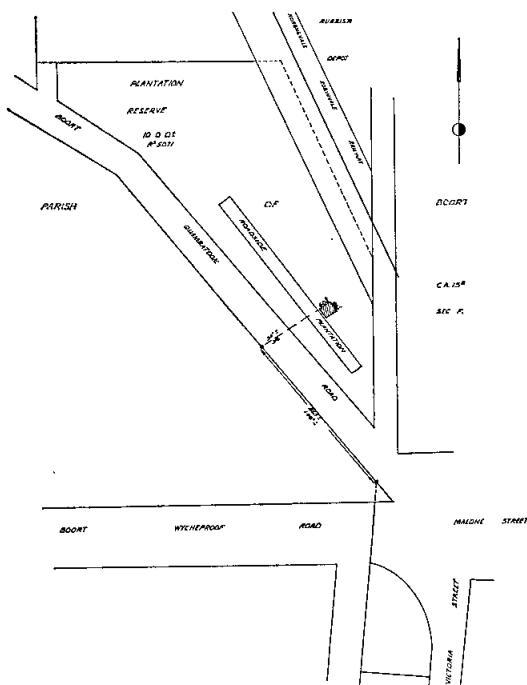
