

### APPRENTICESHIP ACT 1958. .

### VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION OF THE ENGINEERING TRADES AS APPRENTICESHIP TRADES.

WHEREAS Section 13 of the Apprenticeship Act 1958 provides, inter alia, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades and that the Governor in Council (whether with or without any recommendation of the said Commission) may by Proclamation at any time revoke, amend or vary any such Proclamation: such Proclamation:

- (a) the Metropolitan District on the 26th March, 1936;



- 3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 25 cents per thousand gallons.
- 4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at thirteen dollars fifty cents.
- 5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.
- 6. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this By-law shall not apply to any land, tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.



- A By-law of the Shire of Upper Murray made under Section 781 of the Local Government Act 1958 and every other power enabling it in that behalf and numbered 27 for:—
  - (a) Regulating the market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto.
  - (b) For the fixing of the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the Local Government Acts the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Upper Murray (hereinafter referred to as the "Council") order as follows:—

### 1. Operation of By-law

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipality of the Shire of Upper Murray and shall come into operation on the 18th day of September, 1968.

The ordinary day of holding the Market shall be on the last Friday in each month for cattle, but the market shall be open for the receipt and for the sale of such animals as the Council shall permit to be sold therein on such days during the year and for such hours during each day between sunrise and sunset as the Council may from time to time determine except Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays, on which days no business shall be transacted therein. therein.

### 3. Special Sales

(a) Special Sales may be held on any day between sunrise and sunset except Market days and the Thursday preceding a Market Day, or Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays. If any applicants apply simultaneously they shall draw lots to decide who has prior right to conduct a Special Sale, or in default the Inspector shall draw for them.

(b) The Council may grant the use of any specified section of the Market to any auctioneer, agent or firm for any day which is not a regular market day provided that at least 7 day's notice is given to the Council and such application is accompanied by a deposit of \$50. Agents shall not be permitted to sell in conjunction on regular market days unless the Inspector is notified of such intention prior to the draw.

6. Sales Before and After Opening or Closing of Market No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the Market any animals before the hour of opening or after the hour of closing the Market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council as a day upon which the Market will be open without the sanction in writing of the Council or some person authorised by the Council in that behalf.

### 7. Inspector

There shall be appointed by the Council an Inspector for the said Market whose duty shall be as follows:—

- (a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of the Local Government Acts relating to Markets are duly observed.
- (b) To preserve order and regularity in the Market.
- (c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing animals to the Market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such Inspector to be most

### 8. Payment of Dues

Any person placing any animal in the Market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon and all such tolls and dues chargeable under the Special Order of the Council for the time being in force shall be payable within 48 hours of the closing of the Market, unless an agreement is made with the Council to pay accounts monthly. The Council shall demand, receive and have of and from every person selling any animal in the Corryong Municipal Market, and from every person selling any animal in any licensed yards or premises within the Municipal District the several sums of money as and for tolls and dues as may be fixed from time to time by Special Order of the Council.

### 9. Interference with Council's Officers

No person wilfully resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector, Officers of the Council or any of their assistants in the discharge of his or their duty shall independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed an offence against this By-law.

### 10. Removal of Animals

No animals shall be taken out of the Market by any person without the written authority of the auctioneer selling the same, and any person taking out of the Market any such animals without such written authority shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

### 11. Gates not to be Opened, etc.

No person shall wilfully open any gate or lock or fastening of any gate, or open or break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings or appurtenances of the said Market, nor cause any riot or distrubance, or curse or swear or use any indecent language or be guilty of any indecent or gross conduct within the said Market or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

### 12. Commencing Times of Sales at Regular Markets

The sale of cattle yarded will commence at 12 noon. All sales must be punctually commenced and must conclude without any breaks or adjournments. If and when more than one sale is being conducted at the same time, each sale shall be conducted in a separate yard and in each case as and where the Council or the Inspector shall direct

13. Lots to be Drawn for Priority of Sale

At 12 noon on the day preceding each regular Cattle Market there shall be a drawing of lots by auctioneers desirous of selling in the Market for priority of sale.

In the event of the day preceding the regular cattle market being a public holiday the drawing of lots shall take place at 12 noon on the preceding Wednesday.

Any auctioneer proposing to sell at the Market shall before any drawing takes place furnish the Inspector with the number of the various kinds of animals he intends to offer for auction. In the case of any auctioneer being absent at the time of any drawing the Inspector shall, as soon as possible after the conclusion of each ballot for priority of sale, post a list in some conspicuous part of the Market showing the names of the auctioneers in the several positions of priority and the time allotted to each auctioneer for selling. The Inspector shall have full each auctioneer for selling. The Inspector shall have full control over the allotment of pens and the allotment of selling time and his decisions shall be final.

### 14. Time Limit on Sales

The following limits of time shall be allowed each auctioneer to offer the various classes of animals:—

Fat Cattle: Not less than 240 cattle per hour Store Cattle: 2 minutes per pen
Dairy Cattle: Not more than 1½ mins. per head
Bulls: ½ minute per head
Fat Pigs: 1½ mins. per pen
Store Pigs: 2 mins. per pen

When the time allotted to any auctioneer has elapsed the Inspector shall sound a whistle at the pen where the auctioneer is selling. On finishing a lot under the hammer such auctioneer must immediately cease selling.

15. Auctioneers failing to complete in Time Allotted

In the event of any auctioneer failing to complete his sales in the allotted time he shall be allowed time for the sale of the remainder of his animals after all auctioneers have completed the time allotted to them for each such class, and the order of priority of selling shall be in accordance with the original draw.

### 16. Auctioneers not proceeding on Time

### 18. Miscellaneous

- (c) Agents will be permitted to draft in the Store Cattle yards on the day prior to Special Sales only with the prior approval of the Inspector.
- (d) Placards erected at the Market before or during the course of a sale must be removed by the Agents concerned immediately after the close of the sale.
- (e) No animals shall be left in the yards other than on Market days without the consent of the Inspector.

Matters submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 9, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or, at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.

### THE "VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE".

Subscriptions.—The subscription, including postage, is \$10 per annum, or \$5 per half year, payable in advance.

Subscriptions are required for whole months, and must cover at least a half year.

Single copies are 20 cents, posted 25 cents. Subscribers do not receive the Acts of Parliament with the GAZETTE.
