AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

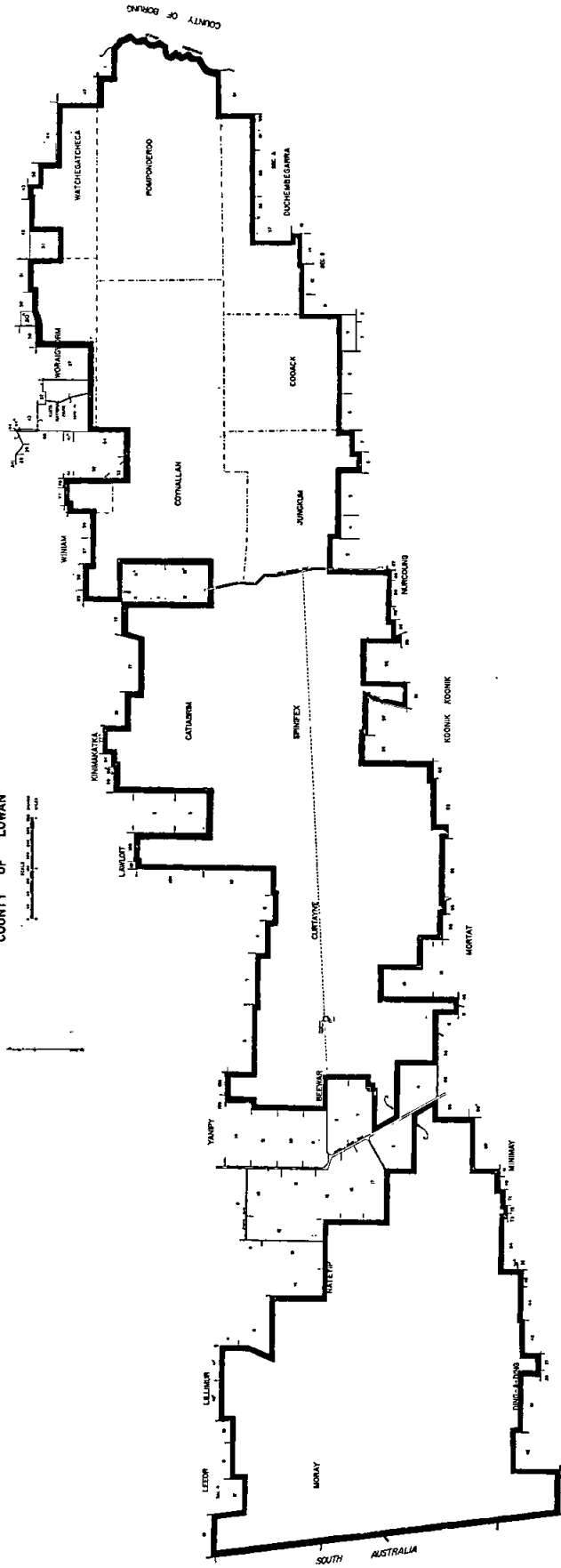

PROCLAMATION

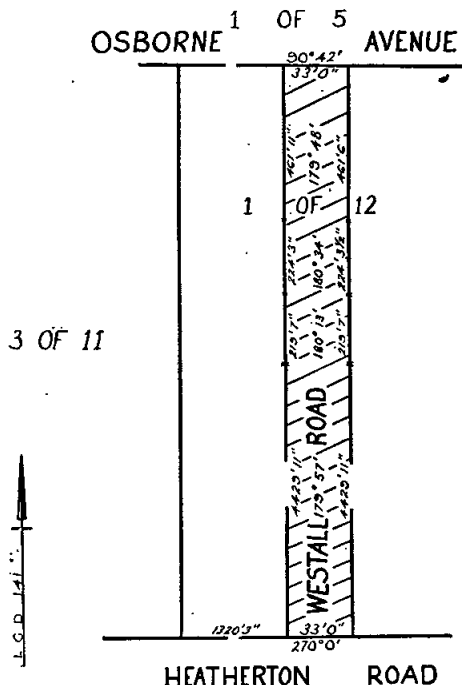
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to

be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the City of Oakleigh has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street, road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Westall Road shown hatched on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust:—

- (A) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 15 cents per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
- (B) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 15 cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

4. The provisions of Clause 3 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the *Water Act 1958*.

THE Rochester Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. #### LEXTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1968-1969.

THE Lexton Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts* doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Seventeen and one half cents in the dollar of the Net Annual Value of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Lexton Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Seventeen dollars, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of October 1968, and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of March, 1969, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at a quantity which, at a charge of Thirty-four cents per 1000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such properties for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Thirty-four cents per 1000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the Office of the Trust.

#### BEALIBA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1969.

THE Commissioners of the Bealiba Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Seven cents in the dollar on the annual municipal valuation of the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Bealiba Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Seven dollars and fifty cents (\$7.50), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Two dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on 1st day of January, 1969, and shall be payable on the 5th day of March, 1969, at the office of the Trust, Dunolly.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year, without further charge to any property rated by the Trust, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Thirteen cents per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Thirteen cents per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Twenty cents per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 37,500 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Dunolly.

## MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1969.

THE Mansfield Waterworks Trust in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a by-law as follows:—

1. The Trust hereby makes and levies a rate in respect of all the lands and tenements within the Mansfield Urban District of seven and one half cents in the dollar on the net annual value set out in the valuation at present in force of such lands and tenements for the purposes of the municipal rate of the Shire of Mansfield which is hereby adopted as the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively.

2. Such rate shall be made and levied upon the occupiers and owners of such lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1969, and shall be payable on the 1st day of March, 1969, at the office of the said Trust.

3. In no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than one dollar and fifty cents.

## THE ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1969.

THE Elmore Waterworks Trust in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act* doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Eleven cents in the dollar of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements to be rated within the Elmore Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount payable in respect of any tenement (other than land upon which there is no building) be less than Fifteen dollars and in respect of any land upon which there is no building be less than Four dollars.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing 1st January 1969, and shall be payable on the 14th day of March 1969.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which at the charge of Twenty cents per 1,000 gallons would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust, in excess of the quantity computed as in the preceding paragraph is hereby fixed at Twenty cents per 1,000 gallons and the charge for such water shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipe by measure shall be at the rate of One dollar per 1,000 gallons with a minimum charge of Fifty cents.

The charge for water supplied to water troughs shall be at the rate of Fifteen dollars per trough per annum and water used in excess of the allowance shall be charged for at the excess rate of Twenty cents per 1,000 gallons.

## SHIRE OF HEYTESBURY WATERWORKS TRUST.

## By-Law No. 1.

THE Shire of Heytesbury Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-Law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter

year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where a meter has been installed in any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at twenty five cents per thousand gallons for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

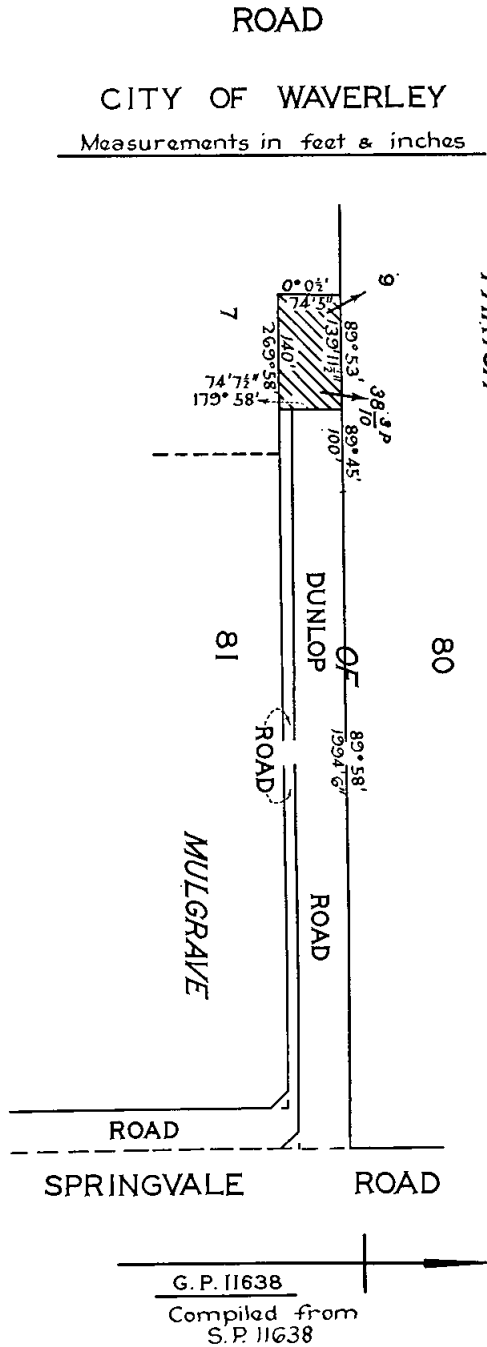
