

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, Section WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor-in-Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.







Legal Profession Practice Act 1958. SOLICITORS' (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE) RULES.

- 2. Save as otherwise hereinafter declared these Rules shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
- 3. Rule 2 of the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules is amended—
 - (a) by substituting in paragraph (b) of sub-rule (3) the words "not more than four times in the aggregate during a period of not more than one month before and one month after" for the words "during a period of not more than one month before and three months after" and the words "a newspaper or newspapers circulating in that district" for the words "a newspaper published in and circulating principally in that district";
 - (b) by deleting in paragraph (c) of sub-rule (3) the word "principally";
 - (c) by inserting after paragraph (e) of sub-rule (3) the following paragraph:-
 - "(f) an advertisement published in accordance with any of the preceding paragraphs shall not occupy a space in the newspaper or other publication exceeding one and one half inches in depth by a column in width nor be published in such a position or in such type as to give undue prominence to the advertisement.";
 - (d) by inserting after sub-rule (4) the following

sub-rule:—

"(5) As from the 1st day of January 1970 a solicitor shall not except with the express permission of the Council exhibit or permit on or in the vicinity of any premises in which he carries on practice any sign or name plate on which the individual letters in the word "solicitor" or the words "barrister and solicitor" or any word or words indicating that the occupant of the premises is engaged in legal practice exceeds two inches in height or one inch in width."

m THE}$ Toora Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth make a By-Law as follows: \longrightarrow

- 1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.
 - 2. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust-
 - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge in the respective Urban Districts is hereby fixed at a quantity which if charged at the amount per thousand gallons for any meter year as is set out in Column 2 opposite the name of the respective Urban Districts in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto, would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
 - (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at the amount per thousand gallons for any meter year as is set out in Column 3 opposite the name of the respective Urban Districts in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto.
- 3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the amount per thousand gallons as is set out in Column 4 opposite the name of the respective Urban Districts in Column 1 of the said Schedule.
- 4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the amount as is set out in Column 5 opposite the name of the respective Urban Districts in Column 1 of the said Schedule.
- 5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.
- 6. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3, and 4 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

SWAN HILL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

BY-LAW NO. 4 (RATING).

THE Swan Hill Sewerage Authority in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Act 1958, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

1. Pursuant to the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Act 1958, Section 87 (4) the Swan Hill Sewerage Authority hereby fixes the following sums which shall be the minimum amount of rate to be paid annually by the owner or occupier of any rateable sewered property on which there is a building at twenty five dollars (\$25) and in respect of any rateable sewered property on which there is no building sixteen dollars (\$16.00).

2. Such minimum rate is made and shall be levied for

2. Such minimum rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1969 and in each and every subsequent year and ending on the thirty first day of December of that year and shall be payable at the office of the Authority, situated at the Town Hall, Swan Hill.

3. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid rate becomes during the said year a "sewered property" there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.

4. Such person or persons as the Swan Hill Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates.











STATE HIGHWAY KIEWA VALLEY HIGHWAY SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH



Cemeteries Act 1958.

WARRACKNABEAL PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Cemeteries Act 1958, the trustees of the Warracknabeal Public Cemetery make the following Regulations, and with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following scale of fees:—

Part 1.-General.

- 1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter— $\,$
 - "Cemetery" means the Warracknabeal Public Cemetery.
 - "Memorial work" means manual work (including the writing of inscriptions) in connexion with any building, tomb, vault, tombstone, kerbing or other structure erected or placed on or in any place of burial.
 - "Trustees" means the Trustees of the Warracknabeal Public Cemetery.
- 2. The Secretary shall exercise general supervision and control over the Cemetery and be responsible to the Trustees for its administration, carry out such work and to receive orders on behalf of the Trustees.
- 3. A person who carries out work within the Cemetery, whether or not he is carrying out the work for the Trustees, shall carry out the work in as short a time as is possible and shall obey directions given to him by the officer in charge or other authorized employee relating to the carrying out of the work or to any other matter arising out of the carrying out of the work.
- 4. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- 5. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in the Cemetery unless the planting is approved by the Trustees and the trees and shrubs are planted in accordance with the terms of the approval.
- 6. No person shall cause or allow any animal or vehicle (other than a hearse or authorized vehicle) to pass along a road, path or part of a road or path in the Cemetery.
 - 7. No person shall within the Cemetery-
 - (a) Put any animal or animals for the purpose of grazing except with the consent, in writing, of the Trustees.
 - (b) Wilfully damage or destroy any flowers or other tokens placed upon any graves.
- 8. The Cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily, throughout the year.

Part 2.-Memorial Work.

- 9. A person desiring to carry out memorial work shall apply, in writing, to the Trustees, for their permission to carry out the work enclosing with his application a plan of the proposed work (clearly showing any inscriptions).
- 10. No memorial work shall be carried out without the permission of the Trustees.
- 11. When the Trustees give a person permission to carry out memorial work, the work may be carried out only according to the plans enclosed with the application for permission.
- 12. A person who has carried out any memorial work otherwise than in accordance with the plan enclosed with his application for the permission of the Trustees to his carrying out of the work, shall if required to do so by the Trustees, have the structures altered so as to accord with the plan.
- 13. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after the execution of any memorial work shall be removed immediately by the person who carried out the work and he shall repair and make good, all damage caused by him to the satisfaction of the Officer in Charge.
- 14. When a person proposes digging or making a grave or vault or carrying out memorial work in a Cemetery, he shall produce the document evidencing the permission of the Trustees for his digging or making that grave or vault or carrying out that work to the Officer in Charge before beginning the work or delivering the materials or equipment within the Cemetery (as the case may be).
- 15. All monuments, kerbing, &c., erected in the general section of the Cemetery shall have a 3 feet apron at the head or foot of such monument, kerbing, &c. Such apron to be included in the cost of such kerbing, monument, &c. The apron is to be on a level with existing aprons or ground level so that no step results when adjoining another allotment.

16. Beam Lawn Section (Non-Denominational).— Reinforced concrete beam at ground level provided by Cemetery Trust and sold to the public as part of grave

Size of beam per lot-

2 ft. 3 in. wide x 4 feet long (single beam). 3 ft. 6 in. wide x 4 feet long (double beam.)

- 17. The only Memorial permitted in the lawn section shall be a memorial headstone or plaque placed on the
- 18. The Trustees will provide at cost to the person making application for burial, flower containers for use in the lawn section. No person is permitted to use a container other than that provided.
- 19. All flowers, wreaths, &c., remaining on any grave in the Lawn Section seven days after the date of burial shall be removed by the Officer in Charge with the exception of those placed in containers provided by the
- 20. The Trustees may order the removal or alteration of any monument, tomb, tablet, gravestone, vault, railing or other erection, or the erasure of any inscription which has been erected or placed in the burial ground in contravention of the foregoing Regulations.

Part 3.-Interments.

- 21. An application for a permit to bury a corpse shall be made at least eight working hours before the time appointed for burial.
- 22. The Trustees shall divide the burial ground into sections and shall allot graves within the sections and cause a plan to be made showing the sections and graves of the burial ground and shall sign and certify the plan when made. The plan or a copy thereof shall be kept for reference by the Secretary.
- 23. The Trustees shall cause a register to be kept, in which shall be entered the name and former address of every person whose body is interred in the burial ground and the section and number of the grave in which the interment has been made, and the date of the interment. The entry shall be made as soon as possible after each interment. interment.
- 24. Two persons only shall be interred in any one grave except where under special circumstances the permission of the Trustees has been obtained.
 - 25. The grave allotments shall be as follows:-
 - (i) General Cemetery; 8 feet long and 4 feet wide.
 - (ii) Lawn Section; 8 feet long and 4 feet wide plus Ream
- 26. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug.
 - 27. The ordinary hours for burial shall be-

On week-days: 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Week-ends and Public Holidays: 10 a.m. to 3

28. Graves sites in the Lawn Section shall be allotted in sequence. Not more than two sites shall be allotted pursuant to any application, and in no case will an application be granted unless at least one site is required for immediate burial.







Swimming Pools.

A BY-LAW of the Shire of Swan Hill made under the provisions of Sections 197 and 756 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 63 for regulating the management and use of the Municipal Swimming Pools at Robinvale, Manangatang and Nyah and for fixing the amounts to be charged for persons using or entering the said Pools and for providing penalties for breaches of this By-law.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 61 "Swimming Pools" is hereby repealed.

Definitions.

- 2. Throughout this By-law unless inconsistent with the
 - " Attendant " tendant" means the manager, lessee or person authorised in writing by Council from time to time to be in charge of the Pool.
 - "Council Officer" means the Shire Secretary, Shire Engineer, Shire Health Inspector and their respective deputies.
 "Learners' Pool" at Robinvale means the pool of
 - at Robinvale means the pool of approximate dimensions 42 feet by 30 feet.
 - "Main Pool" at Robinvale means the pool of approximate dimensions 110 feet by 42 feet and at Manangatang the pool of approximate dimensions 82 feet 6 inches by 36 feet and at Nyah the pool of approximate dimensions 110 feet by 36 feet.
 - feet by 36 teet.

 "Pool" means and includes any Pool provided by the Council within the premises for the purpose of providing a place for bathers to swim, wade or dive.

 "Premises" means and includes the whole of the area fenced and used for the purposes of and incidental to the Pools erected thereon at Manangatang, Robinvale and Nyah.

 "Wading Pool" at Robinvale means the semi-circular

 - "Wading Pool" at Robinvale means the semi-circular pool of approximate 42 feet diameter and at Manangatang the semi-circular pool of approximate 36 feet diameter and at Nyah the semi-circular pool of approximate 36 feet diameter.

Admission.

- 3. Opening Hours.—The premises shall be open to the public during such periods and such hours as the Council shall from time to time by resolution fix.
- 4. Admission.—Admission to the premises shall be obtained by purchasing a season ticket or paying the appropriate charge which the Council by special order from time to time shall fix.

- 5. Season Tickets.—No season ticket shall be transferable and any holder of such ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and all the rights and privileges given by such ticket.
- 6. Unauthorised Admission.—No person shall enter the premises unless the attendant is present or unless the prior consent of the attendant or a Council Officer has been obtained.
- 7. Children under Six Years.—No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter the premises unless in the opinion of the attendant such child is in the care of a responsible person.

Conduct.

- 8. Attire.—Every person using the premises shall be properly attired in a bathing costume so as to preserve public decency and the decision of a Council Officer or the attendant shall be final in this regard.
- 9. Privacy.—No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her costume in any part of the premises open to public view.
- 10. Expectorating.—No person shall expectorate on the concourse of any Pool, on any lawns, in the dressing rooms, in entrances, on walls or any sealed surface within the premises or spit, spout water or blow his or her nose in any Pool.
- 11. Animals.—No person shall bring into or cause or allow any dog or other animal to remain in the premises.
- 12. Misconduct.—No person shall within the premises mis-conduct himself or herself, commit a nuisance, bring rubbish, filth or other offensive matter or deposit any rubbish therein nor leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers, cast-off clothes or litter except in receptacles provided for such purpose.
- 13. Climbing.—No person who is not authorised by the attendant or a Council Officer shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the premises or climb or attempt to climb over ontc or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fence, roof, building or other structure within the premises.
- 14. Stones.-14. Stones.—No person shall introduce any stones or similar materials into any Pool.
- 15. Selling.—No person other than a person authorised in writing by the Council shall hawk, sell or offer for sale in the baths any goods or articles.
- 16. Damaging Notices.—No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the premises.
- 17. Liquor.—No person using the premises shall at any time bring or introduce into the premises or any part thereof, spirituous or other intoxicating liquors.
- 18. Intoxication.—No person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.
- 19. Personal Uncleanliness.—No person shall use the Pool whilst in an uncleanly condition or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and any such person shall retire from the Pool upon being requested so to do by the attendant.
- 20. General Uncleanliness.—No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the Pool or the shower baths or wilfully or improperly soil or defile the toilet facilities, dressing rooms or any part of the premises or any furniture or article thereon.
- 21. Damage.—No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap or fitting in connection with the Pool nor carelessly, negligently or wilfully damage or injure any furniture, fitting or other article supplied for use in the Pool or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or any other parts of the premises.
- 22. Language.—No person shall at any time while being in or upon the premises use indecent or offensive language nor behave in an indecent or offensive manner.
- 23. Showers.—No person shall occupy the shower baths for an unreasonable time.
- 24. Nuisance.—No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the premises by any other person and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths when required to do so by the attendant.
- 25. Good Order.—For the purpose of maintaining good order the attendant may refuse admission to any person or require any person to leave the premises.
- 26. Lifesaving Equipment.—No person shall use or interfere with any life-saving appliance in the premises unless legitimately for the purpose of rendering assistance to another person.

- 27. Spoiling Water .- No person shall use any soap or other substance or preparation in any place or manner in the premises whereby any water in the Pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for use of bathers.
- 28. No person shall introduce into the main Pool or learner's Pool, beach balls, tennis balls, motor tubes, inflated rubber, plastic articles, or any other similar articles but toddlers may be permitted at the discretion of the attendant to introduce toys into the wading pool. This shall not preclude the introduction into the Pool with the consent of the attendant of any article being legitimately used by any person for the purpose of assistance in learning to swim.
- 29. Bottles and Glass.—No person shall be in possession of any bottle or glass within ten feet of the pool.
- 30. Bicycles.-No person shall bring any bicycle into
- 31. Boisterous Behaviour.—No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play within the premises.
- 32. Obstruction.—No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with the attendant or Council Officer in the performance of his or her duty thereat.
- 33. Non-Swimmers (Robinvale).—No boy or girl under the age of ten years who is unable to swim shall use the main pool at Robinvale without the permission of the attendant unless accompanied by an adult.
- 34. Women's Facilities.-No man or boy shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.
- 35. Men's Facilities.—No woman or girl shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man or boy or any separate passage or approach thereto so appointed or appropriated.
- 36. Use of Wading Pool.—No person over the age of six years shall use the wading pool.
- 37. Running, Jumps, Dives, Etc.—Running jumps and running dives from the side of the Pool into the Pool are prohibited. Jumping from diving boards is also prohibited.
- 38. Swimming Coaching.—No person shall, for fee or reward, instruct or coach any person in the Pool unless authorised in writing as a professional coach by the Council.
- 39. Authority of Attendant.—No person shall remain in any part of the Pool or premises when in the opinion of the attendant such presence hinders the effective management of the Pool or premises and when requested so to do by the attendant such person shall forthwith vacate such part of the Pool or premises.

Carnivals.

- 40. The Council reserves the right to permit any person or persons or organisation to use the premises or any part thereof for carnivals, gala, entertainment or other purposes for such time and upon such terms and conditions as it shall think fit and on such occasions—
 - (a) The charges fixed by the Council for admission to the premises shall be suspended.
 - (b) Season tickets issued by the Council shall not be used or availed of for attendance or entrance to the premises.
 - (c) Entire responsibility for the conduct of such carnival, gala, entertainment or other purposes as aforesaid shall be assumed by the persons or organisation permitted to use the premises.
 - (d) Neither the Council nor its Officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for any article deposited with any person in charge of or in any way connected with any such carnival, gala, entertainment or other purpose.
 - (e) Neither the Council nor any of its Officers or employees shall be in any way responsible for any injury to or any loss or damage sustained by any person during the time of any such carnival, gala, entertainment or other purpose.

- 41. Neither the Council nor any Officer, employee or agent of the Council shall be responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person admitted to the premises.
- 42. Any person finding any article in or on the premises, shall immediately thereafter deliver the same to the attendant who shall thereupon register a description of same and all particulars relating thereto in a book to be

- kept for that purpose and upon any person claiming such article, giving satisfactory proof of loss, the attendant shall deliver the same to such last-mentioned person after entering the name and address of that person in the same book and obtaining his or her signature therefor.
- book and obtaining his or her signature therefor.

 43. Any person may deposit with the attendant any articles for safe keeping and the attendant receiving the article shall thereupon give to the person so depositing the article a ticket or token as a receipt therefor. On presentation of such ticket or token the attendant may deliver the article to the person presenting the same notwithstanding that such person may not be the person who deposited the article; provided however that the Council or any person duly authorised in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of any article deposited as aforesaid and not claimed within three calendar months from the date of such depositing without being liable in any way to the owner or depositor of such article by reason of such sale or disposition.

 44. Any attendant receiving any article deposited as
- 44. Any attendant receiving any article deposited as aforesaid shall take reasonable steps to ensure the safe keeping of such article but neither the Council nor any attendant exercising such reasonable care shall be answerable to any person for the loss, theft or destruction of or any damage to any article deposited as aforesaid.

- 45. Eviction.—The attendant may require any person offending against any part of this By-law (but without prejudice to the imposition of any penalty in respect of such offence) to leave the premises and may cause such person to be ejected therefrom if he fails to leave forthwith.
- 46. Suspension.—The attendant may temporarily suspend admittance and/or clear the premises or any part thereof of any person or persons who fail to comply with any provisions of this By-law.
- 47. Penalty.—Any person wilfully offending against any provision of this By-law shall for every such offence upon conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding
