PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

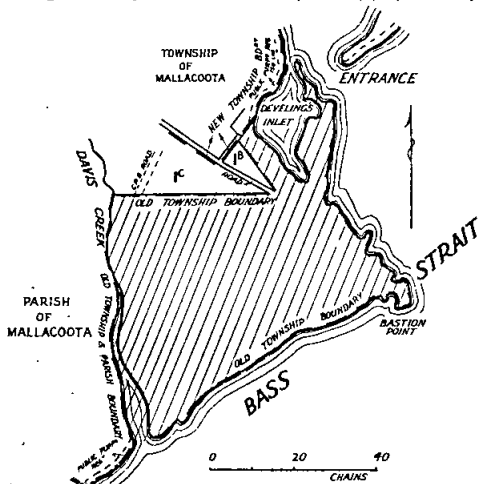

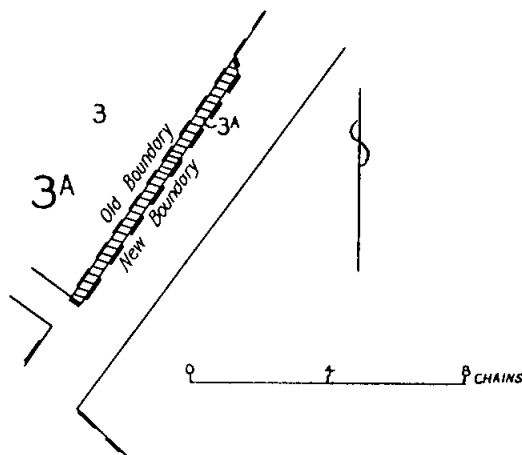

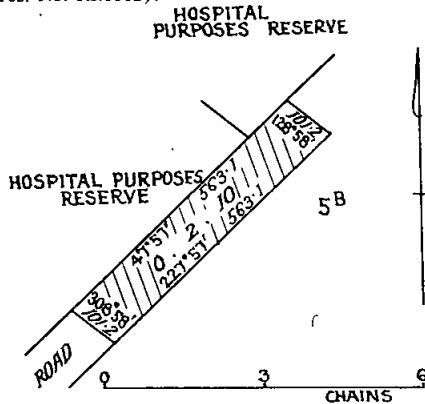

FLAT GLASS WORKING TRADE PROCLAIMED TO BE AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE OUTSIDE THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 13 of the Apprenticeship Act 1958 provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades:

AND WHEREAS the Apprenticeship Commission having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of flat glass working be proclaimed an apprenticeship trade under the said Act in so far as it is carried on in the supply, servicing and/or fitting of flat glass and in the manufacture and repair of furniture anywhere in the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District and having considered the representations made on behalf of the employers and employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed:

AND WHEREAS the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trade of flat glass working to be an apprenticeship trade in so far as it is carried on in the supply, servicing and/or fitting of flat glass and in the manufacture and repair of furniture anywhere in the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, JAMES CHARLES MURRAY BALFOUR, Acting Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter, as follows:—

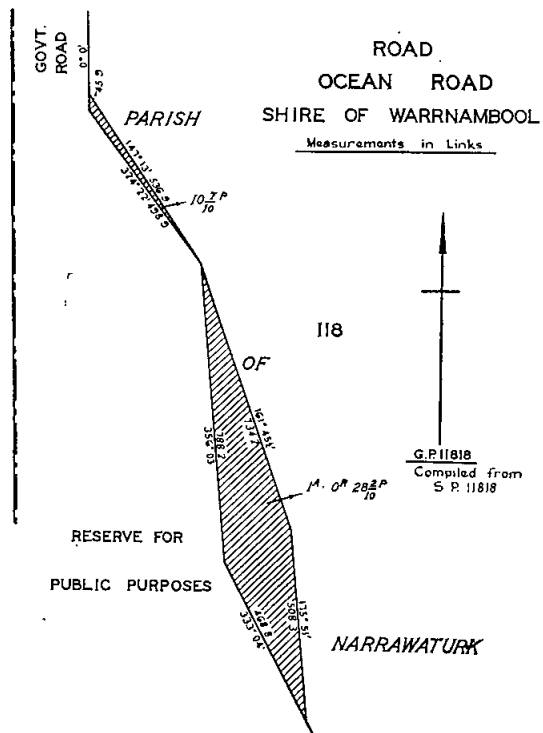

RAINBOW SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.—SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AND AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED.

(a) That a Sewerage Authority is hereby constituted and its corporate name shall be Rainbow Sewerage Authority.

(b) That the Members of the said Sewerage Authority shall be for the time being all three North Riding Councillors of the Shire of Dimboola together with three persons appointed by the Governor in Council.

(c) That the lands within the boundaries described in Portion I. of the Schedule hereto are hereby proclaimed to be the Sewerage District (to be known as the Rainbow Sewerage District) of the said Sewerage Authority.

(d) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the said Sewerage Authority shall consist of reticulation sewers, main sewers, pumping stations, rising main and treatment works.

(e) That the amount of money which the said Sewerage Authority may borrow for the purposes of the said Act shall be Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000).

(f) That the site of the rising main outside the Sewerage District be within the lands described in Portion II. of the said Schedule.

(g) That the site of the treatment works be within the lands described in Portion III. of the said Schedule.

(h) That the lands outside the said Sewerage District which may be compulsorily acquired by the said Authority for construction of the said works shall be those within the boundaries described in Portion III. of the said Schedule.

Persons renting or having any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may determine, not exceeding \$100 by way of guarantee, that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and the Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited as guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

11. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve for camping purposes, hereafter in these Regulations referred to as the Camping Area, and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and the use of any such area or the buildings thereon.

12. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in the Camping Area and then only in the places set apart by the Committee for that purpose and every occupier shall pay to the Committee the respective fees prescribed by the Committee.

13. Motor cars and other vehicles shall, on payment of parking fees fixed from time to time by the Committee, be allowed in the Reserve only in places set apart by the Committee as parking areas and shall be parked as directed by the Committee or its duly authorized officer.

14. No person shall drive a vehicle in the Reserve at a speed greater than 10 miles per hour and no person shall drive in such a manner as to cause injury to any person.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LAKE FYANS RESERVE, PARISH OF BELLELLEN.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parish of Bellellen and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the 28th day of February, 1968, were reserved as a site for Water Supply and Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William John Farquhar McDonald, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the Committee with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain on the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, and the Committee or its duly authorized representative may refuse any person admission to the reserve or any structure therein.
2. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills or posters thereon, or in any way damage, mark or injure any building, gate, fence, seat or tree in the Reserve.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars.
