WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part 1., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

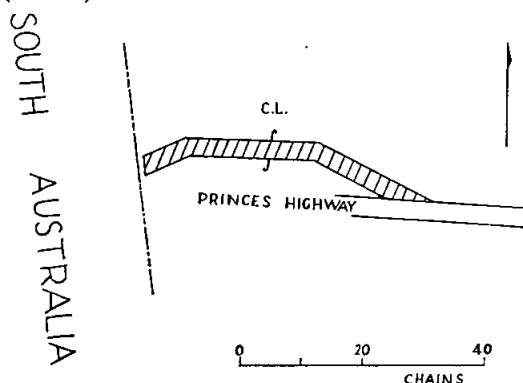

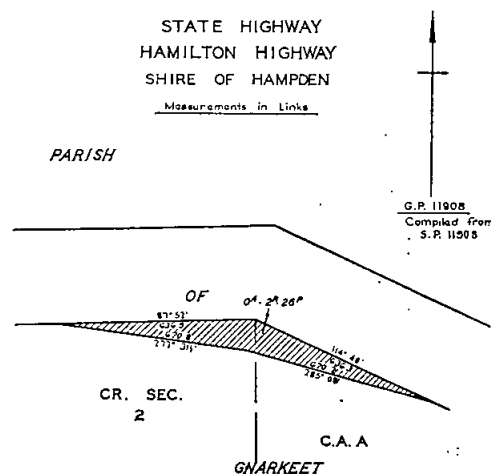

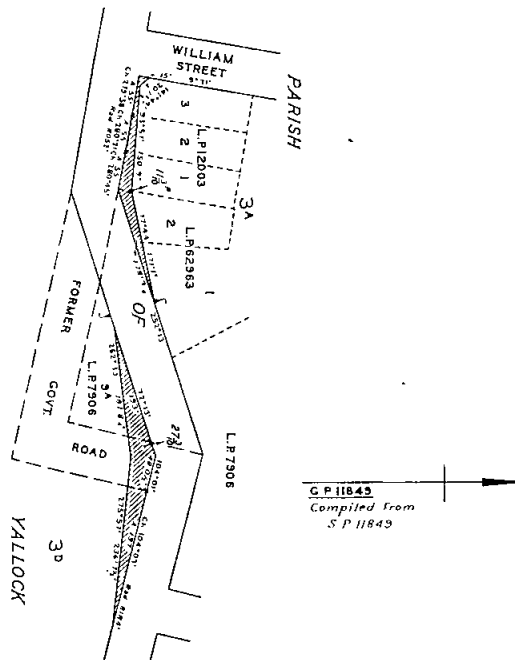

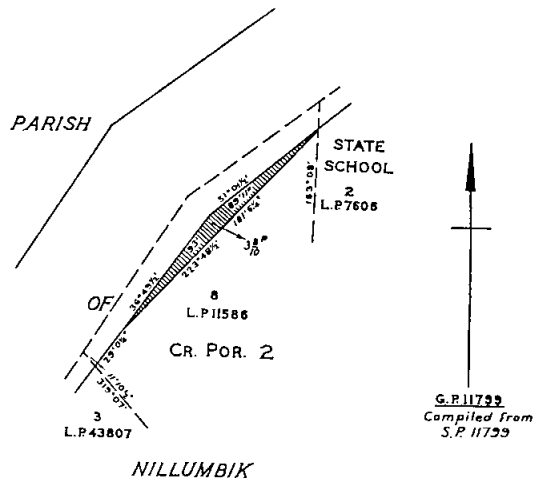

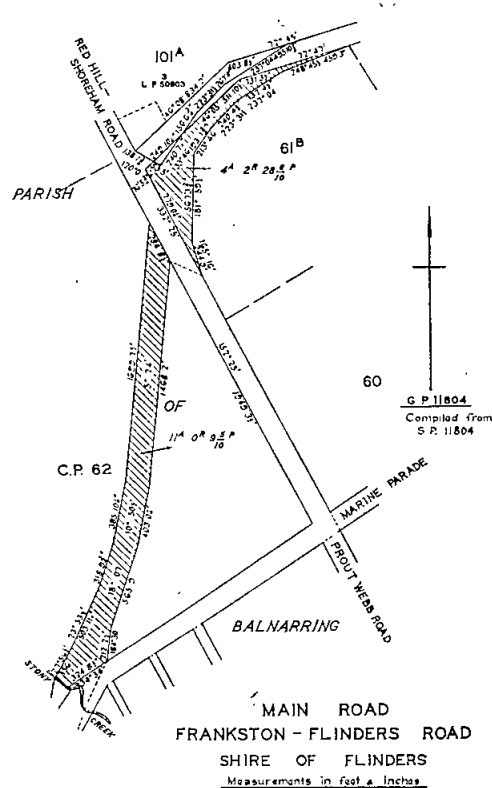
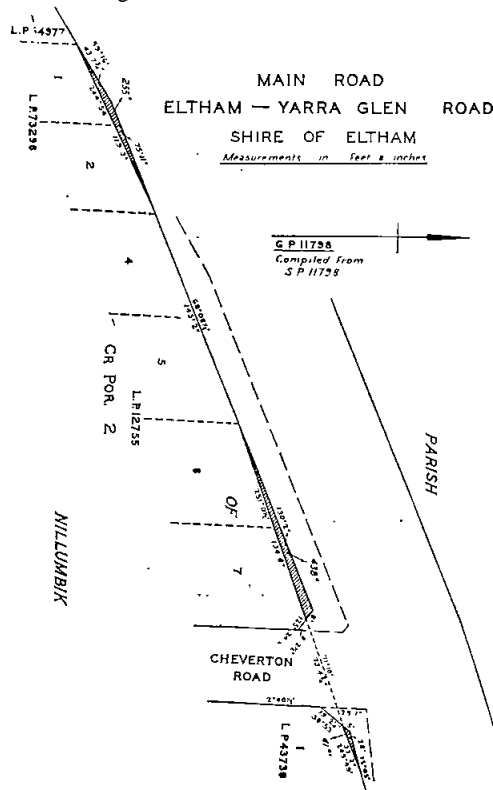

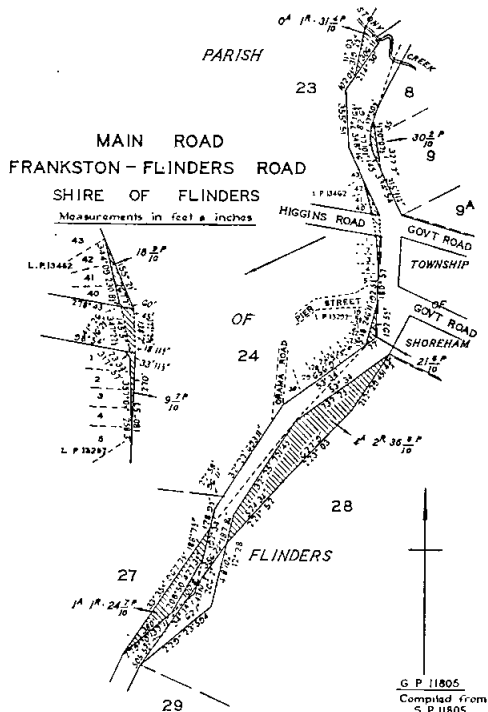

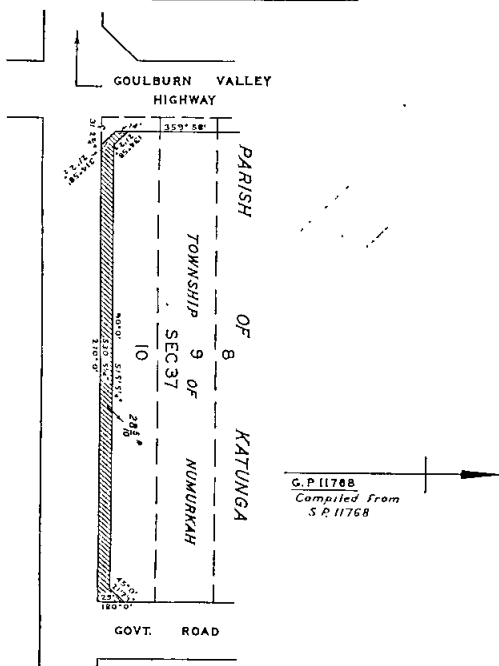

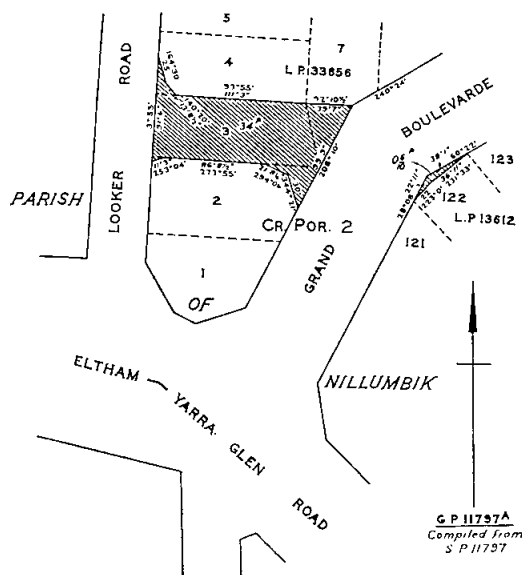

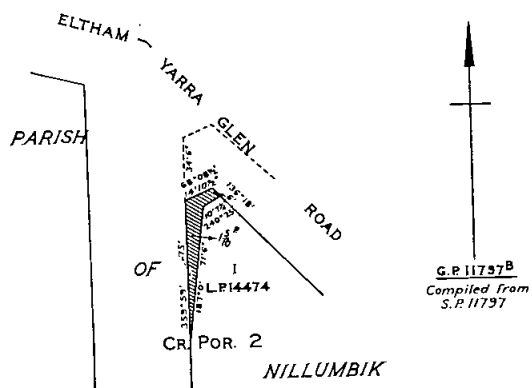

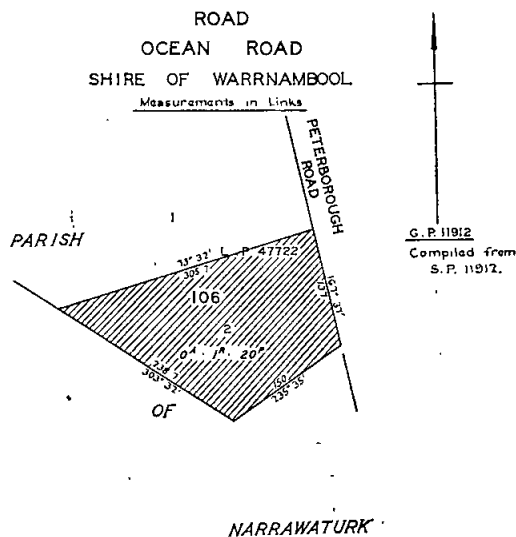

The said fees and dues shall be demanded and received by the Council for services at each abattoir or meat inspection depot within the meat area and shall be paid to the Shire Secretary of the Council at least once in every 30 days by the proprietor of the abattoir or meat inspection depot where such service is rendered.

6. The times for slaughtering at abattoirs in the Meat area shall be between the hours of 6 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any or every of the following days—Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and/or Friday in each week, subject to the succeeding clause of this By-law, in accordance with times approved by the Meat Inspector from time to time.

7. No animal shall be slaughtered in the Meat area on Saturdays, Sundays or Public Holidays, unless with the consent in writing of the Meat Inspector to whom at least 24 hours notice of intention to slaughter must be given. All additional inspection expenses incurred by reason of such slaughtering on any such Saturday, Sunday, or

Public Holiday shall be paid to the Council by the proprietor of the abattoir where such service is given in addition to the fees referred to in this By-law.

8. Any person doing, causing or permitting to be done any act forbidden to be done or failing to do or causing to be done any act directed to be done by this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law. 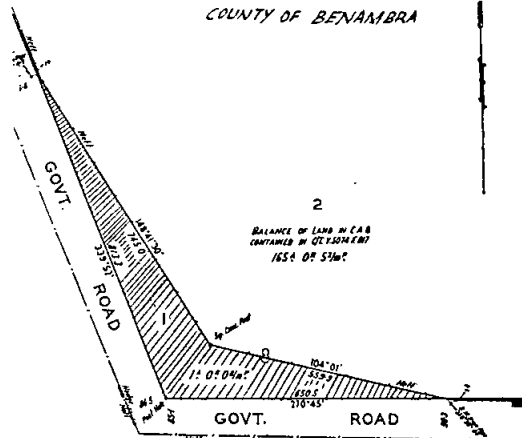
