AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of Sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in Section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

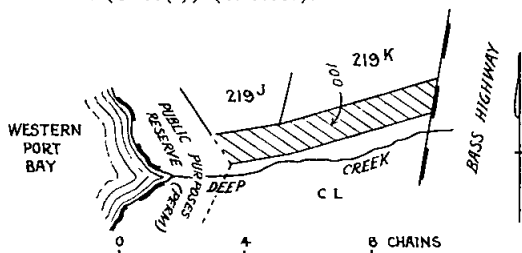

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* may appoint an Authority over any Victorian waters for the purpose of the said Act:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the Council of the Shire of Warracknabeal to be the Authority over the waters of the Yarrambiack Creek within the Township of Warracknabeal for the purposes of the said Act.

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.—SECTION 4 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

And whereas the Lake Charlegrark Foreshore Committee of Management has been proclaimed the Authority over the waters of Lake Charlegrark:

And whereas the Lake Charlegrark Foreshore Committee of Management has recommended that the use of parts of the waters of Lake Charlegrark be prohibited for all classes of boating:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, do by this my Proclamation prohibit the use of the following parts of the waters of Lake Charlegrark for all classes of boating—

1. That part of the waters of Lake Charlegrark contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point on the bank of the Lake being the intersection with the easterly prolongation of the southern boundary of Allotment 12, Parish of Booroopki, thence generally easterly and northerly along an arc of 80 yards radius and with its centre on the shoreline; thence by a line tangential to such arc and parallel to the bank and 80 yards therefrom to a point being 150 yards north of the easterly prolongation of the said southern boundary of Allotment 12, Parish of Booroopki, thence directly to the bank; and
2. That part of the waters of Lake Charlegrark contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point on the bank of the Lake 22 yards north west of the south east corner of the Foreshore Reserve, thence along a line perpendicular to the bank to a point 100 yards therefrom, thence in a direct line north westerly to the tangent point of an arc of 100 yards radius with the centre at a point on the shore 300 yards southerly of the north east corner of the Foreshore Reserve, thence along such arc to the bank of the Lake.
3. The areas specified above shall be marked on the shore by beacons and to seaward by buoys.

MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961.—SECTION 4 (1).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* the Governor in Council on the recommendation of an Authority having control over any Victorian waters, may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* set aside or prohibit or restrict the use of any specified part or parts of any waters under the control of the Authority for any specified class or classes of boating or similar activity:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill has been appointed as the Authority over the waters of Lake Boga:

And whereas the said Authority has recommended that the use of certain parts of the waters of Lake Boga be set aside or prohibited for certain classes of boating or similar activity:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Motor Boating Act 1961* do by this my Proclamation set aside or prohibit (as the case may be) the use of the following parts of the waters of Lake Boga for the class or classes of boating specified in relation thereto:—

(A) Prohibit the use of the waters between the parts of the shoreline described hereunder and lines to seaward through beacons marking the ends of the shoreline and buoys 250 feet to seaward and a line parallel to the shoreline 250 feet to seaward therefrom for all classes of boating—

1. From a point where the extension of the eastern boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments 10 and 7d, Section 1, Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level, thence in a north easterly direction for approximately 300 feet along the high water level to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a north easterly direction approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

2. From a point where the extension of the western boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A2 and 9, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence in a north westerly direction along the high water level for approximately 500 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a north westerly direction for a distance of approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

3. From a point where the extension of the northern boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A and 8, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence in a northerly direction along the high water level for approximately 2600 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a northerly direction for approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

4. From a point where the extension of the northern boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A and 8, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a northerly direction for approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

5. From a point where the extension of the northern boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A and 8, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence in a southerly direction along the high water level for approximately 2400 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a southerly direction for approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

6. From a point where the extension of the western boundary of Crown Allotment A8, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence in a westerly direction along the high water level for approximately 400 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a westerly direction for approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

7. From a point where the extension of the south easterly boundary of the Crown Pre-Emptive Section A at Lake Boga and Long Lake, Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level thence in a south easterly direction along the high water level for approximately 500 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a south easterly direction for approximately 200 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

8. From a point where the extension of the south easterly boundary of Crown Pre-Emptive Section A at Lake Boga and Long Lake, Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level thence in a north westerly direction for approximately 4000 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a north westerly direction for approximately 300 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

(B) Set aside the use of the waters between the parts of the shoreline described hereunder and lines to seaward through beacons marking the ends of the

shoreline and buoys 250 feet to seaward and a line parallel to the shoreline 250 feet to seaward therefrom for yachting.

From a point where the extensions of the south easterly boundary of the Crown Pre-Emptive Section A at Lake Boga and Long Lake, Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level thence in a north westerly direction along the high water level for approximately 2500 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a north westerly direction for approximately 700 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

(C) Set aside the use of the waters between the parts of the shoreline described hereunder and lines to seaward through beacons marking the ends of the shoreline and buoys 250 feet to seaward and a line parallel to the shoreline 250 feet to seaward therefrom for motor boating and water skiing.

1. Commencing at a point marked by a beacon where the extension of the northern boundary of Crown Allotment 9, Section 1, Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level thence in a south westerly thence southerly direction along the high water level for approximately 4300 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

2. From a point where the extension of the western boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A2 and 9, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence in a north westerly direction along the high water level for approximately 2100 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a north westerly direction for a distance of approximately 400 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

3. From a point where the extension of the western boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A2 and 9, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence in a south easterly direction along the high water level for approximately 900 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 400 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

4. From a point where the extension of the northern boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A and 8, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence northerly along the high water level for approximately 1500 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a northerly direction for approximately 400 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

5. From a point where the extension of the southern boundary of the road reserve between Crown Allotments A and 8, Section 1, Parish of Boga, intersects the high water level thence southerly along the high water level for approximately 1000 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a southerly direction for approximately 400 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

6. The shoreline, the limits of which are marked by beacons, within 250 feet of the point where the extension of the south easterly boundary of the Crown Pre-Emptive Section A at Lake Boga and Long Lake, Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level.

7. From a point where the extension of the south easterly boundary of Crown Pre-Emptive Section A at Lake Boga and Long Lake Parish of Kunat Kunat, intersects the high water level thence in a north westerly direction for approximately 3100 feet to a point marked by a beacon.

Commencing at this point thence along the high water level in a north westerly direction for approximately 400 feet to another point marked by a beacon.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 916 of the *Local Government Act* 1958, provides *inter alia* that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX. of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd October 1947, 5th September 1951, 10th September 1958, and 23rd December 1958 the operation of the said Part was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Alberton.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Alberton has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to a further part of the municipal district of the Shire of Alberton.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act* 1958, to the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Alberton described hereunder:

(a) The Township of Carrajung.

(b) The Township of Woodside.

(c) Woodside Beach comprising part of Crown Allotments 18d, Section 2, Parish of Balloong incorporated in Lodged Plan No. 44798.

And order that the said Regulation shall come into operation in the above described part of the municipal district of the Shire of Alberton on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* provided that parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall be deemed not to come into operation till the 4th May, 1970, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 4th May, 1970.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Section 916 of the *Local Government Act* 1958, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor-in-Council may, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the Council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of Part XLIX of the said Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd January 1947, 6th October 1954, 29th October 1958, 3rd April 1963 and 12th February 1964, the operation of the said Part was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Towong has requested that the operation of the said Part be extended to a further part of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX of the *Local Government Act* 1958, to the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong described hereunder:

TOWNSHIP OF MITTA MITTA.

All of that area enclosed by a line commencing at the south eastern corner of the Township of Mitta Mitta, Parish of Magorra, County of Bogong thence westerly along the southern boundary of the above township to its south western corner thence westerly to the south eastern corner of allotment A8, Parish of Dorchap thence along the southern and western boundaries of that allotment to the north western corner of that allotment thence on a bearing of 18 degrees 4 minutes for 168 feet 3½ inches thence on a bearing of 25 degrees 43 minutes for 330 feet 8 inches to the north western corner of allotment A7, Parish of Dorchap thence north easterly across the Mitta Mitta River to the angle in the eastern boundary of allotment 10, Section E, Parish of Mitta Mitta thence easterly across a road to the corresponding angle in the western boundary of allotment 11, Section E, Parish of Mitta Mitta thence south easterly to the north western corner of Lot 1 on Plan of Subdivision 83002 thence south easterly along the northern boundary of that lot and along its prolongation to the south bank of the Mitta Mitta River thence easterly along the south bank of that river to the north eastern corner of the Township of Mitta Mitta thence southerly along the eastern boundary of that township to the point of commencement.

And order that the said Regulation shall come into operation in the above described part of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* provided that Parts I and II of Chapter 8 thereof shall be deemed not to come into operation till the 4th May, 1970, except insofar as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make by-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III of the said Chapter and provided further that no such by-law shall come into operation before the 4th May, 1970.

Health Act 1958 (No. 6270).

DEFINING CERTAIN AREAS IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DIAMOND VALLEY IN WHICH IT SHALL NOT BE LAWFUL TO ESTABLISH OR AFTER A PERIOD OF DISUSE TO CARRY ON ANY OFFENSIVE TRADE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by Section 102 of the *Health Act 1958 (No. 6270)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation, define the following localities in the Municipal District of Diamond Valley as being those in which it shall not be lawful to establish or after a period of disuse to carry on an Offensive Trade within the meaning of the *Health Act 1958*.

The localities defined for the purposes of this Proclamation are:—

1. Those portions of the North Riding described in the three following paragraphs.

Zone A. Commencing at a point on the eastern boundary, one sixteenth of a mile north of Wattle Glen and bounded by a line running due west to Murray Road, then due south for five sixteenths of a mile along the eastern boundary of Murray Road, then due west seven sixteenths of a mile, then due south one quarter of a mile, then due west one and three quarters miles, then due south parallel to and to the west of Oatland Road for one and one sixteenth miles, then west for one eighth of a mile to the Plenty River, then

adjacent to the eastern boundary of the river to the southern boundary of the North Riding, then in an easterly direction following the southern boundary of the North Riding to a position one quarter of a mile east of Ryans Road, then due north half a mile to a point south of Challenger Street, then a line due east to the Municipal boundary, then north along the Municipal boundary to the point of commencement;

Zone B. Commencing at a point at Iron Bark Road, three eighths of a mile east of Yan Yean Road, and bounded by a line running due north for three eighths of a mile, then due west for three quarters of a mile, then due south for three eighths of a mile, then due east for three quarters of a mile.

Zone C. Commencing at a point at the junction of the Northern and Eastern boundaries of the Municipality and bounded by a line following the Municipal boundary in a westerly direction three quarters of a mile, then due south for half a mile, then due east to the eastern Municipal boundary, then in a northerly direction following the eastern boundary to the point of commencement; and

2. The whole of the South West, Central and South East Ridings.

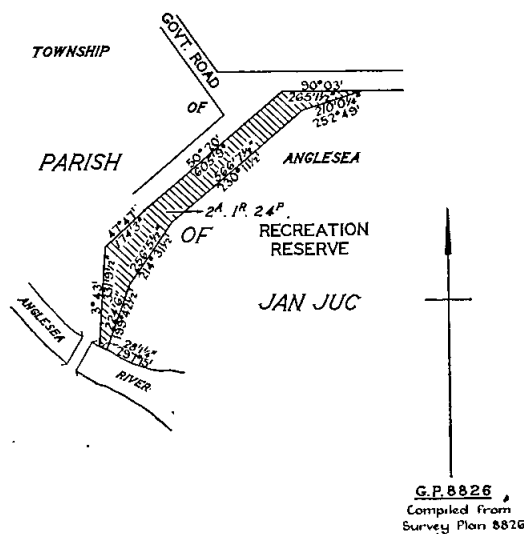

1. *Matter submitted to the Executive Council.*

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the *Gazette Officer*, Room 9, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

2. *Other matter.*

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the *Gazette Officer* not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.
