BY-LAW No. 5644 REVOKING BY-LAW No. 5514 AND AMENDING BY-LAW No. 4521—SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION—CAMPASPE IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-Law following:—

1. By-law No. 5514 made by the Commission on the 15th day of November, 1965, to amend By-law No. 4521 made by the Commission on the twelfth day of December, 1949, shall be and is hereby revoked as on and from the date hereof.

2. The said By-law No. 4521 is hereby amended by substituting for clause 5 thereof the following:—

5. The charge per acre foot for water supplied for irrigation other than in respect of any water right shall be the same as the irrigation charge per acre foot last made for the district before the date on which such water is supplied.

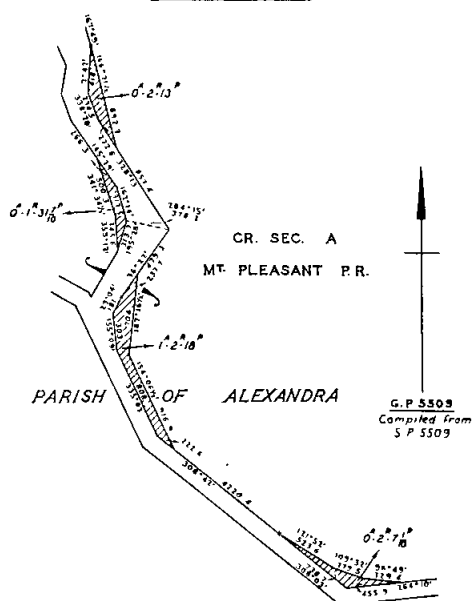

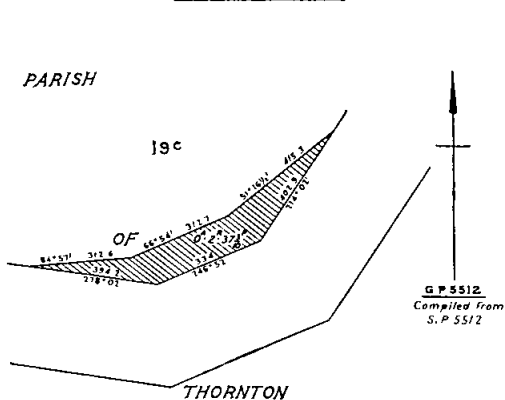
STATE HIGHWAY

Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

VARIATION OF FIRE DANGER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREAS OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by declaration published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be the fire danger period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the fire danger period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended or varied by a subsequent declaration so published:

And whereas by declaration issued on the date stated in Schedule A annexed hereto, different fire danger periods expiring on the thirtieth day of April, 1971 were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, situated within the municipal districts or parts of municipal districts specified in Schedule B hereunder:

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at Twenty Five cents per 1000 gallons and the minimum quantity of water to be charged in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 48,000 gallons.

Where the water supply to any premises is not metered the Council may issue to the occupier thereof a licence to permit such occupier to use water through a hose for watering the garden on such premises and the abutting footpath between the following hours only, viz.:—6 a.m. and 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. The charge for any such licence issued for the year commencing on the 1st day of October, 1970 shall be the sum of Five dollars, but a concessional charge of One dollar is available to pensioners on the production of evidence that they are in receipt of a pension.

Such person or persons as the Council may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorised to demand, receive and collect the said rates and charges.

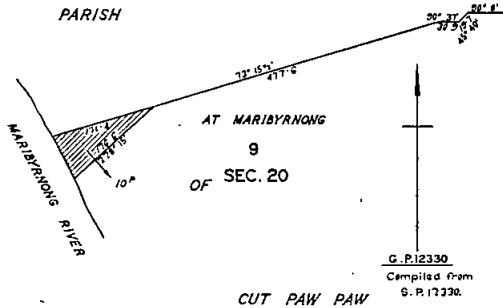


Main Road.

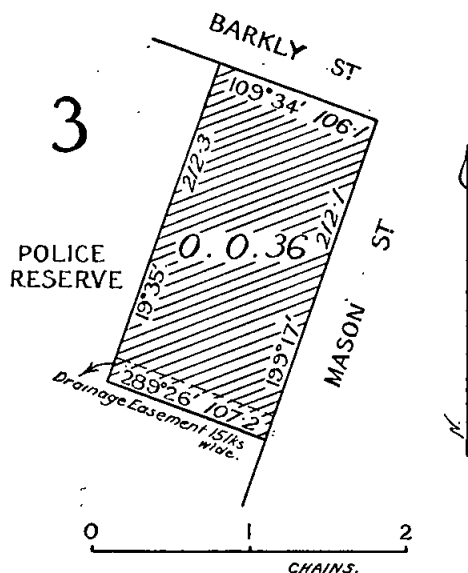


TOTAL AREA OF HATCHED PORTIONS: 0.2.24

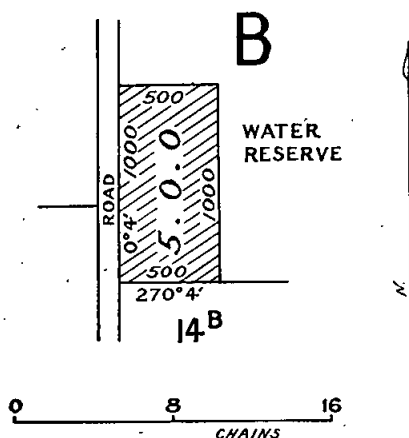

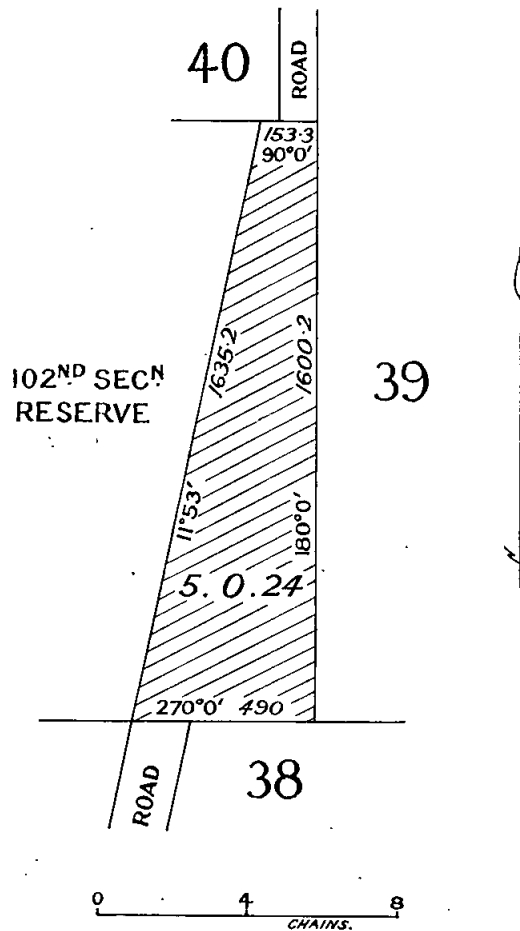


Total area of hatched portions: 10.1.25±

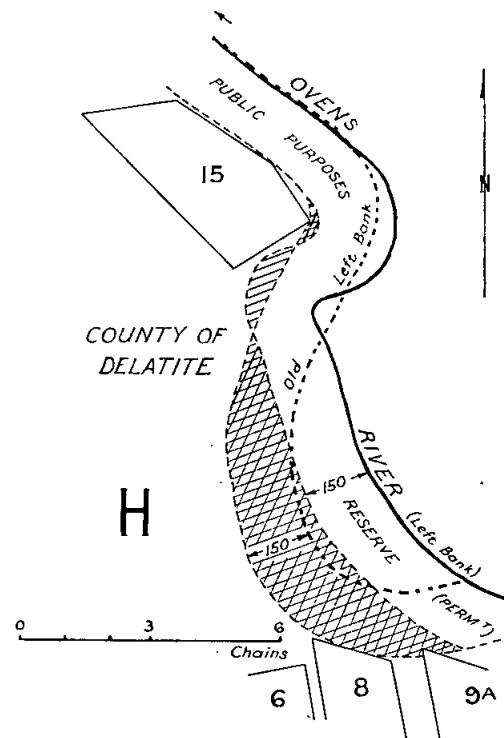

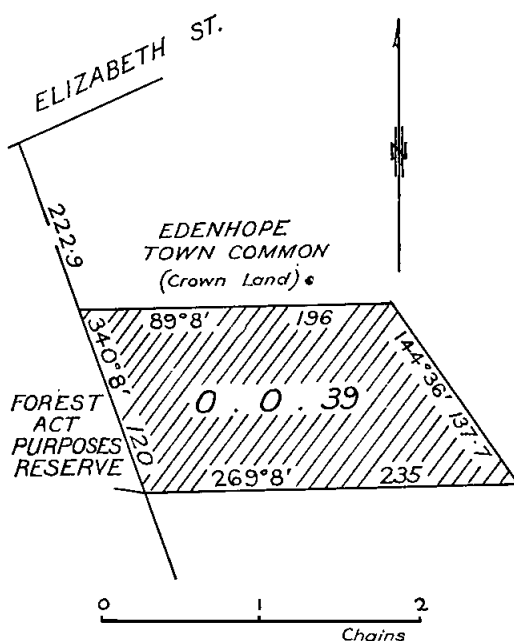

AMENDMENT TO REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PENGUIN RESERVE" AT PHILLIP ISLAND.

I, WILLIAM ARCHIBALD BORTHWICK, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, do hereby amend the regulation made on the 13th September, 1959, with respect to the land in the Parish of Phillip Island temporarily reserved by Orders in Council of the 13th December, 1955, and 6th June, 1956, as sites for a Penguin Rookery, both areas being together known as the "Penguin Reserve" at Phillip Island as follows:—

REGULATION.

1. The front beach of the Reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to 6 p.m. After the hour of 6 p.m. an admission charge of thirty (30) cents will be made on all adults and children over the age of fourteen years.—(Rs.7419.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LONG SWAMP STATE GAME RESERVE.

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Parishes of Glenelg and Warrain and described in a notice published in the Gazette of the 6th day of July, 1966 were reserved as a site for Wildlife Purposes: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

1. The Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers are empowered to have carried out such works and improvements considered necessary for the improvement and management of wildlife and wildlife habitat and for the control of the public within the Reserve.

2. Without the consent, in writing, of the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife or his authorized officers no person shall—

- (a) Interfere with the flow of any water into, out of, or within the Reserve or remove water from the Reserve by any method whether natural or artificial.
- (b) Interfere with or remove or damage or destroy any tracks, signs, buildings, water control structures, earthen banks, wildlife shelter belts or any improvements or structures within the Reserve.
- (c) Carry any poison, traps or snares within the Reserve.
- (d) Poison, trap, snare, catch or otherwise destroy, interfere with or disturb any bird or other animal, or take away any skin, egg, feathers or nests or part thereof in or from the Reserve, provided that subject to the provisions of the *Game Act* 1958 the holders of current Game Licences may take and kill wild ducks during the open season for such ducks.
- (e) Pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind within the Reserve.
- (f) Light or maintain any fire within the Reserve except in a properly constructed fireplace which is more than 25 feet from the nearest dead timber and with the surrounding ground cleared of all inflammable material for at least 10 feet. Further no person shall leave such a fire unattended, without completely extinguishing it.
- (g) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (h) Deposit any rubbish debris or material of any kind on the Reserve.
- (i) Bring or allow any animal of any kind into the Reserve other than a dog under the immediate control of a person who is legally hunting ducks during the open season and is the holder of a current Game Licence. Any dog except as mentioned aforesaid shall be liable to be destroyed. Any "cattle" as defined by section 3 of the *Pounds Act* 1958 found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
- (j) Carry a firearm of any description or any weapon or instrument capable of discharging a missile, shoot at, or kill, or injure any animal, bird, or other wildlife; provided that, subject to the provisions of the *Game Act* 1958, the holder of a current Game Licence legally in pursuit of wild ducks during the open season for such ducks may use a shotgun as defined under the *Game Act* 1958.
- (k) Use within the Reserve any motor boat or powered water craft having an engine with a developed horse-power greater than three horse-power, excepting that boats with a

greater horse-power may use such areas within the boundaries which are defined for such purposes:

- (i) Deposit on the Reserve or construct within the Reserve any fence, shed structure or equipment. Any fence, shed structure, or other equipment located within the Reserve without permission will be dismantled and removed from the Reserve.

3. Notwithstanding anything in clauses (i) and (j) above, the holder of a current Game Licence may carry a shot gun and or have a dog in his or her control during the 24 hour period immediately prior to the open duck season.

These regulations are made in lieu of all previous regulations in respect of the said reserve which are hereby revoked.

2. (1) A driver approaching a school crossing shall travel at such a speed that, if necessary to comply with this By-Law, he will be able to stop his vehicle before reaching the school crossing.

(2) A driver approaching a school crossing shall stop his vehicle before reaching the school crossing—

- (a) if any pedestrian is on the school crossing;
- (b) if a barrier bearing a red sign inscribed in white with the word "Stop" is turned so as to extend partly across the carriageway with the sign facing him; or
- (c) if a pole bearing a red sign inscribed in white with the word "Stop" is held so as to extend partly across the carriageway with the sign facing him and shall not permit any portion of his vehicle to enter upon the school crossing while any pedestrian is upon it or while any barrier or pole is so turned or held.

(3) Where there is a stop line on the approach side of a school crossing, any stop made pursuant to the provisions of this By-Law shall be made before reaching and as near as practicable to the stop line.

(4) A driver shall not permit any portion of his vehicle to enter upon a school crossing or to cross any stop line on the approach side of a school crossing if any vehicle headed in the same direction is stopped on the approach side of or upon the school crossing apparently for the purpose of complying with this By-Law.

(5) Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this clause of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$40.

3. (1) A person shall not leave a vehicle standing so that any portion of the vehicle is within 60 feet:

- (a) of a school crossing established on a two-way carriageway;
- (b) on the approach side of a school crossing established on a one-way carriageway:—

PROVIDED that this clause shall not apply to a person leaving a vehicle standing in a no-parking area or a parking area as defined in the Road Traffic Regulations 1962.

(2) Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this clause of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$25.

4. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Springvale.

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 9, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matter for publication will be accepted by telephone.
