For the guidance of those attending the Levee, it will be appropriate, for those who wish to do so, to wear Honours, Decorations and Awards.

Private Entree Cards will admit recipients to the South Door of the Spring-street Entrance at Parliament House at 9.30 a.m. All other citizens are requested to enter by the North Door of the Spring-street Entrance at 10.15 a.m.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed or typed in capitals, or written in block letters, their styles of address for presentation in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

 DISTRICT PROCLAIMED A "RURAL DISTRICT".

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do hereby proclaim that as on and from the first day of July, 1971 that portion of the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and become a "Rural District" for the purpose of the said Act and shall be known as Mount Duneed Rural District and the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission shall have jurisdiction and control over such Rural District.

thence southerly by the western boundary of Horse-Shoe Bend road to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment P, section 6; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundary of Lake road to the south-eastern angle of allotment O, section 6; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its north-eastern angle; thence westerly by the northern boundaries of allotments O and P, section 6, and by a line in continuation thereof to the north-eastern angle of allotment M, section 5; thence northerly by the western boundary of Horse-Shoe Bend road to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment I, section 6; thence easterly by a line, the northern boundaries of allotments I, J and K, section 6 and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment K, section 6, to its south-eastern angle; thence easterly by the northern boundary of allotment M, section 6, to its north-eastern angle; thence northerly by the western boundary of Charlemont road to the north-eastern angle of allotment L, section 6; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundary of allotment E, section 7, to its north-eastern angle; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the north-western angle of allotment H, section 7; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments H, I, J, K, L, M and N, section 7 and allotments A2 and A3, section 13 and by a line in continuation thereof and by a line connecting those boundaries to the southern angle of allotment D1, section 13; thence generally northerly by the western boundary of that allotment to its north-western angle; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments D1, D and E, section 13 and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment E, section 13, to the north-western angle of allotment F, section 13; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments F and G, section 13, to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment G, section 13, to its south-eastern angle; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments G and F, section 13 and by a line in continuation thereof to the north-eastern angle of allotment E, section 12; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments E, F and G, section 12, to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally south-easterly by the northern boundary of Mount Duneed road to the south-western angle of allotment A, section 14; thence northerly by the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its north-western angle; thence generally easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments A, B, C and D, section 14, to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment H, section 14; thence northerly by a line and the western boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its north-western angle; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of allotments H, J and K, section 14, to the most easterly angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence generally south-westerly by the south-eastern boundary of allotment K, section 14, to its south-western angle; thence generally southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments G, E and F, section 14, and allotments A, B and D, section 23 and by lines connecting those boundaries to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments D and C, section 23, and the northern boundary of a Public Purposes Reserve and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of that Reserve; thence southerly by the western boundary and south-easterly by the south-western boundary of the Public Purposes Reserve to a point in the western boundary of allotment N, section 23; thence northerly by the western boundary, easterly by the northern boundary, southerly by the eastern boundary and westerly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its south-western angle; thence generally westerly by the southern boundaries of Beach P.R., section 22, allotments D, E, F, K and L, section 21 and allotments F1 and G1, section 28 and by lines connecting those boundaries to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of allotment G1, section 28 to the south-eastern angle of allotment H, section 28; thence westerly by the southern boundary of allotment H, section 28 to its south-western angle; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of allotment I1, section 28 to the south-eastern angle of that allotment; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to its most westerly angle; thence generally southerly by the eastern boundary of Breamlea road to the north-eastern angle of a Reserve

for Municipal Purposes adjoining allotment 10, section D, township of Breamlea; thence northerly by a line in production of the eastern boundary of the Reserve for Municipal Purposes to the left bank of Thomson's (or Bream) Creek; thence generally north-westerly by that Creek bank to the south-eastern angle of allotment E, section 25; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundary of a road to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 49, parish of Puebla; thence westerly by a line and the northern boundaries of allotments 49, 50, 51 and 52 and by a line connecting those boundaries to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of allotment 41 parish of Puebla, to the south-western angle of allotment C, section 24, parish of Conwarre; thence generally westerly by the left bank of Thomson's (or Bream) Creek and the southern boundary of allotment A, section 44, parish of Duneed and by a line in continuation thereof to a point in the eastern boundary of allotment C, section 45; thence northerly by the western boundary of Petavel road to the north-eastern angle of allotment D, section 34; thence easterly by a line and the northern boundaries of allotments K and G, section 35 to the north-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by the western boundary of allotment F, section 35, to the point of commencement.

TARRA RIVER WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

NOTICE OF DETERMINATION OF LAND-USE.

Proclaimed 26th January, 1971, Victoria Government Gazette, No. 13, dated 17th February, 1971, pursuant to section 22 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 23, sub-section (1), of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372), the Soil Conservation Authority after consultation with the Land Utilization Advisory Council has determined the land-use for all that area of land in the Parishes of Bulga, Devon and Jumbuk within the boundaries of the Tarra River Water Supply Catchment delineated and marked on Plan No. 2461, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority. All land within this area shall be used in accordance with the provisions of the particular category of land-use to which each area has been assigned. The boundaries of land-use areas shown on Plan No. 2508 are intended as a guide to landholders, who should consult with the Soil Conservation Authority before making any changes in land-use.

The provisions of each of the land-use categories are set out hereunder—

Category No. 1.

Land which shall be used for the protection of streams and watercourses where—

- (a) No building shall be erected, tree removed or soil disturbed in any way without the specific approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.
- (b) The crossing of streams and watercourses within this category if so required by the Authority shall be permitted only by means of crossings specifically approved for the particular site by the Soil Conservation Authority.

This category covers areas within a 10 chain radius of the offtake weir and within 1 chain, or such greater distance as the Authority may require, from the banks of all permanent and specified streams, springs or watercourses.

Category No. 2.

Land which shall be used for permanent forest or plantation purposes where forestry operations or any other changes affecting catchment interests shall be carried out only in accordance with management conditions made or approved by the Soil Conservation Authority. The construction of roads, tracks, dams or earthworks of any description are subject to the approval of the Authority.

Category No. 3.

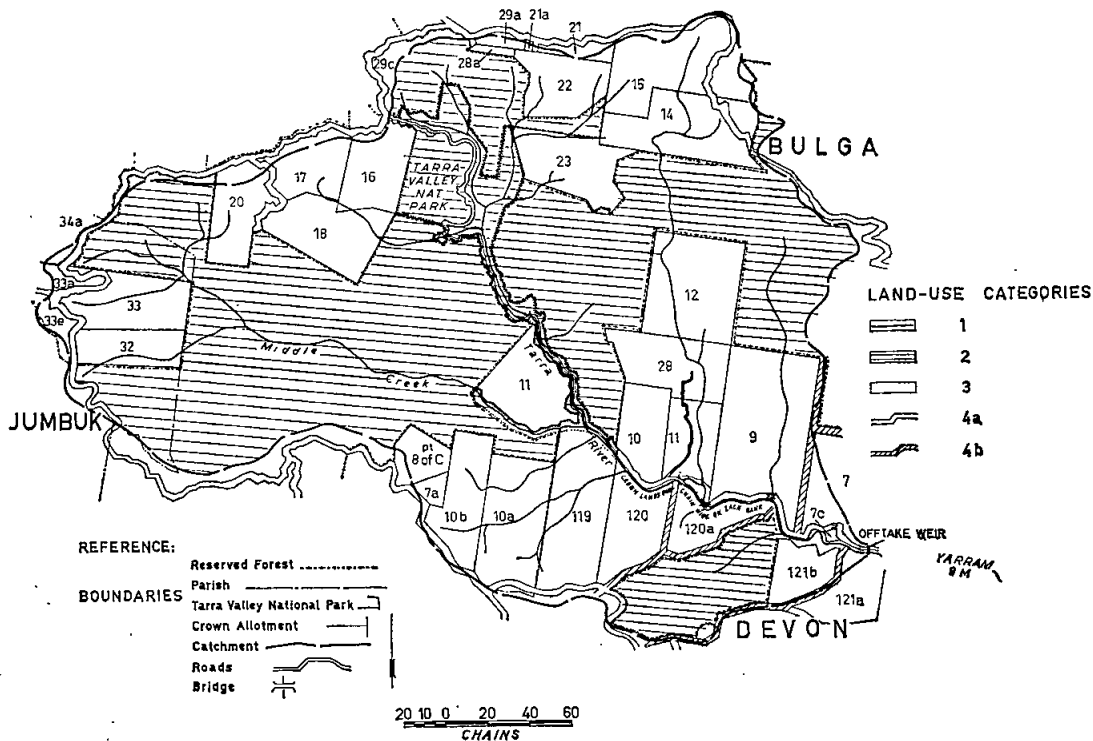
Land suitable primarily for forestry or plantation purposes which may also be used for grazing, for limited cultivation or some kinds of approved recreational purposes subject to the observance of conditions specified by the Soil Conservation Authority for the particular circumstances, such conditions to include—

- (a) the specifications of areas which may be cleared and those which shall remain under forest;
- (b) the specification of the acreage which may be cleared in any one year;
- (c) the specification of areas suitable for plantation and for particular recreational purposes, for grazing and for cultivation;
- (d) the specification of management and conservation practices where necessary.

Category No. 4.

4A. Land used for roads on which any changes in land-use shall be made only after consultation with the Soil Conservation Authority.

4B. Land reserved for roads or other public purposes on which any changes in land-use shall be made only with the approval of the Soil Conservation Authority.

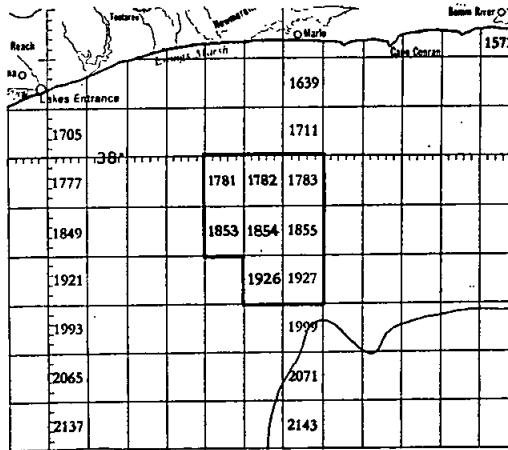

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WINTON RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands is empowered to make regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township of Winton and described in a notice published in the *Gazette* of the 27th day of May, 1892 were reserved as a site for Racecourse and Public Recreation: And whereas such lands (hereinafter called "the Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees; And whereas it is expedient that regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of the Corporation of the Shire of Benalla (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

The following Regulations are made in lieu of all previous Regulations which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, except those areas set apart for specific uses, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, and at such other hours as the Committee may determine except on such occasions (not exceeding seventy in any one year) as the same may be set apart for race meetings, public sports, football or cricket matches, shows, entertainments, or such like purposes.

2. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the Reserve and to any buildings, erections or enclosures for the time being thereon on any day or any night set apart for public sports, football or cricket matches, shows, entertainments or such like purposes, as provided hereinbefore in clause 1, shall be—

- (a) For admission of each adult person to the Reserve—A sum not exceeding Three dollars.
- (b) For admission of each adult person to any stand, building, erection or enclosure in the Reserve—A sum not exceeding Two dollars in addition to the charge for admission to the Reserve.
- (c) For admission of each saddle horse (exclusive of the rider)—A sum not exceeding Fifty cents.
- (d) For admission of any cart, carriage, motor car, motor conveyance or other vehicle (exclusive of the driver and passengers)—A sum not exceeding Fifty cents.

Provided however that the Committee may at any time and at its discretion but not unreasonably or arbitrarily refuse to admit any horse, cart, carriage, motor car, motor conveyance or other vehicle.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the footpaths, water pipes, drinking taps, tools, appliances, seats, buildings, fences, walls or other properties or erections or trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the written permission of the Committee.

5. No person shall in the Reserve—

- (a) Climb or jump over or upon fences, gates, buildings or trees.
- (b) Place any bill, placard, or other document on or write or paint on or otherwise deface any gate, fence, structure, building, seat, wall or tree without the written consent of the Committee.
- (c) Scatter about or throw down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers or any other such like matter.
- (d) Distribute or give out to any person or persons any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, papers, programmes or any such like matter except with the written consent of the Committee.
- (e) Throw, place or leave any glass, filth, dirt, paper, rubbish or any such like matter.
- (f) Roll, throw or discharge any stone or other missile.
- (g) Interfere with or in any way damage any notice, placard, sign or regulations.

6. No person shall put, or take, or allow to wander into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the written permission of the Committee.

7. No person shall take into the Reserve any dog which is not led or controlled by a leash, chain or cord and no vicious dog shall be taken into the Reserve unless securely and efficiently muzzled.

8. No person shall, without the written permission of the Committee, camp in the Reserve or erect therein any tent or building, booth or other structure, and no person shall, without the written permission of the Committee, hawk or offer any article for sale in the Reserve.

9. No person shall, in the Reserve, take part in any football or cricket match, entertainment, amusement or meeting whatsoever without the written permission of the Committee.

10. No person shall, in the Reserve, spit or expectorate on the footpaths or on any structure, building or erection or on the floors thereof.

11. When any sports, football or cricket matches, entertainments or such like are held in the Reserve and any person uses, rents or hires any stand, building, structure, erection or enclosure, the Committee may require such person to deposit with it a sum not exceeding Two hundred dollars by way of guarantee that no damage will be done thereto or therein, and such sum may be used at the absolute discretion of the Committee in making good any damage which may have been done to such stand, building, structure, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, or to any other property in the Reserve, or for any losses otherwise sustained by the Committee by reason of such renting or hiring of such stand, building, structure, erection or enclosure, and any person so renting or hiring shall conform to these Regulations and to any order or direction which may be given by the Committee in respect

thereof, or for the protection of the property of the Committee, or under its control, or for the safety or the protection of the health of the public.

12. All persons using any grandstand or other building in the Reserve shall observe any and every order or direction given by the Committee or body renting, using or hiring any such stand or building for the prevention of overcrowding, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Committee, engage in cricket, football, tennis, bowls, golf, lacrosse, croquet, baseball or any other game or amusement or motor sport in the Reserve, nor shall any band play therein, without such written permission.

14. No person shall, without the written permission of the Committee, bring any vehicle onto that portion of the Reserve set apart for motor sport at any time that portion of the Reserve has not been specifically permitted to be used for the conduct of motor sports.

15. No person shall, without the authority of the Committee, enter upon any portion of the Reserve set apart for cricket, football, motor sports, or other games or sports during such time as such portion may be required or used for the purpose for which it has been so set apart, nor shall any person enter upon any portion of the Reserve set apart for tennis, croquet, bowls, or any other such like game, motor sport, or for children's playgrounds, unless such person has authority from the Committee to do so.

16. Any person, organization or club renting or hiring the Reserve, or any part thereof including any stand, structure, erection or enclosure for any approved purpose shall pay to the Committee such annual or other charge as the Committee may consider fair and reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

17. No person shall enter and leave and park in the Reserve any horses, vehicles, motor cars, motor conveyances, motor cycles, bicycles, and other such like conveyances at places other than those as may be appointed or set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

18. No person shall, in the Reserve, erect or remove any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building or structure without the written consent of the Committee.

19. No person shall, whilst in the Reserve, be in a state of intoxication or behave in a disorderly manner, or sing any obscene song or ballad, or write or draw any indecent or obscene word, figure, or representation, or use any profane, indecent or obscene language or create or take part in any disturbance, or interfere with any games, sports or amusements or use any threatening, insulting or abusive words or gestures or otherwise misbehave.

20. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for any lawful game or sport, and may from time to time grant to any person, organization, club or combination of clubs the use of such portion so set apart upon such terms and conditions as the Committee may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

21. No person shall wilfully obstruct, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper and lawful use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, nor wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee, or any person appointed by it in the execution of his official duty.—(Rs.502.)

"DIVISION IV.—SHIFT DUTY AND ROSTERED TIME OF ORDINARY DUTY PERFORMED BY OFFICERS DURING WEEK-ENDS OR ON PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

136. (1) Officers, other than those in the Mental Hygiene Branch, Department of Health, referred to in Regulation 136A, who are required to perform rostered time of ordinary duty on Saturdays, Sundays or holidays observed in accordance with the provisions of

the Public Service Acts or shift duty and whose standard salaries do not exceed the standard salary provided in the Third Schedule for the top subdivision of Class "B1", Administrative Division, shall, unless otherwise determined by the Board, be paid allowances as shown hereunder—

Monday to Friday Inclusive.

- (a) When required to perform rostered time of ordinary duty on an afternoon or night shift—at the rate of 10 per centum of their hourly rate for each hour of duty; provided that this allowance shall not apply to officers working a roster of two days on duty and two days off duty.

Saturday.

- (b) When required to perform rostered time of ordinary duty—
 - (i) in the case of Student Nurses or officers who are required to be registered with the Victorian Nursing Council as general nurses, mental nurses or mental deficiency nurses—at the rate of 25 per centum of their hourly rate for each hour of duty;
 - (ii) all others—at the rate of 50 per centum of their hourly rate for each hour of duty.

Sunday.

- (c) When required to perform rostered time of ordinary duty—
 - (i) in the case of Student Nurses or officers who are required to be registered with the Victorian Nursing Council as general nurses, mental nurses or mental deficiency nurses—at the rate of 50 per centum of their hourly rate for each hour of duty;
 - (ii) all others—at the rate of 100 per centum of their hourly rate for each hour of duty.

Public Holiday.

- (d) When required to perform rostered time of ordinary duty—at the rate of 25 per centum of their hourly rate for each hour of duty; provided that an officer who is rostered to perform ordinary duty on a holiday observed in accordance with the provisions of the Public Service Act shall, in addition to the allowance prescribed in this paragraph, be granted an additional day off in lieu; provided further that an officer whose rostered day off duty falls on a Public Holiday shall be granted an additional day off in lieu.

- (2) For the purpose of this Regulation—
 - (a) "Standard salary" means salary excluding any additional amount payable under the provisions of Regulation 87.
 - (b) "Afternoon shift" means a period of duty commencing at or after 10 a.m. and before 8 p.m.
 - (c) "Night shift" means a period of duty commencing at or after 8 p.m. and before 6 a.m.
- (3) The hourly rate of allowance shall be determined in accordance with the following formula, but in no case shall the hourly rate exceed that calculated on an annual actual salary appropriate to the standard salary provided in the Third Schedule for the top subdivision of Class "C2", Administrative Division:—

$$\frac{\text{Actual fortnightly salary}}{\text{Fortnightly ordinary hours of duty}} \times \frac{\text{Annual salary (including any additional amount payable under the provisions of Regulation 87)}}{365\frac{1}{2}} = 1$$

- (5) For work performed additional to a rostered shift of ordinary duty payment shall be made of overtime rates as prescribed in Regulation 128: Provided that Student Nurses and officers who are required to be registered with the Victorian Nursing Council as general nurses, mental nurses or mental deficiency nurses, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for all such work.

(6) For the purpose of computing allowances, a shift that finishes on the day after it commences shall be deemed to have been worked in its entirety on the day on which the majority of the shift occurs.

(7) In calculating overtime rates, any allowance prescribed by this Regulation shall be disregarded.

General—Cleaners.

136A. A Cleaner (Male or Female) who is employed during any week for 25 hours or less shall receive payment at the rate of ordinary time plus 15 per centum for all time worked. Ward Assistants, Training Assistants, and such other officers and employees as the Board may determine whose ordinary hours of duty are worked in accordance with a roster of 8 hour shifts shall be paid an allowance of 70 cents for each period of rostered duty which finishes between 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. or commences between 6 p.m. and 6.30 a.m.

Provided that, if such officers are required to permanently work any such rostered shift which finishes on the day after it commences or which commences between midnight and 5 a.m., the allowance shall be increased to \$1. "Permanently work" shall mean work for any period in excess of four weeks.

CITY OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW No. 200.

A By-law of the City of Brighton made under sections 197 and 800 of the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling and numbered 200 for amending and altering By-law 128 of the City of Brighton (as amended by By-law 176) for preserving good order and decency and controlling and regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in those public reserves parks pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation in the said City referred to in the said By-law 128 as amended.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every other power in that behalf enabling it the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in those parts of the Municipal District of Brighton set out in Schedule "A" of the said By-law 128.

2. By-law 128 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) by adding the following definition to the definition in Clause 2 thereof:—

"Liquor" means any wine spirits ale beer porter cider perry or other spirituous or fermented liquor of an intoxicating nature;

(b) by deleting clause 36 thereof and substituting in lieu thereof the following clause;

36. No person shall sell or offer for sale liquor on any of the Reserves and no person shall bring any liquor on to any of the Reserves or consume it thereon except with the consent of the Council. Such consent may be given at the Council's discretion but only in respect of consumption of liquor in any permanent building situate on any of the Reserves upon written application therefor by or on behalf of any person corporation club or association requesting permission to bring on and consume liquor on any specified occasion or during any specified period in any specified portion of the Reserves occupied by a building of a permanent character and such consent shall prescribe such conditions as the Council may see fit.

(c) by adding the number 7 before the number 11 in clause 46 thereof and by adding the number 35 before the number 38 in the said clause 46.

Resolution for making and passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council at its meeting on the Fifth day of April, 1970 and confirmed the Third day of May, 1971.

CITY OF KEILOR.

By-LAW No. 64.

A By-law of the City of Keilor made under Section 756 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 64 for:

- (a) Preserving public decency;
- (b) Regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the City of Keilor Swimming Pool;
- (c) Controlling, managing and preserving the City of Keilor Swimming Pool;
- (d) Imposing, collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees from clubs, associations or persons using or entering the City of Keilor Swimming Pool.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Keilor orders as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter:—

Definitions.

"Swimming Pool" means any pool or body of water provided on the swimming pool premises for the use of swimmers, including any wading or diving pool.

"Pool Premises" shall mean the paths, aprons, seats, dressing rooms, compartments, bathrooms, buildings, picnic area and other areas forming part of the City of Keilor Swimming Pool and associated with the pool.

"Council" will mean the Council of the City of Keilor.

"Manager" shall mean the person from time to time appointed by the Council to manage the pool and pool area.

"Attendant" means any employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connexion with the swimming pool premises.

"Carnival" shall mean any function held by or organized with the written consent of the Council.

"Vehicle" shall mean any car, bicycle, cart, trailer or other wheeled vehicles, but not including any conveyance for the infirm or for a child under the age of four years.

2. The swimming pool premises shall be open to the public during such periods and such hours as the Council shall, by Resolution determine. Periods of Opening.

3. The Council may at any time and from time to time close the pool premises or any part thereof for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of cleansing, repairing rebuilding and reconstructing the same or for any other like purpose. Power to Close.

4. The attendant in charge or other person duly authorized by the Council may charge every person entering the pool premises the proper fees as determined from time to time by Special Order of the Council. Charges to be made.

5. In the event of the Council holding or authorizing a swimming carnival or other entertainment in the pool premises, the Council shall have the power by resolution to prohibit bathing in the pools whilst any such carnival or entertainment is being held, and to fix the fees chargeable to any organization conducting such carnival or entertainment, and to fix the prices that shall be charged for admission thereto. Seasonal or concession tickets shall not admit any person to the pool premises during the time fixed as the time for such carnival or entertainment. Carnivals.

6. Applications shall be made to the Council six weeks in advance of the date for which the organizations desire to hire the pool and pool premises. Application to be made.

7. No person shall obstruct hinder or interfere with the Manager any attendant officer or servant employed by the Council in the performance of his duty at the pool and pool premises. Obstruction.

8. Any person finding any article which may have been left in the pool or pool premises shall at once deliver the same to the Manager who shall thereupon register a description of same in a book kept for that purpose, and any person claiming such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership receive such article from the Manager upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to. Lost property.

9. The Council will not be responsible for articles lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the pool or pool premises.

10. No person shall offer any goods for sale in the pool or pool premises without the consent in writing of the Council. Sale of goods.

11. The Council shall call tenders from time to time as it may decide for the running of the kiosk in the pool premises and may enter into such arrangements with any person for the supply and sale of confectionery soft drinks and other goods from such kiosk as may be necessary. Conduct of Kiosk.

12. No person shall teach or coach swimming diving or associated skills or conduct classes for gain or profit in the pool or pool premises without written license of the Council. Teaching or Coaching.

13. Persons desirous of obtaining a license to teach, coach or conduct classes in the pool or pool premises shall make written application to the Council setting out their qualifications and experience.

14. The Council may from time to time by Special Order of the Council determine the fees to be paid in respect of licenses to teach, coach or conduct classes in the pool or pool premises.

15. Nothing in the three preceding clauses shall prevent an accredited swimming teacher employed by the Education Department of Victoria or by a Registered School from teaching coaching or conducting classes in swimming diving or associated skills for school children in his or her charge during normal school hours.

16. Every person not being the holder of a seasonal or concession ticket shall before entering the pool premises pay to the person authorized for the purpose, the price fixed from time to time for admission thereto. Admission to be paid.

17. No seasonal or concession ticket shall be transferable and any holder of such ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and the rights and privileges given by such ticket. Seasonal or Concession tickets not transferable.

18. The attendant in charge of the pool premises may refuse admission thereto to any person. Admission.

No person shall enter the pool premises unless an attendant or authorized person is present.

19. An authorized attendant may require any person offending against any part of this By-law (but without prejudice to the imposition of any penalty in respect of such offence) to leave the pool premises and may eject such person therefrom if he or she fails to leave forthwith. Persons may be required to leave.

20. No person over the age of eight years shall use the wading pool unless with the approval of the attendant. Use of Wading Pool.

21. No boy or girl under the age of eight years who is unable to swim shall use the main pool without the permission of the attendant in charge unless accompanied by an adult or other person approved by the attendant in charge, and no adult non swimmer will enter the pool beyond his or her depth. Use of Main Pool.

22. No child under the age of six years shall be permitted to enter the pool premises unless in the opinion of the attendant in charge such child is in the care of a responsible person. Children under 6 years.

23. No person other than a child under the age of four years under the care of a responsible person shall enter or use any dressing room, shower or convenience passages leading thereto which have been appointed or appropriated to use of persons of the opposite sex. Use of dressing rooms.

24. Every person using any swimming pool, shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the Council or its authorized officer shall be the sole judge of the suitability of any costume. Costume.

- No undressing in open. 25. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the pool premises open to the public view on in or upon any part of the pool premises, except places specifically reserved for such purpose.
- No use of toys etc. 26. No person shall use any flippers, snorkels, masks or goggles, beach balls, motor tubes, inflated rubber or plastic articles or toys or kicking boards except by the permission of the attendant in charge. Toddlers may be permitted by the attendant in charge to take rubber toys into the wading pool. Water polo may only be practised or played at times and by teams approved by the Council. No other ball games of any kind shall be permitted in the pools or the pool premises.
- Cutaneous, infectious or contagious diseases. 27. No person shall use the pools whilst in an unclean condition or who is suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and any person shall retire from the pools on being requested to do so by the attendant in charge.
- Showering. 28. No person shall enter a pool before first washing himself or herself in the shower bath and every bather after using the latrine or water closets shall wash under the showers without costume before entering or re-entering the pool.
- Pollution of water. 29. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the pool, or the shower baths, or wilfully and improperly soil or defile any dressing room, closet, box or compartment or any part of the pool or any furniture or article therein.
- Use of soap. 30. No person shall use soap in any portion of the pool other than in the showers provided for that purpose.
- Discolouration of water. 31. No person shall at any time while being in the pool use any substance or preparation whereby the water in such pool may be discoloured or rendered unfit for the use of the bathers.
- Interference of use by others. 32. No person shall interfere with the use and enjoyment of the pools by any other person and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner, shall immediately leave the pool when requested to do so by the attendant in charge. Only one person shall stand on or dive from any diving board at the one time, and no person other than the attendant in charge shall prevent any other person from using any diving board. No person shall use any diving board if the attendant in charge deems it dangerous for any such board to be used and so advises the person concerned either verbally or by a notice suitably displayed in the vicinity of such diving board or boards.
33. No person shall engage in boisterous or rough play or conduct within the pool premises.
34. No person shall spit, spout water, or blow his or her nose in any of the pools.
35. No person shall roll or throw stones or other articles into any of the pools.
- Misconduct litter. 36. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself or herself or commit a nuisance in the pool premises or bring any bottle, tin or rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into the said premises or deposit any rubbish therein or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, orange or other peel, papers cast-off clothes or other litter, except in receptacles provided for such purpose.
37. No person shall dispose of any cigar cigarette pipe ash or match within the pool or pool premises except in the receptacles provided for the same.
- Placard or Notice Boards. 38. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the pool premises.
- Interference with equipment. 39. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently damage or destroy or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock cock valve pipe work plant or machinery in connection with the pool or pool premises or carelessly or negligently damage or destroy any furniture, fittings or conveniences in any bathroom dressing room closet or compartment and shall not by cutting or writing thereon deface any wall fittings or any portion of the pool or pool premises.
- Offensive language or behaviour. 40. No person shall at any time while being in the pool or pool premises use any indecent insulting or offensive language or behave in any indecent insulting offensive or riotous manner.
- Dogs. 41. No person shall cause or allow any dog other than a dog trained for and engaged in the guidance of the blind, or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in the pool or pool premises, provided always that the Council may give written permission to the Manager to keep a dog or dogs in the pool premises for the purpose of guarding such premises at such time as the pool premises are closed to the public.
- Gambling. 42. No person shall bet play cards or any game of chance in the pool or pool premises, providing always that this shall not prevent the Council giving written permission to conduct a raffle or similar scheme in the event of an organization having obtained the necessary permit to do so from the Attorney-General.
- Intoxicated persons excluded. 43. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the pool or pool premises whilst in a state of intoxication, and no person shall at any time introduce into the baths or consume or cause to be consumed any spirituous or intoxicating liquor in the pool or pool premises.
- No expectorating. 44. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the pool or on any lawns or in the dressing rooms, compartments, passages or entrances thereto, or in the vicinity of the kiosk, on the walls or on any sealed surface within the pool premises.
- Hire of equipment. 45. Any person hiring any article from any attendant at the pool shall return the same to the attendant in charge prior to leaving the premises.
46. Every person shall before being furnished with any towel, bathing costume or locker pay to the authorized attendant, the price of payment for the use thereof and the deposit for same as fixed from time to time by the Council and after use shall return the same to the attendant who will return deposits lodged provided the said towel, bathing costume or locker has not been damaged in any way.
- Vehicles. 47. No person shall in the pool premises ride or drive or push any vehicle not being a vehicle delivering any goods or providing any services for or in connection with the running of the pool or pool premises or with the conveyance of the infirm or of a child under the age of four years.
- Climbing on fixtures. 48. No person unless authorized by the attendant in charge shall climb or attempt to climb over, into or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fence, roof, building or structure.

49. No person shall use or interfere with any rope, raft, lifebuoy, or lifesaving appliance or apparatus in the premises except in the case of accident and danger occurring to a bather rendering their use necessary. Interference with equipment.

50. No unauthorized person shall enter the plant room, its enclosure or any storeroom within the pool premises. Unauthorized entry.

51. No person shall occupy the shower baths for an unreasonable time or enter any shower or water closet occupied by another person. Shower.

52. Any person guilty of an act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty dollars (\$50) for every such offence. Penalty.

53. The Council will not be responsible for any physical injury suffered by any person or persons arising out of the use by them of the pool or pool premises. Operation.

54. This By-law shall come into effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

55. This By-law shall apply to that part of the municipal district known as the City of Keilor Swimming Pool situate on land in Quinn Grove, Keilor East and more particularly described in Certificate of Title Volume 8338 Folio 718.

A Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Keilor on 19th November, 1968, and confirmed on the 4th February, 1969.

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the City of Keilor made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 65 for:—

- (a) Preventing and extinguishing fires;
- (b) Suppressing nuisances;
- (c) Preserving public decency;
- (d) Preserving good order and decency in any building belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council, preventing damage to such building or to furniture or fittings thereof or regulating any meeting or gathering held therein;
- (e) Generally maintaining the good rule and Government of the Municipality; and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Keilor orders as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be known as the City of Keilor Good Order in Buildings By-law. Title.

2. By-law 15, By-law 52 and By-law 59 of the City of Keilor all relating to preserving good order and decency in buildings belonging to the Municipality or under the control or management of the Council are hereby repealed. Repeal of 15, 52 & 59.

3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject matter:— Definitions.

- "Council" means the Council of the City of Keilor.
"Municipal District" means the Municipal District of the City of Keilor.
"Building" means any building belonging to the Municipality or under the control and management of the Council.
"Hallkeeper" means the person from time to time appointed by the Council to such position.
"Assistant Hallkeeper" means and includes any employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connection with buildings.
"Liquor" means liquor within the meaning of the *Liquor Control Act 1968*.
"Consent of the Council" means consent in writing given over the hand of the Town Clerk.

4. No person shall in any building behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, threatening, insulting, violent, quarrelsome or disorderly manner or so as to occasion a breach of the peace. Behaviour.

5. No persons shall in any building use threatening, abusive, obscene, indecent or insulting words. Insulting Words etc.

6. No persons shall enter into or remain in any building while in a drunken or intoxicated condition. Drunken condition.

7. No person shall enter or remain in any building while in the possession of liquor without having first obtained the consent of the Council. Possession of Liquor.

8. No person shall sell or dispose of or permit to be sold or disposed of or consume or allow to be consumed liquor in any building without having first obtained the consent of the Council. Use of Liquor.

9. No person shall in any building obstruct hinder or interfere with the Hallkeeper or any Assistant Hallkeeper Attendant Officer or Servant employed by the Council in the performance of his duty. Obstruction.

10. Any person in or upon any building shall obey forthwith all lawful directions given by a Hallkeeper, Assistant Hallkeeper, Attendant Officer or Servant of the Council in the performance of his duty. Obedience to Directions.

11. A Hallkeeper or Assistant Hallkeeper may require any person offending against any part of this By-law (but without prejudice to the imposition of any penalty in respect of such offence) to leave any building and may eject such person therefrom if he or she fails to leave forthwith. Persons may be required to leave.

12. No person shall dispose of any cigar, cigarette, pipe ash or match within any building except in the receptacles provided for the same. Disposal of Ash.

Damage to Equipment.	13. No person shall at any time wilfully, carelessly or negligently damage or destroy or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, cock pipe, work plant, electrical equipment or machinery in connection with any building or wilfully, carelessly or negligently damage or destroy or mark or deface any part of any building or any fitting or any furniture in any building.
Climbing on Fixtures.	14. No person unless authorized by the Hallkeeper or Assistant Hallkeeper in charge shall climb or attempt to climb over into or upon or remain on or upon any fixture, fence, roof, window sill, parapet, gutter, gable roof parapet or cornice of any building.
Standing on Furniture.	15. No person shall in any building stand on any chair, seat, table or other furniture.
Expectorating.	16. No person shall expectorate upon the floor, walls, furniture or fittings of any building.
Stair Hand-rail.	17. No person shall use any stair hand-rail otherwise than for support or assistance by hand in ascending or descending such stair.
Fire Appliances.	18. No person shall in any way interfere with or destroy or improperly use or damage any fire prevention appliance in any building.
Unauthorised Entry.	19. No unauthorised person shall enter any plant room, equipment room, switch room or store room within any building.
Showers and Water Closets.	20. No person shall occupy any shower, bath or water closet for an unreasonable time or enter any shower or water closet occupied by another person.
	21. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal district.

REGULATIONS TO AMEND THE REGULATIONS (No. 180) FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CARLTON, FITZROY, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS; ALEXANDRA, FAWKNER, FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON, FLINDERS, PRINCES, AND YARRA PARKS; POWLETT RESERVE; AND ARGYLE, CURTAIN, DARLING, LINCOLN, MACARTHUR, MURCHISON, AND UNIVERSITY SQUARES, AND NUMBERED 186.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 219 of the *Land Act 1958*, the Minister of Lands and the Corporation of the City of Melbourne as Trustees of the above-named lands hereby make the following Regulations:

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the *City of Melbourne Parks and Gardens (General) (Amendment No. 1) Regulations 1971*.

(2) In these Regulations, the *City of Melbourne Parks and Gardens (General) Regulations 1959*, Regulations No. 180, as approved by the Governor in Council on 22nd September, 1959, are referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. The Principal Regulations shall be amended as follows:

(a) In the preamble—

(i) for the words "Board of Land and Works" there shall be substituted the words "Minister of Lands"; and

(ii) for the words "Council of the City of Melbourne" there shall be substituted the words "Corporation of the City of Melbourne";

(b) Regulation 10 shall be repealed and the following Regulations shall be inserted in its place:

"10. No person shall throw stones or missiles, or light any fire in the Reserves.

10A. No person shall drop, leave, scatter or throw down in the Reserves any bottles, cast-off clothing, fruit peel, litter, paper or refuse of any kind."

(c) Regulation 25 shall be repealed and the following Regulations shall be inserted in its place:

"25. No person shall give out or distribute any advertisement, book, handbill, notice, pamphlet, paper, placard, program or other printed matter in the Reserves, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

25A. No person shall litter the Reserves by dropping, leaving, scattering or throwing down any advertisement, book, handbill, notice, pamphlet, paper, placard, program or other printed matter therein."

(d) in Regulations 26 and 27 for the expression "*Licensing Act 1958*" (wherever occurring) there shall be substituted the expression "*Liquor Control Act 1968*";

(e) in Regulation 33 for the expression "Cemetery-road" there shall be substituted the words "Princes Park Drive";

(f) Regulation 34 shall be repealed and the following Regulation shall be inserted in its place:

"34. On such occasions only as the areas known as Carlton Recreation Ground, Melbourne Cricket Ground, Olympic Park, and Richmond Cricket Ground are used for cricket or football matches or other functions, the Committee may set apart portions of Flinders, Princes and Yarra Parks for the parking of motor cars, motor cycles and other vehicles, and a charge not exceeding thirty cents (\$0.30) may be made and taken by the Committee or its authorized representatives for the parking of any motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle in the portions of those parks so set apart."

(g) Regulations 43 shall be repealed and the following Regulation shall be inserted in its place:

"43. The right of any persons to enter the areas known as Carlton Recreation Ground in Princes Park and Richmond Cricket Ground in Yarra Park shall be subject to the payment of a charge (not exceeding such sum as may from time to time be fixed in that behalf by the Minister of Lands) on any such days (being not more than 72 in any one year in each case) as those areas may be used for cricket or football matches or other functions."

(h) in Regulation 44—

(i) for the words "Three shillings" there shall be substituted the expression "thirty cents (\$0.30)"; and

(ii) for the word "their" there shall be substituted the word "its";

(i) in Regulation 50—

(i) after the word "Regulations" there shall be inserted the expression "(other than Regulations 10A and 25A)";

(ii) for the expression "Five pounds (£5)" there shall be substituted the expression "\$50"; and

(iii) for the expression "Ten pounds (£10)" there shall be substituted the expression "\$100";

(j) after Regulation 50 there shall be inserted the following Regulation:

"50A. Every person offending against either or both of Regulations 10A and 25A shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$200."

(k) in the paragraph next but one succeeding Regulation 50A for the word "Council" there shall be substituted the word "Corporation";

- (l) in the First Schedule for the words "Olympic Baths" there shall be substituted the words "Beaurepaire Pool"; and
- (m) in the Eighth Schedule after the heading "Committee of Management" there shall be inserted the expression "(As affected by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the *Land (Committees of Management) Act 1967*").
