

Oxytetracycline, Tylosin and its salts and Virginiamycin and its salts in concentrations of 50 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle;

(c) preparations containing 20 parts per million or less of Hygromycin B;

(d) milk replacers for calves and starter rations for pigs containing Bacitracin and its salts, Benzyl Penicillin and its salts (including Procaine Penicillin), Chlortetracycline, Erythromycin and its salts, Oxytetracycline and its salts and Tylosin and its salts in concentrations of 100 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle;

MAIN ROAD HEIDELBERG - DONCASTER ROAD CITY OF DONCASTER & TEMPLESTOWE



- 3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at thirty cents per thousand gallons.
- 4. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at five dollars.
- 5. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

MAIN ROAD YARRAGON – SHADY CREEK ROAD SHIRE OF NARRACAN




MAIN ROAD YARRAGON — SHADY CREEK ROAD SHIRE OF NARRACAN



PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria entituled the Clean Air (Amendment) Act 1972, No. 8324, it is stated that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council do proclaim that Tuesday the fifth day of December, 1972 is the day upon which the Clean Air (Amendment) Act 1972 No. 8324 shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two and in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 11.


