Whereas by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958*
it is amongst other things enacted that any proclamation
made under section 25 of the said Act may be amended
or revoked by a subsequent proclamation: Now therefore,
I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-
wealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the
Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation
further AMEND the Proclamation made on the eleventh
day of May, 1971, as amended by a Proclamation made
on the thirteenth day of July, 1971, declaring portions of
Victoria within the Counties of Wonnangatta, Dargo,
Tanjil, and Buln Buln to be proclaimed areas, as follows:—

In paragraph (4) of the First Schedule, after the
words "Alberton West" there shall be inserted the
expression " , Wonga Wonga South ".


STATE HIGHWAY SOUTH GIPPSLAND HIGHWAY SHIRE OF WOORAYL








MAIN ROAD



FAWKNER CREMATORIUM AND MEMORIAL PARK
REGULATIONS.

A. Recital.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the *Cemeteries Act 1958*, the Trustees of the Fawknor Crematorium and Memorial Park do hereby revoke all previous regulations and make the following regulations which shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*:—

B. Interpretation.

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Park” means the Fawknor Crematorium and Memorial Park.

“Memorial work” means any building, stone, kerbing, memorial inscription, or other work erected or placed on any burial site or allotment.

“Administrator” means the person employed by the Trustees as the Officer in Charge of the management of the Park.

“Trustees” means the Trustees of the Fawknor Crematorium and Memorial Park.

“Burial” shall unless the context otherwise requires include cremation.

C. General.

2. The Administrator shall, subject to the Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters connected with the Park, subject to the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act* and these Regulations and the direction of such person shall in all matters and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

3. Any workman or other employee, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the Park be subject to the supervision and control of the Administrator or his delegated appointee and shall obey all or any directions given to him by the said Administrator or his delegated appointee, and upon any breach of these Regulations shall be subject to the penalty prescribed by section 11 of the *Cemeteries Act 1958*.

4. Any person desiring ground in the Park for a private grave, monument or for any other purposes, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved, the Trustees on the payment of the required fees shall issue to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in form set out in Schedule “A” hereof.

5. (a) The Trustees shall divide the burial ground into sections, including a lawn section, and shall allot graves within the sections and shall cause a plan to be made showing the sections and graves of the burial ground and shall sign and certify the plan when made. The plan or a copy thereof shall be kept for reference in the office of the Administrator.

5. (b) Plots of ground in the lawn section shall be allotted in rotation. Where a plot is purchased for immediate use for burial not more than one other plot may be reserved to the applicant.

6. All fees and charges in respect to applications for burial, cremation or for memorial work shall be paid in full to the Trustees upon grant of a permit, provided however that an applicant may with the consent of the Trustees deposit with the Trustees such sum as may be estimated to be sufficient to cover the total amount of such fees and charges as are likely to be incurred by the applicant during a period of one month. An account for the actual fees and charges shall be rendered to the applicant monthly and in default of payment within three days of rendering the account such deposit shall be applied by the Trustees in discharge of such fees and charges but without prejudice to the right of the Trustees to recover from the applicant any amount of fees and charges owing by him in excess of the sum so deposited.

7. Except with permission of the Administrator no vehicle except hearses and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter or stand opposite the entrance gates of the Park save for the purpose of loading or unloading which shall be carried out with all due despatch.

8. Unless otherwise ordered the main entrance shall be opened daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. All gates other than the main entrance will be opened as soon as possible thereafter.

9. No person in the Park or in its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass or be guilty of any breach of decorum or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of the Park any flower, plant, shrub or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, nor cut, pluck, gather or take out of the Park any grass, plot, border, railing, fence, or any other erection or gate therein, or move or interfere in any way with anything laid, built or placed on or in any grave or burying place. No person in the Memorial Park shall carry fire-arms or air guns or go bird nesting, catch or trap birds, destroy eggs or nests or fish in the ornamental pools.

10. The Trustees shall have the power to remove from any burial allotment or memorial any unsightly ornaments such as glass/plastic bottles—jars—milk bottles—tins—decayed and broken wreaths—dead flowers—plastic flowers and wreaths and/or any article which in the opinion of the Trust lowers the standard of the Park. Fresh flowers are authorised and encouraged but these must be contained in the bronze flower containers—supplied by the Trustees at a reasonable cost.

11. All rubbish is to be placed in the receptacles provided in the Memorial Park for that purpose.

12. Grave markers in the form of simple white crosses of a uniform size and type can be obtained from the Trust at a nominal charge. These are for use as a temporary marker until such times as a more permanent stone memorial is constructed. They must not be used in a lawn area. Any crosses, which are not authorised by the Trustees, if found on a grave or memorial will be removed by the Park staff. Written notice will be given before the removal of the unauthorised crosses.

13. No dogs shall be admitted to the Park unless on a leash and in the charge of some person over the age of twelve years.

14. The Trustees may undertake the keeping of burial allotments in order, turfing, planting with flowers, according to such fees and charges as shall be made by the Trustees from time to time.

15. No photographs shall be taken in the Memorial Park without the authority of the Trustees being first obtained in writing and no photograph of any memorial work in the Memorial Park shall be permitted to be taken without the written authority of the owner being produced at the Memorial Park office.

16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Park or at any gateway thereof of any approach thereto any trade, business or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

17. All exhumations must be in accordance with the *Cemeteries Act 1958* and shall only be made after the permission of the Trustees has been obtained. Deceased persons exhumed at other Parks or cemeteries and brought to Fawkner Crematorium for cremation will only be accepted if complete precautions have been taken by the respective Funeral Director to prevent any obnoxious vapours or liquids emanating from the sealed coffin.

18. No person shall within the Park put any animal or animals for the purpose of grazing except with the consent, in writing, of the Trustees.

19. Any person committing a breach of any of these Regulations or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-Laws lawfully made in pursuance of an Act relating to Cemeteries and Crematoria may be thereupon forthwith removed from the Park by the Trustees, Administrator or other officer and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be prosecuted accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

D. Memorial Work.

20. The position of all memorial work shall be subject to the regulations of the Trustees for general appearance and condition, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the Park in an appropriate manner.

21. On burial allotments on which, having regard to the general appearance of the Park, it is, in the opinion of the Trustees, desirable that a certain class or style of monument shall be erected the Trustees may sell the Right of Burial in such allotments with a condition that the purchaser must erect upon such allotment a monument of the description specified by the Trustees.

22. Any person desiring to construct, erect, add to or alter any memorial work or any other construction or erection in any part of the Park shall, at least seven days before it is proposed to commence the erection thereof, apply in writing to the Administrator for permission to do so, and at the same time submit the Certificate of Right of Burial for endorsement, and shall also submit, upon the form issued by the Trustees, a drawing of the proposed works, with full particulars, including the position and size of foundation piers, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work. The Trustees shall be at liberty to withhold their permission and prevent the erection or placing of any monument or tombstone which appears to them inappropriate or unbecoming.

23. Every person prior to placing any inscription or epitaph, or other writing or drawing in any part of the Park shall submit a copy thereof to the Administrator, and shall obtain his written permission for the same.

24. A payment as specified from time to time by the Trustees, shall be made by all masons and others prior to the commencement of any work which they may be engaged to perform in the Park, which sum will be repaid to them upon their having complied with all the regulations of the Park, and upon their having cleared away all surplus soil, and removed out of the Park all refuse caused by the performance of such work, and made good to the satisfaction of the Administrator all damage caused by them, or in their default, it shall be applied towards such purpose, as far as it will extend, they being liable for any deficiency.

25. (a) All memorial work is to be composed of materials as the Trustees may from time to time by resolution approve.

(b) Regulations of the Trust as expressed in the *Cemeteries Act* shall be applied on the advice when and there required of the Trustees' Consultants.

26. Drivers of vehicles conveying materials for memorials must proceed direct to the office for instructions as to the route that shall be taken.

27. If it is desired to drop heavy objects from a vehicle on to a roadway, pads must be provided on to which the objects may fall.

28. No material for memorial work shall be brought into the Park on Saturday or Sunday.

29. The designer's or mason's name, or both, may, with the owner's consent, be placed upon memorial work in half-inch letters, provided that no address or other particulars be added.

30. Foundations shall be built to the depth below the surface of the ground directed by the Administrator, and the holes and trenches shall be submitted for the Administrator's inspection before any work is built therein.

31. The erection of memorial work shall commence no later than on the next working day after any material therefor is delivered in the Park, and all memorial work when commenced shall be proceeded with from day to

day until completion, save for delay caused by bad weather, or the permission given for the erection thereof shall be void.

32. All mortar shall be mixed on a proper mortar board.

33. The Trustees may order the removal or alteration of any monument, tomb, tablet, gravestone, vault, railing or other erection, or the erasure of any inscription, which has been erected or placed in the burial ground in contravention of the foregoing Regulations.

34. When a kerbing or other permitted enclosure is placed upon an allotment, the whole of that allotment as shown upon the Memorial plan, shall be enclosed with the kerbing or other enclosure; that is, for instance, an owner of an 8 ft. x 8 ft. allotment may not enclose half of it but must enclose the whole area.

35. All memorial work upon the level of the ground is to be composed of stone or metal of such varieties as the Trustees may from time to time by resolution approve, but in such sections of the Memorial Park as may be specified by the Trustees from time to time, kerbing composed of concrete and constructed by the Trustees may be placed around allotments with or without a tablet or headstone, such tablet or headstone to be at least 1½ inches thick and not more than 2 feet high.

36. In estimating the value of memorial work, the total cost of the work will include all foundations and work under and upon the ground. All materials required in the completion of any memorial work must be fully prepared before being taken into the Memorial Park and no vehicles conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Memorial Park.

37. No stone or other material shall be rolled or levered along roads or pathways or over lawns but must be moved upon a hand-truck, and, where considered necessary by the Administrator the hand-truck must be drawn over planks.

38. Where the weight upon any pier exceeds two tons, or where the weight upon any pier exceeds one ton per square foot, the pier shall be carried down to the level of the bottom of the grave. Where any pier or foundation goes nearer than 6 inches, measured horizontally, from any grave, such pier or foundations shall be carried down to the bottom of the grave.

39. Where white pebbles, marble chippings or similar material are used over a grave, they shall be laid on a cement mortar or concrete slab of at least 1½ inches in thickness, with approved metal re-inforcement.

40. Stones used in kerbing shall not be less than 6 inches wide, and stones carrying headstones shall not be less than 12 inches wide.

41. When kerbing consists of a single course of stone, the stones shall not be less than 12 inches high and where kerbing consists of more than one course the bottom course shall not be less than 12 inches high.

42. Where a kerbing consists of a single course only and a ledger is not used, the stones shall be pitched, faced or rubbed blue-stone or granite.

43. Kerbing up to the length of 9 feet shall be in one section or piece only.

44. A continuous metal railing around an allotment must have a continuous stone kerb under it.

45. Kerbing shall be fixed to a level given by the Administrator.

46. Stone masons will be held responsible for the outer face of all kerbing being accurately placed upon the proper boundary lines of the allotments, to the specification of the Administrator and if it is not so done, it will have to be re-set.

47. On narrow paths, and where required by the Administrator, a stone 6 inches high shall be placed along the length of the front of the grave under the kerbing.

48. No headstone shall be less than 1½ inches thick and no headstone over 2 feet 6 inches high shall be less than 2 inches thick or over 4 feet 6 inches high, less than 3 inches thick.

49. No memorial work shall be allowed upon a grave situated in a common undenominational area, i.e., Other Denominations Section, North of 4th Avenue and the University area, 7th Avenue or any other areas so specified from time to time. Tributes may be placed in the raised flower beds, provided, adjacent to these areas.

E. Burial and Cremation.

50. All applications for burial or cremation shall be made at the Park Office, at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial or cremation.

51. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug.

52. (a) All applications for burial or cremation shall be made upon the official forms issued by the Trustees and in the case of applications for cremation in conformity with the form prescribed by the *Cemeteries Act 1958*.

52. (b) Upon receipt of an application for burial or cremation duly completed to the satisfaction of an officer authorized in that behalf by the Trustees and accompanied by such other documents as are required by the *Cemeteries Act 1958* such officer shall issue a permit for such burial or cremation.

53. No burial shall be permitted in any private allotment without the production of the Certificate of the Right of Burial, or other evidence to the satisfaction of the Trustees that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so; and in the case of an application for interment in any private allotment, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application.

54. No corpse to be buried or cremated shall be brought into or buried or cremated in the Park except in a coffin which is soundly constructed of substantial wooden or other approved materials in such a way as to prevent the escape of offensive liquids or exhalations and to prevent any person seeing the contents thereof. Every coffin shall have on the lid a metal plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

55. The regular hours fixed for burial or cremation shall be as follows unless and until otherwise notified by the Trustees:—

On weekdays—from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

On Saturdays—from 9 a.m. to 11.15 a.m.

On Sundays and Holidays (when permitted)—from 9 a.m. to 11.30 a.m.

56. The time fixed for any burial or cremation shall be the time when the funeral is to arrive at the Park, and such time shall be punctually observed.

57. No burial or cremation shall be allowed on Sundays except when it is certified in writing by a duly qualified medical practitioner or a Stipendiary Magistrate or a Justice of the Peace that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the same takes place on that day. For the purpose of this Regulation, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Anzac Day shall be regarded as being a Sunday.

58. (a) The Trustees shall cause a register to be kept in which shall be entered the name and former address of every person whose body is interred in the burial ground and the section and number of the grave in which the burial has been made and the date of the burial. The entry shall be made as soon as possible after each burial.

58. (b) The Trustees shall cause a register to be kept in which shall be entered the name and former address of every person whose body is cremated. Such register book shall be indexed so as to facilitate searches for entries therein and shall particularize the manner in which the disposition or burial of the ashes has been effected. The entry shall be made as soon as possible after cremation.

59. No more than two persons shall be buried in any one grave except where under special circumstances the permission of the Trustees has been obtained.

60. No corpse shall be received into the Memorial Park if carried in or upon a vehicle engaged in another funeral.

61. No person being the owner of an exclusive Right of Burial shall transfer such Right without the consent of the Trustees and no transfer shall be consented to by the Trustees except to a near relative of the owner or such other person as authorized by the Trustees. Upon the Trustees having consented, and the transferee having delivered up the existing Certificate of Right of Burial, and paid the charge prescribed by the Trustees, a new Certificate shall be issued.

62. Upon satisfactory evidence being produced to the Trustees that a Certificate of Right of Burial has been lost or destroyed, and upon the charge prescribed by the Trustees being paid, a new Certificate shall be issued by the Trustees.

63. The Trustees have the authority to arrange and construct for sale below ground vaults or brick wall graves.

64. The disposal of the ashes of cremated bodies within the Park and the memorial work relating thereto shall be subject to any regulations of the Governor in Council made pursuant to the *Cemeteries Act 1958*.

65. The Trustees shall cause a plan to be made identifying the place of disposal of ashes of cremated bodies and the plan or a copy thereof shall be kept for reference in the Office of the Administrator.

F. Trustee.

66. The number of Trustees of the Park shall not at any time exceed nine. The Trustees shall, at their first meeting, and thereafter annually in the month of April, elect one of their number to be Chairman. A Deputy Chairman is also to be appointed and in the event of the Chairman resigning the Deputy Chairman becomes Chairman.

67. The Trustees shall hold regular meetings for the transaction of the business of the Trust of the Park, and shall hold at least one such meeting each calendar month, except the month of January.

68. Such meetings shall be held at such times and places as the Trustees shall by resolution direct, and 7 clear days notice of all such meetings shall be given to the Trust specifying the business to be transacted.

69. At any meeting of such Trustees three shall form a quorum. If after 30 minutes there is still no quorum the meeting is to be adjourned for a date to be resolved by the Trustees to hold a meeting within 14 days of the adjourned meeting.

70. The Chairman shall have a deliberative and casting vote and every other Trustee shall have one vote only. No Trustee shall be entitled to vote by proxy. Voting at all meetings of the Trust shall be by simple majority.

71. The Trustees shall keep proper books of record of the business transacted by them, and minutes of their proceedings.

72. The Administrator shall furnish to the Trustees reports of the business transacted at such meeting within one week after such meetings shall have been held.

73. The Deputy Administrator and Accountant shall keep proper books of account and shall furnish to the Trustees each month a statement of the expenditure for the preceding month; he shall also furnish in the months of July and February in each year audited statements of receipts and expenditure for the half years ending 30th June and 31st December in each year.

74. The Trustees shall in the month of April in each year appoint a qualified Accountant as Auditor, to audit the books and accounts of the Fawcner Crematorium and Memorial Park for the current year.

75. The Trustees shall, at the same meeting as they elect their Chairman, also appoint one of their number, other than the Chairman, to be Honorary Treasurer, and if so desired, a deputy for the office of Treasurer.

76. All cheques will be signed by any one of the Trustees PLUS any two of the following signatories—the Administrator, the Deputy Administrator and Accountant, the Office Manager or the authorised signing officer—the Trust's bankers are to be advised accordingly.

77. The Deputy Administrator and Accountant shall prepare in due course and in proper form abstracts of accounts, declarations and reports, which the Trustees are required by law to prepare or to publish or transmit to the Commission of Public Health or otherwise.

78. The Administrator shall keep all books of record and registers which the Trustees are by law required to keep.

79. All Certificates of Right of Burial in the Memorial Park shall be signed by the Chairman or Deputy Chairman and the Administrator.

80. A draft form of all printing and stationery is to be submitted to the Trustees for approval before the Administrator orders same.

81. The Trustees shall appoint the Administrator, the Deputy Administrator and Accountant, the Superintendent of Gardens and the Office Manager. Save as aforesaid and subject to the approval of the Trustees the Administrator shall have power to appoint all officers and employees as are deemed necessary for the management of the Park.

82. All officers and employees of the Park shall be employed at the will of the Trustees and under such terms and conditions and at such remuneration as the Trustees may approve.

83. Subject to proclamation in the *Government Gazette* these regulations may be amended, added to or repealed in whole or in part by the Trustees provided that:—

- (a) At least fourteen days notice in writing has been given to the Trust of the motion proposing such amendment addition or repeal and the general nature thereof.

- (b) The motion is carried by a majority of the Trustees present at such meeting.

Total Area of Hatched Portions 54.3.13



A BY-LAW of the Shire of Narracan, made under the provisions of Section 197 of the *Local Government Act*, and numbered 46, for the purposes of regulating the use of private property at the junction of streets. In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and every other power thereunto, enabling the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Narracan to order as follows;

1. This By-law shall apply to and have effect throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Narracan.

No person shall use any private property situated at the junction of any streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs, hedges or other vegetation abutting on any such street or road or within ten (10') feet therefrom or within a distance of thirty feet (30') from the junction of any streets or roads to a height exceeding three feet six inches (3' 6") above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub, hedge or vegetation.

3. The owner or occupier within one month of receiving written notice from the Council, under the hand of the Shire Secretary, shall reduce all trees, shrubs, hedges or other vegetation on private property abutting on any such streets or roads or within ten feet (10') therefrom or within a distance of thirty feet (30') from the junction of any streets or roads to a height not exceeding three feet six inches (3' 6") above that point on the surface level of the adjacent street or road which is nearest to such part of such tree, shrub, hedge or other vegetation.

4. The owner within one month of receiving written notice from the Council under the hand of the Shire Secretary, shall reduce to a height not exceeding three feet six inches (3' 6") any portion of any fence within thirty feet (30') of the junction of any streets or roads.

5. Where any owner fails to comply with the requirements of any notice given pursuant to Paragraphs 3 or 4 of this By-law, the Council may, at the expense of the owner concerned enter upon the subject property and carry out the work specified therein, and the expense incurred may be recovered by the Council as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

6. Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty of not more than Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction by any Court.

7. This By-law shall come into effect as from the day it is published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
