**MICK'S CREEK WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.**

**PROCLAMATION**

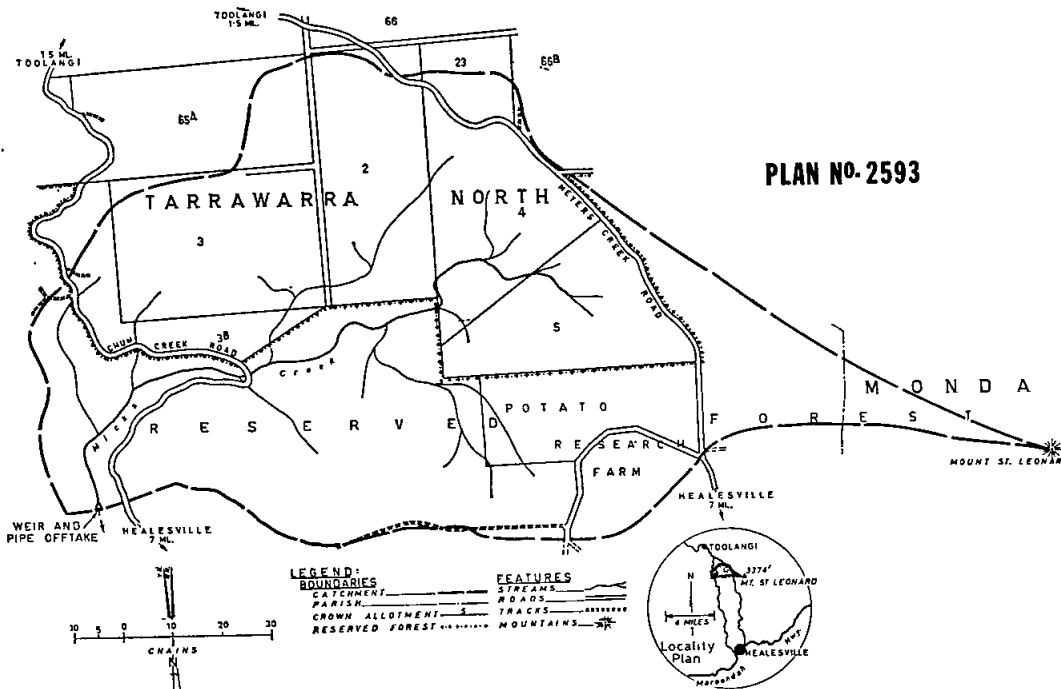
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 (1) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372) and section 5 (1) (b) of the *Land Conservation Act 1970* (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Mick's Creek Water Supply Catchment.

The area proclaimed is the catchment to the Healesville Waterworks Trust offtake weir on Mick's Creek, in Reserved Forest in the Parish of Tarrawarra North, and including the area within a radius of 5 chains downstream of the offtake weir.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of section 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958*, as amended.

The area described is indicated on Plan No. 2593 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, 3101.

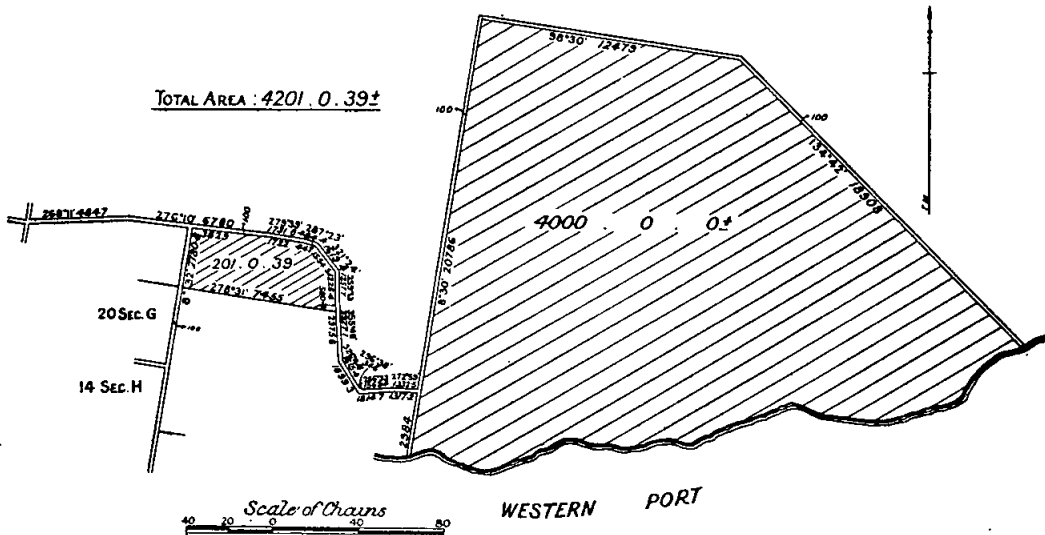

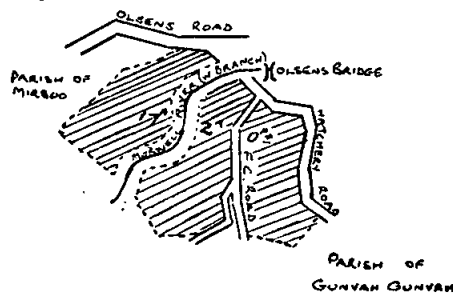

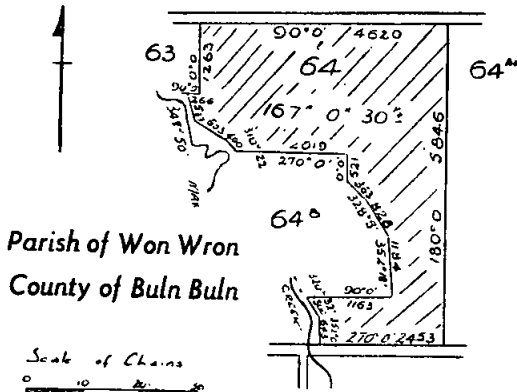

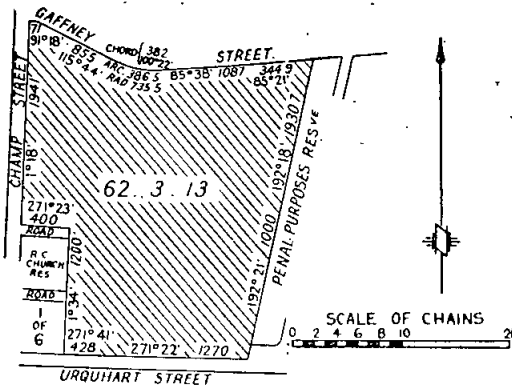

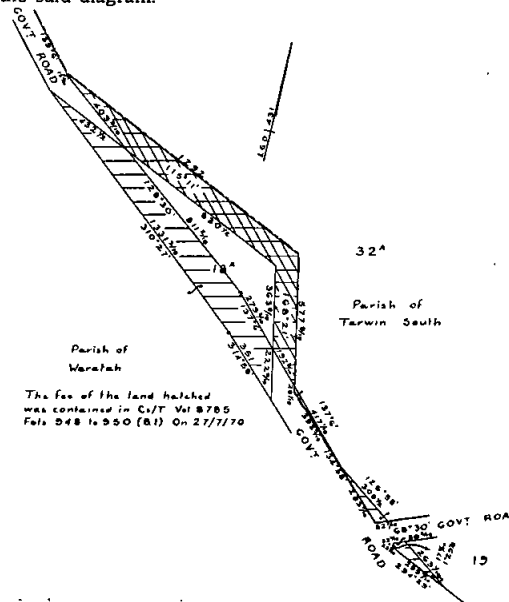

For making and levying such rates the valuations for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal districts of which lands and tenements are situated shall be deemed and taken to be the valuations of such lands and tenements respectively, but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situated or if there is no such valuation, and the municipal value thereof may be for all purposes of such rates determined in the manner in the *Sewerage Districts Acts*.

6. Such person or persons as the Yarram Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF "BUNDOORA PARK".

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Parish of Keelbundora

temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 18th February, 1969, and the 19th January, 1971, as sites for Public Recreation and being together known as the "Bundoora Park":—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge except on such days as the Reserve or portions thereof or buildings thereon may be set aside for the holding of any public entertainment, sports, fêtes carnivals, camping or parking of vehicles on any of which occasions an admission fee, as may be determined by the Committee from time to time, may be made and taken for admission to any area or building so set apart.

2. The Committee may set aside a portion or portions of the Reserve as a golf course and allow any person club or association the use thereof upon such terms, fees and conditions as it may determine from time to time.

3. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of drugs nor bring into, consume or sell any drugs;
- (c) remove or displace or damage in any way whatsoever the whole or any part of any notice or sign or of any board, tablet, plate or any support or fastening or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any notice, sign or Regulations and fixed or set up by the Committee;
- (d) roll, throw or discharge or cause to be rolled, thrown or discharged any stone, brick or any other substance as a missile;
- (e) climb or jump over any of the trees, gates, passageways, barriers, railings, or fences in or around the Reserve;
- (f) paint, fix, write, cut, carve or in any way inscribe letters, figures or marks upon or otherwise disfigure or remove or take away the whole or any part of any rock, tree, wall, seat or other improvement, building property or structure therein, or any gate, passageway, barrier, railing or fencing or survey pegs or permanent marks in or around the Reserve;
- (g) post, stick, paint, print or otherwise affix or mark any advertisement, bill, placard or other notice therein or on any structure, erection, rock, tree, fence or anything in or around the Reserve;
- (h) spit or expectorate on the paths or on or in any structure or erection therein;
- (i) play any unlawful game or make any wager for money or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort or enjoyment of others therein;
- (j) camp therein;
- (k) wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant or employee of the Committee in the proper execution of his or her work or duty.

4. No person, unless authorized in writing and then only subject to such terms, fees and conditions as may be determined by the Committee from time to time, shall—

- (a) sell or offer for sale any article whatsoever, or distribute any bill or like thing, or place any chair or seat for hire;
- (b) use any building, house, booth, shed or any other structure therein;
- (c) erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing or seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part thereof;
- (d) solicit or gather money or other thing;
- (e) take part in any public entertainment of any sort;
- (f) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public;
- (g) carry, use or discharge any fireworks, firearms, airgun or other lethal weapon;
- (h) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any glass, bottle, paper, fruit, peel, litter or rubbish or refuse of any kind, except in receptacles provided by the Committee for the purpose;

- (i) bring into the Reserve or place upon the dam therein any boat or other water craft;
- (j) light or cause to be lit any fires except in such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
- (k) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove or have in his possession while in the Reserve or take away therefrom any live or dead timber or the whole or any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, fern or other vegetation;
- (l) ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush or shrub;
- (m) cut, dig or remove or have in his possession while in the Reserve or take away therefrom any sod, turf, loam, sand, gravel, stone or other substance or the whole or any part of any post or rail;
- (n) enter the Reserve for the purpose of cutting timber or damaging fencing in or around the same;
- (o) take or kill or use any trap or snare for the purpose of capturing any bird or animal, nor destroy or remove or interfere in any way whatsoever with any nest or egg or any bird or animal;
- (p) cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog be or shall continue to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from worrying or disturbing any animals therein, and from entering any ornamental water or area enclosing a house or building;
- (q) bring into the Reserve any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes or sport or for bathing;
- (r) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of alcohol nor bring into, consume or sell any intoxicating liquor.

5. No assemblies for sport, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts, band performances, picnics or for the purposes of public worship or public speaking shall take place in any portion of the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee first had and obtained.

Persons permitted to use or occupy any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the Reserve or any portion thereof on the occasions of any sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, band performances, picnics, or other gatherings may be required to pay to the Committee such fee as the Committee may determine and also to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, buildings, erection or enclosure or of the Reserve or any portion thereof; and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or by the Reserve or portion thereof during such use or occupation, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or injury, and may also deduct the cost of cleaning up such rubbish or litter resulting from such use or occupation from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so using or occupying shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

7. No person shall use any structure constituting a sanitary convenience or any part of the same for any purpose other than that for which the same was specially constructed.

8. No male person, other than a boy under the age of six years, shall enter or use any playground, place, room or building set apart for the use of females, and no female person shall enter or use any place, room or building set apart for the use of males.

9. No person or persons shall transfer, sublet or dispose of the whole or any part of any building or site the occupancy of which has been granted to him, her or them by the Committee, without the consent in writing of the Committee being first obtained.

10. The Committee may at any time, by notice set up, prohibit the taking of a dog or dogs into any particular portion or portions of the Reserve.

11. The owner of any dog or other animal who permits or suffers such dog or animal to be in the Reserve otherwise than in accordance with these Regulations shall, in addition to any other penalty, be liable to make compensation for any damage done by such dog or animal to the Reserve or anything or anyone therein.

12. Bathing in the Dam without the permission in writing by the Committee is prohibited.

13. No person shall use a trammel, trawl or other net in the Dam.

14. (a) Except by the consent in writing of the Committee first had and obtained, a commercial goods vehicle within the meaning of the *Commercial Goods Vehicles Act 1958*, whether carrying or transporting goods stores or material or not, shall not be allowed within the Reserve or to travel on the vehicular routes therein.

(b) A vehicle shall not travel or be allowed to enter on or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specifically appointed constructed or provided for vehicular traffic by the Committee or its servants or agents.

15. The owners or persons in charge of any motor cars, cycles, vehicles or animals shall abide by all the directions as are set out on notices erected by the Committee throughout the Reserve with regard to the driving, riding, parking or attendance of such cars, cycles, vehicles or animals.—(Rs.9113.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which this section relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than \$200.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BURRUMBEET PARK RESERVE AT LAKE BURRUMBEET.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 219 of the *Land Act 1958* the Minister of Lands and the Corporation of the Shire of Ballarat as Trustees of the above-named Reserve, shown coloured blue on plan LB/16.12.71 attached to Lands Department correspondence No. C70834, hereby make the following Regulations:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset and such other times as permitted by the Trustees free of charge, except as hereinafter provided, and also except on such days (not exceeding fifteen in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for shows, sports, fêtes, cricket, football, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Fifty cents may be charged and taken by the Trustees for admission of every adult person to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- (b) Climb, jump over the gates, or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, trees, shrubs, flowers, gates, fences, seats or any equipment of any body therein nor leave nor deposit therein any papers, glass, straw manure, or any rubbish, nor roll, throw or discharge, or cause to be rolled, thrown or discharged any stone, brick or any other substance as missile.
- (c) Discharge any firearm in any part of the Reserve so as to be a danger or annoyance to any other persons using the Reserve.
- (d) Dig or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- (e) Remove or displace any board, plate, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Trustees in the Reserve.
- (f) In the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or disturb any servant of the Trustees in the proper execution of his duty or work.

(g) Alux, print, post, paint, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve, without the consent of the Trustees.

(h) Break anything made of glass in the Reserve.

(i) Permit any broken glass object to remain in the Reserve.

(j) Use the sanitary conveniences, structures, or any part of the same, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed.

(k) Use or cause to be used any boatshed for other than boating purposes without the consent of the Trustees first obtained.

(l) Row or handle any boat or craft on the lake recklessly or in a manner likely to cause injury to its occupants or damage to any other boat or craft or to endanger the safety or comfort of any other person or to cause annoyance to any person on any other boat or on the banks of such lake.

(m) Being a male, other than a boy under the age of seven years, enter or use any playground, oval, place, room or building set apart for the use of females.

(n) Being a female, enter or use any playground, place, room or building set apart for the use of males.

3. No person while in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained:—

(a) Occupy or use any building, house, booth, shed, or any other structure therein.

(b) Erect or place therein any building, booth, shed, stand, screen post, rail, fence, swing or seat or other erection or obstruction of any kind whatsoever, or in any way enclose any part thereof.

(c) Solicit or gather money or other thing.

(d) Take part in any public entertainment of any sort.

(e) Preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public.

(f) Carry on any trade or business or the calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the Reserve.

4. Any written permission granted or ticket or receipt issued in pursuance of these Regulations shall if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Trustees to demand the production of same.

5. Any person driving or bringing any vehicle of any nature whatever into the Reserve shall be under the absolute direction of the Trustees or body hiring the Reserve. The Trustees or hiring body may, at its discretion, prevent any vehicle from entering the Reserve.

6. No person shall bring into nor put into the Reserve nor suffer to be in the Reserve any greyhound, whippet, cattle, horses, or sheep without the permission, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained. Any dog other than a dog of the kind described above may be brought into the Reserve if controlled by a cord or chain and may remain therein while it continues to be so controlled.

7. Any dog, found wandering uncontrolled as aforesaid in the Reserve shall be dealt with in the manner provided in the *Dog Act 1958* or any amendment thereof.

8. The owner of any dog or other animal who permits or suffers such dog or animal to be in the Reserve otherwise than in accordance with these Regulations shall, in addition to any other penalty, be liable to make compensation for any damage done by such animal to the Reserve or any thing therein.

9. Persons may camp in such portions of the Reserve as the Trustees may appoint for this purpose and upon the payment of such charge as from time to time be fixed by the Trustees. This licence to camp may be withdrawn by the Trustees at any time from any person.

10. The Trustees may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Trustees may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of grounds so set apart.

11. Persons or bodies renting or hiring any stand, building, or enclosure on the occasion of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements shall be a written undertaking, take full responsibility for any damage done to any such stand, building, or enclosure, and shall make good such damage

to the satisfaction of the Trustees, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees, and in addition the person or body so hiring shall be required by the Trustees to lodge a deposit of a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200).

12. No person, other than the players and officials connected with any games (football, cricket, tennis, golf, bowls, hockey, or the like) and any competitor at any sports gathering, shall intrude upon the playground or oval during the course of such games and sports.

13. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve or part thereof, for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Trustees a fee for the use of the ground, such fee to be fixed by the Trustees.

14. No building, pier or jetty shall be constructed in the Reserve until plans and specifications have been submitted and approved by the Trustees and written permission given by them for such construction.

15. The Trustees shall be at liberty at any time to require any building or erections in the Reserve to be altered, renovated, repaired or removed, and no stakes or posts shall be driven into the bed of the lake, and no pier or building shall be altered or removed without the Authority, in writing, of the Trustees first obtained.

16. The Trustees may provide and build such fireplaces as they may think necessary, and any person lighting fires or using fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserve save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of such Trustees, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

17. Every person who shall infringe any of these Regulations for the management of the Reserve may be removed therefrom or from any property therein, or directed to leave forthwith the Reserve or such property by any officer or employee of the Trustees or by any member of the Police Force, and such person shall, in addition be liable to prosecution as provided by law.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "TORQUAY PUBLIC RESERVES".

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the reserved Crown land in the Parishes of Puebla and Jan Juc as are indicated by red, blue and purple colours on plan P.J./31.5.49, attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Rs.1644 and known as the "Torquay Public Reserves":—

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserves shall be open to the Public, free of charge, except on such days, (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year, as the whole or any portion of the

Reserves, may be set apart for cricket or football matches, games, fêtes, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions, a sum, determined by the Committee, but not exceeding \$1.00 may be charged and taken for the admission of each person thereto.

2. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserves as and for the purpose of a camping area, and may fix and collect fees and other charges for the use of any such area and facilities thereon.

3. Any permission issued by the Committee or its authorized officers to any person for use of a camping site, may be cancelled or withdrawn at discretion, and, subsequent to such cancellation, no proportionate refund of fees or charges paid shall be recoverable; unless at the discretion of the Committee, having regard to the circumstances governing the case.

4. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserves who behaves in a noisy or disorderly manner or creates or takes part in any disturbance, or commits any act of indecency as regards dress, language or conduct.

(b) Enter or remain in the Reserves whilst under the influence of liquor or drugs.

(c) Light or cause to be lit any fire in the Reserves except in fireplaces as may be provided by the Committee.

(d) Bring into, or allow any animal of any kind to enter or remain in the Reserves. Any dog shall be liable to be destroyed and any horse or cattle as defined in section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*, found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.

(e) Enter any enclosed area or obstruct, disturb or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the lawful execution of his work or duty.

(f) Throw or cause to be thrown any stone or substance or bring into the Reserves traps, poisons, snares, firearms, or any weapon capable of discharging a missile nor remove or cause to be removed any birds' nest or the nest of any animal in or from the Reserve.

(g) Dig, form or grade any sites set apart for camping purposes within the Reserves.

(h) Neglect or refuse to remove any improvements from any camp site within the Reserves within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered mail to his or her last known address such notice of removal.

5. No person shall unless authorized in writing by the Committee—

(a) Offer or expose for sale in the Reserves any article of food or drink or merchandise, nor erect or place any building, tent, booth or other structure within the Reserves for the purpose of display or sale of such merchandise.

(b) Deposit in the Reserves any rubbish, litter or refuse of any kind except in receptacles provided for that purpose nor post bills on the fences, gates or trees, nor cut or paint names or letters, marks or other matter on the trees, seats, gates, posts, fences or other improvements, or otherwise deface same, nor shall he break, cut, dig-up, damage or injure in any way the whole or portion of any tree, shrub, plant, fern, flower, property, soil, sand, or any vegetation in the Reserves.

(c) Remove or displace or damage any board or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulations or any notice fixed or set up in the Reserves or any material which may be around the Reserves.

(d) Ride or drive any vehicle, motor or otherwise within the Reserve at a speed exceeding 15 m.p.h. nor ride or drive any such vehicle other than in areas so defined for vehicular traffic.

(e) Camp in the areas set aside for such purposes and only under such terms and conditions as stipulated by the Committee and shall only do so after fees fixed by the Committee have been paid in advance.

(f) Play at or engage at any game or athletic sport or gymnastic exercise nor enter onto any playing field within the Reserves.

(g) Moor, use, place or leave any boat on the Reserves.

(h) Perform in any band of music, deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer sermon or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public discussion, distribute



or hand out any circulars or literature of any kind or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserves.—(Rs.1644.)

I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Parish of Bellarine permanently reserved by Order in Council dated the 19th December, 1967 as a site for Public Park and known as the "Ocean Grove Nature Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the following Regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- (1) No person shall—
  - (a) Enter or remain in the reserve who, behaves in a noisy or disorderly manner or creates or takes part in any disturbance or commits any act of indecency as regards dress, language or conduct.
  - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of liquor or drugs.
  - (c) Behave in a manner which tends to frighten unduly or disturb any bird or animal within the reserve.
  - (d) Play at or engage in any game or athletic sport or gymnastic exercise within the Reserve.
  - (e) Light or cause to be lit any fire in the reserve except in fireplaces as may be provided by the Committee.
  - (f) Throw down or drop any lighted tobacco, cigarette, cigar or match or any other burning material or thing within the Reserve.
  - (g) Bring into or allow any animal of any kind to enter or remain in the Reserve. Any dog or cat shall be liable to be destroyed and any horse or cattle as defined in Section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958* found trespassing within the Reserve shall be liable to be impounded.
  - (h) Obstruct, disturb or annoy any officer or employee of the Committee in the lawful execution of his work or duty.
- (2) No person shall unless authorized in writing by the Committee:—
  - (a) Carry or bring into the Reserve traps, poison, snares, firearms or any weapon capable of discharging a missile.
  - (b) Trap, poison, snare, catch or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal or bird in or from the Reserve or interfere or take away any skin, egg, feather or nest in or from the Reserve.
  - (c) Bring into the Reserve any seed or any portion of any plant or trees.
  - (d) Offer or expose for sale in the Reserve any article of food or drink or merchandise.
  - (e) Deposit in the Reserve any rubbish, litter or refuse of any kind except in receptacles provided for that purpose, nor post bills on the

fences, gates or trees nor cut or paint names or letters, marks or other matter on the trees, gates, posts or fences or otherwise deface same, nor shall he break, cut, dig-up, damage or injure in any way or take away the whole or portion of any tree, shrub, plant, seed, scrub, undergrowth, fern flower, property, soil or any vegetation in the Reserve.

- (f) Remove, displace or damage any board or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulations or any notice fixed or set up in the Reserve.
- (g) Ride or drive any vehicle, motor or otherwise within the Reserve at a speed exceeding 10 m.p.h. nor ride or drive any such vehicle beyond the car park area.
- (h) Camp nor erect or place any building, tent, booth or other structure in any part of the Reserve.
