Marine Act 1958.
**PORT RULE (GIPPSLAND LAKES SPEED
RESTRICTIONS) 1972.**

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1958*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed and others substituted in their stead: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers hereunto enabling do by this Proclamation repeal Port Rules 65, 66, 67, 69, 70 and 71 published in the *Government Gazette* of 3rd December, 1913, and substitute the following in their stead, that is to say:—

1. (a) This Rule may be cited as Port Rule (Gippsland Lakes Speed Restrictions) 1972 and shall be numbered Port Rule 65.

(b) This Rule shall apply only to vessels of over 65 feet in length.

2. A person shall not operate a vessel at a speed exceeding five miles per hour on any of the waters specified hereunder, namely—

- (a) all the waters of Thompson River and Latrobe River upstream from the swing bridge;
- (b) all the waters of Flooding Creek and Sale Canal;
- (c) the waters of Lake Wellington situated within one hundred yards of the waters edge at Marley Point and between lines extending seaward through each of two sets of beacons in line approximately three hundred and fifty yards apart on the foreshore;

(d) all the waters of the Perry River and the waters of the Avon River upstream from a speed limit notice situated near the mouth of the Avon River;

(e) the waters of Lake Victoria, situated within two hundred yards of the waters edge at Loch Sport, and

(i) between lines extending seaward through two beacons in line on the shore approximately 200 feet westward of the jetty near Barton Street and two beacons in line on the shore near the western end of Seagull Drive, and

(ii) between lines extending seaward through two beacons in line on the shore near the intersection of Seagull Drive and Toorak Avenue and two beacons in line on the shore approximately 1,000 feet westward of the intersection of The Boulevard and National Park Road;

(f) all the waters of Bunga Arm eastward of a line extending north-westward from a speed limit notice on the southern shore approximately five miles eastward of Ocean Grange jetty to the opposite shore;

(g) all the waters of Duck Arm, Lake Victoria westward of a line extending south-eastward from a speed limit notice on the northern shore to a yellow post on the southern shore at the entrance to Duck Arm;

(h) all the waters of McMillans Strait and Newlands Arm, Paynesville bounded on the north by a line joining two speed limit notices on opposite shores at the northern end of McMillans Strait and bounded on the south by a line joining a speed limit notice at Montagu Point, Raymond Island and a speed limit notice at Butlers Point on the mainland;

(i) the waters of Eagle Point Bay, Lake King situated within two hundred yards of the waters edge and between lines extending seaward through two beacons in line on the shore approximately 700 feet north-westward of Eagle Point jetty and two beacons in line on the shore approximately 200 feet south-eastward of Eagle Point boat launching ramp;

- (j) all the waters of Mitchell River upstream from a speed limit notice situated on the shore at the mouth of such river;
 - (k) all the waters of Nicholson River upstream from a speed limit notice placed on a navigation beacon situated at the mouth of such river;
 - (l) all the waters of Tambo River upstream from a speed limit notice placed on a navigation beacon situated at the mouth of such river.
 - (m) the waters of Bancroft Bay situated—
 - (i) westward of a line extending northward from a speed limit notice on Shaving Point to a speed limit notice on the shore approximately 750 feet north-eastward of Metung Yacht Club building.
 - (ii) within one hundred yards of the waters edge and between lines extending seaward from a speed limit notice marked 5 m.p.h. on the shore, approximately half a mile south-westward of Mosquito Point and a similar notice approximately half a mile south-eastward of Mosquito Point;
 - (n) all the waters of Chinamans Creek northward of a line extending south-westward from a speed limit notice on the eastern shore to a yellow post on the opposite shore;
 - (o) all the waters of Box's Creek northward of a line extending westward from a speed limit notice on the eastern shore to the most southerly point of the opposite shore;
 - (p) all the waters of Cunninghame Arm and North Arm and the waters of Reeves Channel situated eastward of a line from the inner end of the eastern Entrance Wall to the western end of Bullock Island; thence north-westward following the training wall to the shore of the mainland.
3. A person shall not operate a vessel at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour on any of the waters specified hereunder, namely—
- (a) all the waters of Latrobe River from a speed limit notice situated near the mouth of such river upstream to the swing bridge;
 - (b) all the waters of McLennans Strait between a speed limit notice situated at the eastern end of such Strait and a speed limit notice situated at the western end of such Strait;
 - (c) all the waters of Reeves Channel westward of the line referred to in paragraph (p) of Clause 2 of this Rule to a line commencing at the inner end of the western Entrance Wall and extending north-westward to a speed limit notice on the centre training wall at the eastern end of Rigby Island and thence north-westward along the shore of Rigby Island to a speed limit notice opposite Kalinna jetty; thence northward to a speed limit notice on the mainland approximately 200 feet westward of such jetty.
4. No person shall at any time ride upon any water ski, surfboard or similar device towed by a vessel or by any other means on the waters—
- (a) of Latrobe River and McLennans Strait referred to in paragraph (a) and (b) of Clause 3 respectively of this Rule;
 - (b) of Reeves Channel eastward of a line extending north-westward from a warning notice on the north-western end of Rigby Island to a similar notice on the shore of the mainland at Nyerimilang.
5. No person shall operate a vessel at a greater speed than five miles per hour within 200 feet of any jetty, wharf, slipway or boat launching ramp in the waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes.

CHARGES).

PORT RULE No. 132.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively and for the regulation of shipping in the same (including the imposition of charges for the use of mooring sites and other facilities):

And that any such regulation may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended or repealed and others substituted in their stead:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, by this Proclamation do hereby amend the Proclamation dated the 31st day of May, 1966, as follows:—

Delete the proviso added at the end of the schedule to Clause 2 by amendment dated 30th May, 1972, and substitute therefor the following:—

"Provided that during the period between the 1st September, 1972 and 30th November, 1972, both dates inclusive, the tolls, rates or charges set forth in paragraphs (A), (B), (C) and (D) of this schedule shall be reduced by 15 per cent., unless the Governor in Council by proclamation determines otherwise."

(b) provide such proper water closet or water closets and such drains, appliances, apparatus and connexion with such sewer as may be prescribed by the Regulations of the Board—

within six months or such further time as the Council may allow from the date of the coming into operation of this Bylaw where such a general notice has been given prior to the said date or within six months or such further time as aforesaid from the date of any such general notice given after the coming into operation of this bylaw as the case may be.

(2) All such sewerage works and the provision of all such water closet or water closets, drains, appliances, apparatus and connexions with a sewer shall be carried out, fitted and laid in accordance with Regulations prescribed by the Board.

(3) Any owner desirous of an extension of time beyond the said period of six months shall—

(a) make application, in writing, to the Council; and

(b) in his application give—

(i) his full name and address,

(ii) particulars of his property,

(iii) the reasons why he requires an extension,

(iv) any other information the Council may require.

(4) Any owner to whom this Bylaw applies who fails to provide for the sewerage from his property to be carried off by a sewer and to provide such water closet or water closets, drains, appliances, apparatus or connexions as may be prescribed by the Regulations of the Board and cause the same to be connected to a sewer within the said period of six months or such further time as may be allowed by the Council shall be guilty of an offence against this bylaw.

BY-LAW No. 44.

Animal and Bird Bylaw.

A Bylaw of the Shire of Donald made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and Section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and numbered 44 for:—

- (a) Regulating the keeping of animals birds and reptiles with power to limit the number of animals birds and reptiles kept on any property within any area within the municipal district set forth in this bylaw and declared herein to be a populous or residential area and to prohibit the keeping of any specified kind of animal bird or reptile in such area;
- (b) Regulating the keeping of any animals (including birds);

(c) Fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such animal;

(d) Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases; and

(e) Suppressing nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and the *Health Act 1958* and of every other act or power it thereunto enabling the President and Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Donald orders as follows—

Part I—Preliminary.

1. This Bylaw may be known as the Animal and Bird Bylaw.

2. Bylaws Nos. 1, 3, 11 and 18 of the Shire of Donald relating to the keeping of birds and animals within the Municipal District are hereby repealed.

3. In this Bylaw, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Animal" means and includes every animal other than a domestic animal or swine goat or ferret.

"Approved Material" means material approved by the building Surveyor or Health Inspector of the Municipality.

"Bird" means and includes every bird other than a domestic bird.

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Donald.

"Domestic Animal" means and includes the horse dog and cat.

"Domestic Bird" means and includes turkey goose duck fowl pigeon and song bird.

"Frontage" means the boundary line between any land and the street upon which the same fronts or (when such land fronts on more than one street) the shorter or shortest (as the case may be) of such boundaries (whether one or more).

"Horse" includes a stallion mare gelding pony colt or foal and an ass or mule.

4. The areas described in the schedule hereto are hereby declared to be populous or residential areas.

Part II—Animals and Birds.

5. No person shall except with the written permission of the Council under the hand of the Shire Secretary keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property any swine goat ferret or snake. Before granting such permission the Council shall satisfy itself that the keeping of such animal or snake will not constitute a nuisance or be dangerous or offensive to or injurious to the health of any other person.

6. No person shall except with the written permission of the Council under the hand of the Shire Secretary keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property more than one animal or bird.

Part III—Horses.

7. No person shall except with the written permission of the Council keep or cause or permit to be kept a horse on any property.

8. No person shall keep any horse on any property upon which any dwelling is erected except in an approved stable and unless such stable is—

- (a) distant at least 50 feet from the street or road to which the property has a frontage;
- (b) distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a width of not less than 25 feet;
- (c) distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (d) distant at least 30 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or an adjoining allotment.

9. No person shall keep any horse on any vacant land unless such horse is kept at a distance of not less than 40 feet from any dwelling or any premises in or on which any food for human consumption is stored manufactured or sold nor unless such land is at all times kept in a sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.

10. If at any time after the granting of a permit pursuant to clause 7 hereof any owner or occupier of land in the municipal district objects to the keeping of a horse on the premises to which such permit relates and notifies the Shire Secretary in writing of such objection the Council after not less than 60 days previous written notice to the person to whom the permit was granted may revoke such permit.

11. For the purposes of Clause 8 hereof an approved stable shall be a stable which complies with the requirements of the Uniform Building Regulations for the construction of stables or a stable which was erected prior to the commencement of those regulations and although it does not comply with those requirements, has been approved in writing by the Council for the purposes of this Bylaw.

12. Any person desiring the approval of the Council to a stable for the purposes of the last preceding clause hereof shall deliver to the Shire Secretary a written request for such approval setting out a full and detailed description of the premises and stable concerned showing in particular the provisions made for drainage and sanitation and such approval shall be given only if the Council is satisfied that the keeping of a horse in such stable will not constitute a nuisance or be dangerous or offensive to or injurious to the health of any other person.

13. The occupier of any property upon which any dwelling is erected and on which is or are kept any horse or horses shall—

- (a) Cause all manure, refuse and rubbish produced or accumulated on such property to be placed in a properly constructed receptacle with brickwork walls at least 9 inches in thickness or concrete walls at least 4 inches in thickness, with brick or concrete floor at least 6 inches in thickness, and lined throughout internally with cement rendering composed of two and one half parts sand to one part cement;
- (b) Maintain any such receptacle at all times in such good state of repair as is necessary to prevent any escape or leakage of the contents thereof;
- (c) Keep any such receptacle wholly covered with an effective cover at all times except when manure, refuse or rubbish is actually being deposited therein or being taken therefrom;
- (d) Effectively deodorise such receptacle and the contents thereof from time to time as may be necessary to prevent its becoming a nuisance, offensive or injurious or dangerous to health;
- (e) Cause all the contents of any such receptacle to be removed from such property at least once every week;
- (f) Keep any stable on such property at all times effectively and thoroughly repaired and cleansed in such a manner as may be necessary to prevent its constituting a nuisance or becoming dangerous or offensive to or injurious to the health of any other person.

Part IV—Domestic Animals and Domestic Birds.

DOGS.

14. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property more than two dogs without the previous written consent of the Council.

CATS.

15. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept or harboured on any property more than three cats except with the previous written consent of the Council, but so that for the purposes of this clause kittens not more than thirteen (13) weeks old shall not be counted.

PIGEONS.

16. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept any pigeons on any property except in an approved pigeon loft.

POULTRY.

17. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) mature birds provided always that this clause shall not apply to a business of poultry killing or cleaning or dressing carried on on any property with the consent of and registered with the Council pursuant to the provisions of Division I of Part V of the Health Act 1958.

18. No person shall keep in any poultry house a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry house by four unless confined in approved battery cages.

19. No person shall without the previous consent in writing of the Council keep or cause or permit to be kept on any property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.

20. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any live fowls on any property except in a fowl-house to which may be attached an enclosed fowl run, or in a mobile battery cage and unless such poultry-house enclosed fowl run or battery cage is—

- (a) distant at least 50 feet from the street or road to which the property has a frontage;

- (b) distant at least 10 feet from any other street or road of a width of not less than 25 feet;

- (c) distant at least 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;

- (d) distant at least 30 feet from any dwelling whether on the same or an adjoining allotment.

21. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any fowls in a mobile battery cage unless each compartment of such mobile battery cage has a minimum size of nine inches in width twenty-eight inches in depth and eighteen inches in height and unless only one fowl is kept in each compartment.

22. Every poultry-house shall be erected in accordance with an approved plan and specification.

23. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any fowls in a mobile battery cage unless such battery cage is housed in a structure erected in accordance with an approved plan and specification.

24. The roof of every poultry-house and every structure for housing mobile battery cages shall be covered with galvanised iron, fibro cement, tiles or other approved material.

25. A poultry-house may have attached thereto for the use of the fowls kept therein a run which shall be enclosed by wire netting in such manner as to prevent the escape of such fowls therefrom.

26. Every poultry-house or enclosed poultry run and every structure for housing mobile battery cages in which fowls are kept shall be paved with impervious material and the surface level of the floor thereof shall at all points be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

27. Every poultry-house and every structure for housing mobile battery cages in which fowls are kept shall be rendered rat proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 18 inches below ground level, and all the walls thereof shall be constructed of rat-proof material.

28. Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 23 hereof, any mobile battery cage may be removed for periods not exceeding 12 hours at any one time from the structure in which it is housed provided that such mobile battery cage is at all times at least 18 inches above the level of the surrounding ground and impervious material is placed below the cage for a distance of at least 12 inches beyond the boundaries of the cage.

Part V—General Provisions as to Poultry and Birds.

29. The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any poultry-house, pigeon loft, bird cage or enclosure, free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse and other materials capable of harbouring rats, or other vermin.

30. The owner or occupier shall cause every poultry-house, pigeon loft, bird cage, or enclosure to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean, wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

31. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry or birds (including song birds) are kept any food for consumption by poultry or birds (including song birds) unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

32. Poultry and bird droppings, litter and refuse shall be removed from the property from time to time or as frequently as may be directed by a Health Inspector so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive condition.

Part VI—Consent of Council.

33. Any person desirous of obtaining from the Council a consent pursuant to any of the preceding clauses of this Bylaw shall lodge with the Shire Secretary a request in writing under his hand accompanied by—

- (a) a block plan drawn in ink to scale showing the boundaries and dimensions of the property in respect of which the consent is required whether such property is at the intersection of two streets and if not the position of the property in relation to the nearest street corner the position and dimensions of any existing or proposed buildings the relation thereof to the boundaries of the property and to any existing buildings on the same or adjoining allotments;

- (b) the type and number of any animals domestic animals birds or domestic birds in respect of which the application is made;

- (c) such other additional information as may be required by the Council.

34. The Council may grant or refuse any application and if it grants the same any consent so granted shall be subject to a condition that no nuisance shall be caused to any other person. Any such consent may be issued under the hand of the Shire Secretary.

35. If the keeping of any animals domestic animals birds or domestic birds pursuant to such consent shall cause any nuisance to any other person the Council may by resolution cancel such consent and the same shall thereafter have no force or effect.

Part VII—Penalties.

36. Any person who shall commit any wilful act or default contrary to any provision of this Bylaw shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than \$100.00c for each offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than \$10.00c per day for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

Part VIII.

37. This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout those portions of the Municipal District set out and described in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

- (a) That portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Donald, which lies within a radius of one and one-half miles of the Donald Post Office—
- (b) That portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Donald which lies within a radius of one and one-half miles of the railway station in the Village of Watchem.

BY-LAW No. 61.

Keeping of Animals.

A By-law of the Shire of Tambo made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 61 for regulating the keeping of animals.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958*, and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Tambo orders as follows:—

1. Definition—"Animal" means and includes cow, bull, bullock, horse, or mare, goat, pig, sheep, dog, cat and the young thereof.

2. No person shall keep or permit to be kept, any animal other than a cat or dog on any property in an area zoned as residential without the consent in writing of the Council.

3. No person shall keep or permit to be kept more than 2 cats and 2 dogs on any property in an area zoned as residential without the consent in writing of the Council.

4. No person shall keep or permit to be kept any animal other than dogs or cats in any land other than land zoned as residential having an area of 1 acre or less without the consent in writing of the Council.

5. Where any animal is kept on any premises where the consent in writing of the Council is required under this By-law, the Council may grant such consent under such conditions as it thinks fit and such permit shall be subject to revocation by the Council at any time.

6. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40.00 and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the Shire of Tambo included in the Interim Development Order (Lakes Entrance Planning Scheme).
