PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—CITY OF CAULFIELD.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

Whereas by the Local Government Act 1958, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision

(3) of Division 9 of Part XIX, or a corresponding previous enactment, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thence-forth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Caulfield has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division (9) of Part XIX, of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Whitehall Court coloured brown on lodged plan No. 81214 shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.



CITY OF WODONGA Measurements in feet & inches






#### MAIN ROAD BUXTON - MARYSVILLE ROAD SHIRE OF



STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 5702.—RATES—URBAN DISTRICTS

The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the By-law following:

The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the respective Urban Districts as set out hereunder:

within the respective Urban Districts as set out nereunder:

On all tenements in respect of which a notice has been given in accordance with the Eighth Schedule to the Water Act that a main pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of such amount in the dollar of the Net Annual Value (N.A.V.) as set out in municipal valuation as at 30th June, 1973, of such tenements as is set down in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Urban Districts in column 1 of the Schedule hereto: Provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually in respect of any such tenements (other than land on which there is no building) shall be not less than the sum of twenty dollars and in respect of any lands on which there is no building shall be not less than the sum of ten dollars in the districts supplied from the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula and Otway Systems and five dollars in all other districts. in all other districts.

- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1973, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1974, and shall be payable on the 1st day of November, 1973. at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, at the place set down in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Urban Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule.
- Interest at the rate of eight per cent per annum will be chargeable on all rates remaining unpaid after 15th March, 1974.
- 4. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION. BY-LAW NO. 5701.—PROHIBITING THE CLEARING OR FALLOW-ING OR BURNING OFF OF LANDS ADJACENT TO CHANNELS IN CERTAIN ALLOTMENTS OF LAND WITHIN THE MALLEE WATERWORKS DISTRICT.



A By-Law of the City of Broadmeadows made under Section 756 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 68 for regulating the management and use of the Municipal Baths within the said City and for fixing the amount to be charged for admission to and for the use of same or any part thereof.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Broadmeadows order as follows:—

- 1. By-Laws 32, 48, 50 and 58 be and are hereby repealed.
- 2. No person shall enter upon any portion of the Baths without having paid the fees chargeable or being otherwise authorized by the Council.
- 3. No person shall use soap in any portion of the Baths other than in the cleansing shower baths provided for that purpose.
- 4. No person shall at any time while being in the Swimming Baths use any substance or preparation whereby the water in such Swimming Bath may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of the bathers.
- 5. No person shall use the Swimming Bath whilst in an uncleanly condition, nor any portion of the Baths while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious
- 6. No person shall wilfully interfere with the use and enjoyment by any person of the Baths, and any person so doing or otherwise behaving in an unseemly, offensive, insulting, or improper manner shall immediately leave the Baths upon being requested so to do by the officer in charge of the Baths, or any officer of the Council; and such officer may refuse to sell a ticket of admission to any person whom he may consider undesirable.
- -7. All persons (other than children, whom the officer in charge may exempt) using the Swimming Bath must wear proper bathing trunks or drawers, or bathing gowns.
- 8. Betting or playing cards or any game of chance for money is strictly prohibited in any portion of the Baths.
- 9. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the Baths whilst in a state of intoxication, and no person shall at any time introduce into the Baths or consume or cause to be consumed any spirituous or intoxicating liquor in any portion of the Baths.
- 10. No person shall wilfully and improperly foul, pollute, or defile the water in the Swiming Bath, or wilfully and improperly soil, or defile or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing gown.
- 11. Every person supplied with any towel, bathing trunk or drawers, or bathing gown shall, before leaving the Baths, return them to the attendant.
- 12. No person shall at any time carclessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, engine, or machinery in connection with the Baths, or carelessly or negligently defile, injure, or destroy any furniture,

fittings, or conveniences of any bath, bathroom, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, and shall not by cutting or writing thereon deface any wall fittings or any portion

- 13. No person shall at any time while being upon any portion of the Baths use any indecent, insulting, or offensive language, or behave in any indecent, insulting offensive or riotous manner.
- $14.\ No$  person shall spit in the Swimming Bath or on the floors or walls of any portion of the Baths.
- 15. No person shall dispose of any cigar, cigarette, pipe ash, or match within the Baths except in the receptacles provided for same.
- 16. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his or her control to enter or remain in any portion of the Baths.
- 17. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any portion of the Baths shall at once deliver the same to the officer in charge who shall thereupon register a description of same in a book kept for that purpose, and any person claiming such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership receive such article from the officer in charge upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.
- 18. No person shall bring into the Baths any radio or television set, without the consent first being obtained from the officer in charge.
- 19. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any attendant, officer, or servant employed at the Baths in the performance of his duty at the Baths.
- 20. The Council will not be responsible for articles lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the Baths.
- 21. No person shall offer any goods for sale in any portion of the Baths without the consent in writing of the council.
- 22. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-Law shall upon conviction for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding \$20.00 and not less than \$10.00.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1958, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City or Horsham doth order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Horsham.  $\gamma$
- 2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter-
  - "Dog" means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of six months.
- 3. No person shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept on any property more than two dogs without the express written permission of the Council.
- 4. Any person applying for the said written permission of the Council under this By-law shall:

- (a) In the case of the first application advertise his intention to do so at least one month before applying for such permission in a form approved by the Town Clerk in a newspaper generally circulating in the said municipal district and post and keep posted in a conspicuous position on the land in respect of which it is intended to make application during such period a copy of such form.
  (h) On the expiration of the said period of one month.
- copy of such form.

  (b) On the expiration of the said period of one month make application in writing to the Council in the form of the first schedule hereto accompanied by a plan of the land to which the application relates showing area distance and position of any neighbouring houses.
- 5. Any person interested in or affected by any application for a permit may object in writing to the Council within one calendar month from the publication of the notice of intention as aforesaid.
- $\,$  6. The Council shall before issuing a permit, consider all such objections made thereto.
- 7. Any permit shall be in the form of the second schedule hereto and may be given under the hand of the Town Clerk.
- 8. Every such permit shall be current for a period of twelve months only but may be renewed from time to time by the Council on the written application of the holder made prior to the expiration of the said period or any renewal thereof.
- 9. Any permit may at any time be revoked or cancelled by the Council at any time if, in its opinion—
  - (a) The property to which it relates by reason of the keeping of the number of dogs permitted becomes offensive injurious to health or dan-
  - (b) if by reason of any reduction in area of the property the Council is of the opinion the number of dogs permitted is too large; or
  - (c) if the person to whom the permit has been granted shall be convicted of an offence against this By-law.

Any person guilty of any breach of or action or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$100 and any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which the offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.


