PROCLAMATION

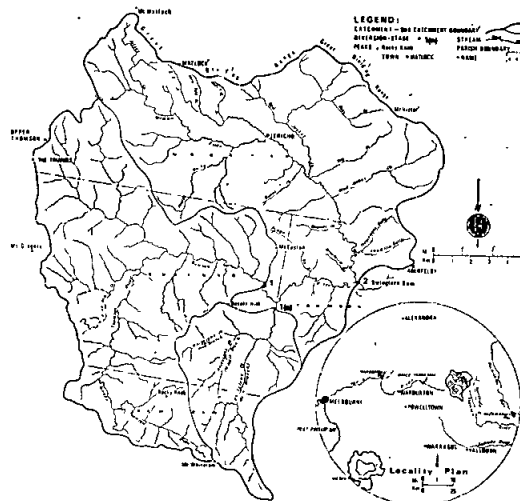
By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in Section 22 (1) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372) and Section 5 (1) (b) of the *Land Conservation Act 1970* (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Thomson River (Stages 1, 1 (a) and 2) Water Supply Catchment.

The area proclaimed is the catchment to water diversion works (Stages 1 and 1 (a)) and Swinglers Dam (Stage 2) to be constructed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works on the Thomson River and its tributary, Whitelaws Creek, and on Crown Land in the Parishes of Bullung and Toombon.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification of notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of Section 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958*, as amended.

The area described is indicated on Plan No. 2763 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.

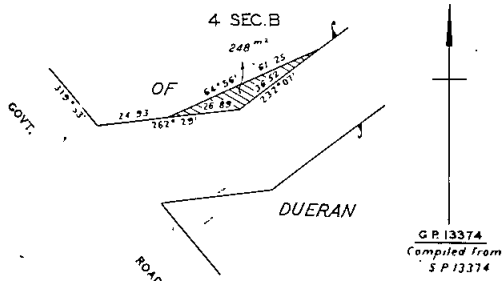
