SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF NOXIOUS WEEDS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the provisions of Section 14 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958, I*, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation specify the second day of December, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-four as the day from and after which the noxious weed, *Rubus fruticosus L. agg.—Blackberry*—shall be simultaneously destroyed by every owner and occupier of any land in the whole of Victoria excepting those parts of the State described in the schedule hereunder.

- (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 61.5 cents per thousand gallons for any meter year.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 61.5 cents per thousand gallons.

4. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

5. The provisions of Clauses 2 and 3 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

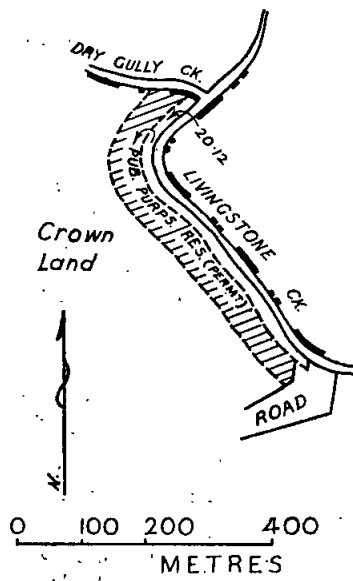

CITY OF RICHMOND.

By-Law No. 184.

A By-Law of the City of Richmond made under Section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and numbered 184 for the purpose of providing for the use and control of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise), and prescribing the size and shape of the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles, and with respect to preventing and regulating the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets and other land and places under the control of the council and with respect to the removal, replacement, cleansing and disinfecting of receptacles for refuse and rubbish.

1. By-Laws Nos. 12 and 171 are hereby repealed.

2. This By-Law shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. This By-Law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Richmond and unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, shop, factory and other building and premises therein.

4. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

“Council” means the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Richmond and their duly appointed and authorised officers, agents, contractors and employees.

“Premises” includes messuages, buildings, lands and hereditaments of every tenure and/or any part thereof separately occupied.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Refuse” includes all refuse and rubbish (except sewage) produced or accumulated in or about any premises.

“Trade Waste” includes all refuse and rubbish produced or accumulated on any trade or business premises as a result of the trade or business carried on thereat.

5. The proprietor of every premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times on such premises, a receptacle of the kind hereinafter specified for the deposit and collection of refuse, or so many of such receptacles as may be necessary to contain all refuse from such premises, and shall from time to time, cause all such refuse to be deposited therein with the least possible delay.

6. Every such receptacle as aforesaid shall comply with the following requirements:—

- Shall have a capacity of not more than 2 cubic feet and when containing refuse shall not exceed 56 lbs. in weight, and
- Shall be constructed of galvanised iron or not less than 24 gauge or other approved impervious material in such a manner as to prevent any escape by leakage or otherwise of any of the contents of such receptacle, and
- Shall be provided with stout side handles to make it capable of being easily and conveniently carried, and
- Shall be provided with a flyproof and vermin proof close-fitting lid with a handle thereon and having a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and
- Shall be kept covered by the proprietor (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and
- Shall be kept at all times in a clean and sanitary condition and be flyproof and vermin proof.

7. Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 6, a plastic bag conforming to the Australian Standards Association specification No. A.S. 1251 “Polyethylene (Polythene) Garbage Bags” may be used as a receptacle provided the mouth of the bag is securely fastened so as to:—

- prevent the escape of any of the contents of the bag, and
- be fly and vermin proof

and also provided that such plastic bag is placed within a receptacle complying with the requirements of Clause 6 hereof when refuse is placed in the appropriate position for collection.

8. A person shall not place or cause or permit to be placed any dust from any vacuum cleaner or any ashes in any receptacle unless such dust or ashes is effectually wrapped in paper so as to remain confined in such paper whilst within such receptacle, and so as not to become loose or spread in such receptacle.

9. A person shall not place or cause or permit to be placed any liquid waste in such receptacle, or deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless the same has been previously strained and wrapped in paper.

10. The proprietor of every premises shall on the day notified by the Council as the day on which refuse will be collected from such premises, place or cause to be placed, the receptacle or receptacles provided by him as aforesaid, immediately inside or as near as practicable to the entrance of such premises, leading to the street upon which such premises front, abut or adjoin.

11. The proprietor or any other person shall not place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, except in the case where such premises are not provided with a suitable area for the placing of such receptacle inside an entrance opening onto a street, and then only if the consent of the Council has been given.

12. Every vehicle used for the removal of refuse shall be provided with a cover which shall be used to cover all refuse contained therein so as to prevent any refuse from falling or being blown out of such vehicle.

13. Every vehicle used for the collection and removal of refuse shall be kept clean and in a good state of repair.

14. A person shall not place, throw, sweep, hose, leave or deposit or cause to be placed, thrown, swept, hosed, left or deposited on any street, lane or right-of-way, refuse of any kind.

15. Any person who commits a breach of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) for every such breach and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100).

SHIRE OF MELTON.

BY-LAW No. 50.

Animals and Birds By-Law.

A By-law of the Shire of Melton made under the Health Act 1958 and the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 50 for the purpose of—

- (a) Repealing By-laws Nos. 29, 30 and 40.
- (b) Regulating the keeping of animals birds reptiles and bees and regulating the keeping of any place or the storage of any thing which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive injurious to health or dangerous.
- (c) Fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal or bird or to store any such thing.
- (d) Limiting the number of animals and birds kept on any property in a populous or residential area.
- (e) Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases.
- (f) Suppressing nuisances.
- (g) Generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958 and the Local Government Act 1958 the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Melton orders as follows:

PART I.

Introduction.

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

- "Animal" means every animal other than a domestic animal.
- "Approved material" means masonry, concrete, reinforced concrete, iron or any other hard incombustible material approved by the Council.
- "Authorised officer" means the Health Inspector of the Council or any other officer of the Council duly authorised in that behalf.
- "Battery cage" means a wire and metal mesh cage of one or more compartments in which laying fowls are kept.
- "Bird" means every bird other than a domestic bird as defined herein.
- "Cat" means any cat over the age of three months.
- "Cattle" means any bull, cow, ox, ram, ewe, wether, goat, and every hybrid or cross thereof and the young of any such animals.
- "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Melton.
- "Dog" means any dog over the age of three months.
- "Domestic animal" means horse, dog and cat.
- "Domestic bird" means any turkey, goose, duck, fowl, or songbird.
- "Dwelling" includes a living room, sleepout, or tent, and all rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.
- "Flat" means a portion of a building used or intended, adapted or designed for use as a dwelling, but does not include a building of Class IV Occupancy as defined in the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.
- "Frontage" means the boundary line between any land and the street on which such land abuts or where such land abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between such land and the street to which the main building fronts or where there is no building on the said land then the shortest boundary line between such land and any street on which such land abuts.
- "Horse" means any stallion, mare, filly, foal, gelding, colt, ass or mule.
- "Litter" includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.
- "Person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.
- "Poultry" means any fowl, turkey, duck or goose.
- "Poultry farm" means any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twelve.
- "Poultry house" means any building used or intended to be used for the purpose of confining, protecting or sheltering poultry.
- "Poultry run" means an area attached to a poultry house enclosed and maintained in such a way as to prevent the escape of poultry therefrom.
- "Premises" includes vacant land.
- "Shire Secretary" means the Secretary for the time being of the Shire of Melton.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Melton defined in the schedule hereto which parts are hereby declared to be populous or residential areas for the purposes of this By-law.

PART II.

Keeping of Poultry.

3. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises more than twelve fowls or more than twenty chickens.
4. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises more than two turkeys, ducks or geese.
5. No person shall keep or allow to be kept any poultry except in a poultry house or battery cage, provided that a poultry house may have attached thereto a poultry run.
6. No person shall keep in any poultry house a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square metres of such poultry house by four.
7. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises any poultry within a distance of—
- (a) 23 metres from the street or road to which such premises has frontage;
 - (b) 3 metres from any other street or road of greater width than 8 metres;
 - (c) 2 metres from any other street or road of a lesser width than 8 metres or from the boundary of any adjoining premises;
 - (d) 12 metres from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining premises.
8. No person shall erect or allow to be erected or used any poultry house or battery cage unless—
- (a) it is constructed of approved materials;
 - (b) it is roofed with an approved material with guttering and spouting leading to a water tank or to adequate storm water drains;
 - (c) the ground surrounding it is adequately and properly drained;
 - (d) the floor beneath it is built up so that the surface shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground;
 - (e) the floor is paved with an approved impervious material.
9. Every poultry house shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least 400 millimetres below the ground level or to bedrock unless the poultry house is constructed on an approved concrete floor and all sides shall be constructed of rat-proof material.
10. The owner or occupier of any premises on which poultry is kept shall—
- (a) keep the area of land within 3 metres of any poultry house, poultry run or battery cage free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other material capable of harbouring vermin;
 - (b) cause every poultry house, poultry run or battery cage to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.
11. No person shall keep poultry on any premises unless there is erected thereon a dwelling.
12. No person shall burn any feathers, carcase or part of any poultry in such manner as to cause a nuisance or to be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous.

PART III.

Animals and Birds.

13. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises any animal or bird other than a domestic animal or domestic bird except with the consent in writing of the Council.
14. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises more than two dogs and two cats except with the consent in writing of the Council.
15. No person shall keep or allow to be kept any dog in or about any flat except in an open space of not less than 75 square metres for the exclusive use of the occupants of that flat, and the number of dogs so kept shall not exceed one.
16. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises except in an approved pigeon loft any pigeon and the number of pigeons so kept shall not exceed the number approved by the Council.

17. No person shall keep or allow to be kept any horse on any land having an area of less than half of one hectare without the consent in writing of the Council.

18. No person shall keep or allow to be kept any horse on any premises having erected thereon a dwelling the curtilage of which is less than 750 square metres without the consent in writing of the Council.

19. No person shall on any premises keep or allow to be kept any animal or domestic animal within a distance of 2 metres from the boundary of any adjoining premises or 6 metres from any dwelling whether on the same or any adjoining premises.

20. No person shall permit any animal, domestic animal, bird or domestic bird kept by him to create or cause such an amount or volume of noise as to be a nuisance to any person residing in the neighbourhood.

21. The Council shall not be required to grant any application for a permit to keep a horse or cattle and shall not grant any such application unless—

- (a) the premises concerned can provide at all times an unrestricted area for the keeping of such animal of at least 100 square metres;
- (b) the premises concerned have an adequate water supply;
- (c) the premises concerned are properly and securely fenced on all sides.

22. No person shall keep or allow to be kept on any premises any snake or lizard without the consent in writing of the Council.

PART IV.

Bees.

23. No person shall place or allow to be placed or allow to remain placed any bee hive on any premises unless such hive is situated—

- (a) at least 60 metres distant from any dwelling whether erected on the same or any adjoining premises;
- (b) at least 12 metres distant from the boundary of any adjoining premises;
- (c) in a position which in the opinion of an authorised officer is not liable to cause a nuisance to any other person.

PART V.

Cleanliness.

24. The occupier of any premises on which any animal, domestic animal, bird or domestic bird is kept shall cause the place where such animal, domestic animal, bird or domestic bird is kept to be maintained at all times in a clean and sanitary condition.

25. No person shall keep or store or allow to be kept or stored on any premises where any animal, domestic animal, bird, domestic bird or poultry is kept any food for consumption by any animal, domestic animal, bird, domestic bird or poultry unless such food is kept in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

26. The owner or occupier of any premises on which a stable is erected shall—

- (a) cause all manure, refuse and rubbish therein to be placed in a properly constructed receptacle with brickwork walls of at least 230 millimetres in thickness or concrete walls at least 100 millimetres in thickness with brick or concrete floor at least 150 millimetres in thickness, and lined throughout internally with cement rendering composed of two and a half parts sand to one part cement.
- (b) Maintain such receptacle at all times in such good state of repair as is necessary to prevent any escape or leakage of the contents thereof.
- (c) Keep such receptacle wholly covered with an effective cover at all times except when manure, refuse or rubbish is actually being deposited therein or being taken therefrom.
- (d) Effectively deodorize such receptacle and the contents thereof from time to time as may be necessary to prevent its becoming a nuisance, offensive or injurious or dangerous to health.
- (e) Cause all the contents of such receptacle to be removed from such property at least once every week.
- (f) Keep such stable at all times effectively and thoroughly repaired and cleansed in such a manner as may be necessary to prevent its

constituting a nuisance or becoming dangerous or offensive or injurious to the health of any resident in the municipality.

PART VI.

Control of Disease.

27. The owner or occupier of any premises on which there is kept any animal, domestic animal, bird, domestic bird, reptile or bee which shall develop any contagious or infectious disease which is or is likely to be injurious to any human being shall cause such animal, domestic animal, bird, domestic bird, reptile or bee as the case may be to receive appropriate treatment from a qualified veterinarian or apiarist as the case may be, or be destroyed and properly disposed of to the satisfaction of the Council.

PART VII.

Consent of Council.

28. Every person desiring a permit from the Council pursuant to the provisions of this By-law shall deliver to the Shire Secretary a written application setting out a full and detailed description of the premises concerned showing in particular the provision made for drainage and sanitation and shall also set out the number and description of the animals, domestic animals, birds, domestic birds, reptiles and beehives (as the case may be) intended to be kept thereon and such consent shall be given only if the Council is satisfied that the keeping of the animals, domestic animals, birds, domestic birds, reptiles or bees (as the case may be) as described in the request on the premises therein referred to will not constitute a nuisance or be dangerous or offensive or injurious to the health of any resident of the municipal district.

29. Every person applying for a permit under this By-law shall—

- (a) at least fourteen days before such application is lodged give or send by certified mail to the owner and occupier of every premises adjoining the premises in respect of which the application is to be made a notice of his intention to apply for such a permit;
- (b) lodge with the Shire Secretary a copy of such notice together with satisfactory proof of the service thereof.

30. The requirement in the preceding clause may be dispensed with by the Council if the owners and occupiers of all adjoining premises consent in writing to the granting of such a permit.

31. Any person interested in or affected by any such application may object to the Council. Such objection shall be in writing and shall be left with or posted to the Shire Secretary not less than five days before such application is dealt with by the Council and any such objection shall state the grounds thereof.

32. The Council before granting any such application shall consider all objections made thereto as aforesaid.

33. The Council may grant or refuse to grant such application and if the Council grants the application it shall issue a written permit.

34. The Council may include in any permit such conditions as it thinks fit.

35. Every permit shall be current for a maximum period of twelve months but may be renewed from time to time by the Council on the written application of the holder of such permit.

36. All applications for the renewal of permits shall be lodged with the Council during the month of November and dealt with by the Council during the month of December in each year.

37. Any permit may be revoked or cancelled by the Council at any time if in its opinion the property by reason of the keeping of the number of animals or domestic animals or birds or domestic birds permitted becomes offensive injurious to health or dangerous, or if by reason of any alteration to premises the Council is of the opinion that the permit should be revoked.

38. Every person giving false or misleading information in a notice of intention to apply for a permit or in any application for a permit shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

PART VIII.

Miscellaneous.

39. Any person guilty of a wilful breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$20 nor more than \$100 and to a further penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction by a court.

40. By-laws Nos. 29, 30 and 40 are hereby repealed.

- (b) The South Central Riding of the Shire of Melton, excepting that part of the said Riding west of Coburns Road and commercial poultry farms when exempted in writing by the Council.
- (c) The Township of Toolern Vale.
- (d) At Diggers Rest: The area bounded by Plumpton Road, the Calder Highway and the southern boundary of Section XIV Parish of Holden, excepting land of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (e) At Rockbank: The area bounded by Leakes Road, the Western Highway, Troups Road and the railway line.
- (f) At Chartwell: The area bounded by Downing Street, Boundary Road, and the eastern and northern boundaries of Plan of Subdivision No. 56343 (Rose-dale Estate).

The resolution for passing this by-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Melton on the 24th day of June, 1974, and confirmed on the 29th day of July, 1974.
