### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the Local Government Act 1958, Section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of sub-division delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Eltham has And whereas the Council of the Shire of Eltham has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned being land used for a street or road or being a street, road, lane, or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating the street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the Local Government Act 1958, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now Therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation declare that Campbell Road, Fernside Avenue, Porter Street and an unnamed road off Fernside Avenue being the land shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act.

Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

VARIATION OF FIRE DANGER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREAS OF VICTORIA.

Whereas by section 4 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958, it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by declaration published in the Government Gazette declare any period to be the fire danger period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the fire danger period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended or varied by a subsequent declaration so published:

And whereas by declaration issued on the date stated in Schedule A annexed hereto, different fire danger periods expiring on the 30th day of April, 1974, were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, situated within the municipal districts or parts of municipal districts specified in Schedule B hereunder:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do by this my declaration vary the aforesaid declaration by declaring that the fire danger period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria situated within the municipal districts or parts of municipal districts specified in Schedule B hereunder shall end at midnight on the 19th April, 1974.



## Legal Profession Practice Act. SOLICITORS' (PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT AND PRACTICE) RULES.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 88 of the Legal Profession Practice Act 1958 and all powers thereunto enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria hereby makes the following rules of the Institute—

- 1. These rules may be cited as the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1974 and shall be read and construed as one with the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules 1948 and all rules amending those rules, which rules and these rules may be cited as the Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules
- 2. These rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1974.  $\label{eq:comparison}$
- 3. The Solicitors' (Professional Conduct and Practice) Rules are amended by adding the following rule at the end thereof-
  - "8. A solicitor shall not advise nor knowingly permit a client to lend money without security to the solicitor or to his partner or a member of the family of the solicitor or his partner or to a company (other than a company the shares in which are listed on any stock exchange in Australia or a building society registered under the Building Societies Act) in which any shares are beneficially held by the solicitor or his partner unless prior to the loan the client has acknowledged in writing that he has been advised by the solicitor that—
    - (a) the loan is a personal loan without security;
    - (b) in the event of default the client's remedy is against the borrower and he may have no recourse to the Solicitors' Guarantee Fund;
    - (c) the solicitor or his partner or a member of the family of the solicitor or his partner (as the case may be) may benefit financially from the loan."




