PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Game Act 1958, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my proclamation amend the proclamation prescribing a close season for Wild Ducks and Teal made on the second day of February One thousand nine hundred and seventy-two and published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd February 1972 as follows:—

The column headed Close Season to read-

"From midnight on the last Saturday in May in each year to six o'clock in the forenoon on the second last Saturday in February next following."

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958. DECLARING THAT TOBACCO LEAF SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE TOBACCO LEAF MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO (2)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by proclamation-

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on, from and after a later date specified in the proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner, and to deal with the same;

And whereas by a proclamation made on the twentieth day of December 1963, under the provisions of section 7 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared tobacco leaf to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act:

And whereas by an Order made on the twenty-second day of April, 1964, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to tobacco leaf and assigned to such

board the name of "The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my proclamation hereby provide and declare that on, from and after the thirteenth day of May, 1974, all tobacco leaf shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 be divested from the producers of tobacco leaf and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any tobacco leaf coming into existence within two (2) years from the thirteenth day of May, 1974, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board as owner of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such tobacco leaf shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Tobacco Leaf Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

Dairy Products Act. QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE. BUTTER QUOTA.

I. BARWON RIVER BY-LAW NO. 128.

THE GEELONG WATERWORKS & SEWERAGE TRUST (hereinafter called "the Trust") pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on the Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act, and of any other power or authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders, as follows:—

· Interpretation and Repeal.

- 1. This By-Law may be cited as the Geelong Waterworks & Sewerage Trust Barwon River By-Law and shall be numbered 128.
- 2: In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:-
 - "Boat" means any device which is used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water.
 - "Boating Regulations" mean any Regulations made under the Motor Boating Act 1961.
 - "Motor Vehicle" means any mechanically propelled vehicle and without limiting the generality of the foregoing includes a motor cycle, mini-bike and go-cart. and go-cart.
 - "Permit" means a permit issued by the Trust under this By-Law.

 - "Person" includes corporation.
 "Power Boat" means any boat mechanically propelled.
 - "River Officer" means and includes an officer appointed by the Trust as such and any Officer of the Trust on river duty and any official in charge of or concerned in a regatta, power boating or water skiing contest or swimming races authorised by the River Officer or by the Trust in writing to so act in connection with such regatta, power boat or skiing contest or swimming races as the case may be.
 - "River" means that portion of the bed soil and banks of the Barwon River the control of which is vested in the Trust under the provisions of the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958 or any amendments or reinactment thereof.
- or any amendments or remactment thereof.

 3. By-Law number 94 relating to the Barwon River shall be and the same is hereby revoked from the date of coming into occupation of this By-Law, but nothing shall invalidate any act or thing, nor annul or stay any proceedings taken, prosecution commenced, or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the said By-Law prior to the date of this By-Law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion, and all offences against any provision of the said By-Law committed before the date of this By-Law coming into operation, may be prosecuted for and punished as if this By-Law had not been made and passed.
- 4. This By-Law shall be read and construed with the Motor Boating Act 1961 and Regulations made thereunder and with any Proclamation made from time to time pursuant to Section 4 of the Motor Boating Act 1961.

. General.

- 5. (i) No person shall—

 (a) Enter or remain on the river who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner or creates or takes part in any disturbance.

 (b) Enter or remain on the river whilst in a state of
 - intoxication.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language on the river. (d) Offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale or bring intoxi-cating liquor onto the river without the consent of the Trust first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed on the river.
 - (f) Climb, jump on, or get over any of the gates, fences in or around the river, or stick bills, or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture, or fittings, gates, stiles, fences; seats, or other structures on the river.
- (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, or plants, or pluck flowers, destroy or cut grasses on the river.

- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatsoever therein, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything that might injure a person.
- Light a fire on the river, except at such places as may be set apart for the purpose by the Trust.
 - (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or airguns on the river, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds thereon.
 - (k) Bet publicly on the river without the consent of the Trust.
 - (1) Erect any building tent or structure or camp on any portion of the river without permission in writing of the Trust first obtained and then only under such conditions as may be deter-mined by the Trust.
- (m) Bring onto the river any dog, unless such animal is controlled by a chain or cord.
 - (n) Do anything whatsoever on the river for the purpose of commercial gain without the consent, in writing, of the Trust first obtained.
 - (o) No person shall remove interfere with damage or deface any life saving gear, life hook, life buy or other life saving apparatus unless such removal or interference be for the purpose of saving lives.
- (p) No person shall pump or discharge or put or permit to be pumped or discharged or put any harmful, noxious, poisonous, or corrosive material or any liquid, oils, spirits, tar or other inflammable or polluting substance whatsoever into the river.
- (q) No person shall cut, break, destroy or interfere with the mooring or fastening of any boat belonging to the Trust or any other boat without the consent of the owner thereof.
 - (r) No person with the exception of the River Officer
- shall—

 (i) remove or interfere with or cast off or take away any boat from any wharf, or place fixed, set apart or allocated by the Trust or its River Officer for the mooring or berthing of boats without the permission of the owner or other authorised persons

 (ii) without the prior consent of the Trust use or occupy any boat moored or berthed in any part of the river as a residence whether permanent, temporary or occasional.
 - whether permanent temporary occasional
- (ii) (a) No club or association or person shall hold or take part in any organised game, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the river without the written authority of the Trust first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Trust deems to be reasonable and consistent with this By-Law.
- (b) No person shall take or put, or allow to be taken or put on the river any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals.
- "(c) The owner of any horses, sheep cattle, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the river shall be guilty of an offence against this By-
- (iii) No person shall drive any motor vehicle on the . , ,,
 - (a) At a speed exceeding 15 m.p.h. (24 kilometres p.h.)
- (b) In a reckless, dangerous or careless manner.
 - (c) Other than on such roads and paths on which such vehicles are authorised by means of signs to travel.
- (d). Unless the complies with all signs erected to
 - (e) Unless he complies with all reasonable directions of the River Officer or any member of the Victoria Police Force given to control such driving or traffic flow on the river.

- (iv) No person shall park any motor vehicle other than in areas authorised by signs for parking or at the direction of the River Officer or any member of the Victoria Police Force.
- 6. The River Officer may, if in his opinion, a boat is being navigated, driven or propelled in an incompetent manner or in a manner dangerous to the occupants or public or is overcrowded, order such boat to the bank of the river or to its berth or moorings and may compel the whole or any number of passengers on board to disembark.
- 7. (i) No person shall use on, bring onto, or allow or suffer to remain on the river any boat:
 - (a) which is likely to be or become offensive or annoying by reason of noise, smoke or smell or machinery of which is defective or is likely to be or become dangerous to life or traffic
 - (b) any boat which is unsafe, derelict, unseaworthy or unsuitable for the river
 - (c) exceeding 6 metres in length or exceeding 2 metres in beam except with the written consent of the Trust and along terms and conditions set out therein save that this clause shall not apply to any rowing eights, fours, pairs or sculls.
- (ii) (a) No person shall anchor, berth, tie up or allow any boat to drift on the river so as to obstruct boats lawfully using the river for rowing, water skiing or water sport or other use.
- (b) Any person in charge of any boat in the opinion of the River Officer causing any such obstruction as referred to in the preceding paragraph shall obey a direction of the River Officer to remove such boat.
- (c) Where any boat is bought onto, anchored, moored or berthed on or remains on the river in contravention of this By-Law, the River Officer may—
 - (a) after seven days notice in writing given to the owner or person in control thereof and such notice has not been complied with, or
 - (b) where the whereabouts of the owner or person in control are not known to the River Officer after reasonable enquiry, or
 - (c) where such boat is or is likely to become offensive, dangerous to life or traffic or an obstruction to the use of the river and the owner or person in control is not immediately available, seize such boat and remove the same to some other portion of the river or off the river into storage and any expenses including storage involved in so doing shall be borne by the owner. In the event of the owner failing to pay on demand such expenses or if the owner after advertisement by the Trust in the Geelong Advertiser or some other newspaper circulating in the district of its intention to sell the such boat fails to pay such expenses and remove such boat, the Trust may sell the same and from the proceeds thereof deduct any expenses incurred as a result of the seizure, removal, storage and sale of such boat and may retain the balance until claimed by the person entitled thereto.
- 7. No person shall launch or recover any boat other than from the ramps or stagings constructed by the Trust for that purpose.
- 8. (a) Boats shall be moored or berthed only in such part or parts of the river and in such manner as may from time to time be directed or by the River Officer.
- (b) No boats shall be moored and no mooring shall be laid in the river without a permit in writing having first been obtained from the Trust which permit shall prescribe the conditions under which it has been issued.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything herein contained the owner or any person in charge of any boat shall remove the moorings thereof within 48 hours of having been served with a notice so to do by the River Officer and unless the River Officer permits the replacement of such moorings or unless the owner or person in charge thereof is in breach of the provisions of this By-Law the owner shall be entitled to a pro-rata refund of any mooring permit fee paid.

Boat Races and Regattas.

- On the occasion of any boat race, regatta or other assemblage of boats for which permission of the Trust shall have been given—
 - (i) no person shall obstruct or improperly interfere with any boats or persons thereon engaged in competing in any boat race;

- (ii) no person shall navigate any boat in such a manner as to obstruct impede or interfere with a boat race, regatta or assemblage of boats or endanger the safety of persons on the river or prevent the maintenance of order thereon;
- (iii) the orders and directions of the River Officer or any member of the Victorian Police Force as to the position to be taken up, the maintenance of order, the keeping clear of the course and in connection with the general control and management of the boat race regatta or assemblage of boats shall be strictly observed.
- (iv) when the signal for clearing the course is given or when otherwise ordered by the River Officer all non-competing boats must be removed from the course as quickly as possible.

Control of Water Skiing.

- 10. (a) Water skilers shall commence to water ski as close to the starboard or right hand bank as practicable.
- (b) Any water skiler losing the tow rope when being towed shall immediately swim to the starboard or right hand bank.
- (c) No water skiier shall continue to slalom or continue outside the wake of the towing power boat within 75 metres of any other boat approaching when the course of the towing boats is such that if they continued on their existing course a situation dangerous to either the skiier or the occupants of the boats would be created.

Bathing.

11. No person, other than a person referred to in Clause 10 herein shall bathe in any portion of the River at a time when that portion is authorized under any Act Proclamation Regulation or By-Law to be used by any power boat.

Permits Generally.

12. The Trust may suspend, cancel or refuse to renew any permit issued by it without assigning any cause for such suspension or cancellation. The person to whom such permit has been granted shall have no recourse against the Trust for any loss or damage that may accrue to him by reason of such suspension or cancellation.

Enforcement of Penalites.

- 13. (a) The River Officer or any member of the Victorian Police Force may give such reasonable directions to any person on the river, or any person who is in charge of or has the control and management of any boat on the river which may in the opinion of such River Officer or member of the Police Force be necessary for carrying into execution the provision of this By-Law.
- (b) Neglect or refusal to obey the lawful direction of the River Officer or member of the Victorian Police Force given as aforesaid shall be an offence against this By-Law.
- 15. (a) In any case where the River Officer or any Officer of the Trust or any member of the Police Force has reasonable grounds for believing or suspecting that any persons have contravened this By-Law the River Officer or such officer or member may request such person to state his name and address and produce such evidence of identity as the circumstances may reasonably require.
- (b) If such person refuses to state his name and address or states a false name and address or refuses to produce to the River Officer or to such officer or member such evidence of identity as the circumstances may reasonably require he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law.
- 16. Any person who by any act or default fails to comply with the provisions of this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence.
- 17. Any person upon conviction for an offence against this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$40.00 and in the case of a continuing offence further penalty of not more than \$4.00 for each day on which the offence is committed or repeated after a conviction or order by any Court.

By-Law Number 130.

A BY-LAW TO AMEND SEWERAGE BY-LAW NUMBER 97.

The Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the Trust) in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958, the Sewerage Districts Act 1958 and every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby amends Sewerage By-Law number 97 as follows:

- 1 Sub-Clause 4 (c) (ii) Clause 12, Sub-Clause 24 (b), Clauses 28, 29 and 30, Sub-Clause 33 (e), Clauses 34, 35 and 36 are deleted and the following Clauses and Sub-Clauses respectively substituted.
- 4 (c) (ii) The owner shall submit for examination a properly drawn design on tracing cloth and a type-written specification. The tracing cloth shall be of a standard size of 330 MM by 215 MM and the drawing shall be to a scale of 1:500 unless such standard tracing cloth and such standard scale are too small to show clearly the nature and position of all fittings. In cases where it is necessary to use a larger tracing cloth and a larger scale, in order to show clearly the nature and position of all fittings, such larger tracing cloth and such larger scale shall be approved by the Trust. The design and specification shall be supplied to the Trust in triplicate. The work shall not proceed until the owner's design and specification have been approved by the Engineer-in-Chief and the third copy returned to the owner with official endorsement.
- 12 The owner or his authorized agent, or the plumber, drainer or contractor carrying out the work, must give at least twenty-four hour's notice in writing to the Trust of his intention to commence work, and also when any work is ready for inspection. All work must be left uncovered and convenient for examination until inspected and approved by an inspecting officer appointed by the Trust.

Such inspection shall be made within twenty-four hours of such notification being received at the office of the Trust, except when notification is received on Fridays, when seventy-two hours must be allowed.

The inspecting officer may apply the ether, peppermint, water or smoke test, and the plumber or drainer shall furnish all the necessary tools, labour and assistance for such tests.

The owner or his authorized agent shall remove or repair any defect when so ordered by the inspecting officer, and if he neglect or fail to do so, he shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten dollars and to a penalty not exceeding Two dollars for every day thereafter during which such neglect or failure shall continue.

Before the fittings are connected with the plumbing of any house or building, or after, if so ordered, and before the soil or waste pipe is connected with the sewer, the outlet of the soil or waste pipe and all openings into it below the top shall be hermetically sealed.

The pipes shall then be filled with water to such height as the inspecting officer of the Trust shall require, and every joint carefully examined for leaks. Work already in place may be examined by the peppermint or other test. Defective pipes must be removed and replaced by sound ones, and all defective joints made tight, and every part of the work made to conform to this By-Law, and subject to the approval of an inspecting officer of the Trust.

House drains, whether laid by the Trust's workmen or others, must be thoroughly tested in every case before being passed by the Trust's inspecting officers. When being tested with water, there must be a head of at least 2 Metres above every part of the drain.

Before a licensed plumber or drainer commences to clear a stoppage in a drain he shall notify the Trust in writing of the time when he intends to clear the stoppage, so that an inspector may attend and pass the work in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

24 (b) All the manure bins must have the inside surfaces rendered with cement mortar, and must be impervious throughout, and provided with an approved close-fitting cover. Walls of new manure bins must, unless otherwise approved by the Engineer-in-Chief, be at least 230 MM in thickness, built of brickwork laid in cement mortar. If an outlet pipe be provided for a manure bin, it must be properly connected with the Trust's sewers. Branches in house drains must be provided in all cases where manure bins exist for their connexion whenever the Trust shall deem it necessary.

28 All drains shall be laid on an even grade and except by special permission, in writing, from the proper officer, such gradients shall not be less than the following:

100 MM diameter 1 in 40 150 MM diameter 1 in 60 230 MM diameter 1 in 90

In cases where the grades of drains are steeper than 1 in 15, concrete anchorage blocks shall be placed at intervals of not more than 10 Metres.

Such blocks shall be let into the sides of the trench at least 150 MM on each side and shall extend not less than 80 MM above and below the barrel of the pipe and for a length of 300 MM along the pipe.

- 29 Drains of stoneware or concrete pipes, unless bedded on and encased in concrete of not less than 150 MM thick over any part of the drain, shall be laid at a depth to the top of the socket of the pipe of not less than the following:
 - (a) In public thoroughfares, rights-of-way, or other open spaces subject to vehicular traffic—800 MM
 - (b) In private property not subject to vehicular traffic —500 MM

30 All pipes shall be laid to such lines and grades as may be shown on the plans or directed, and, except where otherwise ordered, shall be bedded on approved sand or other approved bedding material up to one-third of the diameter of the pipe and so that there shall be at least 50 MM of the bedding material below the barrel of the pipe in the case of earth bottomed trenches and up to the horizontal diameter of the pipe, and so that there shall be at least 80 MM of the bedding material below the barrel of the pipe where laid in trenches in rock.

In water-charged ground, or where the foundation is bad, or near the roots of trees, or where directed, the drain shall be formed of cast-iron pipes or, if of stoneware or concrete or other approved pipes, they shall be bedded on and encased in concrete as ordered, and, if ordered supported upon approved timber foundations as directed. The thickness of concrete encasing and the form of concrete haunching support shall be as directed by the proper officer.

Drops or bends in vertical or inclined drains shall have a concrete support placed under and around the drain as directed.

- 33 (e) "Oil Traps" for collecting all kinds of oil, which shall be of such forms as approved. The term "yard gully" is applied to traps (a) where they are used externally and fitted with dished tops and gratings. The tops of inlets of all disconnector traps must be at least 150 MM above the surface of the surrounding ground.
- 34 Yard gullies, when provided in the yard shall be as near as practicable to the kitchen or back door, with a water tap connected with a satisfactory water service placed over it at a height of not less than 600 MM. No yard gully shall be situated within a building or outbuilding.
- 35 Yard gullies shall be fitted with dished tops and gratings, the dished top being in one piece with the trap or jointed thereto by spigot and faucet, or as otherwise approved.

The depth of the dished top to the grating shall not be less than 150 MM. The grating to every gully trap shall not be less than 174 MM over all, and the grating to every disconnector trap shall be convex in section, with an opening of suitable outlet capacity. Every grating shall be fixed down in an approved manner with bitumen or wedges of lead.

36 Yard gully basins and the dished tops of silt traps shall be so surrounded with an approved impervious kerbing as to prevent the access of surface water to the drains, and if directed, the wall at the rear of the gully or silt trap, if of brick or stone, shall be cement rendered to the height of the tap over same, and if of wood the wall shall be provided with an approved galvanised sheet iron apron. The internal diameter of kerbing around gully traps measured from the face of cement rendering shall not be less than 380 MM, and shall be neatly rounded to meet the gully top.

Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called the Trust) in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred on such Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958 and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf hereby makes the following By-Law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

- 1. Sub-Clauses 9 (a) and (c) Clauses 14, 27, 28 and 32, Sub-Clause 35 (e), Clause 36, Sub-Clauses 38 (a) (iv) and (v) and 38 (b), Clause 40 and Sub-Clause 41 (a) are deleted and the following Clauses substituted.
 - 9. (a) Water Supplies for Rural Purposes

The Trust may grant supplies of water for rural purposes to properties for which the following minimum annual charges shall be payable.

- (i) For properties exceeding 0·4 hectares and less than 12 hectares—16 dollars
- (ii) For properties exceeding 12 hectares and less than 24 hectares—32 dollars
- (iii) For properties exceeding 24 hectares-48 dollars
- 9, (c) The Trust may grant supplies of water for road consolidation purposes for which a charge of 40 cents for each one hundred square metres of road consolidated shall
- 14 In the case of every private service containing any service pipe of 25 MM and upwards in diameter, the notice must be accompanied by a properly dimensioned plan of the premises at which the work is to be done showing the location of all buildings and the arrangements of all pipes and fittings proposed to be laid.
- 27 The maximum diameter of tapping that may be taken shall be 20 MM provided that permission for a larger tapping may be granted after application, in writing, has been made to the Trust.
- 28 A branch must be inserted in mains of 150 MM diameter and over for connections of 75 MM diameter and over and in mains of less than 150 MM diameter for connections of 50 MM diameter and over.
- 32 No person shall permit or suffer any fluid solid or gas, which in the opinion of the Proper Officer of the Trust is capable of polluting water supplied by the Trust, to have means of access to any pipe in communication directly or indirectly with any main pipe of the Trust. Where any service pipe is connected to any cistern, tank or receptacle used for the storage of water or fluid, there shall be an effective air gap at the outlet of such service pipe and the said outlet shall be not less than 12 MM above the highest possible water level in the said cistern, tank or receptacle.
- 35 (e) If water used for or in the operation of the said apparatus under full output exceeds 2 litres per minute it shall not be run to waste unless consent in writing shall have first been obtained from the Trust.
- 36 No person shall use or permit or suffer the use of any private services for the purpose of supplying water to any bath capable of containing more than 500 litres of water unless with the approval of the Trust.
- 38 (a) (iv) The cold water feed into a storage tank shall be at least 12 MM above the top of the overflow from the tank.
- 38 (a) (v) The overflow pipe shall be of galvanised sheet iron with soldered joints and shall be at least 40 MM in diameter and all other parts of such tank shall be made of approved materials.
- 38 (b) Where a storage tank is installed between the roof and the ceiling of any building there shall be fixed beneath such tank a tray constructed of approved material and with an overflow pipe of at least 50 MM in diameter constructed of galvanised sheet iron with soldered joints.
- 40 No person shall construct, lay or use any service pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with or supplies water to any urinal or water closet or, any part thereof save through a cistern or tank so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously and that no more than 14 litres can escape at one static flush.
- 41 (a) Private fire services comprising pipes and fittings not exceeding 150 MM in diameter and without meters may be permitted at the expense of the owner of the

premises. Every such fire service shall be sealed. Except in case of fire no person shall, without the authority of the Trust, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service and in the event of any such seal having been broken accidently or otherwise the occupier of the tenement shall within twenty-four (24) hours thereafter give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the Trust, and shall be liable to pay for all water estimated by the Trust to have been used as a result of the seals having been broken. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of a private source except for extinguishing fires.


