

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RECOMMEND THAT CERTAIN TRADES BE PROCLAIMED APPRENTICESHIP TRADES.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the provisions of the Apprenticeship Act 1958, that it is the intention of the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria to make a recommendation to the Minister of Labour and Industry that the under-mentioned trades be proclaimed apprenticeship trades under the said Act in so far as they are carried on anywhere in the State of Victoria:

- (a) Agriculture (Fruit Growing) in so far as it is carried on in the fruit growing industry anywhere in the State of Victoria.
- (b) Agriculture (General) in so far as it is carried on in the grazing, dairying and cropping industries anywhere in the State of Victoria.

It is also notified that the 22nd August, 1974, has been fixed as the date before which representations may be made to the said Commission by or on behalf of employers and employees in the said trades, whether for or against the said trades being so proclaimed.

It is further notified that the Commission intends to recommend under sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (b) of sub-section (2) of section 13 of the Apprenticeship Act 1958 that both trades be excluded from the application of sub-section (1) of section 33 of the Apprenticeship Act 1958. (This means that on proclamation of the trades voluntary apprenticeship systems would operate and while there would be no compulsion on persons under 21 years of age to enter into a contract of apprenticeship an applicant who wishes to enter the trades of Agriculture (Fruit Growing) or Agriculture (General) as an indentured apprentice would come under the jurisdiction of the Apprenticeship Commission).





Clause 4 (3) of the contract between the Board and dairy farmers provides that the Board shall be entitled to deduct from the price of the milk purchased under such contract, such amount per gallon as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost incurred in transporting the said milk from the farm of the vendor to the point of sale by the Board.

The prices prescribed in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above, make provision for the cost of transport of the said milk from the premises of the Authorised Agent of the Board to the premises of the dairyman to whom such milk is normally sold by the Board, but from each of such prices the Board shall be entitled to deduct such sum per gallon as it may from time to time determine in respect of the cost of transport of the milk from the farm of the vendor to the premises of the Authorised Agent.

In respect of any milk, additional to its normal requirements which the Board may purchase from a dairy farmer to meet a demand in an area other than that in which the said dairy farmer's milk is normally marketed, the Board shall also be entitled to deduct from the appropriate price

herein prescribed, such further sum per gallon as it may determine in respect of any cost (in excess of that for which allowance has already been made in this determination) of transporting such milk from the premises of its Authorised Agent to the premises of the dairyman purchasing such milk.

In respect of payments for milk made by the Milk Board to dairy farmers, the Board shall deduct an amount of .033 cents per gallon or such other amount, not exceeding .04 cents per gallon, as may from time to time be imposed as a levy on wholemilk pursuant to the provisions of the Dairying Research Levy Act 1972 of the Commonwealth of Australia.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 52 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fetes, sports, or holiday or other amusements, on any of which occasions a charge may be made and taken for the admission of each adult to the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 3. No persons shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except in the fireplaces provided for the purpose.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon or cut names on or deface in any way, damage, or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No persons shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.
- 7. No person shall camp in the Reserve except in the part or parts thereof which are set apart for such purpose and then only subject to the payment of such fees and the observance of such conditions as are determined by the Committee.
- 8. No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or commodity without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 10. No person shall play or engage in any organized port, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 11. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
- on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

 12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket or football matches, agricultural shows, fetes, sports or holiday or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding One hundred dollars by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.
- 13. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- 14. No person shall bring into the Reserve or discharge or carry any firearm or offensive weapon therein.

 15. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, litter, or rubbish in the Reserve except in a place provided for the purpose and indicated by notice board.

- 16. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve, or in any of the rooms, buildings, structures, erections or enclosures for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations:—
 - (a) Assaulting or threatening any person or persons;
 - (b) Being under the influence of liquor;
 - (c) Entering, crossing, being on, or trespassing on any playing ground area, enclosure, or course, or building, room, or structure, or any part thereof whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusion of such event without the consent of the Committee.
 - (d) Using profane, indecent, obscene or unseemly language.
 - (e) Using threatening, abusive, offensive, or insulting
 - (f) Behaving improperly, offensively, or riotously.
 - (g) Interfering with, or interrupting any game, sports, competition, entertainment or amusement or practice thereat.
 - (h) Obtaining or attempting to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.
 - 17. No person shall:
 - (a) Remain in the Reserve who behaves in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or creates or takes part in any disturbance.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.
 - (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained,
- 18. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud-speaker, public address system, or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions, and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.
- 19. No person shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set aside for that purpose and then only when he shall:—
 - (a) have obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee and paid to such Committee a fee not to exceed Ten dollars for any meeting or sporting event held in the Reserve, and
 - (b) during the time that he is in or upon the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a book-maker wear a ticket or have a bag either of which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.—(Rs.4387.)

A By-Law of the City of Port Melbourne made under Section 197 of the Local Government Act and numbered 160 for controlling and regulating the use of premises with a view to preventing objectionable noises at unreasonable times for prohibiting or minimising noises in any public highway, for suppressing nuisances, for repealing By-Law Number 140 of the City of Port Melbourne, and for amending By-Law Number 149 of the said City.

No person being the owner or occupier of any premises shall use or permit such premises to be used in such a manner as to cause any objectionable noise to emanate therefrom at any time between the hours of 10.00 p.m. on each day of the week from Monday to Friday both inclusive and 6.00 a.m. on the following day and between 6.00 p.m. on each Saturday and 6.00 a.m. on the following Monday.

- 3. "Objectionable noise" for the purpose of the last preceding Clause shall include a noise which in fact materially interferes with the health or the comfort of or the enjoyment of premises by any person while resident on or in adjoining or adjacent premises, or which might reasonably be expected materially to interfere with the health or the comfort of or the enjoyment of premises by any such person while so resident.
- 4. No person in any public highway shall by any act or default on his part:—
 - (a) cause any objectionable noise to be made on any such highway whether by human or mechanical means, or
 - (b) permit any vehicle of which he is the owner or driver to make any objectionable noise on any such highway.
- 5. Nothing in this By-Law shall apply to anything done by any member of the police force, the fire brigade or an ambulance service, or any officer of any other public authority or utility or any municipality in the course of the proper discharge of his duties.
- 6. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable on conviction:—
 - (a) to a penalty of not less than \$20 and not more than \$100, and
 - (b) to a further penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
- 7. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Port Melbourne.

Recreation Vehicles By-Law.

A By-Law of the City of Port Melbourne made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 161 for prohibiting or regulating the use of motorised vehicles for recreational purposes on certain land.

- 3. Any person applying for the consent of the Council under Clause 2 hereof shall make application in writing stating—
 - a) the place at which such vehicle or vehicles is or are to be used
 - b) the times during which such vehicle or vehicles will be used
 - c) the names and addresses and age or ages of any person or persons who will be using such vehicle or vehicles at such times
 - d) the description of such vehicle or vehicles stating make engine size and whether or not registered

- e) whether or not the consent of the owner of the land has been obtained
- f) such other information that the Council may require.
- 4. The Council in giving its consent under Clause 2 hereof may impose any condition which it considers appropriate to the use of such vehicles.
- 5. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the City of Port Melbourne.
- 6. Any person suspected of contravening this by-law shall give his name and place of abode when asked to do so by a Council Officer.
- 7. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10 or more than \$100 and any person guilty of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10 for each day on which an offence against this by-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

 - (g) supply such other information that the Council may require.
- 4. The Council in giving its consent under Clause 2 hereof can impose any condition which it considers appropriate to the granting of such permit for the use of such vehicle.
- 5. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District.
- 6. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default, contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 and any person guilty of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.
