By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, 1958 (No. 6270), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation rescind all the previous Proclamations relating to meat supervision fees made under subsection (2) of section 317 of the Health Act 1958, and in accordance with the powers conferred by section 317 of the said Act, I now specify in the attached Schedule the maximum fees and dues which may be prescribed by By-Laws of a Council for certain services at abattoirs and meat inspection depots.


NOTICE OF FIXING NEW ALIGNMENT OF THE GLENELG HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF GRENVILLE.



The maximum quantity of water supplied in any one meter year without further charge to the property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 51c per thousand gallons or 11c per kilo-litre for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.
- 5. For all water in excess of the maximum quantity (referred to in paragraph 4 of this by-law) which is supplied in any meter year the charge is hereby fixed at 51c per thousand gallons or 11c per kilo-litre for any meter
- 6. Subject as hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 51c per thousand gallons or 11c per kilo-litre for any meter year.
- 7. A resolution passing this by-law was agreed to by the Trust on the 6th day of August, 1974.

- (a) Where the Authority designs the work and has same carried out for the owner—
 - 1. A charge shall be made equal to 12% on the capital cost of the work for designing, specifying, letting of contract, and supervising all details associated with such work.

- 2. Consent for additions to and/or amendments or approved plans or to works previously approved will be made only on the application of the owner or his authorised agent, and on payment of a fee of \$3.50.
- (b) When the Authority designs work for the owner and the owner then carried out his own work—
 - 1. For plan of drainage a fee of \$20 plus \$5 for each fixture for the first 10 fixtures and then \$2.50 for each additional fixture.

For design of a plumbing installation the charge will be computed according to the time occupied thereon by the Authority's Officers at the rate of \$8 per hour.

- 2. For making and/or examining any alterations or additions to a plan previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of \$4 for each fixture or drain altered or added.
- 3. The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of drains by the Proper Officer is \$10 for the first 20 fixtures plus \$5 for each additional 10 fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation, is \$6.50.
- 4. The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of plumbing by the Proper Officer is \$10 for the first 10 fixtures plus \$5 for each additional 10 fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is \$6.50.
- 5. The fee for the initial visit for the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer is \$5 for each 10 fixtures or part thereof in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is \$3.
- 6. The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work.

The works will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.

- (c) Where an owner designs and carried out his own work—
 - 1. For the supply of a block plan a fee of \$4. For buildings exceeding 375 square metres in ground floor area and/or properties exceeding one hectare in extent an additional fee of \$3 shall be charged for each additional 375 square metres or part thereof and/or for each additional one hectare or part thereof
 - 2.1. The owner shall submit for examination three legible prints of the drainage plan drawn in ink to scale of not smaller than 1:500 showing—
 - (a) Position of all buildings in their correct relation to the boundaries.
 - (b) The position and depth of the Authority's "point".
 - (c) The approximate position of all existing and proposed fixtures together with a list of fixtures.
 - (d) The position of existing drains, if any, and the layout of the proposed drains showing position of inspection openings, disconnector traps, vents, et cetera.
 - 2.2. In the case of all buildings of more than one storey OR in which it is proposed to install a combined pipe system the owner shall submit for examination three copies of a typewritten specification and three legible prints of the plumbing plan drawn in ink to a scale of not smaller than 1:100 showing—
 - (i) Plan of each floor including ground floor and basements (if any) upon which fixtures are or are proposed to be installed showing clearly the nature and position of all fixtures and the size and arrangements of all soil, waste, combined waste and vent pipes and the position size gradient and approximate depth of all drains. Upon such plans fixtures shall be designated and the various pipe lines shall be delineated as follows—

Soil Pipes

Waste Pipes
Combined Waste Pipes
Vents

- (ii) The intended use of each room in which a fixture has or is proposed to be installed and of each room which opens directly into a water closet or urinal apartment.
- (iii) Sectional line diagram showing clearly each soil waste combined waste or vent pipe or stack together with their sizes and the positions of all fixtures connected thereto and where required the gradient of the soil waste or combined waste pipes.
- (iv) Such other information as the Authority may require.

The work shall not proceed until the owner's specification if any, and plan(s) have been approved by the Engineer and a copy returned to him with the official endorsement.

3. For the examination of the owner's plans and specification of a fee of \$10 for each plan of from one to ten fixtures plus \$2.50 for each five fixtures over ten

Where the owner in writing requests the Authority to prepare a design of a plumbing installation only the charge will be computed according to the time occupied thereon by the Authority's officers at the rate of \$8 per hour.

- 4. For examining any alterations or additions to a plan and/or specification previously issued or approved by the Engineer, a fee of \$2.50 for each fixture or drain altered or added.
- 5. The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of drains by the Proper Officer is \$10 for the first 20 fixtures plus \$5 for each additional 10 fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is \$6.50.
- 6. The fee for the initial visit for the inspection and testing of plumbing by the Proper Officer is \$10 for the first 10 fixtures plus \$5 for each additional 10 fixtures in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is \$6.50.
- 7. The fee for the initial visit for the final inspection by the Authority's Engineer is \$5 for each 10 fixtures or part thereof in the installation. The fee for each additional visit, irrespective of the number of fixtures in the installation is \$3.
- 8. The Engineer may during construction of the work order the owner to carry out such additions and/or amendments as may be necessary for the satisfactory completion of the work. The works will not be passed until the installation, together with the amendments ordered, have been completed to the Engineer's satisfaction.
- (d) Where an owner has selected one or another of the methods set out in Sub-Sections (α), (b) or (c) above, but subsequently desires to adopt another of such methods, he may do so provided that no contract has been let for the work and that he pays to the Authority the following fees which shall be additional to fees which will become due in respect of the newly adopted method.
 - (i) Where the change is from the method set out in Sub-Section (α) an amount equal to 8% of the estimated capital cost of the work.
 - (ii) Where the change is from the method set out in Sub-Section (b) the fees prescribed in Sub-Section (b) 1 and (b) 2.
 - (iii) Where the change is from the method set out in Sub-Section (c) the fees prescribed in Sub-Section (c) 1, (c) 3 and (c) 4.


