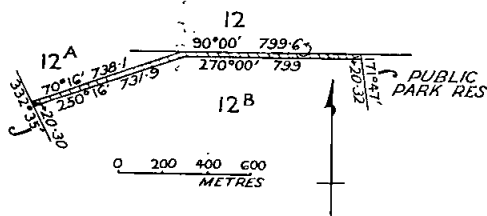
### ROAD PROCLAIMED.

#### DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, Queen of Australia, entitled the *Liquor Control (Amendment) Act 1975 No. 8732*, it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of the said Act shall come into operation on a day or the respective days to be fixed by proclamation or successive proclamations of the Governor in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday the Third day of September, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-five as the day on which Section 13 of the *Liquor Control (Amendment) Act 1975, No. 8732* shall come into operation.

## PROCLAMATION VARYING THE AREA OF AN URBAN FIRE DISTRICT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 15 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Authority, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim parts of the country area of Victoria as fire control regions for the purposes of the said Act, proclaim the whole or parts of any such region as urban fire districts for the purposes of the said Act and abolish or in any way vary the area of any such region or district:

And whereas by proclamation issued on the tenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-three and published in the *Government Gazette* on the nineteenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-three parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions and the whole or parts of such regions were proclaimed as urban fire districts:

And whereas the said Authority, has reported that it is expedient to vary the proclamation aforesaid by extending the Warburton Urban Fire District:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and having considered a report by the said Authority do by this my proclamation vary the area of the Warburton Urban Fire District as described in my proclamation aforesaid by proclaiming the herein described part of the Thirteenth Fire Control Region to be an urban fire district for the purposes of the said Act (that is to say):—

## IN THE THIRTEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

## 8. Warburton Urban Fire District:—

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 17, Parish of Warburton; thence westerly to the south-western angle of allotment 17; thence southerly and westerly by the boundary of allotment 16 to the south-western angle thereof; thence northerly and westerly by the boundary of allotment 18 to the north-western angle thereof; thence westerly by the boundaries of the Township of Warburton and allotment 116 of the north western angle of allotment 116; thence southerly to the south-western angle of allotment 116; thence north-westerly by the boundaries of allotments 112, 114 and 113 to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 12L; thence westerly by a line, the southern boundary of allotment 12L and a line to the eastern boundary of allotment 12G; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of allotments 12G, 12E and 12B to the south-western angle of allotment 12B; thence northerly by the boundary of allotment 12B and westerly by the southern boundaries of allotments 12J and 4C to the south-western angle of allotment 4C; thence northerly by a line and the eastern boundaries of allotments 77C and 77F to the north-eastern angle of the latter allotment; thence westerly and southerly by the boundaries of allotment 77F to the north-eastern angle of allotment 77G; thence westerly and south-westerly by the boundaries of allotment 77G to the south-western angle thereof; thence westerly by a line the prolongation of the southern boundary of allotment 77G to the eastern boundary of allotment 1; thence northerly by that boundary and a line in continuation thereof to the Yarra River; thence generally easterly by that river to a point in line with the western boundary of Crown allotment 16, Parish of Yuonga; thence northerly by the boundary of allotment 16 to the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works aqueduct; thence easterly and north-easterly by the

aqueduct to the road forming the western boundary of allotment 23; thence southerly by that road and a line in continuation thereof to the Yarra River; thence south-westerly by that river to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of allotment 17B, Parish of Warburton; thence south-easterly by a line, the north-eastern boundary of allotment 17B and a line to the north-western angle of allotment 17D; thence southerly by the boundaries of allotment 17D and allotment 18A to the point of commencement.

LOCAL AUTHORITIES SUPERANNUATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers aforesaid the Estate Agents Committee hereby makes the following Rules (that is to say):—

1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Estate Agents (Commission Amendment No. 3) Rules 1975 and shall come into operation on the 3rd day of July, 1975.

(2) In these Rules the \* Rules of the Estate Agents Committee 1964 are called the Principal Rules.

2. Paragraph (f) of Item No. 1 in the First Schedule to the Principal Rules is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) in sub-paragraph (iii) for the expression "\$10,000" there shall be substituted the expression "\$14,000"; and

(b) for sub-paragraph (iv) there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:

"(iv) Where the purchase price exceeds \$14,000—  
the sum of \$1,000 plus 3½ per cent of such part of the purchase price as is in excess of \$14,000".

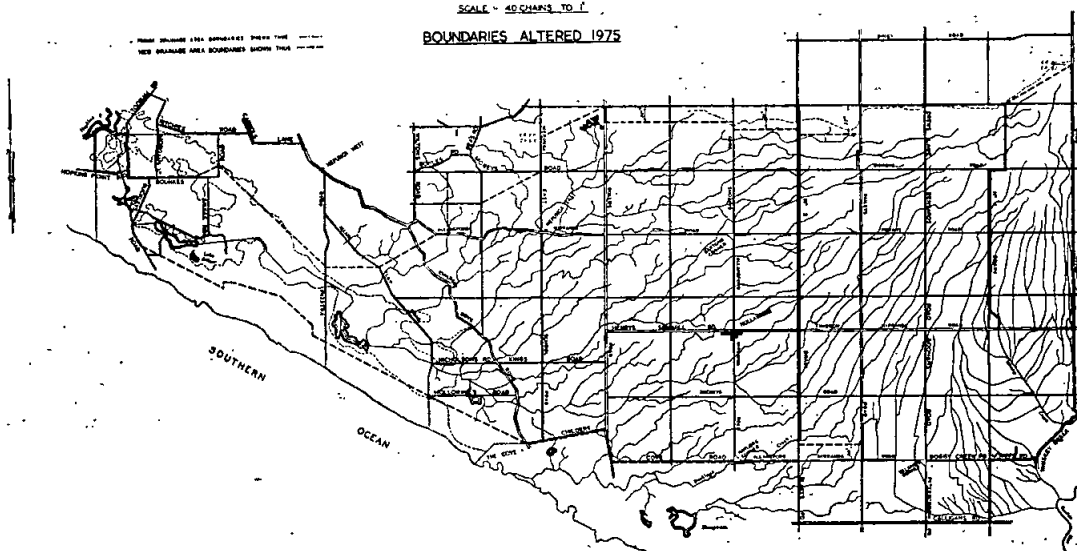

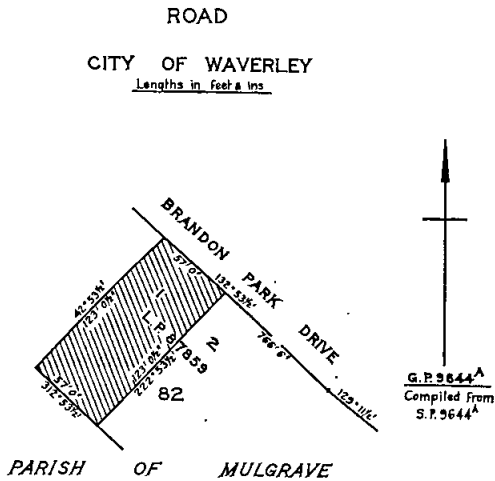

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE HUMFFRAY STREET RECREATION RESERVE, TOWNSHIP OF BALLARAT EAST.

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Minister of Lands to make Regulations for or with respect to the care protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Acting Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the said section do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Township of Ballarat East temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated the 8th October, 1974, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall—

- (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance or create or allow to be created any noise or loud excessive sound which, in the opinion of the Committee or its appointed officers, a Bailiff of Crown Lands or a member of the Police Force is an annoyance to members of the public or adjoining residents.
- (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of liquor or drugs.
- (c) Use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve.
- (d) Offer any article of food, drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.
- (e) Obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed on the Reserve.

- (f) Climb, jump on, or get over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats or other structures in the Reserve.
- (g) Interfere with, break, or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants or pluck flowers or destroy or cut grasses in the Reserve or damage or disturb the surface of the Reserve or remove any soil or like material except with consent of the Committee first obtained. Nothing in this clause shall apply to workmen employed by the Committee in works for maintenance or development of the Reserve.
- (h) Leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatsoever therein or roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind in the Reserve or leave anything that might injure a person. Nothing in this sub-clause shall restrict the Committee granting approval for any specific portion of the Reserve or any building thereon being used for an authorised, properly supervised and conducted waste drive.
- (i) Light fires in the Reserve, except as authorised by the Committee and at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee.
- (j) Carry or discharge any firearms or air gun in the Reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any game or birds thereon.
- (k) Bet publicly in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.
- (l) Spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure in the Reserve.
- (m) Erect any building, tent or structure or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission in writing of the Committee first obtained and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee. Nothing in this sub-clause shall be deemed to prevent the Committee giving authority for an approved society or club to erect a building, structure or conveniences for the use of its members or others attending for a like purpose, provided that such building or structure is used for purposes generally associated with public recreation. Such usage shall be permitted at all reasonable hours as approved by the Committee outside those stated in Regulation (1).
- (n) Bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- (o) Do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

3. For the purpose of good order any person authorised by the Committee may refuse admission to any other person to the Reserve.

4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee to leave the same.

5. No club or association or person shall hold or take any part in any game of any description, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. The provisions of this clause shall not limit or restrict any society or club referred to in Regulation 2 (m) from using the Reserve or buildings for purposes associated with its activities for which no charge is made.

6. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without paying the fees chargeable for admission.

7. No person shall drive or ride any motor car, motor cycle, mini-bike or bicycle on the Reserve except for a purpose for which prior approval by the Committee has been given. No person shall park a motor car or vehicle within the Reserve except at such places (if any) as are designated or set apart for the purpose by the Committee.

8. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep or other animals without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee or authorised body under Regulation 2 (m) and any person having done so shall leave the same on having been requested to do so by any member of the Committee, a Police Constable or Crown Lands Bailiff.

10. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding 8 kilometres an hour in a direction indicated by persons appointed by the Committee to control vehicular traffic in the Reserve.

11. The Committee shall have the right to charge or authorise any person, club or association to charge a fee for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football, or other matches, sports, shows, musical performances, fêtes, outdoor and holiday amusements on any of which occasions a fee which may be determined by the Committee from time to time may be charged and taken for admission.

12. Persons renting or hiring any of the facilities in the Reserve may be required by the Committee to deposit a sum not exceeding One hundred dollars (\$100) with the Committee by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such property hired and the Committee may, at its absolute discretion, retain all or part of the said sum to compensate it for any damage caused to property by the hirer, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any Order given by the Committee.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which this section relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Two hundred dollars.

#### *Land Act 1958.*

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF LAND RESERVED FOR A PUBLIC PARK, PARISH OF SANDHURST.

Whereas by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958* power is given to the Minister of Lands to make Regulations for or with respect to the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the *Land Acts* for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Her Majesty's Acting Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the said section do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the land in the Parish of Sandhurst temporarily reserved as a site for a Public Park by Order in Council dated the 30th July, 1974, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Fifty cents may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;

(b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;

(c) bring any intoxicating liquor on the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;

(d) exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve or any part thereof without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments, shows or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. No club, association or person shall hold entertainments, performances or sports without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained. Such consent may be granted subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. The Committee may authorize any club, association or person to make a charge for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserves the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Twenty cents for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding \$200 which the committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of any stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve except in fireplaces provided for that purpose.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey or any other games or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.



18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs.3296.)

##### AMENDMENT No. 324 (PROF. C.S. & A.4).

**T**HE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby amends the Teaching Service—Professional (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulation as follows:—

After clause 5 insert the following clause:—

"5A. *Salary Loading Allowance.*

- (a) A professional officer, in respect of recreation leave taken after the 1st January, 1976, shall be entitled to an allowance at the rate of 17½ per cent. of his salary for the period of recreation leave taken, not exceeding \$200 in respect of leave for any calendar year.

- (b) Salary for the purpose of calculating this allowance shall be deemed to be the subdivisional salary of the professional officer as at the 1st January of the year in which the recreation leave is taken or, where he commences employment after the 1st January in that year, the 1st January equivalent of the subdivisional salary payable to him at the date of the commencement of his employment.
- (c) A professional officer who has transferred from a position as a classified or temporary teacher shall be paid at the time of transfer a pro-rata allowance in the terms of clause 10A of the appropriate Teaching Service—Primary, Secondary, or Technical Schools Division (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulation in respect of all current service as a classified or temporary teacher of .5 time fraction or greater and based on his final teaching salary rate. The provisions of clause 4, Regulation 23, Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations, shall determine the amount of leave which will attract the allowance for the remainder of the current calendar year."

TEACHING SERVICE—SECONDARY SCHOOLS DIVISION  
(CLASSIFICATION, SALARIES, AND ALLOWANCES)  
REGULATION.

AMENDMENT No. 326 (SEC. C.S. & A.6).

**T**HE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby amends the Teaching Service—Secondary Schools Division (Classification, Salaries, and Allowances) Regulation as follows:—

After clause 10 insert the following clause:—

“ 10A. *Salary Loading Allowance.*

- (a) A member other than a student in training who is employed on the final day of the last complete pay period in June of any year and who has at that date completed one year of full-time service for which salary has been received shall be entitled to receive an annual salary loading allowance equivalent to 17½ per cent. of four weeks of the normal fortnightly total emolument to which he is entitled at that date or \$200, whichever is the lesser.

Provided that no payment shall be made in respect of service prior to resignation.

Provided further that pro-rata payment in respect of service at .5 time fraction or greater shall be made in the case of—

- (i) members who die or members who retire on account of age or ill health—at their final salary rates,

or

- (ii) members who have completed a minimum of ninety days service within the preceding twelve months at the date of the entitlement.

For the purpose of payment under paragraph (ii) the allowance shall accrue at the rate of one quarter of the entitlement for each completed ninety days of service and in the case of part-time service the rate of payment shall be determined by the time fraction for which service within the preceding twelve months was the longest in the aggregate.

- (b) For the purposes of this clause, a temporary member shall be deemed to retire—

- (i) on account of age—if on or after attaining the age of 60 years he ceases to be employed;
- (ii) on account of ill health—if he produces to the Tribunal satisfactory evidence that his ceasing to be employed is due to ill health which is likely to be permanent.”

### CITY OF GEELONG.

#### By-Law No. 163.

A By-Law of the CITY OF GEELONG made under Section 798b of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 163 with respect to the control and management of the Civic Centre Car Park and for fixing and collecting charges for the use thereof and for other purposes.

WHEREAS the Council of the said City has caused to be constructed a multi-storey car parking centre on land on the north-east corner of Gheringhap Street and Little Malop Street Geelong to be known as the Civic Centre Car Park.

NOW in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 798b of the *Local Government Act 1958* and of every other act and power enabling it in that behalf the MAYOR, COUNCILLORS AND CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF GEELONG doth order as follows:

1. By-Law No. 162 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. In this By-Law unless the context otherwise requires—

“Car” means a car within the meaning of Section 3 of the *Motor Car Act 1958* or any statutory re-enactment thereof;

“Car parking area” means any parking area provided by the Council within the complex known as the Civic Centre Car Park;

“Car Park” means the Civic Centre Car Park;

“Clause” means clause of this By-Law;

“Council” means Council of the City of Geelong;

“Officer” means any traffic officer of the Council or any other person appointed by the Council to perform duties within the Car Park;

“Park” means to leave a car standing (whether unattended or not) and any derivative of the verb “to park” has a corresponding meaning;

“Parking space” means an area approximately rectangular in shape and of size large enough to permit the parking of a car entirely within its confines marked or indicated on a car parking area by means of painted broken or unbroken lines or concrete strips or other marks or devices;

“Person” includes a corporation;

“Prescribed” in relation to any day, hour, period or fee within the meaning of clause 3 means prescribed by this By-Law or fixed by resolution of the Council in accordance with the provisions of Section 555A of the *Local Government Act 1958*;

“Ticket” means a ticket emitted by a ticket dispensing machine installed in the Car Park.

“Ticket dispensing machine” means a mechanical appliance or device installed in the car park for automatically emitting tickets when actuated by the approach of a car;

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine and the singular number includes the plural and the plural the singular.

3. The days and hours during which and the periods for which cars may be parked in the car park and the fee to be paid in respect of cars so parked shall be the days, hours, periods and fees fixed by the Council from time to time in accordance with the provisions of Section 555A of the *Local Government Act 1958*.

4. Every person in the car park shall at all times obey any signal by hand or any reasonable direction or instruction given by an officer.

5. (i) Any person parking a car in any car parking area on which parking spaces are not marked or indicated shall park the car as directed by any officer for the time being on duty at the car parking area and if no such officer be present shall park the car in such a position as not to prevent the ingress or egress of any car to or from the car park.

(ii) Any person parking a car in the car park or any on which parking spaces are marked or indicated shall park the car entirely within the confines of a single parking space and if so directed by any officer for the time being on duty at the car park shall park the car in a particular parking space.

6. (i) Any person parking a car in the car park or any portion thereof in which no ticket dispensing machine is operating shall pay the prescribed fee to any officer for the time being collecting fees in respect of the car park.

(ii) Any person parking a car in the car park or any portion thereof in which ticket dispensing machines are installed and operating shall pay the prescribed fee in accordance with instructions set out on the ticket dispensing machine or on a notice or a sign displayed or erected near the machine.

(iii) No person shall in any portion of any car parking area endeavour to park any car in any parking space in which any other car is already parked.

7. (i) No person shall in any portion of any car parking area set aside and reserved for the parking of cars of any particular class or kind (as indicated by signs displayed or erected in the car parking area) park or endeavour to park any car other than a car of that particular class or kind.

(ii) No person shall in any portion of any car parking area set aside and reserved for the parking of cars of any particular class of persons (as indicated by signs displayed or erected in the car parking area) park or endeavour to park any car unless he is a person of that particular class of persons.

8. No person driving any car shall enter the car park except through a proper entrance or leave the car park except through a proper exit or proceed in the car park contrary to any direction of travel indicated by signs or notices displayed or erected therein or by arrows painted or marked on the surface thereof.

9. No person unless authorised in writing by the Council shall remove from the car park any property of the Council of the City of Geelong.

10. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the car park not set aside or available for public use.

11. No person shall enter or remain in the car park except during the days and hours and the periods for which cars may be parked as fixed by the Council from time to time in accordance with the provisions of Section 555A of the *Local Government Act 1958* or any statutory re-enactment thereof.

12. No person shall in the car park—

(a) open any ticket dispensing machine unless he be an officer of the Council appointed so to do.

(b) drive any car at a speed exceeding ten kilometres an hour.

(c) dismantle, paint or wash any car or (except when necessary to enable a car to be removed therefrom) repair any car.

(d) affix anything to, damage, destroy, disfigure, draw upon, interfere or tamper with, write upon or in any manner deface any building, fitting or fixture whether the property of the Council or not or any car.

(e) post or place any advertisement, bill, poster or any other sign, nor give out or distribute any hand bill, placard, notice, advertisement, book, pamphlet or paper without the consent in writing of the Council.

(f) obstruct, hinder or resist any officer in the discharge of his duty.

(g) do anything contrary to any direction or instruction on any notice or sign displayed or erected in the car park.

(h) annoy, disturb, interrupt or obstruct any other person in the proper use of the car park.

(i) hawk, sell or offer or expose for sale any article of any kind except with the consent in writing of the Council.

(j) solicit or collect gifts of money or subscriptions for any purpose without the consent in writing of the Council.

(k) deposit, leave or cast down any rubbish or litter except in such places as may from time to time be set aside by the Council for that purpose.

(l) make any noise, sing, shout or play any instrument or other sound producing device so as to be likely to cause annoyance to or interfere with the enjoyment and use of the car park by any other person.

(m) assemble with any other person or persons in such a manner as to create a nuisance.

(n) do any other thing calculated to or likely to interfere with the effective operation of the car park.

13. Any person who (whether wilfully or not)—

(a) parks any car in the car park on any day and during the prescribed hours contrary to any of the provisions of this By-Law or

(b) does not do anything directed to be done or does anything forbidden to be done by or under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law and liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of \$100.00.

Resolution for passing this By-Law agreed to by the Council on the 29th day of July, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-five and confirmed on the twenty-sixth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and seventy-five.

#### CITY OF GEELONG.

##### By-Law No. 164.

A By-Law to regulate by means of Standing Orders the proceedings of the Council of the City of Geelong.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred by an Act to incorporate the inhabitants of the Town of Geelong and to extend and apply thereto the laws now in force for the regulation of the Corporation of Melbourne, passed in the 13th year of the reign of Queen Victoria and numbered 40 as amended from time to time and every other power enabling it in that behalf THE MAYOR, COUNCILLORS AND CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF GEELONG ORDER as follows—

(1) By-Law No. 136 as amended by By-Laws numbered 139, 152 and 158 is hereby repealed.

(2) The proceedings and business of the Council of the City of Geelong shall be regulated and conducted according to the following regulations which shall be, and shall be called, the Standing Orders of the Council.

#### STANDING ORDERS.

##### CHAPTER I.

##### Order of Proceedings.

*Council to sit with open doors.*

1. The business of the Council shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors; but any one member present may require the exclusion of persons not being members of the Council until it shall have been decided by the Council whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

*Resolution into Committee.*

2. The Council may resolve into a committee for the consideration of any question upon a motion being carried by a majority of the members present of which no previous notice shall be necessary notwithstanding that a motion or amendment may then be before the Chair and shall, upon conclusion of consideration of the question in committee, resume proceedings in Council. The Town Clerk shall record all matters dealt with in committee, in a book provided for that purpose. When the Council has resolved itself into a committee under this Standing Order, a meeting of that committee shall be held behind closed doors and strangers to the committee may be excluded therefrom.

*Count Out.*

3. The Council shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there is sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of twenty minutes from the time specified in the summons there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting. If during a meeting any member shall call the attention of the Mayor or other presiding Chairman to the number of members present then the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall direct the Town Clerk to ring the bell for one minute, at the expiration of which the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall count the number of members present and if a quorum is not present he shall dissolve the meeting. Such dissolution is hereinafter referred to as a "count out". The business under discussion and any business not disposed of at the time of the count out shall at the next following meeting be resumed as from the stage at which it was when the count out took place.

*Quorum.*

4. At all meetings of the Council when there is not one third of the members present, or when the Council is counted out, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute-Book.

*Minutes.*

5. The Minutes of any previous meeting shall be brought forward for confirmation as the first business at any meeting of the Council. Such minutes shall be read unless a

complete copy thereof has been made available to each member not later than three clear days prior to the meeting at which such Minutes are to be brought forward, in which case such Minutes on the motion of a member may be taken as read. A copy of any such Minutes shall be deemed to have been so made available if (a) posted to or left at the last known usual place of abode or principal place of business of a member, or (b) handed personally to such member. In the confirmation of such Minutes no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of their proceedings.

*Precedence of Business.*

6. At all meetings of the Council (unless otherwise provided for by law) the submission of returns, the reading of correspondence, the presentation of petitions by members of the Council shall have precedence over the Orders of the Day and motions of which due notice has been given.

*Correspondence.*

7. On the reading of correspondence pursuant to Standing Order No. 6 no discussion shall be allowed except in the case of an application by a member for leave of absence whereupon the Council may determine the application, and the only motions that shall otherwise be in order shall be that the correspondence or any part or parts thereof be received, or be received and referred to a committee for consideration and report, or if the subject matter thereof is dealt with in any Order of the Day, be referred for consideration in connection therewith.

*Petitions—presentation of.*

8. Petitions to the Council shall be presented only through a member of the Council. Any member presenting a petition shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Council, or violate any of the Standing Orders of the Council, and shall sign his name thereon as having presented it.

*Petitions—how dealt with.*

9. On the presentation of a petition the member of the Council presenting the same shall confine himself to the reading of the prayer therein only and the only motions that shall be in order shall be that such petition be received and if necessary that it be referred to a committee or if the subject matter thereof is dealt with in any Order of the Day, be referred for consideration in connection therewith.

*Orders of the Day.*

10. The Orders of the Day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the Council, reports of committees, and any business which the Mayor may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the Council may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a Notice of Motion, of which he has given at least five clear days notice in writing to the Town Clerk prior to the meeting at which it is to be considered. All such Notices of Motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

*Notice of Motion.*

11. No motion entered on the Notice Paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such Notice, or someone authorised by him in writing, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

*By-Laws.*

12. Any proposal for a By-Law must be referred to the Public Works Committee for report thereon in the first instance and the Council, after considering the report of the Public Works Committee may order the preparation of a By-Law in proper form to give effect to the decision of the Council provided that if it thinks fit the Public Works Committee may submit a draft of the By-Law with its report thereon.

*Chairmen of Sub Committees.*

13. The mover of any motion that a matter be referred to a committee not being a principal committee of the Council or any other committee appointed pursuant to Standing Order No. 40, shall be a member and chairman of such first-mentioned Committee.

#### CHAPTER II.

##### Order of Debate.

*Closure of Debate.*

14. Any member of the Council who has not spoken on the question under consideration may move "That the question be now put" and such motion on being seconded

shall be put at once, and if a majority of the members present vote in favour thereof, the question under consideration shall be put without further discussion.

*Use of Titles.*

15. The members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor as the case may be.

*Pre Audience.*

16. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Mayor or other presiding Chairman, shall decide who is entitled to pre audience.

*Point of Order.*

17. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the Mayor or other presiding Chairman; and no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down; in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker; and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed, or any other subject entered upon.

*Motions—form of.*

18. Any member proposing a motion or amendment shall put it in form and if required by the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall write, sign and deliver it to the Town Clerk, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder; and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council and of the seconder of that motion or amendment.

*Motions—how moved.*

19. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such motion or amendment before addressing the Council in support thereof, and no motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed other than by the mover thereof, unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require enforcement of any Standing Order of Council by simply noticing that such order is not observed.

*Mover and Secunder deemed to have spoken.*

20. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

*Speaking Twice to Motion.*

21. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed, and the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment after the reply, and the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

*Precedence of amendment Carried.*

22. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the Council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

*Foreshadowed Motion.*

23. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Standing Orders it shall be competent for any member not being the mover or seconder of any motion or amendment before the Chair to foreshadow his intention to move a further amendment prior to an amendment being put.

*Limitation on Members in respect of Motions.*

24. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon but not more.

*The Vote.*

25. The Mayor, or other presiding Chairman, shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from a show of hands, on the result of the vote.

*Divisions.*

26. Any member may call for a division upon any question in which case all members then present shall vote except any member precluded by law from voting, and

those voting in the affirmative shall first stand up and afterwards those in the negative, until their votes are recorded; provided that in cases of appointment of committees or to other offices at the disposal of the Council if the Council by resolution (which may be framed and put without notice at the meeting at which such appointment is to be made) so decides, the appointment shall be by ballot.

*Casting Votes.*

27. Except as herein after provided, in all cases of equality of votes on any motion or amendment before the Chair the Mayor or other presiding Chairman, shall have a second or casting vote, provided that in the event of equality of votes on the election of Mayor, the matter shall be resolved by lot.

*Motion of Adjournment.*

28. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council but if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the Notice Paper shall be discussed or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next or adjourned meeting of the Council.

*Mayor or Chairman to rise when addressing Council.*

29. The Mayor, or other presiding Chairman, shall stand up when addressing the Council in discussion of any question.

*Ruling by Mayor.*

30. The Mayor, or other presiding Chairman, when deciding upon a point of order or practice shall state his reasons for so ruling and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final unless such decision is challenged by a member and a majority of all members of the Council (or Committee as the case may be) disagree with such ruling in which event the decision of the majority aforesaid shall prevail and the Mayor or other presiding Chairman's ruling shall be set aside.

*Personal Reflections.*

31. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

*Offensive Remarks.*

32. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member shall, if required by the Council, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the Council, under a penalty in case he refuse or neglect to do so before the rising of the Council of not less than two nor more than twenty dollars.

*Record of Words Spoken.*

33. Any member may require the Town Clerk to record any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

*Production of Documents.*

34. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the Corporation relating to the question or matter in discussion.

*Protests.*

35. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the Council, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the Council; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the member or members protesting and specifying the reasons for protesting must be entered before the next regular meeting of the Council by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Town Clerk's Office, and duly referred to in the Minutes of the Council, and which shall be considered a part of such Minutes.

*Rescission of Motions passed.*

36. No motion the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council or would be to bring forward again any motion which has already been rejected by the Council, shall be entertained during the same Municipal Financial Year within which such previous motion has been passed or rejected as the case may be, unless a Call of the Whole Council has been duly made for that purpose and no such motion which shall have been negatived by the Council shall be again entertained during the same Municipal Financial Year.

*Suspension of Standing Orders other than part of Standing Order No. 36.*

37. Any one or more of the Standing Orders of the Council except Numbers 13, 16, 17, 31, 32, 33, 37, 38, 49, 50 and that part of Standing Order No. 36 commencing "and no such motion," to the end thereof may be suspended without prior notice having been given, on the vote of a majority of the whole number of members of the Council or two-thirds of the members present whichever is the greater.

*Suspension of Part of Standing Order No. 36.*

38. That part of Standing Order No. 36 commencing "and no such motion" to the end thereof may be suspended only in the following manner:—

- (a) a request for the suspension aforesaid signed by at least eight members is received by the Town Clerk in the form of a Notice of Motion, in accordance with the procedure under Standing Order No. 10,
- (b) such motion sets out the intent of the proposal as affecting the decision of Council proposed to be rescinded, amended or varied.
- (c) all members are given three clear days notice of the motion under (a) above.
- (d) the motion aforesaid shall only be adopted on the vote:—
  - (i) by a majority of the whole number of the members if the number of members present at the subsequent meeting is not greater than the number present when the resolution proposed to be rescinded, amended or varied was agreed to, or
  - (ii) by a majority if the number of members present at such subsequent meeting is greater than the number present at such former meeting.

*Stay on Implementing Decisions previously taken.*

39. Any motion put forward under Standing Orders Nos. 36, 37, 38 and 50 shall have the effect of a stay on implementing the related decision of Council until such motion is disposed of under these Standing Orders unless such original decision has already been acted upon whereupon no further motions in relation thereto shall be entertained in the same Municipal Financial Year or as otherwise provided for by law.

CHAPTER 111.  
*Committees.**Appointment of Committees.*

40. At the meeting of Council next after the election of the Mayor each year, the Council shall appoint committees of the Council for the ensuing year and shall designate which of those committees shall be principal committees and shall determine the number of Councillors of which each committee shall consist and the purpose of each principal committee, provided that there shall always be appointed a Public Works Committee consisting of all members of the Council, and a Finance Committee.

*Quorum of Committees.*

41. The quorum of each principal committee shall be half the membership thereof.

*Mayor to be Member of all Principal Committees.*

42. The Mayor shall be a member of each principal committee and be in addition to the number of the members determined pursuant to Standing Order No. 40.

*Limit of Committee Membership.*

43. No member of the Council shall be elected a member of more than three principal committees in addition to the Public Works Committee other than as provided for under Standing Order No. 42.

*Attendance at Committee Meetings.*

44. Any member of a principal committee with the exception of the Mayor, who fails to attend three consecutive meetings of such without leave of absence being sought shall cease to be a member of such committee.

*Chairmen of Committees.*

45. Each committee shall elect a chairman, and in the case of equality of votes in such election the matter shall be resolved by lot.

A committee chairman shall have a second or casting vote in all matters of equality of votes before the chair. No member shall be elected chairman of more than one principal committee.

*First Meeting of Committees.*

46. The Town Clerk shall convene every committee within twenty one days of its first appointment, and at any time by order of the Council, or the written order of the chairman or of any two members of such committee.

*Application of Standing Orders to Committees.*

47. The Standing Orders of the Council shall be observed in committees of the whole council, except the rule limiting the number of times of speaking and the rules relating to the rescission, amendment or variation of previous decisions.

*Finance Committee to Expend Monies.*

48. The Finance Committee shall be at liberty without the express authority of the Council to authorise disbursements for current and urgent expenses to an amount not exceeding 500 dollars in any one week on the certificate of the chairman of the committee concerned and report the same to the Council at its next sitting.

CHAPTER IV.  
*Miscellaneous.**Surety.*

49. No member of the Council and no officer of the Corporation shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council; and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the party giving the same.

*Call of the Whole Council.*

50. For the consideration of any By-Law or for the raising or appropriating of money, or for the objects contemplated in Standing Order No. 36, it shall be competent for any member, by notice of motion duly given, to move for a Call of the Whole Council for the consideration of any such subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried due notice thereof shall be given in the Notice Paper for the day when the order of the day or notice of motion for which such Call was made is set down for consideration, and any member, not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or amendment thereof, whether of adjournment or otherwise, shall be liable to a penalty of two dollars unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the Council.

*Corporation Seal.*

51. The Town Clerk shall have the charge of the Common Seal of the Corporation and shall be responsible for its safe custody and proper use. 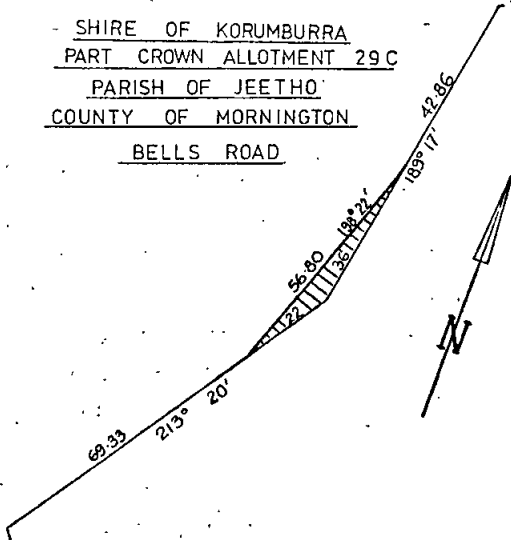

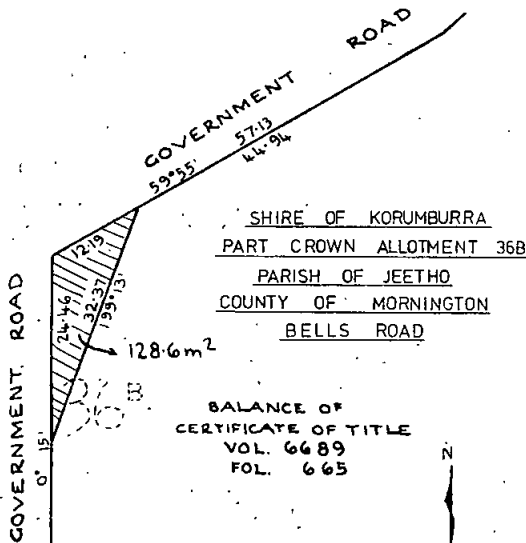
