MOTOR CAR TRIALS OF SPEED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section eighty-three of the Motor Car Act 1958 that, if a motor car is used on a highway for purposes of racing or of trial of speed, the driver or the person in charge thereof shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that the said sub-section (2) shall not apply to a motor car used as aforesaid on any highway or portion thereof specified by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette and on such days and during such hours as are specified in the Order:

And whereas the Warrnambool Motor Sports Club has requested that such an Order be made to enable motor car trials of speed to be conducted by the said Club on Simms Road, Winslow, on Sunday, 12th October, 1975:

Road, Winslow, on Sunday, 12th October, 1975:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Car Act 1958, doth by this Order specify Simms Road, Winslow within the Shire of Warrnambool, as a highway in respect of which any motor car may, without being subject to the application of the said subsection (2) of section eighty-three of the Motor Car Act, be used for purposes of trials of speed under the control of the said Warrnambool Motor Sports Club on Sunday, 12th October, 1975, between the hours of twelve noon and five o'clock in the afternoon on the said day, provided that the Officer-in-Charge of Police in attendance is satisfied that the highway is in a satisfactory condition for racing purposes and that adequate arrangements have been made for the safety of the public.

And the Honorable John Frederick Rossiter, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
