MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.  
DECLARING AN AREA TO BE A PASTEURIZED MILK DISTRICT.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 4 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare any area specified in such proclamation to be a pasteurized milk district on and after a date specified in the proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my proclamation hereby declare the Municipal district of the City of Mildura to be a pasteurized milk district on and after the first day of March, 1976.

Cyclofenil.

## PROCLAMATION

## PRESCRIBING STANDARDS FOR PESTICIDES AND DECLARING A SUBSTANCE TO BE AN INSECTICIDE.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.,

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Pesticides Act 1958*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof do by this my proclamation:—

1. Revoke the Proclamation made pursuant to the said Act on the 3rd March, 1970, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 11th March, 1970, as amended by Proclamations made on the 22nd April, 1970, the 14th August, 1973, the 25th June, 1974, and the 6th August, 1974, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 29th April, 1970, the 15th August, 1973, the 26th June, 1974, and the 7th August, 1974, respectively.
2. Prescribe as standards for specified pesticides, the standard constituted by the requirements set out in Column 3 of the Schedule hereto opposite the respective type of pesticide set out in Column 1 of the said Schedule.
3. Require that the specified constituent or constituents set out in column 3 of the Schedule hereto opposite the respective type of pesticide set out in column 1 of the said schedule and the proportion per centum of the constituent or constituents set out in column 3 shall be stated upon the sale of such pesticides.
4. Define the following terms used in this proclamation:
  - "fluoroacetate" means sodium fluoroacetate (1080), fluoroacetamide or any other derivative of mono-fluoroacetic acid.
  - "iodophor" means iodine or a compound or mixture which releases iodine in solution or when mixed with water.
5. Declare that any preparation of *Bacillus thuringiensis* shall be an insecticide.

The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the By-law following :—

1. The following General Rates are hereby made under the provisions of the Water Act, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands within the Carwarp-Yelta, East Loddon, Mallee, Normanville, Tyntynder North, West Loddon and Wimmera Waterworks Districts, except within any Urban District thereof for the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for watering cattle or other stock.

2. For the purpose of the said Rates, the lands within each of the said Waterworks Districts have been arranged in Divisions as shown by numbers in the column headed "D.S.R." in the Rating Registers for such Districts, sealed by the Commission on 8th September, 1975. 3. (a) On all lands in the First Division of the said Waterworks Districts—General Rates of such amount for each and every hectare of such lands as is contained in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks District shown in column 1 of the Schedule hereto.

Provided that Crown lands in the said First Division which are held under annual grazing licence and which are neither supplied with water nor part of a holding so supplied shall in lieu of a General Rate, be subject to a Special Rate of such amount for each and every hectare thereof as contained in column 5 of the said Schedule opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts shown in column 1 thereof.

(b) On all lands in the Second Division of the said Waterworks Districts—General Rates of such amounts for each and every hectare of such lands, as are contained in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts shown in column 1 of the said Schedule.

(c) On all lands in the Third Division of the said Waterworks Districts—General Rates of such amounts for each and every hectare of such lands, as are contained in column 4 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts shown in column 1 of the said Schedule.

Provided that the sum of Two Dollars shall be the minimum amount of rate in respect of any land liable to be rated in the said Districts.

4. Such Rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1975, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1976, and shall be payable on the 1st December, 1975, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule.

5. Interest at the rate of eight per cent. per annum will be chargeable on all Rates remaining unpaid after 15th April, 1976.

6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said Rates.

### CLASSES OF PIPELINES EXCLUDED FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE PIPELINES ACT 1967.

Whereas in paragraph (d) of the interpretation of "Pipeline" in section 3 of the *Pipelines Act 1967* it is stated that a pipeline or part thereof or a pipeline of a class of pipelines excluded from the provisions of the said Act by Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* shall not be a pipeline within the meaning of the said Act:

And whereas Orders were made on 13th August, 1968 and 20th August, 1968, excluding certain classes of pipelines:

And whereas it has now become necessary to amend such Orders:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, revoke the Orders made on 13th August, 1968 and 20th August, 1968, and do by this Order exclude the following classes of pipelines from the provisions of the *Pipelines Act 1967*:—

1. Pipelines conveying hydrocarbons in a gaseous state where—

- the pressure of the gas being conveyed through a pipeline is less than 210 kPa gauge;

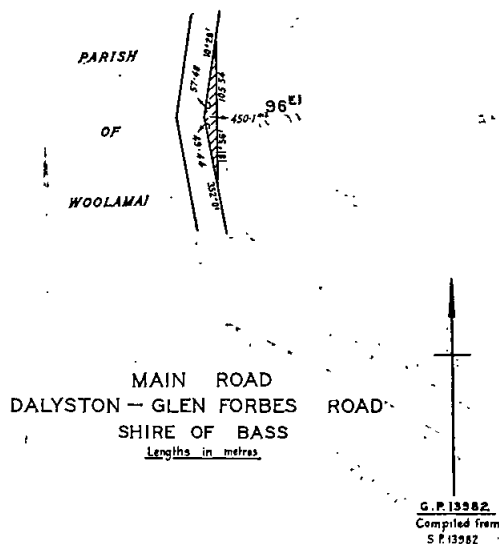

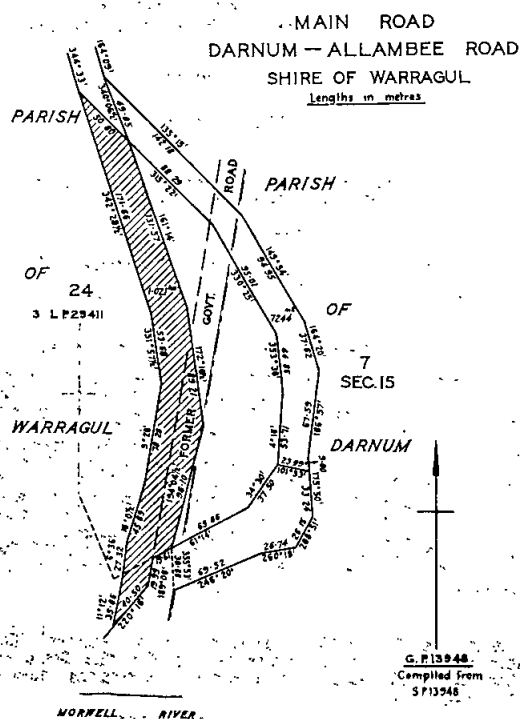

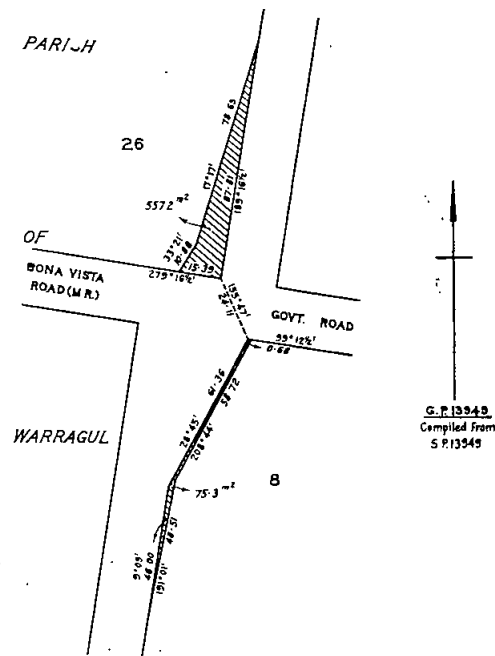

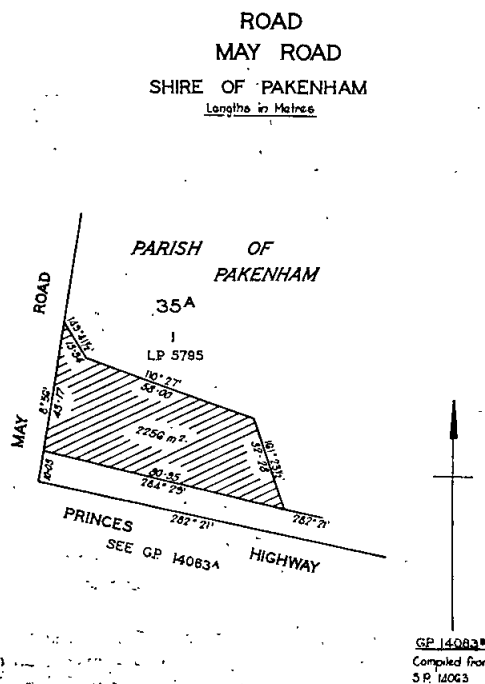


MAIN ROAD

## BY-LAW No. 50.

## Animal and Bird By-Law.

A By-Law of the City of Altona made under the provisions of Section 93 of the *Health Act 1958*, and Sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and all other powers thereunto enabling passed by a Special Order of the Council of the City of Altona sealed with the Common Seal of the City of Altona advertised in accordance with the provisions of the *Health Act 1958*, and the *Local Government Act 1958*, approved by the Governor in Council and numbered 50 for the purpose of:

- (a) Suppressing nuisances;
- (b) Regulating the keeping of animals, birds, reptiles and bees;
- (c) Limiting the number of animals, birds, and reptiles kept on any property;
- (d) The regulating or prohibiting of the keeping of any place or the storage of any things which in the opinion of the Council may be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous;
- (e) Fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any animal, bird or reptile or store any such thing;
- (f) The provision use and control of receptacles for the deposit and storage of food for consumption by animals or poultry;
- (g) Providing for the health of residents in the Municipal District against the spreading of contagious or infectious diseases;
- (h) Maintaining the good rule and government of the Municipality;

and for other purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Altona orders as follows:

## Short Title.

1. This By-law may be cited as the Animal and Bird By-law.

## Commencement and Area of Operation.

2. This By-law operates:

- (a) After notice of its making is published in the *Government Gazette*;
- (b) Throughout the Municipal District in areas declared to be populous or residential.
- (c) For the purposes of this By-law, all areas within the Municipality are hereby declared to be populous or residential areas.

3. By-laws Nos. 20, 22 and 41 are hereby repealed.

## PART I.—GENERAL.

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:

"Animal" means, and includes, cow, heifer, bull, bullock, horse, camel, goat, swine, ferret, pig and sheep and the young thereof.

"Approved materials" means materials approved by the Health Inspector of the Municipality.

"Area" applied to a poultry house means the superficial area of the horizontal section thereof made at a point of greatest surface inclusive of the external walls and of such portions of any party wall as belong to the building.

"Dog" means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of six months.

"Dwelling" means any Building or portion of a building which is used or intended, adopted or designed to be used for the purpose of a residence by a single family or an occupier having a right to the exclusive use thereof and which contains bathing or sanitary facilities within its bounds, but not include a building of Class III Occupancy or a portion of such a building.

"Frontage" means a boundary line between a site and the street upon which site abuts and in the case of—

- (i) a site other than a corner site which abuts on two streets such boundary line as determined by the Surveyor; or

- (ii) a corner site either boundary line which when chosen would enable the site to comply with the provisions of the Uniform Building Regulations.

"Horse" means and includes any stallion, mare, gelding, pony, colt or foal, ass, donkey or mule or any animal used for burden or draught or for carrying persons.

"Litter" includes wood shaving, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.

"Poultry" means and includes any fowl chicken, turkey, goose, gander, duck, duckling, pigeon, squab, any caged bird or the young thereof.

2. Any premises where poultry or animals are kept for trade, such premises being registered with Council under the *Health Act 1958*, are exempt from the provisions of this By-law.

3. A person shall not permit any animal or poultry kept by him to create or cause such an amount or volume of noise as to be a nuisance to any person residing in the neighbourhood.

## PART II.—ANIMALS.

1. Except with written permission by the Council no person shall keep or permit to be kept, any horse on any property within the municipal district—

- (a) within a distance of 12 metres from the nearest point of any dwelling, whether erected on such property or on any other property; and
- (b) having an area less than 4,000 square metres.

2. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept any other animal on any premises without the previous written consent of Council.

3. Any consent granted under this part may be for any period of time and be given subject to such conditions if any as the Council in the particular case considers advisable, such conditions shall be included in the consent and the consent may be withdrawn if the conditions are not complied with.

## PART III.—DOGS.

1. A person shall not keep or permit or suffer to be kept more than two (2) dogs as defined in PART I hereof on any premises without being the holder of a permit in writing from the Council.

2. Any person desiring the consent of the Council pursuant to Clause 1 of this Part shall deliver to the Town Clerk a written request for such consent and every request shall set out a full description of the premises concerned showing in particular the provisions made for drainage and sanitation and shall also set out the number and description of the dogs intended to be kept thereon and such consent shall not be given unless the Council is satisfied that the keeping of the dogs as described in the request on the premises therein referred to will not constitute a nuisance or be dangerous or offensive or injurious to the health of any person.

3. Any consent given by the Council pursuant to the previous Clause may be given subject to such conditions if any as the Council in the particular case considers advisable, such conditions shall be stated in the consent and if they are not complied with the Council may withdraw the consent.

## PART IV.—POULTRY.

1. Subject to Clause 6 of this part a person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises more than twenty (20) head of poultry without the written consent of Council.

2. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises any poultry in a battery laying cage or battery laying cage system without the written consent of Council.

3. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises any poultry except in a poultry house constructed in accordance with this By-law provided that a poultry house may have attached thereto for the use of the poultry a poultry run.

4. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept in any poultry house a number of poultry greater than the number produced by multiplying the area in square metres of such poultry house by 3.5.

5. A person shall not on any premises, keep or cause or permit to be kept any poultry within a distance of:—

- (a) 22 metres from any street or road to which such land has a frontage;
- (b) 3 metres from any other street or road;

(c) 1.5 metres from the boundary of any adjoining land;

(d) 12 metres from any dwelling.

6. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept at any one premises more than two (2) turkeys ducks or geese without the written consent of Council.

7. Every poultry house situated in a populous or residential zone shall:—

(a) Be roofed with galvanised iron or other approved impervious material and such roof shall be provided with guttering and spouting leading to adequate storm water drains;

(b) Have all external walls constructed of approved rat proof material;

(c) Be rendered rat proof by placing galvanised iron, jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundation to a depth of at least fifty centimetres below ground level;

(d) Be paved with approved impervious material the surface level of which shall be at all points at least ten centimetres above the level of the ground;

(e) Be constructed so as to be capable of holding litter to a depth of at least twenty centimetres.

8. Any person desiring the consent of the Council pursuant to any of the preceding Clauses of this Part shall deliver to the Town Clerk a written request for such consent and every request shall set out a full description of the premises concerned showing in particular provisions made for drainage and sanitation and shall also set out the number and description of poultry intended to be kept thereon and such consent will not be given unless the Council is satisfied that the keeping of the poultry as described in the request on the premises therein referred to will not constitute a nuisance or be dangerous or offensive or injurious to the health of any person.

9. Any consent given by the Council pursuant to the previous Clause may be given to such conditions if any as the Council in the particular case considers advisable; such conditions shall be stated in the consent and if they are not complied with the Council may withdraw the consent.

#### PART V.—VENIMOUS REPTILES AND BEES.

1. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises any venomous reptile without the written consent of Council.

2. A person shall not keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises any bees without the written consent of Council.

#### PART VI.—CLEANLINESS.

1. The ground surrounding any poultry house shall be well drained.

2. The occupier of any land shall cause any poultry house and poultry run thereon, to be thoroughly cleansed from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same at all times in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition.

3. A person shall not keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any land where animals or poultry are kept any food for consumption by such animals or poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat proof receptacles or rat proof buildings.

4. The occupier of any land on which any animal or poultry is kept shall cause any animal or poultry kept thereon which suffers from any infectious disease communicable to man to be forthwith destroyed and disposed of to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector of the Municipality.

5. The occupier of any land on which any poultry house is erected shall keep the area of land within 1.5 metres of such poultry house free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse, rubbish or other materials capable of harbouring rats or vermin.

6. The owner or occupier shall ensure that all poultry droppings, litter and refuse are disposed of in such a manner so as to not create offensive conditions or permit the breeding of flies at any stage of the life cycle.

7. The Health Inspector of the Municipality may by written notice delivered or posted to the owner or occupier of any premises direct that the provisions of this By-law be complied with.

#### PART VII.—PENALTIES.

Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than

One Hundred Dollars and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Ten Dollars per day for each day on which the offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Altona on the 20th May, 1975, and confirmed on the 24th June, 1975.

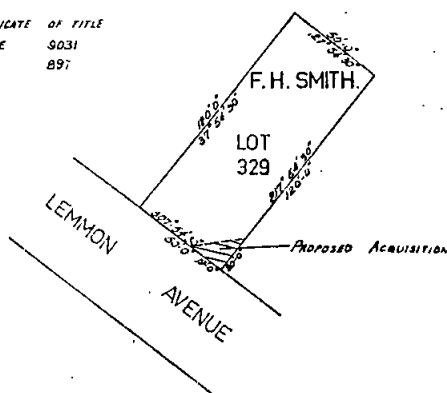

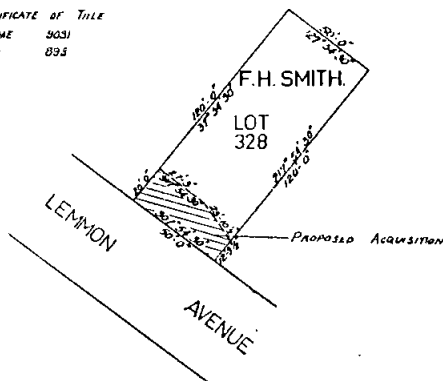

Attention is invited to the following procedure in relation to the publication of official matter in the Government Gazette:—

Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

## 1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council.

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 14, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

## 2. Other matter.

(a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matters for publication will be accepted by telephone.

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
