## VICTORIA POLICE.

## **REWARD**

Notice is hereby given that a reward of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) will be paid by the Government of Victoria for information leading to the location of Terrence James Floyd, aged 12 years, and to the apprehension of any person or persons who may have committed an offence in connection with his disappearance.

It is believed that Terrence was picked-up by the driver of a white panel van at about 5.00 p.m. on 28th June, 1975, on the Avoca-Maryborough Road (Pyrenees Highway) approximately 1 kilometre east of the junction of that road with the Sunraysia Highway at Avoca.

## CONDITIONS.

The allocation of this reward will be at the sole discretion of the Chief Commissioner of Police, Melbourne, and it should be noted that no reward will be paid where death has occurred other than through foul play.
