REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF "AVENEL PIONEER PARK".

MANAGEMENT OF "AVENEL PIONEER PARK".

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the Township and Parish of Avenel were temporarily reserved as sites for Racing and other purposes of Public Recreation by Orders in Council of the 18th July, 1864, and the 4th June, 1935 (vide Government Gazettes of the 29th July, 1864, and the 12th June, 1935, respectively): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve in lieu of all previous Regulations relating thereto which are hereby rescinded. The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge except on such days as the Committee may set the Reserve or portions thereof aside for the purposes of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports and may grant the use of the portions so set apart to any club, association or person subject to the observance of such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the Committee from time to time.

2. No person shall-

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance:
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
- (c) bring into or sell or distribute in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor unless authorized in writing by the Committee and holding a licence or permit as required pursuant to the provisions of the Liquor Control Act 1968 and then only in such place or places or portion of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
- (d) climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills or posters thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage, mark or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or any rubbish whatsoever, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein;
- (e) remove, deface or displace any board, plate or fitting, written or printed notice for exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve;
 - (f) light fires in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Comas are mittee;
- (g) do anything whatever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (h) bring into, cause or permit any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals to enter the Reserve without the permission of the Committee being first obtained otherwise the same may be impounded by the Committee. All dogs must be at all times controlled by a chain or least.
- exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve or on any part thereof without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
- (j) play, practise or engage in any organized game, sport or entertainment in the Reserve at any time without the consent, in writing, of the Committee having been first obtained and then only subject to such conditions as the Committee deems reasonable and consistent with these Regulations: these Regulations;

- (k) take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission in writing, of the Committee first obtained. All applications for the use of the Reserve must be lodged with the Secretary of the Committee fourteen days before the Reserve is required;
- (1) on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee;
- (m) remain within the Reserve or on any property therein when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff or Crown lands or member of the Police Force or authorized officer of the Committee;
- (n) hawk or sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any goods, fruit or merchandise or anything else whatsoever, or solicit or gather money them without the consent, in writing, of the
- (o) in or upon the Reserve kill, wound, trap or snare or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare any bird or other native game, or have any dead bird or other native game or the skin or pelt thereof in his possession;
- (p) dig or remove any sand, soil, stone or other material from the Reserve;
- (q) break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to any person in the Reserve;
- (r) deposit or leave any bottles, glass, tin, can, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind in the Reserve except in a receptacle provided for the purpose by the Committee;
- (s) play or perform in any band of music, or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind or sing any sacred or secular song or enter into any public assemblage on the Reserve, except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained;
- (t) camp in the Reserve or in any building therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee:
- (u) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed at the Reserve;
- (v) ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, or on any area other than that set aside by the Committee for the particular purpose;
- (w) cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee;
- (x) carry or discharge any firearm or air gun in the
- (y) park any motor vehicle or other vehicle in the Reserve except at such place or places set apart for the purpose by the Committee, or bring a caravan into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee;
- .(z) spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any building, structure or erection in the Reserve;
- (aa) enter, cross, be on or trespass on any playing ground area, enclosure or course or building, room or structure or any part thereof in the Reserve whilst any sport, game, competition, race, entertainment or amusement is being played, conducted or carried on, or at any time between the commencement and conclusions. between the commencement and conclusion of any event without the consent of the Committee:
- (bb) interfere with or interrupt any game, sport, competition or entertainment or amusement or practice thereat in the Reserve;
- (cc) obtain or attempt to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admis-sion under these Regulations;

- (dd) no person shall use the closets or urinals or any portion of such closets or urinals in the Reserve for any purpose other than for which the same are constructed;
- (ee) notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, authorized officers or employees of the Committee may at any time enter the Reserve and carry out any work, make any alterations or erect any structures for the maintenance, improvement or good management of the Reserve.—(Rs.639.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Fifty dollars, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred dollars, provided that every person who contravenes any Regulation made under the said section for or with respect to prohibiting the depositing and leaving of any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any land to which such Regulation relates shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Two hundred dollars.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN LAND IN THE PARISH OF SEBASTOPOL RESERVED FOR PUBLIC RECREATION PURPOSES.

RECREATION PURPOSES.

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township of Sebastopol, Parish of Ballarat was temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation Purposes by Order in Council dated the 10th February, 1976 (vide Government Gazette of the 18th February, 1976): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore 1, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations: said Regulations:-

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One dollar may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve, and a charge not exceeding thirty cents may be made for all vehicles entering the Reserve for sports of such gatherings.

 2 No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, seats, fences, trees, shrubs, flowers or any other improvements in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the consent of the Committee.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any other way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, or break bottles or other glass, or leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish therein, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

- 6. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all powers incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "Cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1958.
- 7. The Committee may debar any person from bringing into the Reserve any dog, unless such dog is controlled by a chain or cord.
- 8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained Committee first obtained.
- 9. No person shall take part in any public meeting, nor shall any band of music perform in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first
- 10. No person shall preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 11. No assemblies for sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking or for any purpose or meeting of a like character shall take place in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.
- 12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve or enclosures therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only subject to such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve or enclosures therein
- 13. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods, chattels or any other article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 14. No person shall play at cricket, golf, tennis or any other similar game or play football in the Reserve, except on such areas as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee for such purposes, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee.
- 15. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays without the permission of the Committee first obtained, and then only subject to such terms, and conditions as the Committee may determine.
- 16. No person shall trespass on any playing ground in the Reserve during any cricket or football match or sports gathering or show unless such person is a player or official at the time of such cricket or football match or or official at the time of such cricket of rootinal match or sports gathering or show, nor shall any person obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
- 17. Persons occupying or hiring; any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, matches, sports or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding \$100.00, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure and such Committee in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so occupying or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any lawful order given by the Committee.
- 18. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs or plants without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and any person found removing or taking any plants, flowers, seeds or other property from the Reserve or injuring any property therein shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve and be liable for prosecution.
- 19. No delivery cart, tradesman's cart, dray, lorry, wagon, van, truck or barrow shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

- 20. No person shall park motor cars or other vehicles within the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart by the Committee for the purpose, and then only on such terms and conditions as the Committee may determine.
- 21. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Committee shall ride or drive any horse or any bicycle, tricycle, motor car or other vehicle on any path in the Reserve except as hereinafter provided.
- 22. No vehicle, motor car or motor cycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve, except on the portions thereof specially provided for wheeled traffic.
- 23. No horse with a rider shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for equestrians.
- 24. No horse shall be broken in or trained in the Reserve.
- 25. No bicycle shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve except on the portions thereof specially provided for cyclists.
- 26. No person on foot shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the portions of the Reserve specially set apart for cyclists or equestrians, except to cross through the openings provided for access from one part of the Reserve to another part thereof as indicated by notices in the Reserve.
- 27. No horse, unless controlled by rein or hand, or cattle, sheep or pigs shall be allowed to enter or pass over or through the Reserve.
- 28. No person shall dig or remove any sand, gravel, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.
- 29. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate, fitting or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations, or any notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.—(Rs.2668.)

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Mildura was temporarily reserved pursuant to Order in Council dated the 7th November, 1973, as a site for Public Recreation purposes (vide Government Gazette of the 14th November, 1973): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the Care, Protection and Management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge to any area not occupied by sporting bodies as hereinafter provided.
 - 2. No person shall-
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regard dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;
 - (c) bring any intoxicating liquor into the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained;

- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any member of the Police Force, or any servant of the Committee, to leave same.
- 5. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect any building or booth therein for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 6. No person shall remove any trees, timber, saplings, shrubs or other vegetation or sand, sand-stone, earth, marl or gravel from the Reserve.
- 7. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any person in the proper use of the Reserve or any part thereof, or wilfully obstruct or interrupt any servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work.
- 8. (a) The Committee shall have the power to set aside any portion of the Reserve for the parking of vehicles and any portion so set aside shall not be used for any purpose other than the parking of vehicles.
- (b) No person shall drive or propel a motor car, motor cycle or other vehicle in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained, except on any portion thereof set aside by the Committee for the parking of vehicles.
- 9. No cattle, horses, goats, pigs, sheep or other animals, shall be allowed to enter the Reserve without the permission, in writing from the Committee.

10. Every animal permitted to enter the Reserve as hereinbefore provided, must be under proper control and the owner of any animal that causes damage shall be held responsible therefor.—(Rs.9798.)

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Township of Werribee was temporarily reserved as a site for an Ornamental Plantation by Order in Council dated the 23rd March, 1886 (vide Government Gazette of the 26th March, 1886): And whereas such reservation was revoked in part by Orders in Council dated the 1st October, 1946, and the 13th March, 1968 (vide Government Gazettes of the 9th October, 1946. and the 20th March, 1968, respectively): And whereas such land (hereinafter called the "Reserve") has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve, which Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations:—

- 4. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or a Crown Lands Bailiff, to leave the same.
- 5. No club or association or person shall hold or take any part in any game of any description, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony or any other recreational activity in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
- 6. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve when a charge for admission is made without first paying the charge for admission.
- 7. No person shall park a motor car within the Reserve except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the purpose.
- 8. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the written consent of the Committee first obtained.
- 9. The owner of any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve without written authority of the Committee, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 10. No person shall enter any buildings in the Reserve or enter upon the arena therein without the permission of the Committee, and any person having done so shall leave the same on having been requested to do so by any member of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or a Crown Lands Bailiff.
- 11. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding 8 kilometres per hour in a direction indicated by persons appointed by the Committee to control vehicular traffic.
- 12. The use of mini bikes, trail bikes and similar recreational vehicles shall not be permitted on the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.
- 13. The Committee shall have the right, subject to such terms and conditions as it deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, to authorize any club, association or person to charge a fee for admission to the Reserve for picnics or other recreational activities.—

- The owner of any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

No person shall enter any building in the Reserve or enter upon the arena therein without the permission of the Committee, and any person having done so shall leave the same on having been requested to do so by any member of the Committee, any member of the Police Force or by any bailiff of Crown lands,
- 11. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding eight (8) kilometres per hour in a direction indicated by persons authorized by the Committee.
- authorized by the Committee.

 12. The Committee shall have the right to charge or authorize any person, club or association to charge a fee for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding fifty-two (52) in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket, football or other matches, sports, shows, musical performances, fêtes, outdoor and holiday amusements on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding fifty cents (50c) may be charged and taken for admission from each adult person to the Reserve unless from time to time the Committee deems a higher charge to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, in which case such higher charge may be made and taken for admission of each adult person to the Reserve.
- 13. Persons occupying or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure in the Reserve on the occasions of any cricket, football or other matches, sports, shows, musical performances, fêtes or any other outdoor and holiday amusements may be required to deposit a sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding One hundred dollars (\$100), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money

deposited by way of guarantee and all persons so occupying or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any lawful order given by the Committee.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinbefore referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce the said Regulations.—(Rs.947.)

MANAGEMENT OF THE MOTAL BOTAINC GARDENS" IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown lands in the City of Melbourne and described in a notice published in the Government Gazette of the 10th day of October, 1873, were permanently reserved as a site for Public Park and Gardens: And whereas such lands have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care protection and management and for other purposes connected therewith should be made for so much of the aforesaid Public Park and Gardens Reserve as is known as the Royal Botanic Gardens (hereinafter referred to as the "Gardens") and as is shown on a plan marked M.314 (17) todged in the Central Plan Office of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey: Now therefore I, William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Gardens:—

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. The gates of the Gardens shall, unless the Minister of Lands otherwise directs, be opened daily at 7 a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February and March and at 7.30 a.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August and September, and shall be closed at sunset: Provided, however, that on all Sundays and public holidays during the months of May, June, July and August the gates shall be opened at 9 a.m. and on all Sundays and public holidays during the months of September, October, November, December, January, February, March and April the gates shall be opened at 8.30 a.m. 8.30 a.m.

A bell shall be rung five (5) minutes before the locking of the gates and any person found unlawfully in the Gardens during hours when the Gardens are required by this Regulation to be closed shall be liable to prosecution.

Any person locked in the Gardens after the appointed time shall contact a lodgekeeper who is hereby authorized to open the gates alongside the lodge which he occupies so that such person can leave the Gardens.

- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the Gardens who is in a state of intoxication, or who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, nor shall any person behave in a disorderly manner, or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency or commit any act of indecency therein.
- 3. No male person shall enter any of the women's lavatories, and no female person shall enter any of the men's lavatories in the Gardens.

- 4. No child under the age of ten (10) years shall enter the Gardens unless accompanied by and in the care or charge of an adult.
- 5. No person shall, unless authorized in writing by the Minister of Lands, offer for sale or sell in the Gardens any goods or article, or let for hire any chair, seat or carriage.
- carriage.

 6. No person shall without the consent in writing of the Director of the Gardens cause or suffer any dog or other animal to enter the Gardens unless such dog or other animal be and remain under proper control on a chain, cord or leash. Any such dog or other animal shall be at all times effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from entering any ornamental water or area enclosing a house or other building or from going on or being upon any garden or bed. This provision shall not apply to any member of the Police Force while acting in the execution of his official duties.
- 7. No person shall climb over any fence or gate in or around the Gardens nor shall any person enter or leave the Gardens except through a gate provided for the pur-
 - 8. No person shall whilst in the Gardens-
 - (a) Interfere with or deface any property or tree or plant life or any fence in or around the Gardens.
 - (b) Walk on any flower or shrubbery bed, border, or edging, or any plot specially planted or enclosed for a plantation or any other purpose therein.
 - (c) Interfere with any fish, bird, or other animal, or bird's nest or bird's egg therein.
 - (d) Engage in any game or sport therein.
 - (e) Throw stones or any other material or missiles
 - (f) Commit any nuisance or leave any refuse in the Gardens except in any receptacle provided for refuse.
 - (g) Enter without lawful excuse any enclosure or area where a dwelling, conservatory, equipment shed, or other building or propagating frame is located.
 - (h) Ride a bicycle or other similar wheeled vehicle except if engaged on official duties.
 - (i) Wilfully obstruct or interrupt any person em-ployed therein in the proper execution of his work or duty.
 - (j) Annoy any person.
 - (k) Bathe, wade, or wash in any lake, pond, stream, or other ornamental water therein, or pollute any such water, or use any drinking fountain for any purpose other than drinking.
- 9. No person whilst in the Gardens shall, without the approval in writing of the Director of the Gardens being first obtained—
 - (a) Remove any plant, plant material, bird or animal.
 - (b) Take photographs for any other than private pur-
 - (c) Display commercial goods for advertisement or seek information for commercial purposes.
 - (d) Hold meetings, display banners, signs or devices, or distribute any bill, programme or like thing.
 - (e) Collect or attempt to collect money.
 - (f) Take part in public entertainment.
 - (g) Preach or deliver an address or speech of any kind to members of the public.
 - (h) Light any fire, including a barbecue of any type.
 - (i) Bring any vehicle, including a motor car, motor bicycle, go-cart, mini bike, roller skates or skate board, into the Gardens. This provision shall not apply to government, police or ambulance vehicles which may enter and leave the Gardens for official purpose. for official purposes.

Any person offending against any of these Regulations shall, upon being requested by any member of the staff of the Gardens, or of the Police Force, to leave the Gardens, forthwith leave the same, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to prosecution. 11. No person shall remain in the Gardens when lawfully directed to leave the same, and any person who refuses to so leave may be removed therefrom, and be liable to prosecution.

These Regulations are made in lieu of the Regulations made on the 2nd April, 1958, and published in the Government Gazette of the 11th April, 1958, which are hereby rescinded.—(Rs.1041.)

For each child between the ages of 4 and 16 years—30 cents per day or \$1.80 per week;

For electric power-a maximum fee of \$1.00 per day.—(Rs.477.)


