Industrial Training Act 1975
FLORISTRY TRADE PROCLAIMED TO BE AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas section 19 of the *Industrial Training Act 1975* provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Industrial Training Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades:

And whereas the Industrial Training Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of floristry be proclaimed an apprenticeship trade under the said Act, insofar as it is carried on anywhere in the State of Victoria and having considered the representations made on behalf of the employers and employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed and has further recommended that the said trade be excluded from the application of sub-section (1) of section 41 of the said Act:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trade of floristry to be an apprenticeship trade under the said Act insofar as it is carried on anywhere in the State of Victoria and do further proclaim that the said trade be excluded from the application of sub-section (1) of section 41 of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventy-seven, and in the twenty-sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God, Queen of Australia and Her other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth.

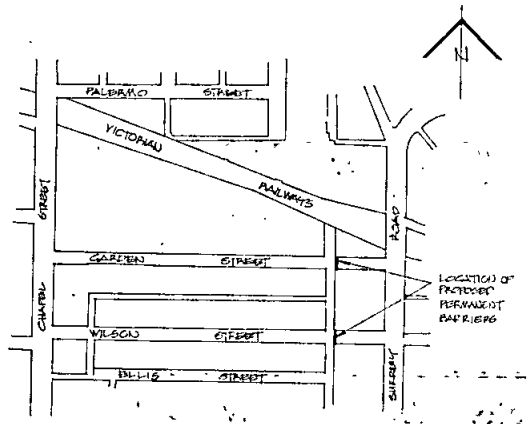

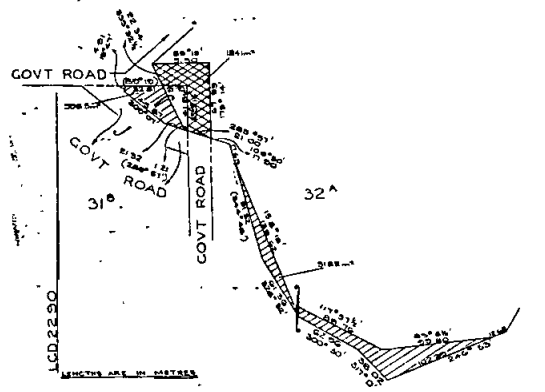

Liquor Control (Orderly Marketing) Act 1976

DETERMINATION OF LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION

No. 3 of 1977

The Liquor Control Commission, pursuant to powers conferred upon it by section 11A Liquor Control Act 1968 as amended, hereby determines the prices below which licensed persons may not sell and dispose of packaged beer to unlicensed persons in the State of Victoria.

By this determination the Liquor Control Commission determines different prices for different types and sizes of packaged beer and different prices at which packaged beer may be sold in different parts of Victoria as set out in the table hereunder. The different parts of Victoria in respect of which different prices are hereby determined are referred to as "Metropolitan Area", "Country Areas" Groups 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 and "Special Area Group 1", respectively, in the said table. The areas referred to in the said table are defined by reference to municipal districts or subdivisions within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1958 as amended.

"Metropolitan Area" means the municipal districts of Altona, Box Hill, Brighton, Broadmeadows, Brunswick, Bulla, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Croydon, Dandenong, Diamond Valley, Doncaster and Templestowe, Eltham, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Keilor, Kew, Knox, Malvern, Melbourne, Melton, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Ringwood, Sandringham, South Melbourne, Springvale, St. Kilda, Sunshine, Waverley, Whittlesea, Williamstown, and the subdivision of the municipal district of Werribee known as the East Riding.

"Country Area Group One" means the municipal districts of Bacchus Marsh, Bannockburn, Berwick, Broadford, Corio, Cranbourne, Franks-ton, Geelong, Geelong West, Gisborne, Kilmore, Mornington, Lillydale, Newham and Woodend, Newtown, Pakenham, Romsey, Sherbrooke, Upper Yarra and Werribee, save and except the subdivision of the municipal district of Werribee known as the East Riding.

"Country Area Group Two" means the municipal districts of Ballan, Ballarat City, Bendigo, Barrabool, Bass, Bellarine, Buln Buln, Castle-

maine, Colac, Colac City, Daylesford and Glenlyon, Eaglehawk Borough, Euroa, Flinders, Goulburn, Hastings, Healesville, Korumburra, Kyneton, Mclvor, Maldon, Maryborough City, Metcalfe, Moe, Morwell, Narracan, Newstead, Phillip Island, Pyalong, Queenscliffe Borough, Ripon, Seymour, South Barwon, Strathfieldsaye, Talbot and Clunes, Traralgon, Traralgon City, Tullaroop, Violet Town, Warragul, Wonthaggi Borough, Winchelsea, Yallourn and Yea.

"Country Area Group Three" means the municipal districts of Alberton, Alexandra, Ararat, Ararat City, Avon, Bairnsdale, Bairnsdale Town, Ballarat, Beechworth, Belfast, Benalla, Benalla City, Bet Bet, Bright, Bungaree, Buninyong, Camperdown Town, Charlton, Chiltern, Cobram, Cohuna, Creswick, Deakin, Donald, Dunmunkle, East Loddon, Echuca City, Gordon, Grenville, Hamilton City, Hampden, Heytesbury, Horsham City, Huntly, Kara Kara, Kerang, Kerang Borough, Koroit Borough, Korong, Kyabram Town, Leigh, Lexton, Maffra, Marong, Minhamite, Mirboo, Mortlake, Mt. "Country Area Group Five" means the municipal districts of Kowree, Omeo, Orbost, Tallangatta, Upper Murray and Walpeup.

"Special Area Group One" means the municipal districts of Mildura and Mildura City.

ECHUCA WATERWORKS TRUST

BY-LAW FIXING CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE FOR YEAR COMMENCING ON OCTOBER 1, 1977

The Echuca Waterworks Trust in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-law as follows:—

1. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "the meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

2. In respect of any land or tenement rated by the Trust:—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which if charged at 11.0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 11.0 cents per kilolitre for any meter year.

3. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 11.0 cents per kilolitre.

4. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

5. The provisions of Clauses 2, 3 and 4 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the *Water Act 1958* or by agreement with consent of the Governor in Council, pursuant to Section 186 of the *Water Act 1958*.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1978**

6. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning the 1st day of January, 1978, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1978 and shall be payable on the 31st day of January, 1978 at the office of the Trust, R.M.B. 2560, Benalla, 3673.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates.

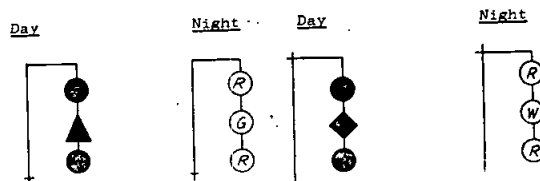

The "Port Closed" signals below will be displayed at the Point Lonsdale Lighthouse. The "Keep Clear" signals below will be displayed by the blasting vessel(s).



The attendant and blasting vessels may also display any of the following signals by International Code flags:—

Signal	Meaning
"A"	I have a diver down. Keep well clear at slow speed.
"B"	I am carrying dangerous goods.
"U"	You are running into danger.
"IR"	I am engaged in submarine survey work (underwater operations). Keep clear of me and go slow.
"OW"	Underwater mining operations are in progress. You should stop your vessel and wait for instructions.

The attendant and blasting vessels may also make the International Code signal "U" by daylight signalling lamp.

Caution.—No vessel shall approach the attendant or blasting vessels engaged in blasting work nearer than one mile and a warning will be given by prolonged siren blasts from the blasting vessel when a charge is about to be exploded.

Every vessel shall obey any directions received from the attendant or blasting vessels or by radio from Point Lonsdale Signal Station. No vessel shall operate any radio transmitter within 300 metres of the blasting vessel.

When underwater blasting is in progress in either the South or West channel areas, movement of vessels in those channels may be prohibited in addition to the prohibition of traffic movements through the Heads.

Noise Control

A By-Law of the City of Fitzroy made under section 197 (1) (xi), (xia), (xxi) of the Local Government Act 1958 as amended and any and every other power thereunto it enabling and numbered 129 for controlling and regulating the use of premises with a view to preventing objectionable noises at unreasonable times, suppressing nuisances, preventing or minimizing noise on public highways and for repealing or altering the by-laws of the City of Fitzroy hereinafter specified.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 as amended, and any and every other power thereunto it enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

1. (1) Sections 62, 63, 64 and 65 of By-Law No. 100 are hereby repealed.
- (2) By-Law No. 114 is hereby repealed.
2. This By-Law operates—
 - (1) from the day after this by-law or notice of its making is published in the *Government Gazette* of the State of Victoria;
 - (2) throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Fitzroy.
3. In this by-law, unless inconsistent with the context of the subject matter—
 - (1) "apparatus" includes any instrument, device or anything whatsoever capable of making or being used for making any sound or noise and without limiting the generality of the foregoing includes any loudspeaker, amplifier, broadcasting set, wireless receiving set, television set, gramophone, radiogram, piano, bell, siren, alarm or any other noise or sound producing device;
 - (2) "premises" include any building or land.

PART I.

4. Where any premises have been used in such a way as to create a nuisance by the emission of noise an Officer of the Council may—
 - (a) make inquiries of the owner and occupier or person apparently in charge of the premises for the purpose of ascertaining the use of the premises and the source of the nuisance;
 - (b) serve a notice in writing upon the owner and the occupier or the person who has caused or permitted or suffered the said premises to be so used as to make the said nuisance, specifying—
 - (i) the address and general use of the said premises;
 - (ii) the apparent source of the said nuisance;
 - (iii) that the person to whom the said notice is addressed is required not to cause or permit or suffer the said premises to be so used as to make the said

nuisance at the times stated in the said notice after the expiration of seven (7) days from the date on which the said notice is served.

5. Any person who—
 - (a) fails to or refuses to answer any such inquiry or makes any false answer to any such inquiry;
 - (b) fails to comply with the provisions of any such notice
 shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

PART II.

6. No person upon any street or footway shall make or cause to be made any loud or violent noise disturbance or sound which causes annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway or in any premises abutting thereon or adjacent thereto.
7. No person upon any street or footway shall—
 - (a) make sound or play any apparatus, or
 - (b) sing or harangue, so as to cause annoyance or obstruction to or so cause such annoyance or obstruction to any other person upon such street or footway in any premises abutting on or adjacent thereto.
8. No person upon any street or footway shall after being required by any Officer of the Council or member of the Police Force to desist:
 - (a) sound or play any apparatus or
 - (b) sing or harangue.
9. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) or more than one hundred dollars (\$100) and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not more than ten dollars (\$10) for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
10. In addition to any penalties any expenses incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this by-law shall be paid by the person committing such breach.

- 4.1 In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules forms and usages of Parliament which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

Order of Business

- 5.1 The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Council shall be as follows—provided that at any particular meeting it may be altered by resolution of the Council:
 - (i) Prayers.
 - (ii) Apologies for absence and the granting of leave of absence where necessary.
 - (iii) Disclosures of Interest by Councillors under section 181 of the Act.
 - (iv) Confirmation of Minutes.
 - (v) Reception and reading of Petitions and Memorials.
 - (vi) Outwards Correspondence.
 - (vii) Inwards Correspondence.
 - (viii) Reports of Committees
 - (ix) Reports of Councillors on activities carried out at the direction of Council.
 - (x) Reports of the Officers of the Council.
 - (xi) Ordinary Business including—
 - (a) Questions with Notice.
 - (b) Questions without Notice.
 - (xii) Orders of the Day.
 - (xiii) All other business included in the notice paper.
 - (xiv) All Supplementary business including Supplementary Inwards Correspondence and Supplementary Officers' reports.
- 5.2 The order of business at all other meetings of the Council including Statutory and Special Meetings shall be as set out in the notice paper.

Confirmation of Minutes

- 6.1 At every meeting of the Council the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be dealt with as follows:
 - (a) If a copy of the minutes of such preceding meeting shall not have been delivered to each Councillor at least two days before the meeting such minutes shall be read and the question put for the confirmation of such minutes.
 - (b) If a copy of the minutes of such preceding meeting shall have been delivered to each Councillor at least two days before the meeting the Chairman may ask whether any item of the minutes is opposed as to accuracy and if no Councillor indicates opposition the Chairman shall declare such minutes to be confirmed. If any Councillor indicates opposition he shall name the item or items to which he objects, give details of his objections and move accordingly. When such motion is seconded it shall be open to debate. When all questions so raised have been determined the Chairman shall put the question for the confirmation of the minutes or the confirmation of the minutes as amended (as the case may be).
- 6.2 No discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings and the minutes shall then be signed by the Chairman of that meeting.

Motions and Amendments

- 7.1 All motions and amendments shall be—
 - (a) within the powers of the Council;
 - (b) relevant to ordinary business or business of which notice has to be given as provided by section 184 of the Act;
 - (c) relevant to Supplementary business providing a majority of the Council agree to such being dealt with and the Chairman allowing a period of at least five (5) minutes for such business to be studied prior to it being dealt with;
 - (d) neither objectionable nor defamatory in language nature or intent.
- 7.2 If any Councillor objects to the debate of a motion proposed during ordinary business the motion shall not be debated but shall be placed on the Notice Paper of the meeting of the Council next following.
- 7.3 A motion or amendment which is not seconded shall lapse provided that a Councillor may second a motion or amendment "pro forma" for the sake of discussion and may withdraw such seconding

- after discussion in which case the question shall not be put unless formally seconded by another Councillor.
- 7.4 No motion or amendment may be withdrawn without the consent of the Council.
- 7.5 No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Councillor authorized in writing by him to move the same; but such motion shall be postponed until the next meeting of the Council and if not then moved as aforesaid shall lapse.
- 7.6 Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of same within a period of one (1) minute before he addresses the Council thereon.
- 7.7 No second or subsequent amendment whether upon an original motion or an amendment shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 7.8 If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next motion, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.
- 7.9 If an amendment be negatived then a second may be moved to the question to which the first mentioned amendment was moved but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Council for discussion at a time.
- 7.10 When all amendments have been disposed of the motion shall be debated as amended and such debate shall be confined to those Councillors who have not previously spoken on the original motion or any amendment and the mover of the resolution may exercise his right of reply.
- 7.11 If a debate on any motion moved and seconded or on any order of the day be interrupted by the number of Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business such debate may at the next meeting of the Council be resumed at the point when it was so interrupted.
- 9.4 No Councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion or comment on the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate.
- 9.5 A Councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted an explanation by the Chairman or by resolution of the Council.
- 9.6 The Councillors in meeting of Council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Mayor, Chairman or Councillor, as the case may require.
- 9.7 If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to speak first.
- 9.8 Whenever any Councillor makes use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Councillor, the Councillor so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the Council.
- 9.9 Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language and having been called to order or to withdraw or to apologise for such conduct and refusing so to do shall be guilty of an offence.

Points of Order

- 10.1 The Chairman when called upon to decide points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussion or commenting on same and his decision shall be final.
- 10.2 A point of order may be taken on the ground that the matter objected to is—
- (i) in contravention of this by-law;
 - (ii) defamatory;
 - (iii) disloyal;
 - (iv) irrelevant;
 - (v) irreverent or obscene;
 - (vi) ambiguous or obscure;
 - (vii) ultra vires the Council.

Personal Explanation

- 11.1 Any Councillor or officer may at any meeting of the Council at such time as shall be decided by the Chairman make a personal explanation for a period not exceeding two (2) minutes as to any statement whenever made affecting him as a Councillor or officer as the case may be.

Documents

- 12.1 Any Councillor may demand the production at the Council table of any documents of the Council relevant to the subject under discussion.
- 12.2 The Corporate Seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Town Clerk or Acting Town Clerk is present.

Voting

- 9.1 Any Councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the Chairman and shall not be interrupted unless called to order when he shall sit down until the Councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of when the Councillor in possession of the floor may proceed with the subject.
- 9.2 The mover of every original motion but not of any amendment shall have a right of reply to be exercised at the conclusion of the debate including debate on any amendment, but save as aforesaid no Councillor shall speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given by the Chairman or by resolution of the Council to explain when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood or unless for the purpose of calling the attention of the Chair to a point of order. For the purpose of this clause a motion shall be deemed to be an original motion even although any amendment thereto has been carried.
- 9.3 Except by the express leave of the Council in any particular case no Councillor shall speak to any question for a longer time than—
- The Mover and Seconder of the Motion for five (5) minutes (each)
- The first and second Councillor opposing the Motion for five (5) minutes (each)
- Other Councillors for three (3) minutes (each)
- The mover when exercising the right of reply for two (2) minutes
- and at the conclusion of the appropriate time the Councillor concerned shall sit down, and if he shall fail to do so at the request of the Chairman shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence.
- 13.1 When any motion or amendment has been seconded the Chairman shall ask the Council whether any Councillor other than the mover or seconder wishes it to be debated or is opposed to the motion or amendment. Any Councillor may ask for further information at this stage. If no Councillor requests a debate or voices opposition the vote shall thereon be taken. If any Councillor requests a debate or voices opposition the mover and seconder may address the Council, the question shall be debated and the Chairman shall put the question to the Council first in the affirmative then in the negative and shall thereupon announce the result thereof. In such case the Council shall vote by show of hands and any Councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 13.2 Forthwith after the declaration of the result of such a vote the Chairman or any Councillor may demand a division in which case the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and the Chairman shall call their names and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands and the Chairman shall call their names and the results shall be then declared by the Chairman. The Town Clerk or Minute Secretary shall record in the minutes the names of the Councillors voting in the affirmative and of those voting in the negative on such a division. When a division is demanded the vote already taken shall have no effect and the question shall be decided on the division.

Petitions

- 14.1 No motion except that for receiving same shall be made on any petition, memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Council after that at which it has been presented unless the Council by resolution otherwise decides.
- 14.2 It shall be incumbent on every Councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof and to ascertain that it does not contain language or matter disrespectful to the Council and that the contents do not violate any Statute, By-Law or any provision thereof.
- 14.3 Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall write his name thereon.
- 14.4 Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no-one else except in cases of incapacity through illness.

Question Time

- 15.1 Question time at ordinary meetings of the Council shall be for the purpose of enabling Councillors to address questions to officers but this shall not restrict the right of a Councillor to ask for information during the course of debate on other items of business as set out on the notice paper.
- 15.2 Questions may be asked with or without notice. A question upon notice shall be delivered to the Town Clerk not later than seven days before the time fixed for holding the meeting at which the question on notice will be asked and the Town Clerk shall include such question on the notice paper or such meeting.
- 15.3 An officer shall not be required to answer a question without notice. If an officer replies to a question asked without notice to the effect that he requires notice of it, notice shall be treated as having been given for the next ordinary meeting.
- 15.4 All questions and answers shall be as brief as possible and no discussion shall be allowed.
- 15.5 A question may be disallowed by the Chairman upon the ground that it—
- relates to a matter other than Council business;
 - is disloyal, defamatory, indirect, abusive or objectionable in language or substance;
 - is repetitive of a question already answered (whether at the same or any earlier meeting);
 - is asked to embarrass a Councillor, officer or employee.

Suspension of Standing Orders

- 16.1 Any one or more of the clauses of this By-Law may be suspended for a special purpose by resolution of the Council providing that such suspension will not enable the introduction of business not appearing on the notice paper except where otherwise provided for in this By-Law or of which notice has to be given as required by section 184 of the Act.

Visitors

- 17.1 Any person not being a Councillor who having been admitted to any meeting of the Council is guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct or who does not leave when lawfully requested by the Chairman so to do shall be guilty of an offence.
- 17.2 Any such person who being lawfully requested by the Chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed; and any constable or peace officer or person requested by the Chairman so to do may remove the person.

Correspondence

- 18.1 Copies of all letters written at the direction of Council shall be filed in chronological order and placed on the Council table at each meeting for perusal by the Councillors but no such letters shall be read to the Council save at the request of a Councillor, and with the consent of the Chairman.
- 18.2 All letters received by the Council shall be entered into the Inwards Correspondence Register which shall be tabled on the Council table at each meeting of the Council and no correspondence shall be read to the Council save at the request of a Councillor, and with the consent of the Chairman.

Offence Penalty

- 19.1 Any person who wilfully contravenes the provision of this By-Law shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than the maximum provided by the Act for each and every offence.

Definitions

- 20.1 In this By-Law the words "The Act" shall mean the *Local Government Act 1958* or any consolidation or amendment thereof.

Resolution for passing this By-Law agreed to by the Council of the City of Ringwood on the 22nd day of August, 1977, and confirmed on the 12th day of September, 1977.
