 but not including any article of headwear, footwear or handwear; and
 - wear, footwear or handwear; and

 (ii) of any of the sizes 0 to 14 inclusive as defined by AS1182-1972 being the specifications for the Size Coding Scheme for Infants' and Children's Clothing (Underwear and Outerwear) contained in the Standards Association of Australia publication approved on the 14th July, 1972 and entitled "Size Coding Scheme for Infants' and Children's Clothing (Underwear and Outerwear)"—

with effect as from the 1st January, 1978.



STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION By-Law No. 5818

Fixing Fees for Connections to the Commissioner's Water Supply System

The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the By-Law following:—

1. By-Law No. 5796 is hereby revoked from the 1st February, 1978.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Mount Duneed and Otway Rural Districts, the Antwerp, Bellarine, Berriwillock, Beulah, Birchip, Birregurra, Breamlea, Brim, Carwarp, Chillingollah, Chinkapook, Corop, Culgoa, Dimboola, Dingee, Dooen, Eildon, Gunbower, Hopetoun, Jeparit, Jung Jung, Koondrook, Lalbert, Lascelles, Leitchville, Lockington, Macorna, Managatang, Marnoo, Merbein, Meringur, Minyip, Mitiamo, Mornington Peninsula, Murrabit, Nandaly, Natimuk, Newstead, Nullawil, Nyah, Nyah West, Otway, Ouyen, Patchewollock, Piangil, Pimpinio, Pyramid Hill, Quambatook, Rainbow,

Red Cliffs, Robinvale, Rupanyup, Sea Lake, Speed, Stanhope, Tallygaroopna, Tempy, Ultima, Upper Beaconsfield, Waitchie, Walpeup, Watchem, Werrimull, Wonthaggi, Woomelang, Woorinen, Wycheproof and Yaapeet Urban Districts, the Urban District supplied with water from the Coliban System of Waterworks, and the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula and Otway Waterworks Districts tricts.

- 3. As on and from 1st February, 1978, fees for connection to the Commission's water supply system in the beforementioned districts will be charged as follows:—
 - (a) for connection to other than main pipelines and races in the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula and Otway Waterworks Districts:
 - (i) where the work is performed by the Commission-

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION By-LAW No. 5820

Amending By-law No. 5602 as amended by By-law Nos. 5665, 5668 and 5795 for protecting waterworks and all lands under the control or management of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission against interference and damage and for maintaining good conduct by members of

The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission") makes the following By-law pursuant to the provisions of the Water Act 1958 and all other powers enabling it to make the By-law:

Clause 2 (2) of By-law No. 5665 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:-

(e) An area of land consisting of 4 hectares of the Lysterfield Catchment in part of C.A. 49, Parish of Narree Worran, which area is occupied by the Yarra Pistol Club as a Pistol Range is hereby exempted from the provisions of this Clause for the period ending 30th June, 1981.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION By-LAW No. 5819

Fixing Rates and Charges-Upper Beaconsfield Urban District

The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of powers conferred by the Water Act, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes are hereby made and shall be levied upon the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Upper Beaconsfield Urban District.

On all tenements in respect of which a notice has been given in accordance with the Eighth Schedule to the Water Act that a main pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of eight cents in the Dollar of the Net Annual Valuation (N.A.V.) as set out in the municipal valuation as at 30th June, 1977, of such tenements; provided that the total amount of the rate payable annually in respect of any such tenements (other than land on which there is no building) shall be not less than the sum of Thirty-three Dollars and in respect of any lands on which there is no building shall be not less than the sum of Twenty-seven Dollars.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1977, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1978, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1978, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at Frankston.

Interest (at the rate of ten per cent. per annum) will be chargeable on all Rates remaining unpaid after 1st May,

- 3. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any property within the said urban district shall be read once in every financial year as near as practicable to the same date and the quantity so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called the "meter year") shall be the basis of charges payable under this By-law.
- 4. (a) In respect of any property rated or supplied by the Commission the maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge, except where a special agreement with the Commission applies, shall be the quantity which if charged at 25 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at the commencement of this By-law or commencing after this By-law comes into operation would give an amount equal to—
 - (i) the amount of the rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the previous financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1st July to 30th September, both dates inclusive;
 - (ii) the amount of rate or minimum annual charge payable, if any, in the current financial year if the meter year ends at any time from 1st October to 30th June, both dates inclusive.
- (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge shall be 25 cents per kilolitre for any meter year in course at the commencement of this By-law, or commencing after this By-law comes into operation.
- (c) Interest will be chargeable on all charges for water remaining unpaid for a period of three months from the date they become payable.
- 5. The charges as set out in Clause 4 of this By-law shall be payable on demand at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission at Frankston.
- 6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges. and charges.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1977/78 By-Law No. 97

The Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling doth hereby make a By-Law as follows:

- 1. This By-Law shall have effect as from the commencement of the meter year for the financial year commencing on the 1st of October, 1977.
- 2. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called "The Meter Year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where

a meter has been installed on any land or tenement during the course of a meter year the quantity of water measured as having been supplied during the period between the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

- 3. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement rated by the Council—
 - (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which, if charged at 15 cents per kilolitre for any meter year would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended year ended.
 - (b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 16 cents per kilolitre for any meter year.
- 4. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at 15 cents per kilolitre.
- 5. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at \$30.
- The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Council during normal business hours.

Legal Profession Practice Act MORTGAGE REGISTER AND NOMINEE COMPANY RULES

Pursuant to the provisions of section 88 of the Legal Profession Practice Act 1958 and of all powers thereunto enabling the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria hereby makes the following rules of the Institute:—

- 1. These Rules do not apply to any Mortgage of which the Solicitor is the beneficial owner or to any Mortgage held by any Solicitor or a Corporation in his or its capacity as the trustee of any Will or settlement or to any Mortgage which when executed or transferred will be so held.
 - 2. For the purpose of these Rules:-
 - "Contributor" means any person who lends or pro-poses to lend moneys on the security of a Contri-butory Mortgage arranged by a Solicitor.
 - "Contributory Mortgage a transged by a Solictor.

 "Contributory Mortgage" means a Mortgage to secure moneys lent by two or more persons. Two or more persons lending on joint account shall for the purpose of these Rules be regarded as a single
 - "Mortgage" means a mortgage, charge, security, bill of sale, loan contract or any document purporting to secure or regulate the repayment of moneys.
 - "Lender" and "Borrower" mean as the context requires the person to whom and the person by whom any moneys are payable or repayable pursuant to any Mortgage.
 - "Mortgage Register" means a register maintained for the purpose of these Rules containing the parti-culars specified in Schedule 2.
 - "Nominee" means a Solicitor or Solicitor's Nominee
 Company in whose name a Mortgage or Contributory Mortgage is held.

- "Person" includes a corporation.
- "Solicitor" has the same meaning as in Rule 2 of the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificate) Rules.
- "Solicitor's Nominee Company" means a corporation each of the members and each of the directors of which is a solicitor or other person first approved by the Council of the Law Institute.
- 3. Where a Solicitor's Nominee Company holds any property as a nominee or trustee for another person a Solicitor who is a member or director of that Company shall not-
 - (a) permit any person to become a member or director of that Company unless that person is a Solicitor or other person first approved by the Council of the Law Institute; or
 - (b) permit that Company to undertake any other activity.
 - 4. (1) Every Solicitor who:-
 - (a) Prepares a Mortgage, the principal or interest of which is to be collected by that Solicitor; or
 - (b) Is authorised to collect the principal or interest under any Mortgage, except on any discharge or partial discharge of the Mortgage; or
 - (c) Takes a Transfer of Mortgage to himself or prepares a transfer thereof to a Solicitor's Nominee Company of which he is a member or director:

shall keep a Mortgage Register and shall enter in that Mortgage Register the particulars specified in Schedule 2 within one month after—

- (d) the date on which the first loan under the Mort-gage is made; or
- (e) the date on which the Mortgage becomes one to which this Rule applies, whichever date last occurs.
- (2) For every other Mortgage held in the name of a Nominee the same particulars as are required to be entered in such Register by sub-rule (1) of this Rule shall be entered in the Mortgage Register of—
 - (a) the solicitor who is such Nominee; or
 - (b) the solicitor who is the director or one of the directors of the Solicitor's Nominee Company which is such Nominee,

as the case requires.

- 4. (3) Every Solicitor who prepares a variation of any Mortgage to which sub-rule (1) or sub-rule (2) of this Rule applies shall, within one month thereafter, enter in the Mortgage Register such of the particulars specified in Schedule 2 as may in the circumstances be necessary, in consequence of such variation, to maintain the accuracy of the Martgage Pagister. the Mortgage Register.
- 5. Except in the case of a Mortgage to be held by a Solicitor's Nominee Company a Solicitor shall not arrange or agree to arrange a Mortgage which is intended to be held in the name of a corporation (other than a Public Trustee Company) of which that Solicitor is a member or director where the Mortgage will be held by that corporation as trustee for the beneficial owner thereof.
- 6. A Solicitor shall not prepare a transfer of any Mortgage to any Company of which he is a member or director other than to a Solicitor's Nominee Company or a Public Trustee Company where such Mortgage will be held by the Company as trustee for the beneficial owner thereof

7. A Solicitor:-

- (a) Shall obtain the prior written authority of the Lender or of each Contributor, as the case requires, in or to the effect of the form in Part A or B of Schedule i before any moneys are advanced under a Mortgage to which Rule 4 (1) (a) applies.
- (b) Shall not without the consent in writing of each Contributor arrange any Contributory Mortgage under which moneys to be lent are to be advanced otherwise than in a lump sum.
- (c) Shall not arrange any Contributory Mortgage under which it is proposed that progressive advances will be made to any Borrower unless the Solicitor at the date of the first advance to be made pursuant to such Mortgage has received from all Contributors the full amount being contributed by each Contributor; or at such date holds an enforceable unconditional agreement given by a Bank (as defined by the Banking Act 1959) to provide the difference between the maximum amount to be lent under

such Contributory Mortgage and the amounts contributed by the Contributors and such agreement is not revocable except upon the full amount to be lent under such Contributory Mortgage being received from the Contributors or on the discharge of the Mortgage.

- 8. A Solicitor shall not arrange a Mortgage to which Rule 4 (1) (a) applies where the Mortgage:—

- (2) Before any moneys are lent on a Mortgage in the name of a Nominee an account in respect of that Mortgage shall be established in the Solicitor's trust account ledger in the name of such Nominee and the amount to be lent by the Lender or, in the case of a Contributory Mortgage, by each Contributory shall be transferred to the Nominee's account from the Lender's account or the account of each of the Contributors as the case requires.



- 3. The Governor in Council is satisfied as aforesaid in respect of each Patriotic Fund described in the Schedule





Recreational Vehicles

A Bylaw of the City of Hamilton made under the Provisions of Section 197 (1) (xxvia) of the Local Govern-ment Act 1958 and Numbered 107 for prohibiting and regulating the use of Recreational Vehicles on certain

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hamilton order as follows:

PART ONE: INTERPRETATION

- PART ONE: INTERPRETATION

 1. (i) "Council" means the Council of the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hamilton. "Licensed Land" means any land licensed by the Council under this Bylaw as a place where recreational vehicles may be used. "Occupier" in respect of any land within the Municipality of the City of Hamilton means the person in control of the land. "Person" includes a Corporation. "Public Place" means any public place (as defined in the Recreation Vehicles Act 1973) and all that land owned by the Council. "Private Land" means any land within the City of Hamilton other than a public place, a Highway and land vested in any Public Authority Statutory Incorporation or Municipality. "Recreation Vehicle" means a recreation vehicle within the meaning of the Recreation Vehicles Act 1973 and includes all mini-bikes, trail bikes, motor bikes, motor cars, motor scooters, go-carts and any other motorized vehicle which is of a kind normally used for or which is capable of being used for recreational purposes. "Recreation Vehicles Area" means any public place or any part of any public place which has been proclaimed by the Council as an area of land where recreation vehicles may be used. "Registered Owner" in respect of a recreation vehicle means the person registered as owner of the subject recreation vehicle under the Recreational Vehicles Act 1973.

 (ii) This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation
- (ii) This Bylaw shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Hamilton.

PART TWO: DECLARATION OF RECREATION VEHICLE AREAS

- 2. (i) In respect of any public place of which the Council is not the governing or controlling body— $\,$
 - (a) at the request of the governing body the Council from time to time may declare such public place or any part of such public place to be an area of land on which recreation vehicles may be used.
 - (b) in such declaration the Council may reserve to itself or to the governing body of such public place any right or power, and impose any conditions for the use of the subject area as in its discretion, but subject to any direction given by the said governing body, it considers appropriate.
 - (c) the Council at the request of the governing body may revoke any such declaration either as to the whole of the subject area or as to any part of it and in its discretion may suspend, alter vary or revoke any right, power or condition reserved or imposed in any such declaration.
- (ii) In respect of any public place other than that referred to in paragraph (i) of this Clause:—
 - (a) the Council from time to time may declare any public place or any part of any public place to be an area of land on which recreation vehicles may be used.
 - (b) in such declaration the Council may reserve any right or power, and impose any conditions for the use of the subject area as in its absolute discretion it considers appropriate.
 - (c) the Council may revoke any such declaration either as to the whole of the subject area or as to any part of it, and in its absolute discre-tion may suspend, alter, vary or revoke any right, power or condition reserved or imposed in any such declaration.
- 3. No person shall use or permit to be used on a recreation vehicle area a recreation vehicle in respect of which there is not in force a permit granted by the Council under the next succeeding clause.
- 4. The registered owner of a recreation vehicle may apply for a permit to use the recreation vehicle on a recreation vehicle area. Such application shall be in writing addressed to the Town Clerk or other proper

officer of the Council from time to time appointed in this regard and shall be in the form, if any, prescribed by the Council and shall state:

- (a) the name and address of the registered owner of the subject recreation vehicle;
- (b) the recreation vehicle area at which the vehicle is sought to be used;
- (c) the make, engine size and registered number of the vehicle;
- (d) any other information the Council may require.
- 5. In respect of any application for a permit pursuant to the last preceding clause the Council may grant or refuse to grant or impose any conditions to the grant of a permit as in its absolute discretion it considers appropriate without being liable to assign any reason or give any explanation whatsoever for any such grant, refusal, or condition imposed or not imposed.
- 6. Subject to Clause 21 hereof and to any conditions imposed in the permit, a permit granted pursuant to Clause 4 hereof shall continue in force until the 30th day of September next following the grant of the permit.

PART THREE: LICENSED LAND

- 7. Any person seeking to have any private land or any part of any private land of which he is the occupier licensed for the use of recreational vehicles pursuant to this Bylaw shall apply in writing to the Council. Every such application shall contain:
 - (a) the name and address of the applicant;
 - (b) the following details in respect of the land sought to be licensed:
 - (i) the name and address of the owner of the land and whether or not the con-sent of the owner has been obtained:
 - (ii) the address, title particulars and area;
 - (iii) a plan of the land;
 - (iv) the distance to the nearest house or other place of residence of any kind on the land and on neighbouring land;
 - (v) the zoning classification under the City of Hamilton Town Planning Scheme.
 - ne type or types, and number of recreation vehicles to be used on the land. (c) the
- 8. The Council in its absolute discretion may grant, or refuse to grant, or impose conditions to the grant of a licence pursuant to the last preceding sub-clause as it considers appropriate in granting or refusing to grant a licence and in imposing conditions the Council shall have regard to the following:
 - (a) the location of the land sought to be licensed;
 - (b) the distance of the subject land from any house or other place of residence of any kind;
 - (c) the type or types of recreation vehicles sought to be used on the land;
 - (d) what days and at what times of day recreation vehicles will be used on the land.

Notwithstanding anything in this Clause hereinbefore contained the Council shall not licence land pursuant to this Bylaw for use of recreation vehicles outside the hours between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. on any day.

- 9. No person shall use on licensed land a recreation vehicle which does not conform to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Recreation Vehicle Regulations 1973 as amended from time to time.
- 10. Subject to Clause 21 of this Bylaw a licence granted pursuant to this part shall continue in force for a period of 2 years from the date of registration or until a change in ownership or occupation of the land whichever is the

PART FOUR: RENEWALS OF PERMITS AND LICENCES

- 11. The Holder of a permit under Clause 4 hereof may apply for renewal of the permit by application in writing in the prescribed form to the Town Clerk or other Proper Officer on or before 30th September in any year.
- 12. The occupier of any licensed land, may apply for renewal of a licence issued under Clause 8 by application in writing in the prescribed form addressed to the Town Clerk or other Proper Officer not less than fourteen days before the date of expiry of the said licence.
- 13. The Council may renew any licence or permit subject to any terms or conditions whether or not the same were imposed when such permit or licence was granted.

14. Any person being the occupier of land sharing a common boundary with any licensed land by written submission addressed to the Council, may object to the granting, continuance or renewal of the licence of any licensed land.

15. After considering any written submissions made by or on behalf of the occupier of the licensed land, the Council may vary revoke or refuse to renew a licence.

PART FIVE: OFFENCES

20. All persons suspected of or contravening this Bylaw when asked to do so by an authorized Council officer or any member of the Victoria Police shall give their names and places of abode.

21. If after considering any written submissions made by or on behalf of an alleged offender the Council is satisfied that there has been failure of compliance with any of the conditions of a permit or licence the Council may revoke the same.

- (c) The expression "motor vehicle" means a motor car or other vehicle having wheels and used or intended to be used for carriage and includes a trailer.
- 3. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than \$100.00 and in the case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$20.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 4. No person shall be found guilty of an offence under this By-law if he is sleeping or reclining for rest in a tent, caravan, camper or motor vehicle pursuant to the requirements of any Act, regulation or statutory rule of the Commonwealth of Australia or State of Victoria.
- 5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Phillip Island.
