REWARD.

Notice is hereby given that a reward of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000) will be paid by the Government of Victoria for such information as will lead to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the death of James Joseph Patrick Kelly, at Kew, Victoria, on 19th January, 1977.

James Joseph Patrick Kelly, aged 49 years, a massage parlour proprietor, was shot and killed as he left the front door of his home at 26 Mary Street, Kew, at 4.45 a.m. on 19th January, 1977.

CONDITIONS.

1. The person or persons giving information leading to the apprehension and conviction of a person or persons guilty of the above-mentioned crime will receive such amount or amounts not exceeding \$20,000 as shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

2. The person or persons entitled to any reward and the amount or amounts payable to such person or persons shall be determined by the Chief Commissioner of Police.

Any information, which will be treated as confidential, may be given at any time of the day or night, to the Officer in Charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Russell Street, Melbourne (telephone 662 0911) or to the Officer in Charge of any Police Station.
