APPAREL CUTTING TRADE PROCLAIMED TO BE AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas section 19 of the Industrial Training Act 1975 provides, inter alia, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Industrial Training Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades:

And whereas the Industrial Training Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of apparel cutting insofar as it is carried on in the order tailoring for males and females, the ready made clothing for males and the ready made tailoring and dressmaking for females sections of the clothing manufacturing industry be proclaimed an apprenticeship trade under the said Act, and having considered the representations made on behalf of the employers and employees in the said trade, has recommended to the Minister that the said trade insofar as it is carried on in the order tailoring for males, order dressmaking and ready made dressmaking and ready made tailoring for females sections of the clothing manufacturing industry be so proclaimed and has further recommended that the said trade insofar as it is carried on in the order dressmaking and the ready made dressmaking and ready made tailoring for females sections of the clothing manufacturing industry be excluded from the application of sub-section (1) of section 41 of the said Act:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendations into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trade of apparel cutting to be an apprenticeship trade under the said Act insofar as it is carried on in the following sections of the clothing manufacturing industry:—

- (a) order tailoring for males and ready made clothing for males;
- (b) order tailoring for females;
- (c) order dressmaking and ready made dressmaking and ready made tailoring for females;

and do further proclaim that apparel cutting insofar as it is carried on in the order dressmaking and the ready made dressmaking and ready made tailoring for females section of the clothing manufacturing industry be excluded from the application of sub-section (1) of section 41 of the said Act.







VARIATION TO ROUTE OF PIPELINE

I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Minister for Minerals and Energy for the State of Victoria, hereby give notice in accordance with the provisions of Section 12 of the Pipelines Act 1967, No. 7541 that the route of part of the system of pipelines for which Permit No. 103 was granted by me on 26th June 1975, to the Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria, to own and use, has been varied by the deletion of a pipeline forming part of the system described in the Permit.

The description of the deleted pipeline is as follows-

Line 3—"A steel pipeline approximately 4.5 km in length with a nominal bore of 150 mm commencing at a field regulating valve at the terminal of Line 2 and proceeding in an east-north-easterly direction along New Dookie Road to the Shepparton-Numurkah rail line, thence crossing such rail line to continue in an east-north-easterly direction along New Dookie Road to the corner of Doyles Road and Graham Vale Road, thence deviating to continue in an easterly direction along New Dookie Road to Lemnos Road, thence turning to continue in a northerly direction along such road for a distance of approximately 300 metres to terminate at a field regulating valve in the road opposite Campbells Soups Pty. Ltd., City of Shepparton."

A rate of three point eight cents (3.8c) in the dollar on the nett annual value of all properties in the Third Division, being those properties shown coloured green on the said

A rate of two point four cents (2.4c) in the dollar on the nett annual value of all properties in the Fourth Division, being those properties shown coloured orange on the said plan.

A rate of two point three cents (2.3c) in the dollar on the nett annual value of all properties in the Fifth Division, being those properties shown coloured red in the said plan.

A rate of one point seven cents (1.7c) in the dollar on the nett annual value of all properties in the Sixth Division, being those properties shown coloured yellow in the said plan.

A rate of seven tenths of a cent (0.7c) in the dollar on the nett annual value of all properties in the Seventh Division, being those properties shown coloured brown on the said plan.

A rate of three point five tenths of a cent (0.35c) in the dollar on the nett annual value of all properties in the Eighth Division, being those properties shown coloured pink on the said plan. Except for properties included in Crown allotment 133 Parish of Toongabbie South bounded by Maffra Road, Cairnbrook Road and Maffra Railway Township of Glengarry.

- 2. In respect of all those properties within the Ninth Division, being all those properties uncoloured on the said plan, no rate is made or levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of January, 1978, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1978.
- 3. In respect of any rateable property other than those included in the Ninth Division the minimum amount payable shall be Four Dollars (\$4.00).
- 4. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of January, 1978, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1978, and shall be payable on the 1st of May, 1978, at the office of the Latrobe River Improvement Trust at Traralgon.
- 5. Such person or persons as the Latrobe River Improvement Trust may, from time to time, appoint for the purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorised to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate.





- (d) the names, addresses and age or ages of any person or persons who will be using such vehicle or vehicles at such times;
 - (e) describe such vehicle or vehicles stating its make, engine, size and whether or not it is registered;
 - (f) whether or not the consent of the owner of the "land has been obtained;"
 - (g) supply such other information that the Council may require.
- . .4. The Council in giving its consent under clause 2 hereof can impose any condition which it considers appropriate to the granting of such permit for the use of such vehicles.
- 5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation through-out the whole of the Municipal District.

Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 and any person guilty of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court:

A By-Law of the City of Sunshine made under Section 93 of the Health Act 1958 and numbered 123 with respect to the provision use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise) and prescribing the size and shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 93 of the Health Act 1958 and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Sunshine orders as follows:

1. This by-law may be cited as "The City of Sunshine Disposal of Refuse By-Law".

2. By-Laws Nos. 101 and 110 of the City of Sunshine are hereby repealed.

- 3. In this By-Law unless the context otherwise requires-'Approved receptacle' means any type of receptacle container or bag (other than a garbag or rubbish tin) approved by the Council from time to time.
 - "City" means City of Sunshine.
 - Council" means the Council of the City of Sunshine.
 - "Garbag" means a weather resistant sack of a type approved by the Council having a capacity of not more than .085 cubic metres and constructed with a minimum of two plied walls if made of paper and if made of polythene it shall comply with the Australian Standards 1251–1972.
 - "Health Inspector" means a Health Inspector of the City of Sunshine.
 - "House" means any building (or portion thereof) whether used for the purposes of residence or otherwise and includes any hotel restaurant or eating house (or portion thereof).
 - "Proprietor" includes the person or persons registered as the proprietor of premises under the provisions of the Transfer of Land Act 1958 or the equivalent previous legislation owner and/or occupier and/or any person having the management or control of premises for the time being.
 - "Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.
- "Refuse receptacle" means garbag or rubbish tin or approved receptacle.
- 'Rubbish tin" means a container of strong and sturdy ubbish tin "means a container of strong and sturdy construction, constructed of galvanised iron of not less than 24 gauge, or of tough plastic material of not less than 12 gauge thickness cylindrical in shape and tapered towards the bottom. Such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 06 cubic metres shall be water tight and rust proof and shall be capable of being conveniently and easily carried by one man.

Words importing the singular number include the plural and the plural the singular and the words importing the masculine gender include the feminine.

- The proprietor of every house shall provide and keep, 4. The proprietor or every nouse snail provide and keep, a refuse receptacle or so many of such receptacles as are necessary to contain all refuse and rubbish accumulated in, on or from such premises and shall cause all such refuse and rubbish to be placed in such refuse receptacle or receptacles with the least possible delay for collection, in accordance with this by-law.
- 5. (a) The proprietor of every house shall ensure that the refuse receptacle or refuse receptacles are in a clean and sanitary condition and in good order. In the case of a rubbish tin the same shall be fitted with handles and a close fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such recentricing. receptacle.
- (b) A person shall not use a garbag unless it complies with the standard set out in the Australian Standard 1251–1972 Polyethylene (Polythene) Garbage bags, or unless it is of a type approved by resolution of the Council.
- 6. The proprietor of every house shall place or cause to be placed for collection and disposal:
 - placed for collection and disposal:—

 (a) Every refuse receptacle on the footpath adjoining the property of the proprietor near the street channel no more than twelve hours before the commencement of each day which is set aside for the collection of refuse by the contractor or person authorised or employed in that behalf by the Council and all such refuse receptacles shall be removed on to the property of the proprietor within twelve hours from the time at which the refuse was collected therefrom.
 - (b) Every garbag on such premises not more than one metre from the entrance thereto to the street upon which the same fronts, abuts or adjoins in such a position as to be conveniently accessible. All such garbags shall be securely tied at the top.

The day or days of each week for the collection of refuse and garbage from houses shall be such day or days as are from time to time publicised and advertised by the Council.

- 7. Every refuse receptacle shall be such that the combined weight of the refuse receptacle and the contents thereof shall not exceed 25 40 kilograms.
- 8. A person shall not place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in any refuse receptacle nor shall deposit any moist refuse in any refuse receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

- 9. A person shall not place any ashes in any refuse receptacle unless such ashes are securely wrapped in
- 10. A person shall not place or cause or permit to be placed in any refuse receptacle any dirt, dust or other matter obtained by the use of vacuum cleaning of the interior of a dwelling or similar structure unless such dirt dust or other matter is securely wrapped in paper.
- 11. Where the proprietor of premises is using garbags on the premises for the depositing of garbage such garbag shall be supported in a frame fitted with a fly-proof hinged lid so as the garbag is clear of ground or floor level.
- 12. Council may from time to time by resolution approve any type of receptacle container or bag as an approved
- 13. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$500 and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than

LICENSING EXEMPTIONS AMENDMENT

By-Law No. 115

Camping and Caravan By-Law

- A By-Law of the City of Coburg made under the provisions of Section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 115 for the purpose of:—
 - (i) Prohibiting or regulating camping on roads.
 - (ii) Prohibiting or regulating the placing of caravans on private property.
 - (iii) Suppressing nuisances.

Pursuant to the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 as amended and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—

PART I .- SHORT TITLE

Short Title—This By-Law may be known as the Camping and Caravan By-Law.

PART II.—DEFINITIONS

Definitions—In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter.

Authorised Officer means an Officer authorised in writing by the Council.

Camper—Camper includes each and every person camping in or occupying tents or caravans with or without the permission of the proprietor of the land on which such person is camped and with or without the payment of any fee or giving of any consideration to the proprietor.

Caravan includes any object structure vehicle or conveyance having the general characteristics of a caravan, a house on wheels, a covered van and any vehicle used and adapted for living purposes whether the wheels or axles thereof have been removed or not and whether it is resting directly on the ground or is placed on blocks or other support and any structure, awning, annex, verandah, lean-to, car port or any enclosed or partly enclosed area used or capable of being used in conjunction with or appurtenant to a caravan.

Council means the Council of the City of Coburg.

Occupy includes residing or living in any tent or caravan for the purposes of entertainment, sleeping, resting, cooking, eating or for any other similar use whether permanent or temporary.

Camp—Camp includes camping in or occupying tents or caravans or other similar temporary accommodation.

Road includes any highway and any public bridge and any Street, Land, Court, Crescent, Avenue, Footway, Road, Reserve, Square, Alley or passage whether a thoroughfare or not.

PART III.-CAMPING ON ROADS.

l. No person shall camp on any Road without the consent of the Council.

· PART IV .- CAMPING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY

- 2. No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed more than one caravan on any private property (other than for the purpose of sale or hire for use other on such private property or the storing or parking of the same) without the consent in writing of the Council.
- 3. (a) Subject to part (b) hereof no person shall occupy any caravan or tent erected or parked on any private property where a house has been erected without the consent in writing of the Council under the hand of the Municipal Clerk.
- (b) Nothing in this clause shall prevent the occupier of any private property placing thereon one caravan owned by him for the use of a member of his household or a temporary visitor to sleep in the same for a total period not exceeding twenty-eight (28) days in any period of one (1) year, provided always that proper sanitation facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector or authorised Officer of the Council shall at all time be available on the land for the use of such member or visitor.
- 4. No person shall occupy any caravan or tent parked or placed on any vacant land without the consent in writing of the Council or its authorised officer.
- 5. The consent of the Council under the preceeding clauses shall be subject to the following conditions:—
 - (i) the occupation shall be for a period not exceeding six (6) months; and
 - (ii) proper sanitation facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector or authorised officer of the Council being at all times available on the land for the use of the occupant. In the event of such sanitation facilities at any time ceasing of such sanitation facilities at any time ceasing to be so available then any permit granted under sub-clause (a) of Clause 7 shall be immediately cancelled on service to the holder of such permit a notice under the signature of the Health Inspector or authorised officer of the Council that such facilities have ceased to be available.
- Every person applying for such consent shall make application in writing to the Council and supply such information as the Council may require.
- 7. (a) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to the application as it sees fit; and
- (b) The consent may be granted subject to such further or additional conditions as the Council thinks proper including a condition that a specified matter or things be done to the satisfaction of the Council.
- 8. This By-Law shall not apply to Camping and Caravan Parks which have been approved by the Council.

PART V .- ENFORCEMENT OF BY-LAW

- 9. Any notice or permit given by the Council under this By-Law may be given under the hand of the Town Clerk, Health Inspector or Authorised Officer of the Council.
- 10. Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty as prescribed by the Local Government Act 1958 and any amendment thereof and any person guilty of a continuing offence contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of TEN (10) DOLLARS for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
- 11. This By-Law shall have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Coburg.

No person, unless he is the holder of a permit in writing issued to him by the Council pursuant to this By-Law, nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of any such permit shall keep store or repair any heavy vehicle in any area within the municipal district defined in the first schedule hereto which areas are declared for the pursues of this By-Law to be residential areas. the purpose of this By-Law to be residential areas.
- 4. Any person desirous of obtaining a permit to keep store or repair any heavy vehicle in any such area shall apply in writing to the Council in the form set out in the second schedule hereto.
- 5. (i) Before considering any such application, the Council may require the applicant to give notice of the same as hereinafter set out to any person or persons whom the Council considers may be detrimentally affected by the granting of such application in such manner and within such time as it specifies or both to give and publish notice as aforesaid. as aforesaid.

 (ii) Every notice given or published pursuant to subclause (i) hereof shall consist of a true copy of the application lodged with the Council but shall in addition contain an indication that the Council will consider such application after the expiration of fourteen days following the giving or publication of such notice and that all persons who may be affected by the granting of such application may send to the Council statements in writing of any objections they may have to the granting of the application and all such statements received within the said period of fourteen days will be taken into consideration in the determination of the application.



- "Private Property" shall have the same meaning as the expression has in Section 197 (1) (XXXI) (g) of the Local Government Act 1958 and includes vacant land, but shall not include a caravan or camping park or site which is duly registered with the Coupil under the Compiler Part States. the Council under the Camping Regulations.
- 2. This By-Law may be known as the Camping and Caravan By-Law.
- 3. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Newham and Woodend,
- No person shall camp on any road.

Subject as is hereinafter provided no person shall without the prior consent in writing of the Council place more than one caravan on any private property which is not a camping area in respect of which a current permit issued by the Council under the Camping Regulations 1965 or any amendment or alteration thereof is in existence Provided Always that nothing in this clause shall prevent:

The placing of caravans for sale or hire on any land the use of which for the purposes of the business of selling or hiring caravans is permitted by or under any Interim Development Order or Planning Scheme made under the Town and Country Planning Act 1961 or any statutory amendment, modification or re-enactment thereof for the time being in force or by or under any By-Law or Pagulation. Regulation.

- 6. No person shall use or occupy any caravan for the purpose of sleeping, living therein, or generally for resi-dential purposes for a period exceeding an aggregate of 28 days in any one year without the prior consent in writing of the Council.
- 7. (a) Every person applying to the Council for the placing of or for consent to occupy any caravan tent or similar structure under this By-law shall make application in writing and supply all reasonable information required by the Council including the reasons for seeking such consent, the number and age of the persons proposing to occupy the caravan, the size and location of the caravan and the sanitation facilities to be provided in respect thereof.
 - (b) Every such application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$1.00.
 - (c) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to any such application as it thinks fit.
