




PRINCES HIGHWAY

BULN BULN AND WARRAGUL SHIRES Lengths in metros








MAIN, ROAD . ELTHAM-YARRA GLEN ROAD SHIRE OF ELTHAM



- 2. For the purposes of this determination "table cream" shall mean cream (as defined in the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1966) used or prepared or intended to be used or prepared for human consumption as cream.
- 3. This determination shall apply to all milk and/or cream or other butter-fat used or prepared or intended to be used or prepared for human consumption as table
- 4. This determination shall be binding on every person carrying on the business of buying or selling milk or butter-fat, which or part of which is to be used or may be used in the preparation of table cream.

5. The owner of each factory or authorized milk depot in the State of Victoria that receives milk from dairy farmers shall ascertain (a) the total fat content of all milk received by it from dairy farmers, and either used by it for the production of table cream or supplied by it as milk to a cream-processor or packager or otherwise and used for the production of table cream and (b) the total butter-fat content of all separated butter-fat supplied by it of a cream processor or packager or otherwise for use to a cream processor or packager or otherwise for use as table cream or for the production of table cream.

6. Such owner shall apportion the total butter-fat content thus ascertained between the dairy farmers from whom milk was obtained by it during the relevant period in proportion to the total butter-fat content of all milk so obtained from each such dairy farmer and shall in respect of the weight of butter-fat thus apportioned to each dairy farmer, pay him at the relevant price payable to dairy farmers at the farm gate for butter-fat in milk as fixed by this determination.



REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "SWAN HILL PIONEER SETTLEMENT"

MANAGEMENT OF THE "SWAN HILL PIONEER SETTLEMENT"

Whereas by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 the Minister of Lands is empowered to make Regulations as to any land which under the provisions of that Act or of any other Act relating to Crown lands has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees: And whereas certain Crown land in the Parish of Pental Island was temporarily reserved as a site for Public Purposes (Pioneer Settlement) by Order in Council dated the 30th March, 1978 (vide Government Gazette of the 26th April, 1978): And whereas that portion of the land along the Little Murray River as is shown by red colour on plan marked "PI/16.5.78" attached to Lands Department correspondence No. Rs.7746 was permanently reserved for Public Purposes by Order in Council dated the 23rd May, 1881 (vide Government Gazette of the 27th May, 1881): And whereas such lands (hereinafter called the "Reserve") have not been conveyed to or vested in trustees but have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management pursuant to the provisions of section 221 of the Land Act 1958: And whereas it is expedient that Regulations for the care, protection and management of the Reserve and for other purposes connected therewith should be made: Now therefore I. William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS

- 1. Definitions—
- "Authority" means the Swan Hill Pioneer Settlement Authority, duly appointed as the Committee of Management pursuant to section 221 of the Land Act 1958.
 - "Manager" means the Manager of the Swan Hill
 Pioneer Settlement, duly appointed by the said
 Authority pursuant to the provisions of the Swan
 Hill Pioneer Settlement Act 1974, No. 8548.
- 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public on such days and hours as determined by the Authority and at such admission charges if any, as may be prescribed from time to time by the Authority.
- · 3.. No person shall-

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who, in the opinion of the Authority or its authorized officer, may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct;
- (b) affix, print, post, paint, cut or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters and figures to or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Manager being first obtained;
 - (c) hawk, sell or offer or expose for sale any article, confectionery, fluid goods, merchandise, tobacco or anything else whatsoever, or solicit or gather money or hand out literature of any description within the Reserve without the written permission of the Manager being first obtained;
 - (d) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any member of the public using the Reserve or any officer or employee of the Authority engaged in official duties therein;

 - duties therein;

 (e) interfere with, break or damage in any way any building, structure, furniture, fitting, fixture, facility or other property or any tree, shrub, plant or flower within the Reserve;

 (f) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins or any other rubbish whatsoever in the Reserve or the waterways surrounding it except in receptacles provided for the purpose, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything therein that might injure any person or animal;

 (g) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places
 - (g) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set aside for the purpose by the Authority or its authorized officer and at such times as allowed by the Country Fire Authority;
 - (h) carry or discharge any firearm, air gun, catapult or any other weapon within the Reserve with-out the written consent of the Manager first being obtained;
 - (i) shoot, snare or destroy any animal or bird within the Reserve without the consent of the Manager; Manager;

- (j) conduct or take part in any game of chance within the Reserve;
- (k) spit or expectorate on the paths or any structure within the Reserve;
- (1) be under the influence of intoxicating liquor within the Reserve;
- (m) transmit by radio or television from within the Reserve without the permission of the Manager;
- (n) play a musical instrument, tape recorder, radio or amplifier within the Reserve without the permission of the Manager;
- (o) camp in the Reserve or erect any structure what-soever within the Reserve without the permis-sion, in writing, of the Authority or its authorized officer:
- (p) enter any building in the Reserve without the consent of the Authority and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested to do so by any officer or employee of the Authority, any member of the Police Force or by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or other person authorized by the Authority.
- 4. (i) No motor car or vehicle of any kind whatsoever shall be driven, ridden or conveyed onto shall be driven, ridden or conveyed onto, in, over or through the Reserve, except—
 - (a) with the permission of the Manager;
 - (b) for the purpose of entering or leaving an area specially set aside by the Authority for parking of motor cars and other vehicles.
- (ii) The parking of motor cars and vehicles in any such parking area shall be subject to such conditions as the Authority may determine from time to time.
- 5. No person shall bring into or permit to enter the Reserve, any dogs, cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Manager being first obtained
- 6. The Authority shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as defined by the Pounds Act 1958.
- 7. The owner of any dogs, horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve, except as hereinbefore provided, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

 8. Admission to the Reserve by payment of a fee does not of itself confer on a person a right to take photographs, either still or moving, for any purpose whatsoever. However, no restriction shall be placed on a person taking photographs, either still or moving, which are not used for gain or profit so long as an acknowledgement is given that the photographs were taken at The Swan Hill Pioneer Settlement Reserve. Upon payment of a fee determined by the Authority, a person may be granted approval under certain specified conditions to take photographs, which photographs are to be used for gain or graphs, which photographs are to be used for gain or profit. In this Regulation the use of the term "photo-graphs" shall also be deemed to include moving film, video tape, television films and similar methods of recording visually.
- 9. Every person within the Reserve shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable and lawful order or direction of any member of the Police Force or officer or employee of the Authority whether or not such order or direction is to enforce compliance with these Regula-
- 10. Any officer or employee of the Authority may remove or exclude from the Reserve any person who commits a breach of these Regulations.
- 11. The foregoing Regulations shall not restrict any servants, agents or workmen of the Authority in the proper execution of their duty or work in the Reserve—(Rs.7746).

William Archibald Borthwick, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Reserve:—

REGULATIONS

- 1. The Mine on the Reserve shall be open to the public for inspection during such hours and subject to the payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the Committee from time to time.
- 2. No person shall without the consent of the Committee:-
 - (a) enter the Mine on the Reserve without first paying the prescribed fees and unless accompanied by a person authorised by the Committee;
 - (b) smoke whilst in the Mine;
 - (c) interfere with, remove, damage or destroy any natural object or rock formation or any structure, fixture or fitting in the Mine or on the Reserve:
 - (d) camp in the Reserve.
- 3. No person shall interfere with, move, damage or destroy any shrub, tree, plant or any other property within the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall light, kindle or maintain any fire or solid fuel within the Reserve except in fireplaces provided by the Committee.
- 5. No person shall ride a horse, bicycle, motor cycle, minibike or trail bike or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public or on any area other than any access track or parking area designated by the Committee.
- 6. No person shall cut names on or in any way damage 6. No person shall cut names on or in any way damage or deface or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve or stick bills thereon; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- No person except on lawful occasions shall enter any enclosed area or building, garage or shed or any other structure within the Reserve.
- 8. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 9. No person shall remain within the Reserve or on any property therein when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands or member of the Police Force or authorized officer of the Committee.
- 10. No person shall hawk or sell or offer for sale within the Reserve any goods, fruit, merchandise or any commodity whatsoever or solicit or gather money therein without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 11. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Reserve, or scatter or throw down handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers

- 12. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
- 13. No person shall bring into the Mine on the Reserve any dog unless securely held by chain, cord or leash.
- 14. No person shall enter or remain in the Mine on the Reserve whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs, nor consume in or bring or cause to be brought into the Mine any intoxicating liquor.
- 15. No person shall pollute the Mine on the Reserve misuse or foul the sanitary arrangements provided or misuse of —(Rs.9379).



Bylaw No. 160

A Bylaw of the City of Mordialioc made under Section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 for:

Regulating the proceedings at meetings of the Council or of committees of the Council.

- In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and rate-payers of the City of Mordialloc order as follows:
- 1. This Bylaw shall be known as the Meeting Procedure
- 2. This Bylaw shall come into operation upon its publication in the ${\it Government Gazette}$.
- 3. Bylaws Nos. 105 and 159 are hereby repealed.
- 4. REGULATIONS APPLYING TO CONDUCT OF ORDINARY MEETINGS OF COUNCIL SHALL BE:

Business:

1. No business shall be conducted at an ordinary meeting of the council unless it is business of which notice has been given either by inclusion in the agenda or in any report accompanying the same or as provided for in clauses 5 and 6 hereof.

Agenda:

2. A copy of the agenda of business for any ordinary meeting of the council shall be posted or delivered to every councillor not later than 48 hours, before the time fixed for the holding of the meeting.

Order of Business:

- 3. After the confirmation of the minutes and the signing thereof, the business of an ordinary meeting of the council shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:-
 - I. Apologies,
 - II. Declarations by councillors of any direct or indirect pecuniary interest in any items of the agenda.
 - III. Resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meetings.
 - IV. Dealing with the correspondence referred to in clause 4 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.
 - V. Reception and reading of petitions, joint letters and memorials:
 - VI. Presentation of reports and the authorizing of payments.
 - VII. Business not elsewhere included.
 - VIII. Orders of the day including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
 - IX. Reports from delegates appointed by the council to other bodies.
 - X. Other motions of which previous notice has been .given.
 - XI. Urgent business.

Correspondence:

4. Unless otherwise directed by the council, the municipal clerk shall determine what inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the council for its decision or information.

. Notice of Motion:

5. No councillor shall propose a motion initiating a subject for discussion at an ordinary meeting of the council (being a matter not listed in the agenda) except by giving notice as prescribed in clause 6 hereof.

Provided that the council may resolve by a two-thirds majority of those present to admit (without such notice) an item considered to be urgent business, not being a matter where the law otherwise requires that notice shall be given.

- 6. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing and dated and be given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of a meeting or at such other times as will permit the municipal clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for a special meeting.
- (b) A notice of motion to revoke a previous resolution of the council—
 - (i) shall be given to the muncipal clerk as provided in section 185 of the Local Government Act 1958 and in sufficient time to enable him to give seven clear days' notice to all councillors;
 - (ii) shall be deemed to have been withdrawn if the motion is not moved at the next meeting of the council at which such business may be transacted; and
 - (iii) if it is a second or subsequent notice to revoke an earlier resolution, shall not be accepted by the municipal clerk until a period of one month has elapsed after the date of the meeting at which the first or last motion of revocation was dealt
- 7. The municipal clerk shall number notices of motion when received and enter them in a notice of motion book in the order in which they have been received.
 - 8. Should a councillor who has given notice of motion-
 - (a) be absent from the meeting; or
- · (b) fail to move the motion when called upon by the

chairman—
then any councillor may himself move the motion forthwith, or move to defer consideration thereof.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

Petitions:

- 10. A petition or a joint letter-
- (i) shall be in any legible and permanent form of writing, typing or printing;
 (ii) shall not be defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or substance; and
- (iii) shall not relate to a matter beyond the powers of the council.
- 11. (a) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request.
- (b) Any signature appearing on a page which does not bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request, shall not be considered by the council.
- (c) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall be a single piece of paper and shall not be pasted, stapled, pinned or otherwise affixed to any piece of paper other than another page of the petition.
- 12. Any person appending to a petition or joint letter, a signature purporting to be that of any other person or in the name of any other person is guilty of an offence.
- 13. (a) No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover at some previous meeting has submitted a draft of same.
- (b) No motion, except that of receiving the same shall be made on any petition, memorial or like application until the next ordinary meeting of the council after that at which it has been presented. Provided that this restriction shall not apply where the council determines by a two-thirds majority of those present that the matter is one of urgency and should be dealt with at the meeting at which it is presented.
- (c) No petition shall be presented after the council has proceeded to the orders of the day.
- 14. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall state the names of the persons from whom it comes, the number of signatures attached to it, the material allegations contained in it, and the prayer thereof. He may also speak to the petition.
 - 5. REGULATIONS APPLYING TO SPECIAL MEETINGS ONLY:

- 15. (a) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.
- (b) Officers of the council and persons engaged by the council to advise it and members of the public may attend a special meeting of the council, unless the council otherwise resolves.
- (c) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
- 6. REGULATIONS APPLYING ONLY TO MEETINGS OF COMMITTEES OF THE COUNCIL:

First Committee Meeting:

16. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment or any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or any two members

Attendance at Meetings:

17. Members of the public shall be admitted to meetings of any committee of the council unless the committee otherwise resolves. Subject to any direction of the council the municipal clerk, where practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

Correspondence:

- 18. Unless otherwise directed by the committee, the municipal clerk shall determine whether any items of inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the committee for its information or recommendation.
- 7. REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ALL ORDINARY AND SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETINGS AND TO ALL COMMITTEE MEETINGS:

Procedure:

19. In all cases not otherwise provided for herein, resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of Parliament which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable, to the proceedings of the council and its committees.

Minutes:

20. The minutes of any meeting of the council (including a special meeting) shall, unless confirmed at such meeting, be confirmed at the next meeting of the council.

- 21. Where minutes are to be confirmed at the next meet ing of the council the first item of business thereat shall
 - (a) where a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting has been delivered to each councillor at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, the putting of a motion for confirmation of the minutes without the reading of same; or
 - '(b) if a copy of the minutes of such previous meeting has not been so delivered the reading of and the putting of a motion for the confirmation of such minutes provided that no discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

Motions to be in Writing:

- 22.. (a) Where so required by the chairman, the mover of any motion at any meeting of the council or a committee of the council shall reduce such motion into writing.
- (b) Every motion shall be so worded that the meaning is clear and unambiguous and shall not be defamatory or objectionable in language or nature.

Addressing Meeting:

23. Any councillor desirous of moving a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman and subject to clauses 24 and 30 hereof, shall not be interrupted unless called to order when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question or order disposed of when the councillor in possession of the chair may, proceed with the subject.

Moving Motions or Amendments:

- 24. (a) Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the meeting thereon.
- (b) Before the proposer speaks to a motion or amendment the chairman shall call for a seconder. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote until it be seconded except that a councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by drawing-the-chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- (c) By proposing or seconding a motion or amendment, a councillor shall not be deemed to have spoken to the motion, or amendment.
- (d) Upon the seconding of any motion or amendment, the chairman shall call upon the mover to address the meeting. Thereafter the seconder shall be entitled to speak after which the chairman shall call upon any councillor who wishes to speak in opposition and, if no councillor speaks in opposition, the chairman may put the motion. If the motion is not then put, any other councillor may be called upon to speak called cupon to speak.

Debate:

25. Any councillor, except the mover or seconder of the: original motion, may propose or second an amendment. Any, councillor may address the meeting on an amendment-whether or not he has spoken to the motion.

Right of Reply:

26. The mover of an original motion which has not been amended shall have a right of reply to matters raised during debate immediately after which the motion shall be put from the chair; however, no right of reply shall be extended where the amendment is before the chair or the original motion has been amended.

Amendments:

- 27. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon any original proposition or of an amendment, shall betaken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 28. If any words of an original motion be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words, may be moved.
- 29.-If an amendment be negatived or adopted then a second may be moved to the motion to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment. shall be submitted for discussion at any time:
- 30: Except by the express leave of the meeting, in any particular case to grant an extension of time, no councillor shall speak to any question for a longer time than—

The mover of a motion for 3 minutes.

Any other councillor for 3 minutes.

The mover of a motion where entitled to a right. of reply? for 2 minutes.

31. A motion to confirm a special order must be carried or rejected without amendment.

Withdrawal of Motions:

32. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the meeting.

Use of Titles:

33. The councillors and officers in any meeting shall designate each other by their official titles.

Order of Speaking:

34. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same me, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to timė, th priority.

Chairman May Speak:

. 35. The chairman may address any meeting upon any matter under discussion and shall not be deemed to leave the chair on such occasions.

Speaking Twice:

36. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same motion; except where entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood, or as provided for in clauses 25 and 26 hereof.

Points of Order:

37. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same and his decisions as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

Speaking to Subject-matter:

38! No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the motion and discussion or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed disorderly and contrary to clause 41.

Call to Order:

391-At councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain!

Disorderly Expressions:
